- The Stars scored their ninth power-play goal of the postseason, and fifth consecutive, in the first period. It marked the first time in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) that the team has scored a power-play goal in five consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
- Miro Heiskanen** scored on the power play in the first period to extend his point streak to five games for the first time since May 7 to 15, 2024. He is now the third defenseman in franchise history to being a postseason with a five-game point streak according to NHL Stats, joining Sergei Zubov (6 in 2003 and 5 in 2001) and Brad Maxwell (5 in 1983).
 - With an assist in the third period, **Heiskanen** now has 12 points (2-10—12) in 11 career postseason games against Minnesota.
- Jason Robertson** scored Dallas’ second goal of the night to extend his goal streak to five games. He has scored in each game of this series and his last eight playoff games dating back to the 2025 Western Conference Final.
 - With a goal and an assist, **Robertson** extended his point streak this postseason to five games (5-3—8), matching his career high that he previously set from May 7 to 15, 2024.
 - He also extended point streak against the Wild to eight games. He now has 13 points (7-6—12) in 12 career playoff games against Minnesota.
- Matt Duchene** tallied an assist on **Heiskanen’s** goal, extending his point streak to four games, which is the longest playoff point streak of his career.
- Wyatt Johnston** went 10-for-13 at the faceoff dot. His 10 faceoff wins tied for his most in a playoff game in his career.
- Mikko Rantanen** tallied an assist to give him six points (1-5—6) in five games this series.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight marks the Stars' 435th postseason game in franchise history. The Stars own a 219-215 all-time postseason record.
- The Stars currently rank eighth all-time in playoff wins with 219.
- Dallas has a 26-22 all-time record in Game 6s including a 12-9 record on the road.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's game one assist shy of surpassing Richard Matvichuk (19) for the 10th-most playoff assists by a defenseman in franchise history. He is also one goal shy of tying John Klingberg (7) for the fifth-most playoff goals by a defenseman in franchise history.
 - **Lindell** has recorded 12 blocked shots this postseason, which was tied for the eighth-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- During 5-on-5 play this series when **Thomas Harley** is on the ice, the Stars have a 59.2 expected goals for percentage, a 61.1 high-danger chances for percentage and a 61.6 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - Among defensemen in play in at least four playoff games this postseason, **Harley** ranked in the top 15 in on-ice expected goals for percentage (12th) and Corsi rating (eighth) entering play Wednesday.
- **Justin Hryckowian** has gone 29-for-40 at the faceoff dot this postseason for a 72.5 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL among skaters that have taken at least 20 draws entering play Wednesday.
- **Mavrik Bourque** has totaled a team-leading 20 hits this postseason, which was tied for 17th in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Tyler Myers** has recorded 14 blocked shot this postseason, which was tied for the League lead entering play Wednesday.
- Of the 20 Dallas skaters to appear in a game this series, 18 have a positive on-ice scoring chance differential at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- 2026 marks the first trip to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for rookies **Justin Hryckowian** and **Arttu Hyry**.

