- Dallas' victory extended the team's point streak to 12 games (11-0-1), their longest point streak since they also had a point in 12 straight games (11-0-1) from Oct. 29 to Nov. 25, 2019.
- The team's 12-game point streak is tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history.
- The Stars have scored a power-play goal in nine consecutive games, their longest such streak since they had a power-play goal in 10 straight games from March 11 to 31, 2006.
- **Justin Hryckowian** scored Dallas' third goal of the night to give him goals in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Mavrik Bourque** scored a goal and added an assist during the game, giving him multi-point efforts in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Michael Bunting** tallied the primary assist on **Bourque's** goal, marking his first point as a member of the Stars. He is the first player to record a point in their Stars debut since **Mikko Rantanen** did so exactly one year ago on March 8 according to NHL Stats.
- **Matt Duchene** registered an assist during the game to give him seven points (3-4—7) in his last five games played against the Blackhawks dating back to Nov. 27, 2024.
- **Miro Heiskanen** scored the game-winning goal in overtime and now has 11 points (1-10—11) in his last 10 games played against the Blackhawks.
- **Thomas Harley** surpassed Jim Johnson (247) for the 33rd-most games played among franchise defensemen.
- **Tyler Myers'** Stars debut made him the first Texas-born player in franchise history to appear in a game for Dallas.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games that the Stars will play against the Golden Knights this season. Dallas defeated Vegas in their first matchup earlier this season on Jan. 29 in Vegas (5-4 SOW). The two teams will meet for a final time this season on March 22 in Dallas.
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (39, tied third), points (88, second) and points percentage (.698, second) this year entering play Monday. The team's success this season comes despite having 217 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Radek Faksa**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Mikko Rantanen** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Dallas has only allowed 44 goals against in the first period this season, which was tied for the fewest in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Since returning from the Olympic break, when **Matt Duchene** and **Sam Steel** have been on the ice together during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 5-1 and have a 68.3 expected goals for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Casey DeSmith** was ranked ninth and 10th in the NHL, respectively, in goals saved above expected (13.2) and goals saved above expected per 60 (0.558) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Monday.

TEXAS TOUGH

- The Dallas Stars acquired defenseman **Tyler Myers** from the Vancouver Canucks for a 2027 second-round pick and a 2029 fourth-round pick on March 4.
- Born in Houston, **Myers** will become the first-ever Texas-born player to appear in a game for the Stars when he plays in his first game for the club.
- Although born in Houston, **Myers** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition. **Myers** won a gold medal while playing for Team Canada with new teammate **Jamie Benn** at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship. He would later play for Canada alongside **Matt Duchene** at the 2010 IIHF World Championship.
- **Myers** and **Benn** were teammates during the junior careers, both playing for the Kelowna Rockets of the Western Hockey League (WHL) during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. The two won the 2009 WHL Championship together, with **Myers** being named the playoff Most Valuable Player and **Benn** leading the WHL in postseason goals (13), assists (20) and points (33).
- **Myers** and **Duchene** were both nominated for the Calder Memorial Trophy as the League's top rookie in 2010, with **Myers** ultimately taking home the award.
- **Myers** and **Casey DeSmith** both played for the Vancouver Canucks during the 2024-25 season.

I WANNA BE LIKE MIKE

- The Dallas Stars acquired forward **Michael Bunting** from the Nashville Predators in exchange for Seattle's third-round pick in 2026 on March 5, 2026.
- **Bunting** had 31 points (13-18—31) in 61 games played with the Predators prior to the trade. He also previously played for Pittsburgh Penguins (2023-24 to 2024-25), Carolina Hurricanes (2023-24), Toronto Maple Leafs (2021-22 to 2022-23) and Arizona Coyotes (2018-19, 2020-21).
- **Bunting** previously played with Stars defensemen **Kyle Capobianco** and **Ilya Lyubushkin** while he was a part of the Coyotes organizations.
- He later played with **Lyubushkin** again and forward **Colin Blackwell** for the Toronto Maple Leafs.

