GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of three games the Stars will play against the Ducks this season and the second time that they have played in Dallas this year.
 - o Dallas fell short in their last two games vs. Anaheim, with the Ducks winning 4-2 on Nov. 18 and 2-1 on Feb. 4.
- The Stars enter today's game with a 42-21-3 record for 87 points and a .659 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 42 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Monday.
- Jamie Benn enters today's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.38, fourth) and goals against per game (2.62, fifth).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 33 of the 66 games that they have played this year.

FROM START TO FINNISH

 Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, **Rantanen** signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.

- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Tonight will mark Rantanen's first-ever game at American Airlines Center as a part of the home team.
- Rantanen has totaled four points (1-3—4) in four games with the Stars since being acquired from Carolina. If he were to have at least one point tonight, he would become the first Stars skater to have at least five points through their first five games played with the Stars since Mason Marchment has six points (3-3—6) in his first five games with Dallas.
- He scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are **Marchment** (2-0—2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1—2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2—2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1—2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and Marchement in 2022-23.
- Rantanen tallied the 400th assist of his career in Dallas' last game on March 16 against Colorado. He became the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.
- Rantanen also become the 10th Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 career assists. He required the third-fewest games (636) to reach the mark behind Jari Kurri (523 GP) and Teemu Selanne (603 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Entering play Monday, Rantanen ranked 13th in the NHL in scoring this season with 74 points (29-45—74) in 66 regular-season games with the Colorado Avalanche, Carolina Hurricanes and Stars. His assist and point totals top all Stars skaters this season.
- Rantanen's next goal will be his 30th of the season, which will make him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 2000-01).
- Rantanen has totaled 691 points (291-400—691) in 636 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (691) and 10th in assists (400).
 - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.

DUCK HUNTING

- Dallas is 83-40-15 all-time vs. Anaheim, including a 50-13-6 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have won 11 of their last 15 games against the Ducks (11-4-0) dating back to Oct. 25, 2018.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak vs. Anaheim, earning five points (0-5—5) during those games. In all, Rantanen has recorded 33 points (15-18—33) in 29 career games against the Ducks.
- Matt Duchene has 11 points (6-5—11) in his last 10 games against the Ducks dating back to March 10, 2022. In all, Duchene has earned 30 points (14-16—30) in 40 career games vs. Anaheim.
- Roope Hintz has registered seven points (3-4—7) in his last eight games against Anaheim. In all, Hintz has 11 points (5-6—11) in 13 career games against the Ducks.
- Jake Oettinger has posted an 8-1-0 record with a .930 save percentage, 1.87 goals-against average and one shutout in nine career games against the Ducks.
 - Oettinger's eight wins against Anaheim since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied for the second-most in the NHL.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-2-0 career record against Anaheim, posting a .919 save percentage, a 2.36 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- Jason Robertson has nine points (4-5—9) in 11 career games against the Ducks.
- **Jamie Benn** rides a three-game point streak against the Ducks (1-3—4) entering tonight's matchup. In all, **Benn** has 38 points (12-26—38) in 51 career games against Anaheim. His 38 points against the Ducks tops all active Stars skaters and ranks ninth in the league among active NHL skaters.
- Mikael Granlund has four points (1-3—4) in his last five games against the Ducks. In his career vs. Anaheim, Granlund has recorded 22 points (6-16—22) in 32 games.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game riding a seven-game home winning streak dating back to Jan. 24 against the Vegas Golden Knights. During that span, the Dallas has outscored its opponents 33-19.
- Dallas' seven-game home winning streak was the second-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only the Colorado Avalanche who have won their last nine home games.

- It is also the Stars' longest home winning streak since they also won seven straight games at the American Airlines
 Center from Nov. 13 to Dec. 6, 2021. A win tonight would give the Stars eight consecutive home wins for the first time
 since Jan. 23 to March 13, 2006.
- A Dallas victory tonight would also make the Stars the fifth team this season to win at least eight consecutive games
 at home, joining Colorado (Jan. 31 to present), Los Angeles (Nov. 23 to Jan. 4), Carolina (Oct. 15 to Nov. 27) and Vegas
 (Oct. 9 to Nov. 2).
- Since Jan. 24, the Stars have gone 10-for-20 on the power play at the American Airlines Center. Their 50 percent success
 rate on the power play at home is the best mark in the NHL during that span, and their 10 home power-play goals
 ranked fourth entering play Monday.
- In all this season, the Stars have a 24-7-1 record at home. Entering play Monday, they ranked in the top five in the NHL in home wins (tied third), points (fifth) and points percentage (.766, fourth).
 - o Dallas' 24 home wins are just two shy of matching their total of 26 from all of last season.
- The Stars are currently on pace to finish the season with 30 homes wins, which would set a franchise record. The team's
 29 home victories in 1989-99 are currently the most in a single season in franchise history.

