#### PITTSBURGH PENGUINS

**All-Time Wild Record:** 16-18-2 (7-9-2 at Grand Casino Arena, 9-9-0 at Pittsburgh)

**2025-26:** Pittsburgh won the series-opening contest, 4-1, at Grand Casino Arena (10/30)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-0=1) scored the Wild's lone goal, with C **Marco Rossi** (0-1=1) and LW **Marcus Johansson** (0-1=1) picking up assists...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 30-of-34 shots faced for Minnesota...D **Kris Letang** (0-2=2), RW **Bryan Rust** (1-1=2) and D **Ryan Shea** (1-1=2) led the Penguins with two points each...C **Ben Kindel** (1-0=1) and RW **Anthony Mantha** (1-0=1) also scored...G **Tristan Jarry** saved 26-of-27 shots faced to earn the win for Pittsburgh.

**WILD LEADERS:** Johansson leads Minnesota with 26 points (10-16=26) in 45 career games against Pittsburgh...RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 23 points (7-16=23) in 37 games...D **Zach Bogosian** (4-9=13, in 33 games) and RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (4-9=13, in 22 games) have 13 points each...D **Jonas Brodin** has 12 points (3-9=12) in 21 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** Gustavsson is 1-4-0 with a 3.82 GAA and a .881 SV% in five games (four starts) vs. Pittsburgh...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced the Penguins.

**PENGUINS LEADERS:** C **Sidney Crosby** leads Pittsburgh with 40 points (14-26=40) in 27 career games against Minnesota...D **Erik Karlsson** owns 36 points (9-27=36) in 32 games...C **Evgeni Malkin** owns 28 points (12-16=28) in 23 matches...Letang has 22 points (4-18=22) in 25 contests.

**PENGUINS GOALIES:** Jarry is 5-0-1 with a 2.31 GAA and a .921 SV% in six career starts vs. the Wild...G **Arturs Silovs** and G **Sergei Murashov** have not faced Minnesota.

**CONNECTIONS:** Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** totaled 57 points (26-31=57) in 95 games with Pittsburgh in two seasons (2008-10), winning the Stanley Cup in 2009...Guerin spent eight seasons in the Penguins' front office (2011-19), including five seasons (2014-19) as Assistant General Manager where he won two more Stanley Cups (2016, 2017)...Minnesota Head Coach **John Hynes** served as Head Coach of Wilkes-Barre Scranton for five seasons (2010-15) and one season as an Assistant Coach (2009-10)...Hynes led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs as Head Coach...Gustavsson was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft...F **Vinnie Hinostroza** played in 14 games for Pittsburgh during the 2023-24 season, posting three points (1-2=3)...Crosby played at Shattuck St. Mary's (2002-03)...C **Connor Dewar** was drafted by Minnesota in the third round (No. 92 overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and collected 38 points (18-20=38) in 173 across three seasons (2021-24) with the Wild...D **Matt Dumba** was selected seventh overall by the Wild in the 2012 NHL Draft and collected 236 points (79-157=236), 399 PIM and a plus-29 rating in 598 games in 10 seasons (2013-23) with Minnesota...C **Tommy Novak** played four seasons at the University of Minnesota (2015-19) and played high school hockey at St. Thomas Academy...C **Blake Lizotte** is from Lindstrom and played two seasons at St. Cloud State University (2017-19)...RW **Justin Brazeau** tallied two points (1-1=2) in 19 games with Minnesota last season...Wild Player Development Advisor **Alex Goligoski** was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (No. 61 overall) of the 2004 NHL Draft and recorded 90 points (3-67=90) in 177 games across four seasons (2007-11) with the Penguins...Penguins Assistant Coach **Nick Bonino** appeared in 55 games and recorded 26 points (10-16=26) in one season (2020-21) with the Wild...Penguins Player Development Coach **Matt Cullen** was born in Virginia, Minn., played at Moorhead High School and St. Cloud State, and recorded 123 points (44-79=123) in 272 games across four seasons (2010-13, 2017-18) with the Wild.

### NOTES & MILESTONES

**Team:** Owns an active six-game point streak (5-0-1), tied for the second-longest active streak in the NHL...Is 7-1-1 in November, leading the NHL with 15 points and ranking T-1st with seven wins and second with a .833 point percentage...Has not trailed in regulation since a 4-3 loss at CAR (11/6), a streak of six consecutive games (11/11 - 11/19) and 372:21 of TOI. The franchise record stands at 414:32 (2014-15 season)...Has allowed 1.89 goals/game in nine games since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL...Ranks second the NHL with a 1.83 team GAA and T-2nd with a .937 team SV% since Nov. 1...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 20 PPG and fifth with a 25.6 PP% this season...Has scored first in 10 consecutive games since 10/30, marking the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak in the NHL since Los Angeles scored first in 10 straight games from March 29 - April 15, 2025.

**Matt Boldy:** Scored his first career SHG vs. CAR (11/19), as well as the game-deciding shootout goal...Owns an active five-game point streak (4-3=7) and has six goals and nine points (6-3=9) in his last seven games...Ranks T-1st on team in in goals (11) and second in points (11-11=22) and assists (11)...Ranks T-8th in the NHL with five PPG and 10 PPP (5-5=10)...Has played in 176 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 26th-longest active streak in the NHL.

