- The Stars defeated the Bruins 5-2 in their only trip to Boston this season and their final road game before the team heads to Finland to play in the NHL Global Series.
- The win marked the 618th victory of Pete DeBoer's head coaching career, which gave him sole possession of 21st on the all-time coaching wins list.
- The Stars scored three power-play goals, all in the second period. It tied the team record for most power-play goals in a single period, a feat last accomplished on April 7, 2024 against the Colorado Avalanche.
- Matt Duchene (1-2-3) and Tyler Seguin (1-2-3) both recorded three points in the win.
- The matchup marked the 400th game of Roope Hintz's career and the 300th game of Jason Robertson's career.

## **GAME NOTES**

## THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- The Stars have gone 24-for-26 on the penalty kill this season for a 92.3 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the league entering play Friday and makes them the only team with a penalty kill rate above 90 percent.
- The Stars have allowed only 1.88 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, the top three teams in the NHL by both points and points percentage were from the Central Division the Winnipeg Jets ranked first with 14 points and a 1.00 points percentage, Minnesota second with 12 points and a .857 points percentage and Dallas third with 12 points and .750 points percentage.
- Dallas has had four different skaters score four goals this season: Matt Duchene, Roope Hintz, Jason Robertson and Tyler Seguin. Entering play Friday, the Stars and the Avalanche were the only two teams in the NHL this season to have four different players score at least four goals.
- Esa Lindell has registered a team-leading 21 blocked shots this season, which was tied for the eighth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Stars have posted a 9-2-0 record against the Blackhawks since the 2021-22 season, outscoring Chicago 46-27 in those games.
  - o No team has scored more goals against the Blackhawks than the Stars since the start of the 2021-22 season.
  - o The team's 18 points against Chicago since 2021-22 were tied for the fifth-most of any NHL team.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 24th on the franchise's all-time assists list.

Stars head coach Pete DeBoer is two wins away from tying Bryan Murray (620) for 20th on the all-time head coaching
wins list

#### **BLACKHAWK DOWN**

- Jamie Benn has 17 points (6-11-17) in his last 17 games against Chicago dating back to March 9, 2021.
- Matt Duchene has three points (1-2-3) in his last three games against Chicago.
- Miro Heiskanen has 13 points (2-11—13) in his last 13 games against Chicago dating back to April 8, 2021.
  - Since the start of the 2020-21 season, Heiskanen has recorded 14 points (2-12-14) in 18 games against the Blackhawks, which is tied for the fourth-highest total of any NHL defensemen during that span.
  - o In all, **Heiskanen** has 15 career points (2-13—15) in 25 career games against Chicago, which is tied for his highest total against a single opponent.
- Roope Hintz has 26 points (14-12—26) in 23 career games against Chicago and enters tonight's game riding a fourgame point streak against the Blackhawks. His 14 goals and 26 points are both his highest totals against a single opponent.
- Mason Marchment has five points (4-1-5) in his last three games against Chicago.
- Jake Oettinger has won seven of the last eight games he has played against Chicago, posting a .901 save percentage, a 2.76 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- Jason Robertson has 22 points (9-13—22) in 19 career games against Chicago. His 22 points against the Blackhawks are his second-highest total against a single opponent, trailing only the 24 career points (10-14—24) against Nashville.
- Tyler Seguin has eight points (4-4—8) in his last eight games against Chicago.

#### **HOME COOKING**

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Chicago with a perfect 4-0-0 record while playing at American Airlines Center this season. It marks the fourth time since the team relocated to Dallas that they have begun a season by winning four consecutive home games.
  - Entering play Friday, Dallas, Vegas and Winnipeg were the only three teams to be undefeated at home this season.
- If Dallas were to win tonight, it would give them five consecutive home wins to begin a season for only the second time in team history, having previously done so in 1998-99.
- The Stars have allowed only three goals against in total in four games at home this year, which is the best mark in the NHL this season. According to NHL Stats, The Stars joined the Blackhawks (1 in 1971-72), Ducks (3 in 2014-15), Flyers (3 in 2007-08), Flames (3 in 2001-02) and Quebec Nordiques (3 in 1994-95) as the sixth team in the NHL's expansion era to allow three or fewer goals through their first four home games of a season.
- Dallas has gone a perfect 10-for-10 on the penalty kill when playing at home this season. Entering play Friday, the Stars and the Flyers were the only two teams to not allow a power-play goal against at home this year.