ROLLING THE DICE

- Dallas is 9-8-4 all-time vs. Vegas, including a 4-4-3 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have won their last three games played against the Golden Knights. They have also earned points in nine of their last 11 games played vs. Vegas (7-2-2), dating back to April 26, 2022.
 - Dallas has also earned points in seven of their last eight games against the Golden Knights at American Airlines Center (4-1-3).
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game point streak vs. Vegas, collecting seven points (4-3—7) during that span, including scoring a hat trick against them on Jan. 28, 2025. In all, **Johnston** has recorded eight points (5-3—8) in 10 career games against the Golden Knights, upholding a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Vegas, earning four points (2-2—4) during that span. In 13 career games played against the Golden Knights, **Robertson** has tallied 10 points (5-5—10) with a plus-minus rating of +2.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded seven points (0-7—7) in 18 career games played vs. Vegas, averaging 24:46 of time on ice per game.
 - His 24:46 time on ice per game against them ranks seventh among all active NHL skaters who have played the Golden Knights at least 10 times in their career.
- **Jamie Benn** registered two assists in his last meeting vs. Vegas on Jan. 29. In all, **Benn** has totaled 11 points (4-7—11) in 20 career games played against the Golden Knights, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
- **Mavrik Bourque** put up two goals in Dallas' last game vs. Vegas on Jan. 29 and enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against them, collecting three goals during that span. Of **Bourque's** four career games against the Golden Knights, he has scored four goals, upholding a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak vs. Vegas, earning four points (1-3—4) during that span. In all, **Duchene** has put up 12 points (6-6—12) in 19 career games played against the Golden Knights, averaging 18:30 of time on ice per game.

- **Michael Bunting** has five points (2-3—5) in his last six games vs. Vegas, dating back to Dec. 19, 2023. In all, **Bunting** has tallied nine points (4-5—9) in 15 career games played against the Golden Knights.
- **Nathan Bastian** carries a plus-minus rating of +2 through nine career games played vs. Vegas (1-3—4).
- **Jake Oettinger** holds a 7-2-2 record in 11 games played against the Golden Knights, with a .910 save percentage, 2.46 goals-against average and one shutout.
 - His .910 save percentage against them is tied for the seventh-best mark among all active NHL netminders who have played Vegas at least 10 times in their career.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 12 games that they have played, posting a 11-0-1 record during that span. It is the team's point longest streak since they also earned a point in 12 straight games from Oct. 29 to Nov. 25, 2019, posting an 11-0-1 record during that span.
 - Dallas' 11 wins and 23 points since Jan. 23 were both tied with the Buffalo Sabres for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- The team's current 12-game point streak is tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give them points in 13 consecutive games for the first time since March 13 to April 7, 2001, posting a 10-0-3 record during that span.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, at 5-on-5 play during the team's current point streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 32-19 and own a 63.4 expected goals for percentage, a 66.3 high danger chances for percentage and a 57.2 shots for percentage.
 - No team has a better expected goals for percentage during that span. The Ottawa Senators ranked second entering play Monday with 58.8 percent.
- The team has gone 14-for-41 on the power play over the course of this point streak for a 34.1 percent success rate. Their 34.1 percent conversion rate and 14 power-play goals scored ranked fourth and first, respectively, in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Monday.
 - The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in 11 of the 12 games that they have played during the team's current point streak.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling 18 points (8-10—18) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, six Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.50), **Jason Robertson** (1.33), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.17), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.08), **Jamie Benn** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
- **Duchene's** eight goals and 18 points during that span were tied both tied for the ninth-most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Sixteen different skaters have scored at least one goal for the Stars during the team's current 12-game point streak: **Duchene** (8), **Johnston** (8), **Robertson** (5), **Mavrik Bourque** (5), **Benn** (4), **Nathan Bastian** (3), **Thomas Harley** (3), **Sam Steel** (3), **Lian Bichsel** (2), **Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Adam Erne** (1), **Roope Hintz** (1), **Nils Lundkvist** (1) and **Rantanen** (1).
- Defensive pairs **Esa Lindell** and **Miro Heiskanen** (64.6) and **Thomas Harley** and **Nils Lundkvist** (68.5) both have an expected goals for percentage above 60 percent over the course of the streak.

PUTTING ON THE RITZ

- **Justin Hryckowian** has totaled 22 points (10-12—22) in 62 games this year, which ranked second among undrafted rookies in scoring this season entering play Monday.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas in 6-0-4 in those contests.
- **Hryckowian** recorded the second multi-point game of his career with a goal and an assist in Dallas' game on March 6 against Colorado. He skated 20:22 in the game, setting a new single-game career high.
- He then scored the following game on March 8 against Chicago, giving him goals in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- When **Hryckowian** has been on the ice this year during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 29-23 and own a 53.8 expected goals for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Hryckowian** has recorded 93 hits this year, which ranked eighth among all NHL rookies entering play Monday.
- **Hryckowian** has also won 57.7 percent of the faceoffs he has taken this season (112-for-194), which ranked second among rookies to take at least 80 draws this season entering play Monday. His faceoff win percentage ranks second to only **Roope Hintz** (59.1 percent) for the best mark on the team among players to appear in at least five games.

