- The Stars extended their point to 14 games (13-0-1), which is their second-longest point streak in franchise history.
- Thursday's victory extended Dallas' win streak against Edmonton to four games. The Stars have outscored the Oilers 22-11 during that span.
- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 22nd power-play goal of the season, which tied Dino Ciccarelli in 1986-87 for the most in a single season in franchise history.
- With **Johnston's** goal, the Stars extended their power-play scoring streak to 11 games, which sets the record for the longest stretch in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). The team last accomplished this feat from Oct. 11 to Nov. 18, 1986, when the team was located in Minnesota.
 - **Johnston** also extended his point streak against the Oilers to five games, earning 12 points (4-8—12) during that span. His last three games played against them have been multi-point outings.
- **Jason Robertson** finished the game with four points (2-2—4), matching his single-game career high that he has reached on two other occasions, most recently on April 3, 2023 against the Nashville Predators.
 - **Robertson** also extended his point streak against Edmonton to seven games, collecting 15 points (7-8—15) during that span. He's recorded points in 13 of his 15 career games played against them.
- **Jamie Benn** recorded his second multi-goal game of the season and 48th of his career, which gives him sole possession of fifth on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
 - **Benn** has tallied 15 points (7-8—15) in his last 12 games played dating back to Jan. 29 at Vegas, which includes scoring five goals in his last five games.
 - He also extended his point streak against the Oilers to four games, tallying five points (3-2—5) during that span.
- **Sam Steel** scored his 11th goal and recorded his 20th assist of the season, both of which set new single-season career highs for the forward. **Steel** now has eight points (4-4—8) in his last eight games dating back to March 2 at Vancouver.
- **Miro Heiskanen** recorded three assists, making Thursday's contest the third time this season he has had at least three assists in a game.
 - He passed Jere Lehinen (271) for the 15th-most assists in franchise history.
 - He also now has five points (1-4—5) in his last three games played vs. Edmonton.
- **Esa Lindell** tied his single-season career high with his 21st assist of the season.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second and final game that the Stars will play against the Red Wings this season. Dallas earned a point in their last game against Detroit earlier this season on Dec. 23 (4-3 OTL).
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (41, tied second), points (92, second) and points percentage (.708, second) this year entering play Friday. The team's success this season comes despite having 225 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Radek Faksa**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Mikko Rantanen** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Dallas has only allowed 44 goals against in the first period this season, which was the fewest in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Casey DeSmith** was tied for 10th in goals saved above expected (13.2) and ranked eighth in goals saved above expected per 60 (0.558) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Friday.
- **Arttu Hyry** led the NHL in faceoff win percentage (62.7 percent) entering play Friday among players to take at least 50 draws this season. In six games played, he has gone 25-for-42 at the faceoff dot.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 14 games that they have played, posting a 13-0-1 record during that span. It is the team's second-longest point streak in franchise history.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give them points in 15 consecutive games for the first time since the team had a franchise-long, 15-game point streak from Dec. 6, 1998 to Jan. 6, 1999, posting a 12-0-3-0 record during that span.
- Since Jan. 23, Dallas head led the League in wins (13), points (27) and points percentage (.964).
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 59-33 over the course of the streak, and their plus-26 goal differential topped the League during that span entering play Friday.
- Dallas ranked second in the NHL in both goals per game (4.21) and goals against per game (2.36) since Jan. 23 entering play Friday.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, at 5-on-5 play during the team's current point streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 37-22 and own a 62.3 expected goals for percentage, a 65.2 high danger chances for percentage and a 55.7 shots for percentage.
 - No team has a better expected goals for percentage during that span. The Ottawa Senators ranked second entering play Friday with 57.4 percent.
- The team has gone 17-for-50 on the power play over the course of this point streak for a 34.0 percent success rate. Their 34.0 percent conversion rate and 17 power-play goals scored ranked third and first, respectively, in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Friday.
 - The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in 13 of the 14 games that they have played during the team's current point streak.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling 21 points (9-12—21) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, six Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.50), **Jason Robertson** (1.43), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.21), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.21), **Jamie Benn** (1.07) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
 - **Duchene's** 21 points during that span were tied for the eighth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Seventeen different skaters have scored at least one goal for the Stars during the team's current 14-game point streak: **Duchene** (9), **Johnston** (9), **Benn** (7), **Robertson** (7), **Mavrik Bourque** (5), **Sam Steel** (4), **Nathan Bastian** (3), **Thomas Harley** (3), **Lian Bichsel** (2), **Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Adam Erne** (1), **Roope Hintz** (1), **Nils Lundkvist** (1) and **Rantanen** (1).
- Defensive pairs **Esa Lindell** and **Miro Heiskanen** (62.7) and **Thomas Harley** and **Nils Lundkvist** (68.5) both have an expected goals for percentage above 60 percent over the course of the streak.

