SHUTTING THE DOOR

Since the NHL's holiday break concluded on December 27, the Penguins have points in nine of their last 11 games due in large part to the play of the goaltenders and defensemen.

- The Penguins have limited their opponents to a league-best 23 goals against since the NHL's holiday break. In that span, the team's 2.09 goals-against average leads the league, while their .918 save percentage ranks second:

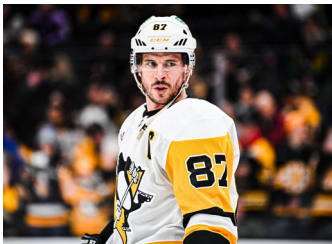