HEATING UP

- **Miro Heiskanen** has scored in each of Dallas' last two games. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the second time in his career, matching his career high that he set earlier this season from Dec. 3 to 7.
- A goal tonight would also make **Heiskanen** the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have two separate goal streaks of at least three games, joining Philippe Boucher, Alex Goligoski, Craig Hartsburg, John Klingberg and Lou Nanne.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 17 points (2-15—17) in his last 14 games played dating back to Jan. 20, 2026.
- **Justin Hryckowian** has also scored in both of the Stars' last two games. If he were to find the back of the net again tonight, he would become the first Stars rookie to have a three-game goal streak since Logan Stankoven did so from Feb. 26 to 29, 2024.
- **Mavrik Bourque** scored a goal and added an assist in Sunday's game against Chicago, giving him multi-point efforts in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Nathan Bastian** scored the Stars' first goal on March 8 against the Blackhawks and now has three goals in his last five games played. The goal was his sixth of the season, which is his highest total since he also scored six goals in 43 games with the New Jersey Devils in 2022-23.

POWER TRIP

- The Stars have gone 56-for-187 on the power play this season for a 29.9 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- The Oilers (57), Stars (56) and Wild (54) were the only teams to score at least 50 power-play goals this season entering play Monday.
- The Stars have scored at least one goal on the power-play in each of the last nine games they have played. If they were to do so again tonight, it would give them power-play goals in 10 consecutive games for the first time since March 11 to 31, 2006.
- Dallas' 56 power-play goals have already matched the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 73 power-play goals, which would be the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 56 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (21), **Jason Robertson** (12), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Miro Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 12 power-play goals are just one shy of matching his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Johnston** (21-12—33) was ranked fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Monday, followed by **Robertson** (12-19—31), who was tied for fifth, and **Rantanen** (5-25—30), who ranked seventh.
 - **Johnston's** 33 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 31 power-play points are the second-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 21 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Monday and were five more than the second-ranked skaters (two tied with 16).
- His 21 power-play goals are already a career high and are the most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 21 power-play goals are already tied for the second-most in a single season in franchise history one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 32 power-play goals, which was the most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 21 points (2-19—21) on the power-play this season, which was the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 34th goal of the season in Dallas' game on March 6 against Colorado, setting a new career high for the forward.
 - His 33 assists this season are eight shy of matching his career high and his 67 points are four shy of matching his career high of 71 that he had last season.
- **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 44 goals, 43 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs.
- **Jason Robertson** (44) and **Johnston** (44) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- With 19 games remaining in the regular season, **Mavrik Bourque** has already set career highs in goals (13), assists (16) and points (29) this year.
- **Sam Steel** had a three-point performance (2-1—3) in Dallas' game on March 3, a 6-1 win over the Calgary Flames. His second goal of the night was his 29th point of the season, setting a career high for the forward.
 - **Steel's** 10 goals and 19 assists this season are both tied for the most of his career.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 25 points (5-20—25) in 63 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. His 20 assists this season are only one shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has scored two goals on the power-play this year, which is one shy of matching his career high of three that he reached in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.
- **Casey DeSmith's** 14 wins are just one shy of matching his career high of 15 that he reached in both 2018-19 and 2022-23 while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
 - **DeSmith** is also two wins away from recording the 100th win of his NHL career.