**Zeev Buuium:** Ranks T-1st among NHL rookies with seven power-play points (2-5=7) and five PPA, fourth with a 18:54 TOI/G average, fifth with seven assists and T-6th with 10 points (3-7=10)...Ranks T-4th among NHL defensemen in PPP and T-6th in PPA.

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Tallied a goal (1-0=1) and skated a season-high 24:32 vs. VGK (11/16)...Leads the NHL in faceoffs won (239) and ranks second in total faceoffs taken (458)...Ranks T-3rd on the team with 10 assists.

**Brock Faber:** Scored his a goal and registered a game-high 25:45 of TOI v. CAR (11/19)...Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (four), T-7th in points (4-6=10) and eighth in shots (29).

**Marcus Johansson:** Owns 13 points (6-7=13) in his last 13 games...Recorded a career-long nine-game point streak (5-6=11) from 10/25 - 11/9, tied for the fifth-longest streak in the NHL this season.

**Kirill Kaprizov:** Scored the 11th OTG of his NHL career vs. VGK (11/16), furthering his Wild franchise record...Since Kaprizov entered the NHL in 2020, only Carolina's Sebastian Aho has more OTG (13)...Owns 14 points (6-8=14) in his last 13 games...Leads the team in points (11-13=24) and assists and ranks T-1st in goals...Ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPG (six), T-8th in shots (73) and PPP (6-4=10)...Owns 113 career home goals in 174 games, tied with Mikko Koivu (517 games) for most home goals in franchise history...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 68 career PPG, trailing Zach Parise (69), and third with 141 power-play points (68-73=141), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).

**Yakov Trenin:** Scored his first goal of the season vs. VGK (11/16)...Ranks second in the NHL with 91 hits this season.

**Jesper Wallstedt:** Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie...Leads the NHL with two shutouts and ranks second in SV% (.926) and fourth in GAA (2.20)...Has not lost in regulation this season (5-0-2), marking the longest season-opening point streak by a rookie in Wild history...Is the second goalie in franchise history to open a season with points in seven consecutive appearances (Backstrom, 6-0-1 in 7 GP from Oct. 11-27, 2008)...Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall...Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goalie in team history to record consecutive shutouts...Notched his first shutout of the season vs. CGY (11/9) with 36 saves...Now with three career shutouts, joins Josh Harding (3) as the only Wild goaltenders to earn three or more shutouts as a rookie.

**Danila Yurov:** Recorded his first career multi-assist and multi-point outing with two assists vs. CAR (11/19) while skating a career-high 14:20 of TOI.

**Mats Zuccarello:** Scored his first goal of the season vs. CAR (11/19)...Owns six points (1-5=6) in six games played this season since returning from injury on 11/7 at NYI.

## WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations Bill Guerin is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach John Hynes, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager Chris Kelleher, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer John Worley and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist Travis Green, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon Joel Boyd, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward Nico Sturm was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

# TEAM NOTES



## ON THE POWER PLAY

- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 20 PPG and fifth with a 25.6 PP% this season.
- Through the first 21 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-4th in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

## LOCKING IT DOWN

- Has allowed 1.89 goals/game in eight games since Nov. 1, the second-best mark in the NHL.

## OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 10 consecutive games since 10/30, marking the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak in the NHL since Los Angeles scored first in 10 straight games from March 29 – April 15, 2025.
- Has scored first in 13 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL.
- Has not trailed in regulation since a 4-3 loss at CAR (11/6), a streak of six consecutive games (11/11 - 11/19) and 372:21 of TOI. The franchise record stands at 414:32 (2014-15 season).
- Owns a 9-2-2 record (.769) when scoring first this season.
- As a franchise, holds a 665-178-108 all-time record (.756) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns 14 points (6-8=14) in his last 13 games.
- Leads the team in points (11-13=24) and assists and ranks T-1st in goals.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPG (six), T-8th in shots (73) and PPP (6-4=10).
- Owns 113 career home goals in 174 games, tied with Mikko Koivu (517 games) for most home goals in franchise history.
- Currently ranks second in franchise history with 68 career PPG, trailing Zach Parise (69), and third with 141 power-play points (68-73=141), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at NYI (11/7) to tally the 113th MPG of his NHL career and now sits one back of Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second-most in Wild history.
- With a goal vs. PIT (10/30), became the third player in Wild history with a point in each of the team's first six home games to start a season (Zuccarello, 11 GP in 2023-24; Bouchard, 6 GP in 2005-06)
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Currently at 213 career assists, needs six assists to pass Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Opened the season with a four-game point streak from 10/9 - 10/14. Per #NHL Stats, became the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Currently with 42 career multi-assist games, tied with Mats Zuccarello (42) for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.

- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

## THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is now 35-26-10 with a 2.58 GAA, .914 SV% and seven shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks T-1st in the NHL in road shutouts, fourth in road GAA and T-4th in road SV% during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 78-53-19 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-5th with 12 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, 2025, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout.
- Stopped a penalty shot at SEA (3/4/25) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20/25 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15/25), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
