

BUNTING SEASON

Michael Bunting scored in a second-consecutive game on Tuesday night against the Colorado Avalanche. He has 12 points (7G-5A) in his last 17 games after having one assist in his first 12 games.

BLUELINE BLITZ

Kris Letang and Erik Karlsson are some of the top-producing active defensemen against the Montreal Canadiens throughout their respective careers.

- Karlsson has 10 goals, 32 assists and 42 points in 51 career games against the Canadiens, while Letang has 10 goals, 27 assists and 37 points in 46 career games.
- Karlsson and Letang's 10 goals against Montreal are the most among all active blueliners:

APPLE PICKING

Sidney Crosby has points in 10 of his last 13 games, recording 11 points (2G-9A) in the span dating back to November 13.

Crosby leads all active players with 1,023 career assists, all coming with the Penguins. He enters tonight's game one assist shy of surpassing Gordie Howe for sole possession of the fifth-most assists with one franchise in NHL history:

Crosby has 25 goals, 41 assists and 66 points in 51 career games against the Canadiens. Among all active players, his 41 assists and 66 points rank second.

GOALS GALORE

The Penguins are 5-2-0 since November 27 in large part due to their offensive output during that stretch.