21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** had two assists in Dallas' game on March 6 to give him 74 points (34-40—74) on the season, which was tied for the 10th-most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- The 2025-26 season marks **Robertson's** fifth-straight 70-point season. The only other active U.S.-born player with as many consecutive campaigns is Patrick Kane (5 from 2015-16 to 2019-20) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** is one of nine players in franchise history to have at least five 50-point seasons for the team, joining Mike Modano (12x), Brian Bellows (6x), Dino Ciciarelli (6x), **Tyler Seguin** (6x), **Jamie Benn** (5x), Neal Broten (5x), Dave Gagner (5x) and Bobby Smith (5x).
- **Robertson** has recorded four consecutive multi-point games from Feb. 28 to March 6, matching his career high that he set earlier this season from Nov. 11 to 18.
 - **Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in eight of the last 14 games that he has played, totaling 18 points in all (7-11—18) during that span.
- **Robertson** scored his 34th goal of the year in Dallas's game on March 2 against the Canucks, the team's 60th game of the season. His 34 goals were the third-most through the team's first 60 games of the season in Dallas Stars team history according to NHL Stats, trailing only his own 35 goals in 2022-23 and Mike Modano's 39 goals in 1993-94.
- **Robertson's** 34 goals were tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Monday. His 34 goals are also his fourth-most in a single season in his career and one shy of the 35 goals he scored last year.
- **Robertson** has scored 12 goals on the power-play this year, which were tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Monday and was also just one shy of his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** has totaled 53 points (9-44—53) this season. The 2025-26 campaign marks his third 50-point season, which makes him the third Finnish-born defenseman in NHL history, alongside Reijo Ruotsalainen (5x) and Risto Siltanen (3x), to have at least three 50-point campaigns according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** 53 points this season are already the third-most of his career, trialing only the 54 points (9-45—54) he had in 2023-24 and the 73 points (11-62—73) he had in 2022-23.
- **Heiskanen** joins Sergei Zubov (6x) and Craig Hartsburg (4x) as the only defensemen in franchise history to record at least three 50-point seasons.
- **Heiskanen's** 53 points ranked eighth among all defensemen in the NHL entering play Monday.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 17 points (2-15—17) in his last 14 games played dating back to Jan. 20, 2026.
- With a goal and an assist on March 6 against Colorado, **Heiskanen** (78) passed Reijo Ruotsalainen (77) for the fifth-most multi-point games by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Kimmo Timonen (113), Teppo Numminen (97), Jyrki Lumme (85) and Risto Siltanen (84).
- **Heiskanen** scored the third overtime goal of his career – and first since March 11, 2023 – on March 8 against the Blackhawks to secure a 4-3 Stars win. His three overtime goals are tied for the third most by a defenseman in franchise history.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (355) and **Wyatt Johnston** (309).
- **Robertson's** 355-game Iron Man streak was tied the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 309 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Monday, it was the 10th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Golden Knights forward Reilly Smith was originally selected by the Stars in the third round (69th overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft. Smith would skate in Dallas from 2011-12 to 2012-13.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Golden Knights forward Jack Eichel were teammates on Team USA during the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Golden Knights forward Jack Eichel and defenseman Noah Hanifan were all members of Team USA during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff.
 - All three were also a part of Team USA during the 2026 Winter Olympics in Milan, winning the gold medal.

- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** and Golden Knights forward Tomas Hertl skated together on Team Czechia during the 2011 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and 2012 and 2013 IIHF World Junior Championships.
 - The two also represented Team Czechia during the 2026 Winter Olympics in Milan.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** and Golden Knights forward Alexander Holtz and goaltender Akira Schmid shared the ice in New Jersey from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
 - Stars assistant coach **Alain Nasreddine** was the assistant coach in New Jersey during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Oskar Bäck** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Golden Knights forward Alexander Holtz all played for Team Sweden during the 2020 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Golden Knights forward Brett Howden were teammates on the New York Rangers during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Kyle Capobianco** and Golden Knights forward Brett Howden both represented Team Canada during the 2015 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** skated with Golden Knights forward Mitch Marner in Toronto during the 2021-22 season. Lyubushkin and Marner would cross paths again in Toronto following the trade deadline in 2023-24.
- Stars defenseman **Kyle Capobianco** and Golden Knights forward Mitch Marner both represented Team Canada Ontario during the 2014 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Golden Knights forward Mitch Marner were members of Team Canada during the 2017 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Golden Knights forwards Mitch Marner and Mark Stone and defenseman Shea Theodore all skated together on Team Canada during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff.
 - The four will represent Team Canada during the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan, taking home the silver medal.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Golden Knights forward Brandon Saad both skated for the Colorado Avalanche during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** and Golden Knights forward Brandon Saad were teammates in St. Louis during the 2024-25 season.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Matt Duchene** both shared the ice in Nashville with Golden Knights forward Colton Sissons. Blackwell and Sissons were teammates from 2018-19 to 2019-20, while Duchene and Sissons would skate together from 2019-20 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Golden Knights forward Mark Stone were both members of the Ottawa Senators from 2017-18 to 2018-19.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Golden Knights forward Mark Stone and defenseman Ben Hutton all represented Team Canada during the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Golden Knights President of Hockey Operations George McPhee served as the general manager of Team Canada.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Golden Knights defenseman Noah Hanifan shared the ice on Team USA during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff.
 - The two also represented Team USA during the 2016 Winter Olympic Games in Milan, winning the gold medal.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Golden Knights defenseman Ben Hutton were teammates in Anaheim during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Golden Knights defenseman Kaedan Korczak skated together on Team Canada Black during the 2018 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge and Team Canada in the 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship.
