AT A GLANCE

HOME SWEET HOME

The Kings return to Los Angeles after winning their first two games of the 2024-25 campaign held at Crypto.com Arena (3-2 W on Oct. 24 vs. SJS; 3-2 W on Oct. 26 vs. UTA). The team ended 2023-24 campaign having won nine of their last 10 home games, including eight consecutive victories at Crypto.com Arena from March 11 through April 13 to mark the team's longest home winning streak since the 2010-11 campaign (8-0-0 from Oct. 12-Nov. 13, 2010).

EDDY'S READY

Defenseman **Joel Edmundson** notched his first two goals as a member of the LA Kings on Saturday against Utah as part of his first career multi-goal game (2-0=2). By doing so, Edmundson (31 years, 120 days) became the second oldest Kings defenseman at the time of his first career multi-goal game behind **Jaroslav Modry** (31 years, 248 days on Nov. 2, 2002), per NHL PR. Edmundson became the 10th different blueliner in team history whose first franchise goal came in a multi-goal performance, and just the fifth to do so in the last 30 years. Among franchise skaters overall, Edmundson is the 35th different Kings skater overall to record such feat. He is also the 20th different player in team history who first two goals were also part of their first career multi-goal game.

HOW SWEDE IT IS

Forward **Adrian Kempe** skates into Crypto.com Arena for the third home-ice appearance of his ninth season in Los Angeles. On Saturday afternoon against Utah, the winger picked up his fourth and fifth assists of the season for his third multi-point effort of the 2024-25 season. Kempe's second-period helper marked his 100th career power-play point (30-17=100). Kempe becomes the seventh skater born outside of North America, and the first Swede, to tally 100 career power-play points with the Kings. Kempe's three multi-point games are the most among Kings skaters this season and his eight points (3-5=8) are tied with **Alex Laferriere** (5-3=8) and trails only **Anze Kopitar** (3-6=9) for the team lead.
