FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP April 7, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [2]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames began a brief two-game California road trip in San Jose on Monday night. San Jose would record the only marker of the first with Will Smith giving the home side a 1-0 edge through 20. In the second, the Flames would outshoot the Sharks 11-8, but both goalies stood tall, and the scoreboard still read 1-0 San Jose through 40 minutes of play. 8:12 into the third, Nazem Kadri and Adam Klapka found themselves on a two-on-one, Kadri would see his shot stopped, but Klapka followed up and banged in his fourth of the season to draw the Flames level. Then on a Flames powerplay, a Morgan Frost shot would deflect off of Jonathan Huberdeau and in to give the visitors their first lead of the night. Shortly after, Matt Coronato would pounce on a Sharks turnover and made no mistake to extend the Flames advantage. San Jose would push late and draw within one, but Calgary held on and left San Jose with two points, beating the Sharks 3-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Ducks. Calgary has defeated Anaheim in all three of their prior matchups in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 13-4-5 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 22-16-7 against Western Conference opponents.

ABOUT A WEEK AGO:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Anaheim Ducks to the Scotiabank Saddledome six days ago for their third meeting of 2024-25. Just 16 seconds into this contest, Nazem Kadri found himself on a two-on-one, and he ripped home his team-leading 31st of the season to give the Flames an early 1-0 lead. The Ducks would respond later in the frame with Calgary native Olen Zellweger tapping in a backdoor pass to knot things at one, and that is where this game stood through 20 minutes of play. Midway through the second, Blake Coleman was sprung on a shorthanded breakaway and the Texas Tiger converted to reclaim the Flames lead. Less than five minutes later, Kevin Rooney would find a puck in the slot and made no mistake to extend Calgary's advantage, and the home side led 3-1 through 40. In the third, Blake Coleman netted his second of the night to help the Flames knock off the Ducks 4-1.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK:

On Tuesday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of defenceman Zayne Parekh from the OHL's Saginaw Spirit. Parekh, a native of Nobleton, ON skated in 61 games for the Saginaw Spirit in 2024-25, posting 107 points from 33 goals and 74 assists, finishing second on the team in scoring. Parekh's 107 points were the fifth-most in the OHL and he led not just all OHL defenceman, but all rearguards in the CHL as he became just the fifth blueliner in Canadian Hockey League history to reach the 100-point mark. He reached the 30-goal mark on March 2nd in North Bay and became just the second defenceman in OHL/OHA history to record 30 or more goals in back-to-back seasons along with Bobby Orr who did so in 1964-65 and 1965-66. The 19-year-old was also named to the CHL's Team of the Month in back-to-back months in January and February.

During his time in the OHL, Parekh was named the OHL's Defensive Rookie of the Year along with a nod to the OHL's All-Rookie Team in 2022-23. Last season, he again led the OHL in points among defencemen, was awarded the Max Kaminsky Trophy as the league's top blueliner as well as being named the CHL's top defenceman and would go on to help Saginaw capture the Memorial Cup.

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau enters tonight's contest with 28 goals and is two away from reaching the 30-goal plateau for the third time in his career: (30 in 2018-19, 30 in 2021-22). Six of Huberdeau's tallies have been game-winning goals which puts him one GWG away from matching his career-best of seven which he recorded during the 2021-22 campaign.

NAZ-HIM KADRI:

With his assist on Joel Hanley's goal on Saturday against Vegas, Nazem Kadri recorded his 400th NHL helper. Kadri has racked up several milestones over the past seven games; he scored his 300th NHL goal on March 25th with a two-goal effort against Seattle, he reached the 30-goal mark on March 27th with another multi-goal performance against Dallas and recorded his 700th NHL point with an assist in Edmonton on March 29th. Since March 1st, Kadri has racked-up a team-leading 18 points from 11 goals and seven helpers.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Entering play tonight, Mikael Backlund has 211 career goals, and with one more can tie Sean Monahan for the eighth most in Flames franchise history. Backlund is tied with a team-best +4 rating against Anaheim during their season-series in 2024-25.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and Anaheim's most recent meeting last week, Nazem Kadri became the 13th player in Flames franchise history to score within the opening 16 seconds of a game and first since Tyler Toffoli (0:15 on Dec. 20, 2022).

Calgary scored three times in the third period on Monday in San Jose to earn its ninth comeback victory in the final frame this season - the only team with as many is Montreal (10).