#### ROBO ON THE GO GO

- Dallas' Oct. 24 matchup against the Bruins marked the 300th game of Jason Robertson's career.
- Robertson scored the 137th goal of his career on Thursday, a power-play goal 31 seconds into the second period. According to NHL Stats, Robertson's 137 career goals are the second most by a Stars/North Stars player through 300 career NHL games behind Dino Ciccarelli (158).
- The goal was also the 320th point of **Robertson's** career. Only five active skaters have totaled more points through their first 300 games than Robertson Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384), Evgeni Malkin (371) and Krill Kaprizov (340).
- Robertson is 13 goals shy of becoming the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the club.
- He has five points (3-2—5) in his last five games played.

#### **KEEPING PACE**

- Entering tonight's game against Chicago, the Stars have had five players playing at a point-per-game pace this season: Tyler Seguin (1.40), Matt Duchene (1.13), Roope Hintz (1.00), Mason Marchment (1.00) and Logan Stankoven (1.00).
- Entering play Friday, the Stars were one of seven teams this season to have at least five players to average a point per game or better this season, with the others being Columbus (6), Tampa Bay (6), Vegas (6), Winnipeg (6), Colorado (5) and Ottawa (5).
- Seguin scored a power-play goal and added two assists against the Bruins, marking his first three-point game of the season. With seven points (4-3—7) in five games played this year, Seguin enters tonight game leading the team with a 1.40 points-per-game rate this season.
  - o Seguin has recorded at least a point in four of the five games he has played this season.
  - o 2024-25 marks the first time that **Seguin** has played at a point-per-game pace through his first seven games of the season since he had 10 points (3-7–10) in his first seven games played of the 2018-19 season.
- Duchene recorded three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' last game against Boston, bringing his season total to nine points (4-5-9) in eight games. He has averaged 1.13 points per game this year.
- **Hintz** scored the empty-net goal in Dallas' 5-2 win over the Boston Bruins and now has eight points (4-4—8) in eight games played this season.

- Marchment tallied two assists in Dallas' last game against Boston. In all, he has eight points (2-6—8) in eight games this
  season.
  - The 2024-25 season marks the first time in **Marchment's** career that he has averaged a point per game through his first eight games played of the year.
- Stankoven scored his first goal of the season on Thursday and now has eight points (1-7—8) in eight played for the Stars this year.

#### **ROOKIE REPORT**

- Logan Stankoven scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' last game against Boston and now has eight points (1-7—8) through his first eight games played of the season.
- Entering play Friday, **Stankoven** was leading all rookies in points and assists this season and was one of four first-year players to be playing at a point-per-game pace this season.
  - o His seven assists were also tied for 13th in the NHL entering play Friday.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, Stakoven became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, Stankoven became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, Stankoven appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.

#### **CASE BY CASE BASIS**

- Casey DeSmith has a 2-1-0 record in three games with the Stars this season, posting a .936 save percentage, 1.69 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Entering play Friday, DeSmith ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (sixth) and save percentage (tied 10th).
- Additionally, according to MoneyPuck.com, DeSmith has saved 4.5 goals above expected this season, which was tied
  with Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck for the ninth-best mark in the NHL this year. His 1.52 goals saved above expected
  per 60 also ranked sixth in the NHL entering play Friday according to MoneyPuck.com.
- **DeSmith** became the third goaltender in Stars history to record a shutout in his debut with the team when he made 25 saves in Dallas' 2-0 win over the Seattle Kraken on Oct. 13.

## FROM START TO FINNISH

- Forward Roope Hitz was named one of the Stars alternate captains this season. 2024-25 will mark the first time that Hitz and fellow Fins Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell are all a part of Dallas' leadership group.
  - o Captain Jamie Benn and alternate captain Tyler Seguin round out the team's leadership group for this season.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are three of six Finnish players in the NHL this season to be a part of their team's leadership
  group, joining Florida captain Aleksander Barkov, Carolina alternate Sebastian Aho and Colorado alternate Mikko
  Rantanen.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are set to face off against Barkov the NHL's Global Series when the Stars will take on the Panthers in back-to-back games on Nov. 1 and 2 at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- All three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell rank in the top 15 in all-time scoring among active, Finnish skaters. At eighth, Hintz ranks the highest with 318 career points followed by Heiskanen (259, 10th) and Lindell (191, 13th).

#### BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 305 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that Benn had played in, making him
  the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- Benn's current 305-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 16 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,120), goals (384), assists (526) and points (910). His 910 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Tyler Seguin is five assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows
  for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is nine points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defensemen in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars. He is also just three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for the 10th-most goals among defensemen in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