WILD THINGS

- In the postseason, Dallas is 10-7 all-time vs. Minnesota, including a 5-3 mark on the road.
 - In the regular season, the Stars are 56-29-13 all-time against the Wild, with a 21-21-6 mark on the road.
- Dallas has a 26-22 all-time record in Game 6s including a 12-9 record on the road, while Minnesota is 5-6 in Game 6s with a 5-4 record on home ice.
- The Wild currently lead the series 3-2. When Dallas trails in a best-of-seven series 3-2 they are 3-19 and 1-5 when starting at home, while Minnesota is 1-0 when leading the series 3-2 and 1-0 when starting the series on the road.
- **Mikko Rantanen** enters tonight's contest riding a four-game postseason point streak against the Wild, earning six points (1-5—6) during that span.
 - Skated in his first NHL playoff game against them in Game 1 on April 18.
 - In all, **Rantanen** has tallied six points (1-5—6) in five career postseason games vs. Minnesota, averaging 22:52 of time on ice per game and 1.20 points per game.
 - **Rantanen** has totaled 44 points (17-27—44) in 42 career regular-season games played against the Wild, carrying a plus-minus rating of +18 and averaging 19:50 of time on ice per game. He has registered 11 multi-point outings against them.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has collected seven points (4-3—7) through 11 career playoff games against the Wild, averaging 20:47 of time on ice per game and tallying two game-winning goals.
 - In Game 5 on April 28 in Dallas, he went 10-for-13 at the faceoff dot. His 10 faceoff wins are tied for his most in a playoff game in his career.
 - **Johnston** tied teammate **Esa Lindell** (1-4—5) for the team lead in scoring against Minnesota during the regular season, collecting five points (2-3—5) in four games.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup riding an eight-game playoff point streak against the Wild, collecting 12 points (6-6—12) during that span. In all, **Robertson** has posted 15 points (7-8—15) in 11 career postseason games played vs. Minnesota, averaging 1.36 points per game.
 - His 15 career postseason points against them is tied for second among active NHL skaters.
 - In the regular season, **Robertson** has recorded 22 points (14-8—22) in 19 games played. He closed out the regular season against them riding a five-game point streak (4-1—5).
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's contest riding a four-game postseason point streak against the Wild, registering eight points (2-6—8) during that span. It is his longest playoff point streak of his career. In seven career postseason games vs. Minnesota, **Duchene** has totaled 11 points (2-9—11), averaging 21:00 of time on ice per game and 1.57 points per game.
 - His 1.57 points per game against them ranks second among active NHL skaters, trailing teammate **Roope Hintz** (2.00).
- **Jamie Benn** has collected 14 points (5-9—14) in 17 career playoff games against the Wild, carrying a plus-minus rating of +2.
 - His 14 career postseason points against them are tied for third among all active NHL skaters.
 - Has posted 50 points (20-30—50) in 62 career regular-season games played against them with a plus-minus rating of +9.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's contest riding a five-game postseason point streak vs. Minnesota, tallying six points (2-4—6) during that span, including putting up a goal and an assist in Game 5 on April 28. In all, **Heiskanen** has posted 12 points (2-10—12) in 11 career playoff games against the Wild, averaging 29:56 of time on ice per game, including putting up a career-high of 43:05 of ice time in Game 3 on April 22 (2OT).
 - His 29:56 of time on ice per game in the postseason against them top all active NHL skaters.

- In 22 regular-season games played vs. Minnesota, **Heiskanen** has put up 18 points (2-16—18) with a plus-minus rating of +10.
- **Jake Oettinger** – a native of Lakeville, Minnesota – owns a 6-5 career postseason record against Minnesota, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.37 goals against average and one shutout.
 - His six playoff wins against them are tied for the most among all active NHL netminders.