HOME COOKING

- Wyatt Johnston has recorded a point in each of the last 14 games he has played at the American Airlines Center, making him the third player in franchise history to have a point in at least 14 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- Johnston's home point streak is the fifth-longest by any NHL skater this season and is the second-longest active such streak in the league, trailing only Nathan MacKinnon's 21-game home point streak.
- Johnston (33 points, 32 games played), Jason Robertson (38 points, 32 games played) and Roope Hintz (34 points 30 games played) are all playing at a point-per-game pace at home this year.
 - o Robertson's 38 home points this year are the most of any Stars skater this season.
- Hintz has scored 18 goals at the American Airlines Center this season, which was tied for the 10th-most home goals in the NHL this season. He enters tonight's game riding a four-game home point streak, recording multi-point efforts in each of those games.
- Robertson enters tonight's game riding a seven-game home point streak dating back to Jan. 24, totaling 14 points (7-7—14) during that span.
- Matt Duchene has tallied 13 points (3-10—13) in his last 12 home games.
- Thomas Harley has recorded 13 points (3-10—13) in his last 13 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His 13 home points during that span were tied for eighth among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.
 - o Eight of those 13 points have come in the five home games that he has played since Feb. 2
- Jake Oettinger has won the last five games that he has played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan. 24, posting a .914 save percentage and a 2.56 goals-against average in those games.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-1-0 record at home this year, which includes winning his last three stars at the American Airlines
 Center.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage
 was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 28-13-3 record in 43 games for 59 points and a 0.670 points percentage. The team's win total during that span was tied for the second-most the NHL entering play Monday and their point total and points percentage ranked third and fourth, respectively.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars
 power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they
 took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 24.8 percent and 86.2 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill,
 respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

 Robertson (tied fourth) and Johnston (seventh) both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring since Dec. 1 entering play Monday.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley enters tonight's game having totaled 16 points (5-11—16) in his last 16 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 16 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
- Harley's 16 points since Jan. 31 were tied for the fourth-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (19), Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin (17) and Ottawa's Jake Sanderson (17) for the league lead.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:15 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked seventh in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - o Harley has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in seven of those 14 games during that span.
 - o Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 39 points (12-27—39) in 64 regular-season games this season, which puts him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 34 assists and 49 points.
 - o His 12 goals this season were the eighth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Monday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- On March 8, **Wyatt Johnston** signed a five-year, \$42 million contract extension with the Stars that will begin next season and carry an average annual value (AAV) of \$8.4 million.
- Johnston has 61 points (24-37—61) in 66 games this season, which ranks fourth on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 60-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 76 points, which would be a career high.
- Johnston scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over
 the St. Louis Blues. Johnston tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before
 turning 22 according to NHL Stats.

- According to NHL Stats, Johnston's hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat
 tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of **Johnston's** goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three powerplay goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.
 - Johnston's performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 – that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- Johnston's first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a
 career high for the forward.
- Johnston scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Monday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for fifth in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since **Johnston** made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (**Roope Hintz**; 7) and are tied for 10th in the NHL.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 26-for-77 on the power play for a 33.8 percent success rate, which was tied with Vegas for the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- The team's 26 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (30) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored six power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
 - o In all this season, **Johnston** has scored a career-high eight power-play goals, which is five more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - o Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

GOALIE GANG

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 14-6-2 record in his last 22 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .906 save percentage and a 2.67 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 14 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last six games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .931 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
 - o Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, **DeSmith** ranked fourth and seventh, respectively, in save percentage and goals-against average.
- DeSmith's six-game win streak is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Monday. If he were to win the next game that he plays, he would become the seventh goaltender this season to have a win streak of at least seven games.
- In all, **Oettinger** and **DeSmith** have combined for a .905 save percentage this season, which was tied for the third-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Monday. Only Winnipeg (.917) and Tampa Bay (.906) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.58 goals-against average this season was ranked fifth in the NHL this year entering play Monday.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has played in 15 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outshot their opponents 109-87 and have 107 scoring chances to their 82 when Bichsel has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - o His 55.6 shots for percentage tops all Stars skaters during that span.

- **Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in 12 of the 15 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 16.8 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Monday.
- Despite only playing in 23 games this season, Bichsel leads all Stars skaters with 96 hits. His 96 hits were tied for seventh among all NHL rookies this season entering play Monday.
 - o He is the only player ranked in the top 10 to have played in fewer than 30 games this year.
- There have been nine instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning eight of them.
- **Bichsel** is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game eight times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Monday.
- Bichsel is the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in a game eight times in a single season since Jani Hakanpää (9) did so in 2022-23.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.5 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was tied with Carolina for the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 27, and their -21 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 30th in the league in total penalty minutes (432) and 29th in penalty minutes per game (6:32) entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (223:26) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:23) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** and **Sam Steel** both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Monday.
 - o Harley, who has played 105:48 of shorthanded ice time, ranked seventh with 3.97.
 - o Steel ranked 10th with 4.05. He has totaled 118:38 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:51 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (363), **Jason Robertson** (276), **Esa Lindell** (236) and **Wyatt Johnston** (230).
