- 12 different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and three had multi-point efforts.
- Wyatt Johnston registered his fourth career shorthanded goal (sixth goal of the season), becoming the third player in Stars/North Stars history with four shorthanded goals before age 22 according to NHL Stats.
- Jason Robertson scored his sixth goal of the season and recorded his 95th career multi-point game, extending his
 point streak against the Flames to nine games (8-5-13, 9 GP), tied for his second-longest point streak against a single
 opponent (also: NSH, 4-11-15, 9 GP).
- Thomas Harley tallied two goals during the game, his second time in his career to put up two goals in a single game (last: Jan. 27, 2024 vs. WSH).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of four games the Stars will play against the Predators this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. The teams will next meet on April 3 in Dallas.
- Tonight is the second of six consecutive home games the Stars will play, their longest such stretch of the season.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Stars have topped the NHL in wins (16), points (40) and goals scored (99) against the Predators.
- Dallas has gone 10-for-30 on the power play against Nashville since the start of the 2022-23 season. Their 33.3 percent success rate while playing a man up with the third-best mark against the Predators during that span.
 - o Only the Edmonton Oilers have scored more power-play goals (12) against the Predators than the Stars during that span.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars, Minnesota Wild and Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.56 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 15 of the 25 games that they have played this year.
- Roope Hintz has won at least 60 percent of the face offs he has taken in five of the last seven games that he has played dating back to Nov. 20. In all, he has gone 51-for-80 at the faceoff dot during that span, for a 63.8 percent success rate.
 - His 63.8 success rate ranked seventh in the NHL among skaters that have taken at least 15 draws during that span entering play Thursday.
- Only one of Dallas' games this season has required extra time their 3-2 shootout win over the San Jose Sharks on Oct. 15. The Stars and the Rangers were the only teams in the NHL this season to have only one of their games go beyond regulation.

PREDATORS TO PREY

- Dallas is 58-39-12 all-time vs. Nashville, including a 34-15-4 mark at home.
- Jamie Benn has totaled 42 points (16-26—42) in 66 career games against the Predators, which is sixth-most among all active NHL skaters.
 - Benn's 42 points against Nashville are the most by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene has totaled 37 points (14-23—37) in 39 regular-season games against the Predators. Duchene's 37 career points rank ninth all-time among active NHL skaters.
 - o Duchene has six points (3-3–6) in five games against the Predators as a member of the Stars.
- Jason Robertson enters tonight's game riding a nine-game point streak against the Predators, dating back to Oct. 13, 2022, totaling 15 points (4-11—15) during that span.
 - o **Robertson** has totaled 24 points (10-14—24) in 21 career games played against Nashville, his highest assist and point total against a single opponent.
 - His nine-game point streak is tied for his second longest point streak against a single opponent (also: CGY, 8-5-13, 9 GP).
 - His 1.14 points-per-game against the Predators rank 15th among active NHL skaters that have played Nashville at least 10 times in their career.
- Wyatt Johnston has totaled seven points (4-3-7) in nine career games played against the Predators.
 - Johnston enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against Nashville, tallying six points (3-3—6) over that span.
- Thomas Harley enters tonight's game riding a four-game assist streak against the Predators dating back to Jan. 6, 2024, totaling five assists during that span. It marks his longest career point streak against a single opponent.
- Roope Hintz has totaled 25 career points (12-13—25) in 26 regular-season games against Nashville, his highest total against a single opponent.
- Mason Marchment (2-3-5) has tallied five points in his last five games against Nashville.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Nashville with an 11-2-O record while playing at home this season. A victory tonight would give the Stars wins in five consecutive home games for the second time this season.
 - Only one of Dallas' "home" losses this season was American Airlines Center, with the first coming at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
 - o Currently the Stars are tied with the Los Angeles Kings for the fewest losses at home this season (2).
- Dallas' .846 points percentage at home this season was the best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday and the team's 11 home wins were tied for second.
- The Stars have allowed only 26 goals and 2.00 goals-per-game in home games this year, which were both tied for the second-best marks in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas has gone 31-for-35 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 88.6 percent success rate when playing a man
 down at home this year was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas' next home win will be their 12th of the season. Last year, the Stars won their 12th home game of the season on Dec. 31, 2024 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
 - o With a win tonight, the Stars could tie the Toronto Maple Leafs for the most wins at home across the NHL (12).
- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer at home this year, totaling 13 points (7-6—13) in 13 games.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's matchup having scored in each of the last four games that he has played at the American Airlines Center.
 - If he were to score again tonight, he would become the first Stars skater to score in five consecutive home games since Matt Duchene did so from Jan. 25 to Feb. 26, 2024 according to NHL Stats.
 - Hintz previously scored in five consecutive home games from Nov. 10 to 23, 2021.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's game riding a four-game home point streak, totaling five points (3-2-5) in those
 games.
- Jamie Benn has nine points (4-5—9) in his last nine home games.
- Jason Robertson has totaled seven points (2-5—7) in his last six games at the American Airlines Center dating back to Nov. 14.
- Thomas Harley has five points (2-3—5) in his last four home games.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored a shorthanded goal in Dallas' last game and now has 10 points (4-6—10) in his last 10 games played dating back to Nov. 20 against the San Jose Sharks. His 10 points during that span lead all Stars skaters.
- Seven of those 10 points came in six consecutive games from Nov. 20 to Dec. 1. **Johnston's** six-game point streak was the longest of his career.
- **Johnston** has logged 123 points (62-61—123) in 191 regular-season games with the Stars since making his Dallas debut in 2022-23. His 61 goals during that span are the third-most of any Stars skater, trailing only linemates **Jason Robertson** (81) and **Roope Hintz** (78).
- **Johnston** leads all 2021 draft selections in career goals, points, even-strength goals (50), even-strength points (96) and plus/minus (plus-22).