21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** scored Dallas' second goal of the night in Game 5 to extend his goal streak to five games. He has scored in each game of this series and in his last eight playoff games dating back to the 2025 Western Conference Final.
- **Robertson** is the first player in franchise history to score in five straight games to begin a playoff run according to NHL Stats. His five-game goal streak is also tied for the longest in franchise history.
- He is the only player since the Stars relocated to Dallas to score in five consecutive postseason games.
- **Robertson** is also the first player with a five-game goal streak to begin a postseason run since Valeri Nichushkin (7) and Artturi Lehkonen (5) did so in 2024 according to NHL Stats.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Robertson** was the only player in the NHL this postseason to score in five consecutive games.
- With a goal and an assist in Game 5, **Robertson** extended his point streak this postseason to five games (5-3—8), matching his career high that he previously set from May 7 to 15, 2024.
- **Robertson's** five-game point streak was tied with teammate **Miro Heiskanen** and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl for the longest active point streaks in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Robertson** points in six consecutive playoff games for the first time in his career.
- He also extended point streak against the Wild to eight games. He now has 13 points (7-6—12) in 12 career playoff games against Minnesota.
- **Robertson** became the fourth different player in Stars team history to start a playoff year with a five-game point streak according to NHL Stats. The others: **Jamie Benn** (2x; longest: 6 GP in 2016), Mike Modano (6 GP in 1999) and Sergei Zubov (2x; longest: 6 GP in 2003).
- In all, **Robertson** has totaled eight points (5-3—8), which was tied for the third-most in the NHL this postseason and was one shy of the League lead.
 - His 1.60 points per game this postseason are the best mark in his career.
- **Robertson's** five goals were the second-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only Brandon Hagel's six.
- **Robertson's** goal in Game 5 also tied him with Tyler Seguin (23) for the 12th-most playoff goals in franchise history and the seventh-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). He enters tonight's game two goals shy of tying Joe Nieuwendyk for the 11th-most in franchise history.
- **Robertson's** goal in Game 4 was the ninth power-play goal of his Stanley Cup Playoff career, which is tied for the seventh-most in franchise history. He joined Mike Modano (20), Sergei Zubov (9), Brendan Morrow (9) and **Jamie Benn** (9) as the only five players to score at least nine power-play goals for the Stars since the team relocated to Dallas.
- **Robertson** scored the third game-winning goal of his postseason career in Game 2 to secure a 4-2 Dallas win. **Robertson's** goal the 20th of his playoff career, making him the 16th player in franchise history and ninth in team history to score at least 20 postseason goals for the team.
- When **Robertson** was on the ice during 5-on-5 in Game 2, the Stars outshot the Wild 9-2, owned a 94.3 expected goals for percentage and had four high-danger scoring chances to Minnesota's zero according to Natural Stat Trick.

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** scored on the power play in the first period of Game 4 to extend his point streak to five games for the first time since May 7 to 15, 2024. He is now the third defenseman in franchise history to being a postseason with a five-game point streak according to NHL Stats, joining Sergei Zubov (6 in 2003 and 5 in 2001) and Brad Maxwell (5 in 1983).
- **Heiskanen** scored in consecutive playoff games for the third time in his career (also 2 GP in 2024 & 2020). He became the first Stars/North Stars defenseman to do so three times, and tied Kris Letang, Evan Bouchard, Drew Doughty, Victor Hedman and Brandon Montour for the most instances among all active blueliners according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** five-game point streak was tied with teammate **Jason Robertson** and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl for the longest active point streaks in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen's** six points (2-4—6) this postseason ranked third among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday. He was the only defenseman in the NHL to score two power-play goals entering play Wednesday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in six straight playoff games for the first time since he had a career-best, eight-game point streak from Aug. 20 to Sept. 4, 2020. It would also make him the second defenseman in franchise history to begin a postseason run with a six-game point streak according to NHL Stats. He would join Zubov in 2003.
- If **Heiskanen** were to score tonight, he would become the second defenseman in franchise history to score in three consecutive playoff games, joining Craig Hartsburg, who did so from April 15 to 18, 1983, when the team was located in Minnesota.
- **Heiskanen** now has 12 points (2-10—12) in 12 career postseason games against Minnesota.
- **Heiskanen** recorded the 51st assist of his playoff career in Game 3 to take sole possessions of fourth on the franchise's all-time playoff assists list.
- **Heiskanen** skated 43:05 in Game 3, the highest single-game ice time of his career, regular season or playoffs. His 43:05 of ice time was the most by a Stars skaters in a playoff game since seven different Dallas skaters had at least 43 minutes of ice time on May 4, 2008 against the San Jose Sharks.