CLIPPING THE WINGS

- Dallas is 122-113-39 all-time vs. Detroit, including a 70-44-22 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned points in nine of their last 10 games played against the Red Wings, dating back to April 24, 2021 (8-1-1), outscoring them 43-28 during that span. Dallas has also won their last 12 consecutive games played vs. Detroit at American Airlines Center, dating back to Jan. 12, 2017.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's contest riding a seven-game point streak against the Red Wings, earning 11 points (2-9—11) during that span. In 18 career games played vs. Detroit, **Heiskanen** has totaled 17 points (2-15—17), carrying a plus-minus rating of +4 and averaging 24:36 of time on ice per game.
 - His 24:36 of time on ice per game against them ranks fifth in the League among active skaters who have played Detroit at least 10 times in their careers.

- **Matt Duchene** has registered five points (1-4—5) in his last five games played against the Red Wings, dating back to Dec. 11, 2023. In all, **Duchene** has totaled 36 points (16-20—36) in 43 career games played vs. Detroit.
 - His 36 career points against them leads active Stars.
 - **Duchene** has put up 20 points (9-11—20) in 20 career home games played against them.
- **Jason Robertson** has totaled 21 points (9-12—21) in 15 career games played against the Red Wings, carrying a plus-minus rating of +4 and averaging 1.40 points per game.
 - His 1.40 points per game against them is tied for ninth in the League among active skaters who have played Detroit at least five times in their career.
 - **Robertson** has recorded points in 13 of his 15 career games against them, including six multi-point outings.
- **Esa Lindell** has recorded 17 points (5-12—17) in 24 career games against the Red Wings, upholding a plus-minus rating of +8.
 - His 17 career points against Detroit is his highest point total scored against a single opponent during his career.
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak against the Red Wings, earning six points (3-3—6) during that span. In all, **Johnston** has collected seven points (3-4—7) in seven career games vs. Detroit, carrying a plus-minus rating of +4.
 - He has tallied points in all but two games played against them.
- **Colin Blackwell** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Red Wings, collecting two points (1-1—2) during that span. In seven career games played vs. Detroit, **Blackwell** has notched four points (1-3—4), upholding a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Michael Bunting** has collected seven points (2-5—7) in his last eight games played against the Red Wings, dating back to Jan. 19, 2024. In all, **Bunting** has totaled 17 points (7-10—17) in 16 games played vs. Detroit, averaging 1.06 points per game.
- **Justin Hryckowian** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Red Wings, in his two career games played, earning two assists during that span. He is also carrying a plus-minus rating of +2.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak vs. Detroit, collecting three points (1-2—3) during that span. In 41 career games played against the Red Wings, **Benn** has notched 25 points (9-16—25), averaging 17:43 of time on ice per game.
- **Jake Oettinger** is 8-3-0 with a 2.81 goals-against average and .899 save percentage in 11 career appearances against the Red Wings.

