- The Stars extended their win streak to six games, their longest winning streak since they won seven straight games from March 22 to April 3, 2025.
 - The team’s six-game win streak is tied for the 10th-longest in franchise history.
- **Jamie Benn** finished the night with three points (2-1—3), including scoring the game-winning goal with 22 seconds left in regulation. The Stars have now won three consecutive games against the Blues by scoring a game-winning goal with 90 seconds or fewer remaining in regulation.
- **Jason Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- With his goal and assist during the game, **Robertson** extended his point streak against the Blues to three games, tallying six points (2-4—6) during that span.
- **Matt Duchene** scored a goal and added an assist during the game to extend his point streak to six games. It is his longest point streak since he tallied a point in seven straight games (3-7—10) from March 27 to April 8, 2025.
 - **Duchene** has eight points (6-2—8) over the course of this streak.
 - **Duchene** also extended his point streak against St. Louis to three games, earning five points (4-1—5) during that span.
- **Mavrik Bourque** scored his 11th goal of the season in his 57th game played, matching his total from the 2024-25 season that he had in 73 games played. **Bourque** now has four points (3-1—4) in his last four games played.
- **Mikko Rantanen** extended his assist streak to five games with an assist during the game. It is the second time this season he has tallied an assist in five or more consecutive games.
- **Thomas Harley** extended his point streak to three games with an assist during the game and now has seven points (3-4—7) in his last eight games played. When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars outshot the Blues 12-5.
- **Roope Hintz** tallied an assist during the game and now has eight points (1-7—8) in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins.
 - He also extended his point streak against St. Louis to three games, collecting four points (1-3—4) during that span.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third and final game that the Stars will play against the Kraken this season. Dallas defeated Seattle in both of their previous games earlier this season on Nov. 9, 2025 (2-1 W) and Nov. 26, 2025 (3-2 W).
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (34, tied fourth), points (77, fifth) and points percentage (.675, fourth) this year entering play Tuesday. The team's success this season comes despite having 193 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Seventy-two of the Stars' 189 goals this season have been scored in the third period, which was tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 428-for-723 at the faceoff dot this season for a 59.2 percent success rate, which was the eighth-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Tuesday.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. We he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Justin Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas in 5-0-3 in those games.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of the last six games that they have played dating back to Jan. 23, which was the second-longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday. Dallas has won each game during the streak by a one-goal margin.
 - In all, the team has won 19 games by a one-goal margin this season, which was tied for the most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Dallas is one of 10 teams this season to have two separate win streaks of at least five games. They previously won five straight games from Nov. 8 to 15.
- A Stars victory tonight would give the team seven consecutive wins for the first time since March 22 to April 3, 2025. It would also tie for the second-longest winning streak in franchise history, trailing only the team's eight-game win streak from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
- A Dallas win would also make them the 11th team this season to win at least seven consecutive games.
- Dallas has scored first in each of the last six games that they have played and have only trailed for 22:25 of game time during the six-game win streak.
- The team has gone 8-for-21 on the power play over the course of this winning streak for a 38.1 percent success rate.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling nine points (6-3—9) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, six Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.50), **Jamie Benn** (1.33), **Jason Robertson** (1.33), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.17), **Roope Hintz** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
- **Duchene's** six goals during that span were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.

SQUID GAMES

- Dallas is 12-1-1 all-time vs. Seattle, including a 6-0-1 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have won eight consecutive games against the Kraken dating back to Dec. 18, 2023. Dallas has outscored Seattle 25-9 during that span.
- Dallas' all-time penalty kill success rate of 95.1 (39-for-41) against Seattle leads the NHL.
- The Stars have a .893 point percentage against the Kraken which ranks second among all NHL teams.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Seattle, earning two points (1-1—2) during that span. In all, **Hintz** has recorded 14 points (7-7—14) in 14 career games against the Kraken, carrying a plus-minus rating of +8.
 - Seattle is one of nine teams that **Hintz** has averaged at least a point per game against in his career, with the others being Detroit (1.50), Edmonton (1.17), Philadelphia (1.09), Washington (1.08), Anaheim (1.00), Los Angeles (1.00), New Jersey (1.00) and San Jose (1.00).
- **Miro Heiskanen** has five points (1-4—5) in his last four games played against the Kraken, dating back to April 13, 2024. In 12 career games vs. Seattle, **Heiskanen** has totaled 13 points (3-10—13), averaging 1.08 points per game and upholding a plus-minus rating of +3.
 - **Heiskanen** is also averaging 25:34 of time on ice per game played against the Kraken which is the sixth-best mark in the NHL among all active skaters.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has registered seven points (3-4—7) in his last six games vs. Seattle, dating back to Nov. 5, 2024. In all, **Rantanen** has totaled 12 points (5-7—12) in 15 career games played against the Kraken, carrying a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has collected nine points (7-2—9) in 11 career games played against Seattle, while upholding a plus-minus rating of +4.

