

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 1, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. NEW JERSEY DEVILS [0]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the New Jersey Devils to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Friday night. Both netminders stood tall through the first 20 and despite a 12-5 edge in shots for the Flames the score remained deadlocked at zero's heading into the second. In the middle stanza, the goalies continued to shine including a pair of Dan Vladar saves on New Jersey breakaways to keep the game scoreless through 40. In the final frame, Blake Coleman redirected a Kevin Bahl shot home to give the Flames the lead with just over five minutes remaining in regulation. 28 seconds later, Anthony Mantha fed Jonathan Huberdeau who deposited his fifth of the campaign into the gaping cage to double the home side's advantage. Blake Coleman added an empty netter to help the Flames knock off the Devils 3-0.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and the Oilers. Calgary knocked off Edmonton 4-1 in round one of the Battle of Alberta at Rogers Place back on October 13<sup>th</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-1-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 3-3-1 against Western Conference opponents.

# BACKS

On Wednesday night, Mikael Backlund became the fourth-active Swedish-born skater in the NHL to reach 1,000 NHL games, joining Nicklas Backstrom (WSH), Victor Hedman (TBL), and Erik Karlsson (PIT). He became the 19th player of Swedish descent in NHL history to reach 1,000 NHL games, the second skater in Flames franchise history to skate in 1,000 games for the club (Jarome Iginla – 1,219), and the 397<sup>th</sup> player in NHL history to skate in their 1,000<sup>th</sup> game.

Backlund also marked the 73<sup>rd</sup> player in NHL history (72 skaters & 1 goaltender) to play each of their first 1,000 career regular-season games with one franchise.

**LAST MEETING:**

The Calgary Flames headed north to Edmonton on October 13<sup>th</sup> for round one of the Battle of Alberta. Edmonton would score the only goal of the first with Jeff Skinner giving the Oilers a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, Rasmus Andersson would draw the Flames level with a slick individual effort and nothing could separate these clubs through 40 minutes of play. In the third, Anthony Mantha would elevate a backhander over the shoulder of Stuart Skinner and in to give the Flames their first lead of the night, before Justin Kirkland doubled the Flames advantage with his first NHL goal. Calgary would shut the door from there, Connor Zary added an empty netter, and the Flames left Edmonton with a 4-1 win.

**DARTH VLADAR:**

Dan Vladar turned aside all 22 shots he faced on Friday night against New Jersey to record his first shutout of the season, and first since November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 in Boston. Vladar also recorded an assist on the night to become just the fourth goalie in Calgary Flames history to post a shutout and an assist in the same game, joining: Pat Riggin (Apr. 1, 1982), Rick Tabaracci (Apr. 12, 1996), and Miikka Kiprusoff (Dec. 17, 2005)

**SAVE THE BEST FOR LAST:**

In the final frame of Friday night's matchup against the Devils, Blake Coleman scored twice along with Jonathan Huberdeau to help lift Calgary over New Jersey. The Flames have now scored 17 goals in the third period at this time last season, the Flames had recorded seven markers in the third period of a game.

**QUICK STRIKES:**

Blake Coleman and Jonathan Huberdeau scored 28 seconds apart to put the Flames up 2-0 on Friday night against New Jersey. This marked the fastest two goals for the Flames this season, and the fastest two goals since Jan. 4, 2024 in Nashville when Connor Zary and Blake Coleman scored 27 seconds apart in a 6-3 Flames win.

**KIRKLAND SIGNATURE:**

With his helper on Wednesday in Utah, Justin Kirkland bumped his season totals up to one goal and four assists for five points in nine games. The 28-year-old has also posted a +4 rating which is tied with Rasmus Andersson for the fourth best on the Flames. All four of Kirkland's assists have been primary assists which is tied for the team lead with Martin Pospisil and Andrei Kuzmenko.

**MATTY'S BACK:**

On Thursday afternoon, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of forward Matt Coronato from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Coronato only played in two games during his brief AHL stint, scoring two goals helping the Wranglers win both contests. Coronato skated in a season-high 16:06 of ice-time with three shots. The last time Coronato spent more time on the ice was against Edmonton on October 29<sup>th</sup> when he logged 17:22 of ice-time



**HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

This will be the 265th installment of the Battle of Alberta, with the Flames holding a 133-110-25 record over their provincial rival. 100 of those games have been one-goal games or ties (82 wins, 18 ties) with Calgary owning 45 of the 82 wins. Jarome Iginla is the Flames all-time goals leader against the Oilers with 34 tallies, while Al MacInnis sets the mark for points with 89 in 75 games against Edmonton during his time in Calgary.

Mikael Backlund needs two assists to tie Guy Chouinard and Paul Reinhart (both w/ 336) for the seventh most in franchise history.

In Calgary and Edmonton's first matchup, Justin Kirkland scored his first NHL goal.