- The Stars played a quadruple overtime game against the Sharks in Game 6 of the Western Conference Semifinal. Dallas eventually won 2-1 to eliminate San Jose.
- **Heiskanen** recorded the 50th assist of his postseason career in Game 2 with the secondary helper on **Matt Duchene's** goal. In reaching the milestone, **Heiskanen** became...
 - The sixth player in franchise history and fourth in Dallas Stars team history to record 50 playoff assists with the team.
 - The seventh Finnish player in NHL history to have 50 postseason assists.
 - The 14th skater since the start of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, when he made his postseason debut, to total 50 assists.
- **Heiskanen** recorded his 50th playoff assist in his 95th career Stanley Cup Playoff game, making him third-fastest European defenseman to reach 50 career playoff assists (95 GP) according to NHL Stats, behind only Sergei Zubov (80 GP) and Sandis Ozolinsh (81 GP).
- In all, **Heiskanen** has notched 71 career playoff points (19-52—71) in 98 Stanley Cup Playoff games, which ranks ninth among all active defensemen and is the second-most by a Stars blueliner in franchise history.
 - He is two points shy of tying Shea Theodore (73) for eighth in playoff scoring among active defensemen.
- He enters tonight's game one point shy of tying Sergei Zubov (72) for the most playoff points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- **Heiskanen's** next goal will make him the 18th skater in franchise history to score 20 playoff goals for the team.
- Tonight's game will be the 99th playoff game of **Heiskanen's** career, which will tie him with Darryl Sydor (99) for the fifth-most playoff games played by a defenseman in franchise history.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** has totaled eight points (2-6—8) this series, leading all Stars skaters in assists and tied with **Jason Robertson** for the team lead in points this postseason.
- His eight points were tied for second in the NHL entering play Wednesday and are already the second-most in a single postseason of his career.
 - He enters tonight's game two points shy of matching his playoff career best of 10 points (5-5—10) he had in 10 postseason games with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2019.
- Six (2-4—6) of his eight points this postseason have come on the power play, which led the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Duchene** recorded multi-point efforts in Games 2, 3 and 4, marking the first time in his career that he had at least two points in three straight playoff games.
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this series, the Stars have a 56.1 expected goals for percentage and a 53.5 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick. Dallas also has 28 scoring chances to Minnesota's 19 when he's on the ice at 5-on-5.
- **Duchene** enters tonight's game riding a four-game assist and point streak, both of which are the longest such streaks of his career.

POWER TRIP

- The Stars have gone 9-for-23 for a 39.1 percent success rate on the power play this postseason, which was the second-best mark in the League entering play Wednesday. Their nine power-play goals topped the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Only two teams in the past 30 years scored more power-play goals through their first five games of a postseason according to NHL Stats: the 2012 Flyers (11) and 2010 Kings (10).
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in every game this series, making the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs the second postseason in franchise history in which the Stars/North Stars have scored one or more power-play goals in each of their first five games, following 1991 (7 GP), according to NHL Stats.
- The 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs is also the first time in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) that the team has scored a power-play goal in five consecutive games at any point during the postseason according to NHL Stats.
 - The team last had a five-game power-play goal streak during the 1991 Stanley Cup Playoffs when the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas scored on their first power-play opportunity of Game 5. With the goal, the team scored on five consecutive power-play opportunities dating back to Game 3.
- The Stars went 2-for-2 on the power play on April 25, making their performance in Game 4 against the Wild the 10th time in franchise history that the team has had a 100 percent conversion rate on the power play in a playoff game.
- Dallas went 3-for-8 on the man advantage in Game 3, which included **Wyatt Johnston** scoring the game-winning goal in double overtime on the team's eighth power-play opportunity of the night.
- The team's performance against the Wild in Game 3 marked the 24th time in franchise history and ninth time in Dallas Stars team history that they scored at least three power-play goals in a playoff game.
 - They last accomplished this feat on May 21, 2025, going 3-for-4 on the power play in Game 1 of the Western Conference Final against the Edmonton Oilers.
 - The Stars also scored three power-play goals against the Wild in Game 2 of the 2023 First Round, a 7-3 Dallas win on April 19, 2023.
- **Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Johnston** and **Jason Robertson** have all scored two goals on the power play this postseason, which was tied for the second-most in the League entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** was the only defenseman to score two power-play goals this postseason entering play Wednesday.
- **Duchene's** six power-play points (2-4—6) topped the NHL entering play Wednesday, followed by **Heiskanen** (2-3—5), **Robertson** (2-3—5) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1-4—5), who were all tied for second.
- During the regular season, the Stars went 71-for-248 on the power play for a 28.6 percent success rate, which set a franchise record for best power-play conversion rate in a single season and was also the second-best mark in the NHL this year.

