- Dallas established a new franchise record after extending its road point streak to 12 games. The previous record stood for over 20 years an 11-game run in 2002-03, according to NHL Stats.
- Jake Oettinger earned the 161st win of his career and surpassed Ed Belfour (160) for the third most in Stars/North Stars history.
 - Oettinger also stopped all 30 shots faced and moved into a tie with Ben Bishop (14) for the fifth-most shutouts in franchise history, according to NHL Stats.
- Mikko Rantanen scored Dallas' third goal, extending his point streak against the Devils to five games, earning seven points (5-2—7) during that span.
- Esa Lindell tallied two assists on Wednesday, passing Lou Nanne (225) for 10th-most points by a defenseman in franchise history.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games that the Stars will play against the Sharks this season. The two teams will face each other again on Dec. 18 and Jan. 10, with both games being played in San Jose.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars ranked second in the NHL in wins (18), points (41) and points percentage (.732) this year. The
 team's success this season comes despite having 113 combined man games lost with Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Lian Bichsel, Matt

Duchene, Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Roope Hintz, Nils Lundkvist and Ilya Lyubushkin all missing multiple games with injury at various points this season.

- Mikko Rantanen (105) and Jason Robertson (105) are both pacing to finish the season with more than 100 points. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the second set of Stars teammates to have concurrent 100-point seasons, joining Bobby Smith (114) and Dino Ciccarelli (106) who did so during the 1981-82 season for the Minnesota North Stars.
- Kyle Capobianco scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Dec. 2 against the New York Rangers, making him the 23rd Stars skaters to score a goal for the Stars this season. Entering play Thursday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have at least 23 unique goal scorers this season.
 - Eight defensemen have scored a goal for the Stars this year, the most of any team this season entering play Thursday.
- Dallas defensemen have combined for 55 assists and 68 points this season, both of which ranked third in the NHL entering play
- Sam Steel enters tonight's game one assist shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career assists.

SHARK BAIT

- Dallas is 77-51-14 all-time vs. San Jose, including a 38-24-8 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned wins in their last six consecutive games against the Sharks, dating back to March 2, 2024. Dallas has also won their last four games vs. San Jose at American Airlines Center.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Sharks (2-1—3). He also has 16 points (6-10—16) in his last 10 games played vs. San Jose dating back to April 16, 2022.
 - In all, Benn has registered 51 points (21-30—51) in 53 career games played against San Jose, which is the fourth-highest total of any active NHL skater.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak against San Jose, collecting 13 points (7-6—13) during that span. His five-game point streak against the Sharks is tied for his second-longest point streak against a single opponent in his career - also New Jersey (4-4-8, 5 GP) and Los Angeles (4-2-6, 5 GP).
 - In all, Johnston has 13 points (7-6—13) in nine career games against the Sharks, averaging 1.44 points per game and carries a plus-minus rating of +8.
 - His 13 career points against them include scoring his first career hat trick and notching a career-high five points (3-2—5) on March 5, 2024.
- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup riding a nine-game point streak against the Sharks, earning 14 points (7-7—14) during that span. It is tied for his third-longest point streak against a single opponent in his career – also Nashville (4-11—15, 9 GP).
 - In all, Robertson has totaled 16 points (8-8—16) in 12 career games played vs. San Jose, averaging 1.33 points per game and upholds a plus-minus rating of +6.
 - He has tallied points in 10 of his 12 career games against them.
- Mikko Rantanen has registered 31 points (17-14—31) in 26 career games played against the Sharks, averaging 1.19 points per game and upholds a plus-minus rating of +16. His plus-minus rating against them tops all active Stars skaters.
 - He enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak vs. San Jose, collecting four points (3-1—4) during that span.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak against the Sharks, earning six points (3-3—6) during that span. In 11 career games vs. San Jose, Hintz has recorded 10 points (6-4-10) with a plus-minus rating of +7.
- Miro Heiskanen has registered 15 points (2-13—15) in 15 career games against the Sharks while averaging 24:52 of time on ice per game played. His average time on ice vs. San Jose ranks fifth among active NHL defensemen.