POWER TRIP

- The Stars have gone 59-for-196 on the power play this season for a 30.1 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Oilers (59), Stars (59) and Wild (55) were the only teams to score at least 50 power-play goals this season entering play Friday.
- The Stars have scored at least one goal on the power play in each of the last 11 games they have played, which sets the record for the longest stretch in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). The team last accomplished this feat from Oct. 11 to Nov. 18, 1986, when the team was located in Minnesota.
 - Dallas is the first team in the NHL to score a power-play goal in 11 consecutive games since the Colorado Avalanche scored on the man advantage in 12 straight from March 7 to 27, 2023 according to NHL Stats.
- If they were to do so again tonight, it would give them power-play goals in 12 consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 1 to 29, 1982 when the team was located in Minnesota according to NHL Stats.
- Dallas' 59 power-play goals have already surpassed the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 74 power-play goals, which would tie for the fifth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
 - The Stars' 59 power play goals are their most in a single season since they scored 64 times on the man advantage in 82 regular-season games in 2022-23.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 different times this season, most recently on March 12 against the Edmonton Oilers, a 7-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 17 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they also scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 59 power-play goals have been scored by 12 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (22), **Jason Robertson** (12), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Miro Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Jamie Benn** (2), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 12 power-play goals are just one shy of matching his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Johnston** (22-14—36) ranked third in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Friday, followed by **Robertson** (12-21—33), who ranked fifth, and **Rantanen** (5-25—30), who was tied for seventh.
 - **Johnston's** 36 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 33 power-play points are the second-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 22 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Friday and were six more than the second-ranked skaters (two tied with 16). They are already tied for the 14th-most in a single season by any NHL skater in the post-lockout era (since 2005-06).
- His 22 power-play goals are a career high, the most in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and tied with Dino Ciccarelli (in 1986-87) for the most in a single season in franchise history.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 28 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl scored 32 power-play goals in 2022-23.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 33 power-play goals, which was the most in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.

- **Heiskanen** has totaled 22 points (2-20—22) on the power-play this season, which was the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** has scored 35 goals this year, which is already a single-season career high for the forward. In all, he has totaled 71 points (35-36—71) this year, which is tied for his most in a single-season, matching the 71 he had in 2024-25.
 - His 36 assists this season are five shy of matching his career high.
- **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 44 goals, 45 assists and 89 points.
- **Jason Robertson** (45) and **Johnston** (44) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- With 17 games remaining in the regular season, **Mavrik Bourque** (13-17—30) and **Sam Steel** (11-20—31) have both already set career highs in goals, assists and points this year.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 26 points (5-21—26) in 65 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. His 21 assists this season are tied for his most in a single season in his career, which he has reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
 - **Lindell's** 26 points are six shy of matching his single-season career high of 32.
- **Oskar Bäck** scored his fifth goal of the season – setting a new career high – in Dallas' 2-1 win over Vegas on March 10th.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has totaled 56 points (9-47—56) in 63 games played this season, the second-highest total in a single season in his career. His 56 points are already the sixth-most by a defenseman in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and the 12th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
 - **Heiskanen** has scored two goals on the power-play this year, which is one shy of matching his career high of three that he reached in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.
- **Colin Blackwell's** eight assists are three shy of matching his career high of 11 that he had last season.
- **Casey DeSmith's** 14 wins are just one shy of matching his career high of 15 that he reached in both 2018-19 and 2022-23 while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
 - **DeSmith** is also two wins away from recording the 100th win of his NHL career.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- **Jamie Benn** scored two goals in Dallas last game – a 7-2 win over the Edmonton Oilers on March 12. His first goal of the game came just 1:23 into the first period, and his second came on the power play in the third period.
- **Benn's** performance against the Oilers was the 48th multi-goal game of his career, which gave him sole possession of fifth on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Benn** has tallied 15 points (7-8—15) in his last 12 games played dating back to Jan. 29 at Vegas, which includes scoring five goals in his last five games.
- **Benn** had totaled 29 points (14-25—29) in 43 games in all this season. Despite missing 22 games with an injury, his 14 goals are just two shy of matching the 16 he scored in 80 games last year.