- The team's 71 power-play goals this year topped the League and was the Stars' most in a single season since they scored 79 times on the man advantage in 2006-07.
- **Johnston** finished the season with 27 power-play goals, which were the second-most in a single-season in the NHL in the post-lockout era (since 2005-06).
- **Johnston's** 27 power-play goals topped the NHL and were seven more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored the game-winning goal in double overtime of Game 3. The goal was the sixth game-winning goal of his playoff career, which is tied for sixth in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, **Johnston** became the eighth player in Stanley Cup Playoffs history with six game-winning goals before age 23, joining Jaromir Jagr (7), Stephane Richer (7), Steve Payne (7), Ted Kennedy (7), Evgeni Malkin (6), Jeremy Roenick (6) and Claude Lemieux (6).
- The goal was also the second overtime goal of his career, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history and only one shy of the franchise record.
 - Joe Nieuwendyk, Steve Payne and Brenden Morrow all scored three playoff overtime goals for the Stars.
- **Johnston** scored the team's first and fourth goals of the night in Game 2 to bring his postseason career total to 20, making him the second player in franchise history and first in Dallas Stars team history to score at least 20 Stanley Cup Playoff goals at age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, **Johnston** is just the 13th player in NHL history, an first since Tampa Bay's Nikita Kucherov, to score 20 goals in the Stanley Cup Playoffs before his 23rd birthday.
- Entering play Wednesday, there were 77 active NHL players that have scored at least 20 postseason goals. **Johnston**, who is roughly two weeks shy of turning 23, is the youngest of those 77 players.
 - At 26 years old, Carolina's Andrei Svechnikov – who has scored 23 goals in 70 career playoff games – is the next youngest active player to have scored at least 20 goals in the postseason.
- **Johnston's** 21 goals since the start of the 2023 Stanley Cup Playoffs – when he made his postseason debut – were tied with teammate **Mikko Rantanen** for ninth in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Fourteen of **Johnston's** 21 postseason goals have been scored at even strength, which ranked 11th in the NHL since the start of the 2023 postseason entering play Wednesday.
- His performance against the Wild in Game 2 was the fourth multi-goal game of his playoff career. **Johnston** is one of eight players to record at least four multi-goal games since the start of the 2023 postseason, joining Leon Drasaitl (8), Connor McDavid (5), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Tyler Seguin** (5), Matthew Tkachuk (5), Brett Howden (4) and Zach Hyman (4).
- In all, **Johnston** has totaled 35 points (21-16—37) in 60 career postseason games, leading all players drafted in 2021 in career playoff games played, goals, assists, points, points per game (0.61), even-strength goals (14), even-strength points (23), power-play goals (6), power-play points (12), shorthanded goals (1), overtime goals (2) and game-winning goals (6).
- Since making his postseason debut in 2023, **Johnston's** 21 goals rank second on the team and his 37 points rank fourth.

