

Selected by the Rangers in the fourth round (103rd overall) of the 2020 NHL Draft, Garand appeared in 32 games for the Hartford Wolf Pack in 2022-23. Prior to turning pro, he played in 135 career WHL contests with the Kamloops Blazers, recording an 89-31-7 record, 2.34 goals-against average and a ,918 save percentage and earning the Del Wilson Trophy as the league's top goaltender and a WHL First All-Star Team selection in his final campaign (2021-22). The Victoria, BC, native represented his country at the 2021 and 2022 IIHF World Junior Championships, suiting up in one game for Canada's silver medal-winning entry at the 2021 tournament and recording a 6-0-0 record, 1.98 goals-against average and .925 save percentage in six games in 2022 to help Canada capture the gold medal.