- **Jason Robertson** has 13 points (5-8—13) in 14 career games against the Kraken. He has put up five multi-point outings vs. Seattle and holds a plus-minus rating of +8.
- **Esa Lindell** scored a goal in his last meeting against the Kraken on Nov. 26, 2025 and now has three points (1-2—3) in his last three games played against them, dating back to March 31, 2025. In all, **Lindell** has notched six points (1-5—6) in 13 career games played vs. Seattle with a plus-minus rating of +5 and averaging 22:19 of time on ice per game.
- **Jake Oettinger** has a 7-1-1 career record against the Kraken, posting a 2.11 goals-against average, .924 save percentage and one shutout in that span.
 - **Oettinger's** seven wins against Seattle are tied for the second-most by any NHL netminder, trailing only Pittsburgh's Stuart Skinner (10).
- **Casey DeSmith** has a 5-1-0 career record vs. Seattle, posting a 1.17 goals-against average, .961 save percentage and one shutout in those games.
 - His .961 save percentage against the Kraken is tied for the fourth highest mark among all NHL goaltenders who have played Seattle at least three times in their career.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in three straight games against the Blues to win in regulation. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2, **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win and **Jamie Benn** scored with 22 second remaining in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 to beat the Blues 5-4.
- At the time, **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- **Benn's** goal on Feb. 4 was his second career go-ahead goal in the final minute of regulation, which tied Brian Lawton for the second-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats. Only Dino Ciccarelli (3) has more.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last six games he has played dating back to Jan. 20, taking down the Bruins, Blues (3x), Golen Knights and Jets. It marks the second six-game win streak this season, after also winning six straight games from Nov. 20 to Dec. 7.
 - His six-game win streak was the third-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- If **Oettinger** were to win the next game he plays, it would make him the eighth goaltender this season to win at least seven consecutive games.
- **Oettinger's** six-game win streak is tied for the seventh-longest in franchise history and the fifth-longest in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). **Oettinger** currently holds the Stars team record, winning eight straight games from March 20 to April 9, 2024.
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 23 games this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.

BIKER GANG

- **Thoams Harley** has totaled 23 points (5-18—23) in 45 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 23 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 46 points (7-39—46).
- **Harley** enters tonight's contest having recorded seven points (3-4—7) in his last eight games played.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Harley** points in four consecutive games, matching his career high that he has reached on three other occasions, most recently from Oct. 9 to 16, 2025.
- **Harley** has scored 37 goals in his career and enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying Richard Matvichuk (38) for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman.
- **Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - **Harley** also scored the series-clinching overtime goal against Winnipeg in Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Harley's** six overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the ninth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Three of **Harley's** five goals this season have stood as game winners, which is tied for the most in his career in a single season. He also scored three game-winning goals in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- **Harley's** three game-winning goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Tuesday.

HEATING UP

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game riding a six-game point streak, totaling nine points (6-3—9) during that span. His six-game point streak was tied for the 13th-longest active streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in seven consecutive games for the first time since March 27 to April 8, 2025.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has tallied at least a point in each of the last five games that he has played dating back to Jan. 27, totaling six points (1-5—6) during that span.

- He enters tonight's game looking to extend his assist streak to second games for the second time this season after previously doing so from Dec. 15 to 27.
 - **Rantanen's** five-game assist streak was the fifth-longest active such streak entering play Tuesday.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in the Stars last four games, including a three-point showing (2-1—3) in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis. If he were to have an assist tonight, it would extend his assist streak to five games for the first time since Feb. 2 to 22, 2025.
- A point of any kind would give **Benn** points in five straight games for the first time this season.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded 10 assists in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 20. If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in at least four consecutive games for the third time this season.
- **Roope Hintz** has eight points (1-7—8) in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins.
- **Jason Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in four of the last eight games that he has played, totaling 10 points in all (5-5—10) during that span.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 50-for-167 on the power play this season for a 29.9 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The Oilers and the Stars were the only teams to score 50 power-play goals this season entering play Tuesday.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them power-play goals in four consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in eight straight games earlier this season from Nov. 1 to 15.
- Dallas' 50 power-play goals are just five shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
 - The Stars have scored two power-play goals in four of the last six games that they have played.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 50 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (18), **Jason Robertson** (11), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 11 power-play goals are just two shy of matching his career high that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Rantanen** (5-25—30) ranked fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Tuesday, followed by **Johnston** (18-11—29), who was tied for fifth, and **Robertson** (11-16—27) who ranked seventh.
 - **Johnston's** 29 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 27 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Tuesday and were four more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 18 power-play goals are already a career high and are tied with Mike Modano in 1993-94 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals are four shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 18 points (1-17—18) on the power-play this season, which was the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 18th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 31 against Utah, matching the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano set during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- His 18 power-play goals are already tied for the eighth-most in a single season in franchise history and are four shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 26 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 29 power-play goals, which was tied with Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.

THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 206:30 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-7, have a 67.7 expected goals for percentage, a 59.3 shots for percentage and a 60.0 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 67.2 expected goals for percentage, which was the best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together entering play Tuesday.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- In the Stars' game on Jan. 29 against Vegas, the team had a 79.9 expected goals for percentage and a 59.1 Corsi rating when the trio was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- On Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, the line had a 74.8 percent on-ice expected goals for percentage and a 68.8 Corsi rating.
- **Hintz** and **Robertson** both assisted on **Bourque's** goal on Feb. 4 against the St. Louis Blues. It marked the 200th time the two have factored in on the same goal according to NHL Stats, which is the third-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). They trail only **Jamie Benn** and **Tyler Seguin** (272) and Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen (242).
- Despite playing in only 57 games this season, **Bourque** (11-11—22) is three assists and three points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 16 goals, 16 assists and 32 points.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Mikko Rantanen** scored in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 to become fifth Finnish player in NHL history to record nine-plus 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats. He joined Teemu Selanne (17x), Jari Kurri (13x), Aleksander Barkov (10x) and Sebastian Aho (9x).
- **Rantanen** is currently pacing to finish the year with a career-high 74 assists and 104 points, which would be one point shy of matching his career high. If he were to maintain that pace, **Rantanen** would become the third Finnish skater in NHL history to record three 100-point seasons after also doing so in 2022-23 (55-50—105) and 2023-24 (42-62—104). He would join Jari Kurri (6x) and Teemu Selanne (4x).
 - 104 points would tie for the 10th-most in a single season by a Finnish player in NHL history.
- If **Rantanen** were to finish the year with 104 points, it would make his 2025-26 campaign the fifth-highest scoring season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Seventy-four assists would be the second-most in a single season in franchise history and the most-ever by a Finnish skater in NHL history.
- **Rantanen** enters tonight's game one point shy of making the 2025-26 campaign the seventh season – and sixth consecutive – in his career in which he has totaled at least 70 points.
- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 43 goals, 44 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs. Forty-three goals would tie for the eighth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game one goal shy of making the 2025-26 campaign his third consecutive 30-goal season. His is also one point away from recording his third straight 60-point season.
 - He is also just four goals shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 26 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (47) and **Johnston** (43) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
 - Forty-seven goals would be a career high for **Robertson** and would also tie for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 22 points (5-17—22) in 57 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 27 assists and 34 points, both of which would be career highs.
 - His 17 assists this season are only four shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 21 assists and 31 points, both of which would be career highs.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

- **Jason Robertson** and **Mikko Rantanen** both scored in the shootout and **Jake Oettinger** stopped each of the two shots he faced to help the Stars defeat the Golden Knights 5-4 in their game on Jan. 29.
- **Robertson's** goal – which stood as the game decider – was the 21st of his career, which passed Mike Ribeiro (20) for the most in franchise history.
 - The goal was also the sixth game-decider in his career, which is just one shy of the most in franchise history.
- His goal against the Golden Knights was also his fourth shootout goal of the season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Robertson** has gone 21-for-37 in his career in the shootout for a 56.8 percent success rate, which is the third-best mark in the NHL among active skaters to have at least 20 shootout attempts in their career.
- **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals since the start of the 2020-21 season are the most in the NHL during that span and are four more than the second-ranked skaters (Adrian Kempe and Trevor Zegras with 17 each).
 - Despite not taking a shootout attempt until the 2020-21 season, **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals are the most in the League since the start of the 2018-19 season.
- **Rantanen's** goal was the third shootout goal as a member of the Stars. Two of his three shootout goals with Dallas have been game deciders.
- **Rantanen** has scored 11 shootout goals in his career, which is tied for eighth in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- With the win, **Oettinger** improved to 3-1 in shootouts this season and has .750 save percentage against shootout attempts this year.
- His performance against the Golden Knights was the ninth time in his career that he has not allowed a goal against in the shootout.
- In all in his career, **Oettinger** has a 0.739 save percentage in the shootout, which is the seventh-best mark in the NHL among active goaltenders to play in at least 20 shootout games.