21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** had four points (2-2—4) on March 12 against the Edmonton Oilers, matching his single-game career high that he has reached on two other occasions, most recently on April 3, 2023 against the Nashville Predators.
- **Robertson** scored his 35th and 36th goals of the season against the Oilers, surpassing the 35 he scored in 82 games last year.
 - **Robertson's** 36 goals are his third-most in a single season in his career and were tied for fifth in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Robertson** is now the fourth player in franchise history with four career 35-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli (6), Brian Bellows (5) and Mike Modano (4).
- **Robertson's** performance against the Oilers was also the 34th multi-goal game of his career, which tied Neal Broten for eighth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson's** first goal against the Oilers stood as the game-winner. He now has seven game-winning goals this year, which was tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Friday and is also tied for the second-most in his career in a single season, trailing only the 11 he had in 2021-22.
- In all, **Robertson** has totaled 78 points (36-42—78) on the season, which was tied for the ninth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The 2025-26 season marks **Robertson's** fifth-straight 70-point season. The only other active U.S.-born player with as many consecutive campaigns is Patrick Kane (5 from 2015-16 to 2019-20) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** is one of nine players in franchise history to have at least five 70-point seasons for the team, joining Mike Modano (12x), Brian Bellows (6x), Dino Ciccarelli (6x), **Tyler Seguin** (6x), **Jamie Benn** (5x), Neal Broten (5x), Dave Gagner (5x) and Bobby Smith (5x).
- He enters tonight's game two points shy of reaching the 80-point milestone for the fourth time in his career
- **Robertson** has recorded four consecutive multi-point games from Feb. 28 to March 6, matching his career high that he set earlier this season from Nov. 11 to 18.
 - **Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in eight of the last 15 games that he has played, totaling 18 points in all (7-11—18) during that span.

- **Robertson** scored his 34th goal of the year in Dallas's game on March 2 against the Canucks, the team's 60th game of the season. His 34 goals were the third-most through the team's first 60 games of the season in Dallas Stars team history according to NHL Stats, trailing only his own 35 goals in 2022-23 and Mike Modano's 39 goals in 1993-94.
- **Robertson** has scored 12 goals on the power-play this year, which was tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Friday and was also just one shy of his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

PUTTING ON THE RITZ

- **Justin Hryckowian** has totaled 22 points (10-12—22) in 64 games this year, ranking second among undrafted rookies in scoring this season entering play Friday.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas in 6-0-4 in those contests.
- **Hryckowian** recorded the second multi-point game of his career with a goal and an assist in Dallas' game on March 6 against Colorado. He skated 20:22 in the game, setting a new single-game career high.
- He then scored the following game on March 8 against Chicago, giving him goals in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Hryckowian** drew four penalties in Dallas' March 12 game, a 7-2 win over the Oilers. His four penalties drawn were...
 - The most by a rookie in a single game this season entering play Friday.
 - Tied for the most by any skater in the NHL (rookie or veteran) in a single game this season entering play Friday.
 - The most in a single game by a Stars rookie in franchise history.
 - Tied for the third-most in a single game by any skater in franchise history (rookie or veteran).
- **Hryckowian** has drawn 17 penalties in all this season, which ranked sixth among all NHL rookies entering play Friday.
- **Hryckowian** has recorded 96 hits this year, which was tied for eighth among all NHL rookies entering play Friday.
- **Hryckowian** has also won 57.1 percent of the faceoffs he has taken this season (121-for-212), which ranked second among rookies to take at least 80 draws this season entering play Friday. His faceoff win percentage ranks second to only **Roope Hintz** (59.1 percent) for the best mark on the team among players to appear in at least seven games.

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** has totaled 56 points (9-47—56) this season. The 2025-26 campaign marks his third 50-point season, which makes him the third Finnish-born defenseman in NHL history, alongside Reijo Ruotsalainen (5x) and Risto Siltanen (3x), to have at least three 50-point campaigns according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** 56 points this season are already the second-most of his career, trailing only the 73 points (11-62—73) he had in 2022-23.
- **Heiskanen** joins Sergei Zubov (6x) and Craig Hartsburg (4x) as the only defensemen in franchise history to record at least three 50-point seasons.
- **Heiskanen's** 56 points ranked eighth among all defensemen in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 20 points (2-18—20) in his last 16 games played dating back to Jan. 20, 2026.
- With a goal and an assist on March 6 against Colorado, **Heiskanen** (78) passed Reijo Ruotsalainen (77) for the fifth-most multi-point games by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Kimmo Timonen (113), Teppo Numminen (97), Jyrki Lumme (85) and Risto Siltanen (84).
- **Heiskanen** scored the third overtime goal of his career – and first since March 11, 2023 – on March 8 against the Blackhawks to secure a 4-3 Stars win. His three overtime goals are tied for the third most by a defenseman in franchise history.