- Johnston was drafted after eight of the other nine skaters ranked in the top 10 in scoring from the 2021 draft class.
- He also tops 2021 draftees in nearly every career playoff stat: goals (14), assists (8), points (22), points per game (.58), even-strength goals (11), even-strength points (17), power-play goals (2), power-play points (4), shorthanded goals (1) and game-winning goals (4).
- Johnston enters tonight's matchup nine games shy of appearing in 200 NHL regular-season games. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 53rd draft pick in franchise history to appear in at least 200 regular-season games for the club according to NHL Stas.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley scored two goals in Dallas' last game on Dec. 8 against the Flames for his 13th and 14th points of the season, which ties him with Miro Heiskanen for the lead in scoring among Stars defensemen this season.
 - Harley's effort against Calgary marked his second-career two-goal game and first since Jan. 27, 2024 against the Washington Capitals.
- Harley is now pacing to finish the year with 43 points, which would be four shy of his career high of 47 (15-32—47) that he set last season.
- This season when Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 37-20. Harley is leading all Stars skaters this year in both and on-ice even-strength goals for (37) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (+17).
- Additionally, entering play Wednesday, Harley ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both on-ice even-strength goals for (tied sixth) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (tied fifth).
- Originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2019 NHL Draft, **Harley** has totaled 67 points (20-47—67) in 146 career regular-season games, which ranks third among defensemen from his draft class.
 - Detroit's Moritz Seider (24-125—149) and Buffalo's Bowen Byram (30-57—87) are the only blueliners drafted in 2019 with more career points than Harley.

JAKE AND BAKE

- Jake Oettinger has gone a perfect 10-0-0 at the American Airlines Center this season, posting a 0.936 save percentage,
 1.59 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- According to NHL Stats, Oettinger is the ninth netminder in NHL history to win the first 10 games he has played at his
 home arena, and the first to do so since Tampa Bay's Andrei Vasilevskiy in 2020-21.
 - Please note that Oettinger has registered one "home" loss this season, but the game was played at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- Oettinger's win against the Flames in Dallas' last game was the 127th victory of his career, giving him sole possession of seventh on the franchise's all-time wins list. He now sits one win shy of tying Jon Casey for sixth.
- In all, **Oettinger** has posted a 14-6-0 record this season with a .912 save percentage and a 2.43 goals-against average. Entering play Wednesday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in wins (tied second), save percentage (tied 10th) and goals-against average (ninth) among netminders to play in at least 10 games this season.

TILTING THE ICE

- Entering play Wednesday, Mason Marchment (plus-16) and Matt Duchene (plus-14) were tied for third and eighth, respectively, among all NHL forwards this season in even strength on-ice goal differential.
- Oskar Bāck (tied seventh), Nils Lundkvist (tied ninth) and Marchment (12th) were all ranked in the top 15 in the NHL this season in on-ice even-strength goals for percentage among skaters that have played in at least 20 games. During even-strength play, the Stars have outscored their opponents...
 - o 9-4 when **Bäck** has been on the ice,
 - o 11-5 when Lundkvist is on the ice, and
 - o 30-14 when Marchment is on the ice.
- Since Nov. 11, Thomas Harley and Miro Heiskanen were tied for fourth and seventh among NHL defensemen in on-ice goal differential with a plus-11 and plus-10 rating, respectively, entering play Wednesday.