MR. 300

- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** played in his 300th NHL regular-season NHL game on Jan. 29 against the Golden Knights. He became the fourth player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the 300-game milestone and the 82nd player in franchise history to play in 300 regular-season games with the team.
- **Johnston** has not missed a Stars game (regular season or playoffs) since making his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He became the 17th skater in NHL history – and first since Nick Suzuki – to begin his NHL career by playing in at least 300 consecutive regular-season games according to NHL Stats.
 - Suzuki played in 410 consecutive regular-season games from Oct. 3, 2019 to Dec. 31, 2024 to begin his NHL career.
- **Johnston** has totaled 235 points (117-118—235) in his career, which is tied for the 19th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the team according to NHL Stats.
 - **Johnston's** goal against Vegas tied Dennis Maruk for 19th. Maruk had 235 points (80-155—235) in his first 300 games with the Minnesota North Stars from 1978-79 to 1987-88.
- His 235 points are also the 10th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the Stars from the start of his career according to NHL Stats.
 - **Jason Robertson** (137-183—320) is the only Stars skater who began his career with the team since the franchise relocated to Dallas to have more points than **Johnston** through his first 300 games played.
- **Johnston**, selected with the 23rd-overall pick in 2021, leads all 2021 draftees in career goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (77), even-strength points (158), power-play goals (34), power-play points (70) and shorthanded goals (6).

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.

- He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
- He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4-9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (349) and **Wyatt Johnston** (303).
- **Robertson's** 349-game Iron Man streak was tied the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 303 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Tuesday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Nathan Bastian** both skated for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Kraken defenseman Jamie Oleksiak was drafted by the Stars with the 14th overall pick in the 2011 NHL draft and played 286 games for Dallas from 2012-13 to 2017-18 and 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Jamie Benn** and Kraken forward Jordan Eberle won a gold medal together while playing for Team Canada at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship. The two would later reunite on Canada's roster at the 2012 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Jason Robertson** and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** all won a bronze medal with Kraken forward Matty Beniers while playing for Team USA at the 2021 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played in Ottawa with Kraken goaltender Joey Daccord for part of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Kraken forward Jordan Eberle have played for Team Canada together at the IIHF World Championships four times: in 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2015. Stars forward **Tyler Seguin** was also on the 2015 squad, where the trio took home a gold medal.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Kraken forward Eeli Tolvanen played in Nashville together for three seasons (2020-21 to 2022-23). Tolvanen and Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** also played for the Predators together for part of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** played for Team Finland with Kraken forward Eeli Tolvanen on four occasions: at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, the 2018 IIHF World Championship and the 2018 Winter Olympics.
 - Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** also skated with the two on Team Finland during the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Kraken goaltender Philipp Grubauer were teammates in Colorado from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forwards **Roope Hintz** and **Mikko Rantanen** and defenseman **Esa Lindell** all played with Kraken forward Kaapo Kakko for Team Finland in the 2025 Four Nations Faceoff tournament.

- Stars forwards **Mikko Rantanen** and **Roope Hintz** and defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** and **Esa Lindell** and Kraken forward Eeli Tolvanen and Kakko Kappo all won the bronze medal with Team Finland during the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** all played with Kraken forward Kaapo Kakko with the New York Rangers. Blackwell played with Kakko in the 2020-21 season and Lundkvist and Kakko were teammates in 2021-22.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** played in Pittsburgh with Kraken forwards Jared McCann and Frederick Gaudreau and defenseman Jamie Oleksiak. DeSmith played with McCann from 2018-19 to 2020-21, including 19 games in 2020-21 with Gaudreau. DeSmith and Oleksiak were teammates in Pittsburgh in 2017-18 and 2018-19.
- Stars defenseman **Alexander Petrovic** and Kraken forward Jared McCann played together in Florida from 2016-17 to 2018-19.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** skated with Kraken forward Ben Meyers in Colorado from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Kraken forward Jaden Schwartz both represented Team Canada during the 2013 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Matt Duchene** both skated with Kraken forward Eeli Tolvanen in Nashville. Blackwell was teammates with Tolvanen from 2018-19 to 2019-20, while Duchene shared the ice with Tolvanen from 2020-21 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Wyatt Johnston** and Kraken forwards Ryan Winterton and Shane Wright all skated for Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** both shared the ice with Kraken defenseman Ryan Lindgren while playing in New York (Rangers). Blackwell and Lindgren were teammates during the 2020-21 season, while Lindgren skated with Lundkvist the following year in 2021-22.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** represented Team USA with Kraken defenseman Ryan Lindgren during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship, 2016 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and 2015 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Kraken defensemen Brandon Montour and Joshua Mahura were teammates in Anaheim. Steel skated with Montour during the 2018-19 season and Mahura from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** shared the ice with Kraken goaltender Matt Murray in Pittsburgh from 2017-18 to 2019-2020.
- Stars Head Coach **Glen Gulutzan** coached Kraken defenseman Adam Larsson as an assistant coach in Edmonton from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** skated under Kraken assistant coach Chris Taylor in New Jersey in 2020-21 and from 2021-22 to 2024-25.
- Stars Vice President of Cultural Growth and Strategy **Al Montoya** played with Kraken defenseman Adam Larsson for the Edmonton Oilers in 2017-18.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Blues forwards Oskar Sundqvist and Pius Suter all skated together in Detroit from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