KEEP IT 100 ON THE LAND, THE SEA, THE SKY

- **Mikko Rantanen** has totaled six points (1-5—6) in five games this series.
- **Rantanen** is over a point-per-game player (1.24) in the postseason in his career, totaling 129 points (44-85—129) in 103 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
 - **Rantanen** had a career-best nine goals during the 2025 postseason, finishing the playoffs with 22 points (9-13—22) in 18 games. His 22 points tied for seventh in the NHL and tied for the 11th-highest scoring postseason in franchise history.
- His 129 career playoff points are tied for the 10th-most among all active skaters and rank third in NHL history among Finnish players.
- **Rantanen's** 1.24 points per game are the fourth-best mark among active players that have played in at least six Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- **Rantanen** played in his 100th Stanley Cup Playoff game in Game 1 against the Wild. In reaching the milestone, he became the 54th active skater and 10th Finnish player in NHL history to appear in at least 100 postseason games.
- **Rantanen** totaled 123 points (43-80—123) through the first 100 games of his postseason career, which is the fourth-most among active skaters according to NHL Stats. Connor McDavid (150), Leon Drasaitl (141) and Nathan MacKinnon (125) are the only active players with more points through their first 100 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- **Rantanen** is also one of 12 skaters in NHL history to have at least 123 points through his first 100 career postseason games according to NHL Stats.
- **Rantanen** is the only player on Dallas' active roster who has previously won the Stanley Cup. He hoisted the Cup in 2022 with the Avalanche, finishing the postseason with 25 points (5-20—25) in 20 games, which was good for fifth in the NHL is scoring that year.

DYNAMIC DUO

- After finishing the regular season with matching 45-goal efforts, **Jason Robertson** (5) and **Wyatt Johnston** (3) have each scored at least three goals this postseason.
- **Johnston's** next goal will tie him with Dave Gagner (22) for the 13th-most playoff goals in franchise history and the eighth-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
- **Johnston's** 45 regular-season goals were a career high and **Robertson's** 45 were one shy of matching his career best of 46.

- The duo's 90 combined goals during the regular season were the second-most by any set of teammates this year, trailing Colorado's Nathan MacKinnon (53) and Martin Necas (38), who combined to score 91 goals this season.
- **Johnston** and **Robertson** are the sixth pair of teammates in franchise history – and first in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) – to score at least 40 goals in the same season.
- The pair's 45 goals tied for the third-most in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94), trailing only **Robertson's** 46 goals in 2021-22 and Mike Modano's 50 goals in 1993-94.
- The two also became just the third pair of teammates to score at least 45 goals in the same season since 2002-03, joining Leon Draisaitl and Connor McDavid who did so in 2022-23 for the Edmonton Oilers and Todd Bertuzzi and Markus Naslund who did so in 2002-03 for the Vancouver Canucks.
- Both of **Johnston** (41) and **Robertson** (51) recorded at least 40 assists this year, making them the third set of teammates in Stars/North Stars history to each register 40 goals and 40 assists in a single season according to NHL Stats. They joined Dino Ciccarelli and Brian Bellows (1987-88) as well as Ciccarelli and Bobby Smith (1981-82).

FAMILIAR FOES

- The 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs marks the third time in franchise history that the Stars have faced off against the Wild in a playoff series, owning a 2-0 record in their previous two postseason meetings.
- In all, the Stars have a 10-6 record against the Wild in 16 playoff games. The team's 10 wins and .588 win percentage against the Wild are tied for second and rank fifth, respectively, in NHL history.
 - A series win in the first round would give the Stars 12 playoff wins against the Wild, which would tie Chicago for the most against Minnesota in NHL history.
- Dallas has outscored Minnesota 55-48 in their 18 playoff games against each other. The Stars' 3.24 goals per game is the best mark of any team against the Wild in the postseason.
- The Stars have gone 22-for-66 on the power play against the Wild in the postseason. Their 33.2 percent conversion rate is the best mark of any team that has played Minnesota in the playoffs.
 - No team has scored more power-play goals against the Wild during the postseason than the Stars.

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999

- The Stars enter the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs looking to win their second Stanley Cup in franchise history after defeating the Buffalo Sabres in six games to bring the team's first championship to Dallas in 1999.
- At the time of the Stars' first Stanley Cup win, 10 players on the team's current roster had yet to be born: **Oskar Bäck**, **Mavrik Bourque**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Arttu Hyry**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Nils Lundkvist** and **Jason Robertson**.
 - **Heiskanen** (July 18, 1999) and **Robertson** (July 22, 1999) were both born about a month after the Stars hoisted the Stanley Cup.
- The Stars defeated the Sabres 2-1 on June 19, 1999 to secure the franchise's first-ever championship. On that day...
 - The number one song in the United States was "If You Had My Love" by Jennifer Lopez.
 - The number one movie was Disney's "Tarzan."
 - The 1999 FIFA Women's World Cup began the same day. The United States would ultimately go on to win the tournament, led by superstars Mia Hamm and Brandi Chastain.

