- **Jamie Benn** recorded an assist on **Lian Bichsel's** goal and now has 43 points (16-37–43) in 67 career games against the Predators, which is the sixth-most by any active NHL skater.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Blues this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. The teams will next meet on Jan. 25 in St. Louis.
- Tonight is the third of six consecutive home games the Stars will play, their longest such stretch of the season.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars, Minnesota Wild and Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.61 goals against per game this season, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 15 of the 26 games that they have played this year.
- Only one of Dallas' games this season has required extra time – their 3-2 shootout win over the San Jose Sharks on Oct. 15. The Stars and the Rangers were the only teams in the NHL this season to have only one of their games go beyond regulation.
- **Oskar Bäck** has gone 19-for-30 at the faceoff dot since Nov. 20. His 63.3 success rate ranks seventh in the NHL during that span among players that have taken at least 20 draws.

SINGING THE BLUES

- Dallas is 120-131-56 all-time vs. St. Louis, including a 74-50-28 mark at home.
- The Stars have earned at least a point in six of the seven games that they have played against the Blues since the start of the 2022-23 season, posting a 5-1-1 record in those games.
 - Dallas has only allowed 1.57 goals against per game during that stretch, which is the best mark of any NHL team against the St. Louis since the start of the 2022-23 season.
- Dallas' .786 points percentage against the Blues since the start of the 2022-23 season ranks second in the NHL, trailing only the Utah Hockey Club, who have won their only meeting with St. Louis.
- **Jamie Benn** has scored 50 points (22-28–50) against St. Louis during his career, his second-highest total against any opponent since making his NHL debut in 2009-10. His 50 points against the Blues rank third among active NHL skaters and his 22 goals rank second among active NHL skaters.
- **Matt Duchene** has 16 points (5-11–16) in his last 13 games against the Blues dating back to Feb. 15, 2020.

- **Jake Oettinger** has a 4-1-0 career record against St. Louis, posting a .950 save percentage, 1.36 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
 - **Oettinger's** save percentage and goals-against average against the Blues are the best mark of any active goaltender that has played St. Louis at least twice in their career.

BICHSEL BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Dallas' last game against the Predators marked the first NHL game of defenseman **Lian Bichsel's** career.
- In making his NHL debut, **Bichsel** became:
 - The 33rd player and 13th defenseman selected in the 2022 NHL Draft to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
 - The eighth player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
 - The 46th Swiss player and 15th Swiss defenseman in league history to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
- **Bichsel** scored his first NHL goal in the game, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score in his NHL debut according to NHL Stats, joining Daniel Poulin (Dec. 12, 1981) and Bryan Maxwell (Feb. 16, 1987). **Bichsel's** goal came exactly 43 years to the day after Poulin's.
- When **Bichsel** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in his NHL debut, the Stars outshot their opponents 7-2 and had eight scoring chances to Nashville's four according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - **Bichsel's** 66.7 percent on-ice Corsi rating in was the best mark of any defenseman to take the ice (Stars or Predators) during the game.
- Additionally, **Bichsel** recorded five hits in the game, which is tied for the most by a Stars skater in a single game this season.
- Standing at 6'7", there are only four players to appear in a regular-season game this year that are taller than **Bichsel**: New York's Matt Rempe (6'9"), Vancouver's Tyler Myers (6'8"), Chicago's Louis Crevier (6'8") and Calgary's Adam Klapka (6'8").
- **Bichsel** was originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2022 NHL Draft, the only Swiss player to be drafted that year. It made him the seventh-highest drafted Swiss player in NHL history, behind Nico Hischier (first overall, 2017), Nino Niederreiter (fifth overall, 2010), Timo Meier (ninth overall, 2015), Kevin Fiala (11th overall, 2014), Sven Bärtschi (13th overall, 2011) and Michel Riesen (14th overall, 1997).
 - Defenseman Mirco Müller was also drafted 18th overall, taken by San Jose in 2013.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against St. Louis with an 11-3-0 record while playing at home this season.
 - Only two of Dallas' "home" losses this season were American Airlines Center, with the first coming at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
 - Currently the Stars are tied with the Carolina Hurricanes and Los Angeles Kings for the fewest losses at home this season (3).
- Dallas' .786 points percentage and 11 wins at home this season were both tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Stars have allowed only 30 goals and 2.14 goals-per-game in home games this year, which were both tied for the third-best marks in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- Dallas has gone 32-for-36 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 88.9 percent success rate when playing a man down at home this year was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas' next home win will be their 12th of the season. Last year, the Stars won their 12th home game of the season on Dec. 31, 2024 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer at home this year, totaling 13 points (7-6—13) in 14 games.
- **Jason Robertson** has totaled seven points (2-5—7) in his last seven games at the American Airlines Center dating back to Nov. 14.
- **Thomas Harley** (2-3—5) and **Wyatt Johnston** (3-2—5) both have five points in their last five home games.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** scored two goals in Dallas' game on Dec. 8 against the Flames for his 13th and 14th points of the season, which ties him with **Miro Heiskanen** for the lead in scoring among Stars defensemen this year.
 - **Harley's** effort against Calgary marked his second-career two-goal game and first since Jan. 27, 2024 against the Washington Capitals.
- **Harley** is now pacing to finish the year with 41 points, which would be six shy of his career high of 47 (15-32—47) that he set last season.
- This season when **Harley** has been on the ice during even-strength play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 37-21. **Harley** is leading all Stars skaters this year in both and on-ice even-strength goals for (37) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (+16).
- Additionally, entering play Friday, **Harley** ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both on-ice even-strength goals for (tied sixth) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (tied eighth).
- Originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2019 NHL Draft, **Harley** has totaled 67 points (20-47—67) in 147 career regular-season games, which ranks third among defensemen from his draft class.

