GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Maple Leafs this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Toronto this year.
- Tonight is also the fifth game of a five-game road trip that will see the Stars play the Ranges, Flyers, Canadiens, Senators and Maple Leafs. It is the team's longest road trip of the season.
- Thomas Harley enters tonight's matchup against the Senators with a plus-25 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the third-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday. Only Leon Draisaitl (27), and Kirill Marchenko (26) ranked higher.
 - o In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-22 plus/minus rating, which was tied for the sixth-best mark among all NHL skaters and tied for second among defensemen entering play Monday.
- Miro Heiskanen is averaging 25:21 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.48 goals against per game this season, which was the third best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 24 of the 42 games that they have played this year.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 8-1-1 record for 17 points and a .850 points percentage. Their win total, point total and points percentage all topped the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 33-21. Their plus-12 goal differential was tied with St. Louis for the best mark in the NHL entering play Monday, and their 33 goals for were tied for fourth.

- Twenty-five of the Dallas' 33 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which ranked second in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only St. Louis (28).
- The team's 21 goals against were also tied for the fifth-fewest allowed since Dec. 23 entering play Monday.
- The Stars have gone 309-for-581 at the faceoff dot during that span for a 53.2 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Monday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 13 points (4-9—13) in 10 games played. His 13 points were tied for the third-most in the NHL since Dec. 23 entering play Monday.
- Twelve different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 13: Jamie Benn (6), Roope Hints (5), Evgenii Dadonov (4), Wyatt Johnston (4), Jason Robertson (4), Matt Duchene (3), Thomas Harley (2), Oskar Bäck (1), Colin Blackwell (1), Mavrik Bourque, Miro Heiskanen (1) and Esa Lindell (1).
 - o Benn's six goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the seventh-most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only team in the NHL to have five different skaters score at least four goals since Dec. 23.

RUNNIN' THROUGH THE 6

- Dallas is 93-99-33 all-time vs. Toronto, including a 39-55-20 mark on the road.
- Wyatt Johnston, a Toronto native, has three points (1-2—3) in five career games against the Maple Leafs.
- Jamie Benn has registered 15 points (7-9-16) in 24 games against the Maple Leafs, including two multi-point games, one being a four-point night (1-3-4) Jan. 23, 2014.
- Miro Heiskanen has two points (0-2—2) in his last two games played against Toronto. Heiskanen earned a 29:50 time on ice against the Maple Leafs on Dec. 18, which is his second-most time on ice in a single game this season (most: Jan. 7 at NYR, 30:43).
- Matt Duchene ranks second among active Stars in assists (11) and points (5-11—16) in 24 career games vs. the Maple Leafs.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 22 points (6-16—22) in his last 20 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 22 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
 - o Robertson also has nine points (3-6—9) in his last eight road games.
- Robertson scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montreal Canadiens.
 - o In his career, Robertson has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- Robertson has multi-point efforts in five of the last eight games that he has played.
- Robertson recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- Robertson tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. Robertson has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
 - He now sits seven points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- Robertson's second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise
 history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

DADDY ISSUES

- Evgenii Dadonov has 12 points (5-7—12) in his last 12 games played dating back to Dec. 18 against the Toronto Maple Leafs, which includes tallying two points (1-1—2) in Dallas' last game on Jan. 12 against the Senators.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-4 when Dadonov has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His plus-8 on-ice goal differential at 5-on-5 since Dec. 13 ranks second to only Jamie Benn (puls-9) on the Stars roster.
 - Only Benn (14), Esa Lindell (14) and Wyatt Johnston (13) have been on the ice for more 5-on-5 goals since
 Dec. 13 than Dadonov according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Dadonov's goal against the Senators was his 12th of the season, matching his total that he reached in 51 games last season. He is now pacing to finish the year with 23 goals, which would be his highest total since he scored 25 for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- Dadonov's goal was also his fourth power-play goal of the year, which tied Roope Hintz for the team lead.