PLAYOFF BOUND*

- The Stars clinched their berth to the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs with Utah's win over Los Angeles on March 22.
- The Stars are making their fifth consecutive postseason appearance, tied for the second-longest run in franchise history, behind seven straight playoff berths from 1980 to 1986.
- Dallas has made it to the Conference Finals in each of the past three postseasons. The Stars will look to become the third team in the past 40 years to reach the Conference Finals in four straight playoffs, following Colorado (4; 1999-2002) and Detroit (4; 1995-1998).
- The Stars have earned six series wins since 2023, the third most among all teams behind Florida (11) and Edmonton (7).

REGULAR SEASON RECAP

- The Stars ended the regular season with a 50-20-12 record, 112 points and a .683 points percentage, finishing the year ranked third in the NHL in wins (tied), points and points percentage.
- The 2025-26 campaign marked the team's fifth-consecutive 40-win season and is the first time in franchise history that the team has won at least 50 games for three straight years.
- Their 112 points and .683 points percentage were both tied for the third-best mark in a single season in franchise history and makes the 2025-26 season the fourth consecutive year that the team has finished the regular season with at least 100 points.
- The team's success this season came despite logging 314 man games lost with **Tyler Seguin**, **Jamie Benn**, **Mikko Rantanen** and others all missing significant time with injury.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- Four players appeared in all 82 regular-season games for the Stars this season: **Mavrik Bourque**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Esa Lindell** and **Jason Robertson**.

- The 2025-26 campaign is the fourth consecutive year that **Robertson** played in all 82 regular-season games. He finished the season riding a 374-game Iron Man streak, which is the second-longest such streak in franchise history and the eighth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- This is also the fourth-straight year that **Johnston** has played in all 82 games. He has not missed a regular-season game since making his NHL debut at the start of the 2022-23 season, making him one of 13 players in NHL history to begin their career by playing in at least 328 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

THE FINNISH FIVE

- Dallas' roster currently houses five Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Arttu Hyry**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' five Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**), Oulu (**Hyry**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- **Heiskanen**, **Hintz**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen**, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild forward Matt Boldy and defenseman Brock Faber played for Team USA in the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild forward Matt Boldy and defensemen Brock Faber and Quinn Hughes all won the gold medal with Team USA at the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild defenseman Quinn Hughes represented Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Jason Robertson** and Wild defenseman Quinn Hughes skated on Team USA together during the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Wild forward Quinn Hughes were teammates in Vancouver from 2019-20 to 2025-26.
 - Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** joined the two in Vancouver during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Wild forward Vinnie Hinostroza were teammates in Arizona for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons. They also played together in Buffalo in 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Wild forward Yakov Trenin played for Colorado during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Wild defenseman Jacob Middleton both represented Team Canada during the 2023 IIHF World Championship
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Wild forward Nick Foligno crossed paths in Columbus following the 2019 trade deadline.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Wild forward Nick Foligno shared the ice in Chicago during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** skated with Wild forward Robby Fabri in St. Louis during the 2024-25 season.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Wild forward Robby Fabri were teammates in Detroit from 2019-20 to 2022-23.

- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Wild defenseman Jeff Petry were teammates in Pittsburgh during the 2022-23 season.

- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverly** and Wild defenseman Zach Bogosian played for the Atlanta Thrashers from 2008-09 to 2010-11.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** and Wild defenseman Zach Bogosian played for the Winnipeg Jets during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Wild associate coach Jack Capuano both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1989-1990.