- Detroit's Moritz Seider (24-125—149) and Buffalo's Bowen Byram (30-58—88) are the only blueliners drafted in 2019 with more career points than **Harley**.

EVEN STEVENS

- The Stars have played 16 games since returning from the Global Series in Finland dating back to Nov. 7. During that span, the team has scored 41 5-on-5 goals, the most of any team in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas has averaged 2.4 5-on-5 goals per game during that span, which ranked fourth in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Additionally, during that span the Stars have outshot their opponents 415-374 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick. Their 374 shots at 5-on-5 rank second in the league during that span and their 52.2 percent shot share ranks 10th.
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 41-31 at 5-on-5 during that span. Their 56.9 goals-for percentage since Nov. 7 is the fifth-best mark in the NHL according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Seventeen different Stars skaters have scored at least one even-strength goal (5-on-5 and 4-on-4) since Nov. 7, with **Mason Marchment** leading the team with 10. **Marchment's** 10 even-strength goals were tied with Colorado's Mikko Rantanen for the most in the NHL since Nov. 7 entering play Friday.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is two points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- **Matt Duchene** is six points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- **Esa Lindell** is three games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- **Lindell** also enters tonight's contest five assists shy of typing Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only seven teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, NY Rangers, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Blues GM Doug Armstrong was the assistant GM with the North Stars in 1992-93 and the Stars from 1993-94 to 2001-02 before becoming the GM in Dallas mid-season in 2001-02 until the middle of the 2007-08 season.
- Blues assistant coach Steve Ott was drafted by the Dallas Stars with the 25th pick of the 2000 NHL Draft. He played for the Stars in 2003-04 and 2005-06 to 2011-12 where he served as the assistant captain his last two seasons.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** and Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** played for the Blues during their careers. Nill during the 1981-82 season and Bishop in 2008-09 and 2010-11.
- Blues forward Radek Faksa was drafted by the Stars 13th overall in the 2012 NHL Draft and played for Dallas from 2015-16 to 2023-24.
- Blues head coach Jim Montgomery played for the Stars for nine games during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. He also was the head coach in Dallas from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played for Dallas from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** and Blues defenseman Nick Leddy played together with the Chicago Blackhawks during the 2010-11 season.
- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverly** and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played together in Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and forward **Colin Blackwell** played with Blues forward Pavel Buchnevich as members of the New York Rangers. Smith and Buchnevich were teammates from 2016-17 to 2020-21, Blackwell joined the duo for the 2020-21 season.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blues forward Brayden Schenn were both with the Philadelphia Flyers from 2011-12 to 2014-15 when Reese was a goalie coach in Philadelphia.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and defenseman **Matt Dumba** were teammates with Blues forward Oskar Sundqvist in Minnesota, when Sundqvist played 15 games for the Wild during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blues forward Alexandre Texier played two games together with the Columbus Blue Jackets at the end of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Blues defenseman Pierre-Olivier Joseph were teammates in Pittsburgh from 2020-21 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter were teammates from 2013-14 to 2020-21 in Minnesota.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott played together in Detroit during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott were teammates at the end of the 2016-17 season in Montreal.
- Stars Director of Player Development **Rich Peverly** and Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** played under Blues assistant coach Claude Julien when Julien was the head coach in Boston. Peverly played under Julien in Boston from 2010-11 to 2012-13, winning a Stanley Cup together in 2011, and Turco played under Julien in 2011-12.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played under Blues assistant coach Claude Julien when Julien was the head coach in Montreal during the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons.
