

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 18, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS [5]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a back-to-back set last night at the United Center against the Chicago Blackhawks, falling 5–2. Chicago opened the scoring late in the first when Ryan Donato converted at 15:05, and Connor Bedard doubled the lead midway through the second. Matt Coronato responded on a Flames powerplay with just 28 seconds remaining in the period to bring Calgary within one heading into the third. Rasmus Andersson tied the game early in the final frame, but the Blackhawks quickly regained control as Bedard netted his second of the night at 4:57. Oliver Moore added insurance at 13:04, the Blackhawks tacked on an empty-netter in the final minute.

## TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Sabres. Calgary and Buffalo split their season-series in 2024-25, with the home team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-1-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 3-1-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

### **BEECH DAY:**

On Tuesday afternoon the Calgary Flames claimed forward John Beecher off waivers from the Boston Bruins. Beecher, a native of Elmira, NY, had skated in six games for the Boston Bruins, scoring one goal at the time of Calgary's claim. Beecher was selected in the first round (30<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2019 NHL Draft by Boston after three seasons at the University of Michigan where he would be named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2020 and help Michigan win the Big Ten Championship in 2022. The 24-year-old has 136 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 11 goals and 11 assists for 22 points along with 50 penalty minutes.

### **2024-25 SEASON RECAP VERSUS BUFFALO:**

The Flames and Sabres met twice during the 2024-25 season, with Calgary claiming three of a possible four points against Buffalo.

#### *GAME ONE (November 9, 2024 – at BUF):*

The Calgary Flames finished off a three-game eastern road swing on November 9 in Buffalo. The Sabres would open the scoring 1:11 into the contest with Zach Benson giving Buffalo an early advantage. The home side would get another to double their lead midway through the frame and carry that 2-0 advantage into the intermission. In the second, Matt Coronato got the Flames on the board and cut the deficit to one heading into the third. Calgary would outshoot Buffalo 12-4 in the final stanza, and Mikael Backlund drew the Flames even late in the period to force extra time. Overtime would solve nothing, and the Flames would eventually fall in a shootout, claiming a point at the KeyBank Center.

#### *GAME TWO (January 23, 2025 – vs. BUF):*

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Buffalo Sabres to the Scotiabank Saddledome on January 23<sup>rd</sup>. It would be the home-side who took a 1-0 lead into the first intermission after Jonathan Huberdeau converted on a shorthanded breakaway for his 19<sup>th</sup> of the campaign. In the second, Buffalo would score a pair before the midway point of the frame to flip the script, but Nazem Kadri would draw the Flames level, and nothing could separate these clubs through 40 minutes of play. In the final stanza, Calgary would solve Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen to reclaim their lead and clamp things down. Dustin Wolf made nine third period saves, and Calgary added a pair of empty netters to knock off the Sabres 5-2.

### **KLAP YOUR HANDS:**

Adam Klapka registered a game-high 11 hits last night in Chicago, establishing a new personal single-game best. His 11-hit performance marked the most by any Flames player in a game since Martin Pospisil recorded 11 on April 5, 2025, against the Vegas Golden Knights. Since the NHL began tracking hits in 2005–06, Klapka's total is tied for the most by any Flames player in a single game.

### **RICK AND MORTY:**

On Monday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of Sam Morton from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. In 16 American Hockey League contests this season, Morton has registered 12 points from four goals and eight assists, including a helper in his most recent outing on Sunday night in Henderson. The Lafayette, CO native skated in 70 games for the Wranglers in 2024-25, posting 20 goals and 25 assists for 45 points in his first full professional campaign. He also produced four game-winning goals, tied for the third-most on the team last season. Morton made his NHL debut last season, suiting up for the Flames season finale in Los Angeles on April 17<sup>th</sup>, celebrating the occasion by scoring his first NHL goal.

### **ON THE HUNT:**

Monday morning also saw the Flames announce the recall of forward Dryden Hunt from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Hunt has appeared in 15 games for the Wranglers this season, recording five goals and 11 assists for a team-leading 16 points. Last season, he skated in five games with the Flames and registered three assists, while producing 49 points (16G, 33A) in 49 AHL contests. The 29-year-old has played 235 career NHL games — including 33 with Calgary — and has totaled 18 goals and 36 assists for 54 points, along with 121 penalty minutes.



**BACK-TO-BACKS:**

The Calgary Flames are prepared finish their fourth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season following last night’s setback at the United Center in Chicago. Calgary’s last back-to-back set came on November 1<sup>st</sup> when they faced the Nashville Predators at Bridgestone Arena before heading to Philadelphia the following night. The Flames have five more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their next coming on November 22<sup>nd</sup> when they welcome to Dallas Stars to the Scotiabank Saddledome before heading to Rogers Arena for their second meeting with the Vancouver Canucks on November 23<sup>rd</sup>.


**HUBY DOO:**

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 791 points in his NHL career and is just nine-shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,012) and Mark Scheifele (831) There are 25-active skaters who has surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

**HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Flames new acquisition John Beecher was teammates with Sabres defenceman Owen Power at the University of Michigan for two seasons (2020–21 and 2021–22). The duo helped the Wolverines capture the Big Ten Championship in their second year together, with Beecher contributing an assist in the Big Ten Final as Michigan edged the Minnesota Golden Gophers 4–3.

Adam Klapka, Matt Coronato, Sam Morton, Yan Kuznetsov, Sam Honzek, and Dustin Wolf were all teammates on the Calgary Wranglers during the 2024 Calder Cup Playoffs. Klapka paced the club with seven points in six postseason games, while Coronato (1-5—6) and Morton (3-1—4) finished second and fourth on the team in playoff scoring, respectively. Between the pipes, Dustin Wolf started all six contests, posting a .924 save percentage, a 2.84 goals-against average, and one shutout.