HEATING UP

• Wyatt Jonston has 13 points (4-9—13) in his last 13 games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals. He is now pacing to finish the year with 42 assists, which would be a career high for the forward.

- Jamie Benn has totaled 10 points (6-4-10) in his last 10 games played dating back to Dec. 23 against the Utah Hockey Club. He has recorded at least a point in eight of those 10 games.
- Roope Hintz has six points (4-2-6) in his last seven games played. After scoring in Dallas' Jan. 9 game against the Flyers, Hintz is now pacing to finish the 2024-25 season with a career-high 38 goals.
 - Hintz's next goal will be his 20th of the year, marking his fourth consecutive 20-goal season.
- Colin Blackwell tallied his fifth assists of the season in Dallas' last game on Jan. 12 against the Senators. He is now pacing to finish the year with 10 assists, which would match his career high that he set in 2020-21 and matched in 2021-

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.0 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was tied with the Carolina Hurricanes for the best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Dallas has allowed only 17 power-play goals against and .40 power-play goals against per game played this year, which were both the top marks in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 33-for-36 on the penalty kill for a 91.7 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
 - This stretch includes an eight-game streak (from Dec. 8 to 27) in which the Stars did not surrender a powerplay goal.
- Thomas Harley has allowed 2.62 power-play goals against per 60, which was the sixth-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday among NHL skaters that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell has skated 145:31 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was the most of any NHL skater this season entering play Monday.
 - Since 2016-17 his first full NHL season no skater has spent more time on the penalty kill than Lindell, who has totaled 1926:16 of shorthanded ice time during that span.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (339), Jason Robertson (252), Esa Lindell (212) and Wyatt Johnston (206). Entering play Moday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 12 against the Senators was the 339th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- Robertson's 252-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Sunday.
- Lindell's 212-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR

- Dallas finished 2024 with a 52-25-6 record for 110 points and a .663 points percentage. Their 52 wins tied for the thirdmost in franchise history in one calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - o The Stars ranked fifth in the NHL in points, points percentage and wins (tied) in 2024.
- 2024 marked the third consecutive calendar year in which the Stars finished with at least 100 points and a points percentage above .600.
 - In 2023 they had 104 points and a .658 points percentage, and 118 points and a .648 points percentage in
- Jason Robertson was Dallas' leading scorer in 2024 with 72 points (27-45-72) in 83 regular-season games. He was followed closely by Wyatt Johnston (32-37-69) and Matt Duchene (28-39-67).
- Johnston's 32 goals topped all Stars skaters in 2024, with Roope Hintz (31) and Duchene (28) ranking second and third, respectively.
- Thomas Harley posted a plus-38 plus/minus rating in 2024, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL. Harley (10-37-47) was the Stars' highest scoring defenseman in 2024.
- Jake Oettinger posted a 41-16-3 record in 2024. His 41 wins ranked second to only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (44).
- Oettinger's 41 wins were the second-most by a Stars goaltender in a calendar year in franchise history, trailing only Marty Turco who had 42 in 2006.

WHAT IN THE WORLD

- Stars prospects Emil Hemming (Finland) and Aram Minnetian (United States) both represented their home countries at the 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship, which was held in Ottawa from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5.
- Hemming, who was selected by Dallas Hemming with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.

- The tournament marks Minnetian's first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
 - Minnetian was originally selected by the Stars is the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Hemming and Minnetian faced off in the tournament championship, with Minnetian and the Americans taking home the gold and and the Fins earning silver.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Lian Bichsel, Evgenii Dadonov, Matt Dumba, Thomas Harley, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell, Nils Lundkvist, Ilya Lyubushkin, Jake Oettinger, Jason Robertson, Logan Stankoven and Sam Steel.

- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is two assists shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 25th on the franchise's all-time assists list. He is also six goals shy of becoming the 19th player in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.

 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.

- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship. 0
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.