TEXAS TOUGH

- The Dallas Stars acquired defenseman **Tyler Myers** from the Vancouver Canucks for a 2027 second-round pick and a 2029 fourth-round pick on March 4.
- Born in Houston, **Myers** will become the first-ever Texas-born player to appear in a game for the Stars when he plays in his first game for the club.
- Although born in Houston, **Myers** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition. **Myers** won a gold medal while playing for Team Canada with new teammate **Jamie Benn** at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship. He would later play for Canada alongside **Matt Duchene** at the 2010 IIHF World Championship.
- **Myers** and **Benn** were teammates during the junior careers, both playing for the Kelowna Rockets of the Western Hockey League (WHL) during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. The two won the 2009 WHL Championship together, with **Myers** being named the playoff Most Valuable Player and **Benn** leading the WHL in postseason goals (13), assists (20) and points (33).
- **Myers** and **Duchene** were both nominated for the Calder Memorial Trophy as the League's top rookie in 2010, with **Myers** ultimately taking home the award.
- **Myers** and **Casey DeSmith** both played for the Vancouver Canucks during the 2024-25 season.

I WANNA BE LIKE MIKE

- The Dallas Stars acquired forward **Michael Bunting** from the Nashville Predators in exchange for Seattle's third-round pick in 2026 on March 5, 2026.
- **Bunting** had 31 points (13-18—31) in 61 games played with the Predators prior to the trade. He also previously played for Pittsburgh Penguins (2023-24 to 2024-25), Carolina Hurricanes (2023-24), Toronto Maple Leafs (2021-22 to 2022-23) and Arizona Coyotes (2018-19, 2020-21).
- **Bunting** previously played with Stars defensemen **Kyle Capobianco** and **Ilya Lyubushkin** while he was a part of the Coyotes organizations.
- He later played with **Lyubushkin** again and forward **Colin Blackwell** for the Toronto Maple Leafs.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (357) and **Wyatt Johnston** (311).
- **Robertson's** 357-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Friday.

- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 311 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Friday, it was the 10th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Red Wings forward Andrew Copp skated together while with the New York Rangers in 2021-22.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** played with Red Wings forward Patrick Kane in Chicago. Blackwell and Kane were teammates during the 2022-23 season, while Turco and Kane were members of the Blackhawks in 2010-11.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Red Wings forward Dylan Larkin were members of Team USA during the 2025 Four Nations Face-Off Tournament.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Nathan Bastian** and Red Wings forward Mason Appleton were teammates in Seattle during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Red Wings forward Andrew Copp skated together on Team USA during the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Red Wings defenseman Travis Hamonic both represented Team Canada during the 2008 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Oskar Bäck** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Red Wings forward Lucas Raymond were all teammates on Team Sweden during the 2020 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Red Wings goaltender John Gibson skated together in Anaheim from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Red Wings goaltender Cam Talbot were members of Team Canada during the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Jamie Benn** and defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Red Wings defenseman Travis Hamonic all represented Team Canada during the 2008 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Michael Bunting** and Red Wings defenseman Jacob Bernard-Docker shared the ice on Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Red Wings forward Andrew Copp and defenseman Ben Chiarot were all teammates in Winnipeg from 2014-15 to 2018-19.
 - Red Wings forward Mason Appleton also skated with the trio in Winnipeg during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** and Red Wings GM Steve Yzerman were teammates in Detroit from 1987-88 to 1989-90.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Red Wings forward Andrew Copp were teammates in Winnipeg during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** and Red Wings defenseman Ben Chiarot played one game together as members of the Winnipeg Jets during the 2012-13 season.

- Stars Head Coach **Glen Gulutzan** and Red Wings goaltender Cam Talbot crossed paths in Edmonton during the 2018-19 season while Gulutzan was an assistant coach.
- Stars Head Coach **Glen Gulutzan** and Red Wings Head Coach Todd McLellan coached together in Edmonton during the 2018-19 season when Gulutzan was an assistant coach and McLellan was head coach.
- Stars forwards **Tyler Seguin** and **Matt Duchene** played under Red Wings Head Coach Todd McLellan while he was head coach of Team Canada during the 2015 IIHF World Championship. Jim Nill was also General Manager of that team.