EVEN STEVENS

- The Stars have played 15 games since returning from the Global Series in Finland dating back to Nov. 7. During that span, the team has scored 40 5-on-5 goals, the most of any team in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas has averaged 2.5 5-on-5 goals per game during that span, which ranked second in the NHL to only the Washington Capitals (2.53) entering play Wednesday.
- Additionally, during that span the Stars have outshot their opponents 384-352 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 Their 362 shots at 5-on-5 rank fourth in the league during that span and their 52.2 percent shot share ranks 10th.
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 40-29 at 5-on-5 during that span. Their 58.0 goals-for percentage since Nov. 7 is the third-best mark in the NHL according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Sixteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one even-strength goal (5-on-5 and 4-on-4) since Nov. 7, with Mason Marchment leading the team with 10. Marchment's 10 even-strength goals were tied with Colorado's Mikko Rantanen for the most in the NHL since Nov. 7 entering play Wednesday.

SETTING THE PACE

- With 55 regular-season games remaining, four different Stars skaters are pacing to set career highs in scoring this year:
 Matt Duchene, Ilya Lyubushkin, Mason Marchment and Sam Steel.
- Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 37 goals, 47 assists and 84 points, all of which would be career highs. His 27 points this year are already 50.9 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31—53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
- Duchene (36-52-88), Lyubushkin (0-21-21) and Steel (9-25-34) are all on pace to finish the regular season with career highs in both assists and points.
- Colin Blackwell (14), Esa Lindell (24) and Brendan Smith (17) are all pacing to finish the 2024-25 season with a career high in assists.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is two points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is six points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is four games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- Lindell also enters tonight's contest five assists shy of typing Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only seven teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, NY Rangers, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold)
 IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
 again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward Matt Duchene played for Nashville for four seasons (2019-20 to 2022-23), recording 197 points (84 goals, 113) in 197 regular-season games and adding nine points (five goals, four assists) in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell played part of the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons with the Predators, totaling 10 points (three goals, seven assists) in 33 regular-season games.

- Stars Director of Player Personnel Rich Peverley played for the Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09, recording 20 points (seven goals, 13 assists) in 73 regular-season games.
- Stars forward Jamie Benn, Predators forward Ryan O'Reilly and Predators defenseman Luke Schenn all played for Canada at the 2012 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Predators defenseman Jeremy Lauzon were both a part of the Seattle Kraken's inaugural roster in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Predators forward Jonathan Marchessault both played for the Vegas Golden Knights during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Predators forward Ryan O'Reilly played in Colorado together from 2009-10 to 2014-15. The two also played for Team Canada together at the 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017 IIHF World Championships and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey. They've won four medals together: 2015 World Championship (gold), 2016 World Cup of Hockey (gold) and 2017 World Championship (silver).
 - Stars forward Tyler Seguin won a gold medal with the duo at the 2015 World Championships and defenseman
 Matt Dumba won a gold medal with the two at the 2016 World Championships.
 - Predators forward Steven Stamkos and defenseman Luke Schenn were also on the 2013 team with Duchene and O'Reilly. Stamkos played again with the two at the 2017 World Championship.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene played for Team Canada with Predators defenseman Luke Schenn at the 2011 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and forward Sam Steel both played for the Minnesota Wild with Predators forward Gustav Nyquist during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Predators forward Steven Stamkos both played in Tampa Bay in 2023-24.
- Stars defenseman Thomas Harley won a silver medal with Predators forward Philip Tomasino while playing for Team Canada at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward Roope Hintz and defenseman Esa Lindell have both played for Team Finland in international competition
 with Predators goaltender Juuse Saros.
 - Hintz and Saros played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
 - Lindell and Saros played together at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Championship. They won a gold medal in 2014 and a silver medal in 2016.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Predators forward Gustav Nyquist were teammates in Detroit from 2011-12 to 2016-17.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Predators defenseman Brady Skjei both played for the New York Rangers from 2016-17 to 2019-20. The two then reunited in Carolina for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Predators defenseman Luke Schenn both played for the Anaheim Ducks in 2018-19.
- Stars forward Sam Steel won a gold medal with Predators defenseman Dante Fabbro while playing for Team Canada at the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