SEEING STARS

- Wyatt Johnston was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marks the first time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
- Johnston has totaled 31 points (16-15—31) in 28 games played this year and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team and tied for 15th in the NHL in scoring this season entering play Thursday. His 16 goals this season were tied for sixth in the League entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, Johnston was tied for fifth in goals and seventh in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- Johnston was one of five players under the age of 23 to have at least 30 points this year entering play Thursday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 14-26—40), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 17-21—38), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 14-22—36) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 15-15-30).
- Eighteen (12-6—18) of Johnston's 31 points this season have come on the power play, which was tied with teammate Mikko Rantanen (4-14—18) for the League lead entering play Thursday.
- Johnston's 12 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Thursday and were five more than the second-ranked skater (seven tied with seven). His 12 power-play goals are already a career high and are 10 shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
 - Mike Modano currently holds the Dallas Stars team record with 18 in 1993-94.
- Johnston had scored as many or more power-play goals than 12 NHL teams this season entering play Thursday: Philadelphia (12), Calgary (11), NY Rangers (11), Seattle (11), Tampa Bay (11), Utah (11), Washington (11), Columbus (9), NY Islanders (9), Carolina (8), Los Angeles (7) and Toronto (7).
- Johnston is currently on pace to finish the year with 47 goals, 44 assists and 91 points, all of which would be career highs.

- Johnston is also on pace to finish the season with 53 power-play points, which would be a career high and set a single-season franchise record.
- Johnston scored the fourth hat trick of his career and added an assist for his second four-point game of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 30 against the Senators. He became the third player in Stars/North Stars history with four career hat tricks before age 23 according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli and Tyler Seguin (both with five).
- Johnston had four points (1-3—4) in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Oilers an 8-3 Stars win scoring one power-play goal and adding three assists. It was his highest single-game point total since he had a career-high five points (3-2—5) on March 5, 2024 against the Nashville Predators.
 - His performance against Edmonton marked the third time in his career that he has had at least four points in a game. He joined Tyler Seguin (6x) as the second player in Stars team history to register as many at age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's second assist of the night was the 200th point of his NHL career, making him the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the club. He is the first player in Stars team history with 200 career points at age 22 or younger, and the fifth in franchise history alongside Brian Bellows (342), Mike Modano (309), Bobby Smith (222) and Tom McCarthy (202) according to NHL Stats.
- Among players to debut with the Stars, Johnston (100-100—200 in 269 games played) became the third-fastest player in team history to record 200 NHL points behind Jason Robertson (190 games played) and Roope Hintz (263 games played) according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's second assist of the night also marked the 100th assist of his NHL career. He became the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists and the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the Stars.
- Johnston (100-100—200) became the 10th active player to have 100 goals and 100 assists at the time of his 200th career point according to NHL Stats. He joined Alex DeBrincat, Tyler Toffoli, James van Riemsdyk, Conor Sheary, Nino Niederreiter, Sam Bennett, Victor Olofsson and Joel Armia.
- Johnston's scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North
- Johnston, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- Johnston recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since Tyler Seguin had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
 - Both of Johnston's goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
 - Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson was named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- Robertson has totaled 36 points (17-19—36) in 28 games played this season, leading the team in scoring and tying for fourth in the NHL in points entering play Thursday.
 - Robertson's 17 goals were tied for fourth in the League entering play Thursday.
- Robertson is currently on pace to finish the season with 50 goals, which would be a career high and would tie for the fourth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
- Robertson was leading all American NHLers in both goals (17) and points (36) this season entering play Thursday.
- Robertson's 114 shots on goal this year were tied for the most in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
- During even-strength play this season when Robertson has been on the ice, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 33-15. His plus-18 on-ice goal differential was tied for the fifth-best mark among all NHL forwards this year entering play Thursday.
- Robertson played in his 400th NHL game on Sunday against the Senators. In reaching the milestone, he became the 47th player in franchise history and the 13th skater selected in the 2017 NHL draft to play in 400 regular-season games.
 - Robertson's 429 career points (184-245—429) are the third-most in franchise history through a player's first 400 games with the team and the fifth-most in NHL history among American-born players through their first 400 career games.
- Robertson scored the 184th goal of his career in that game, which was the second-most by a player through 400 career games with the Stars/North Stars (NHL debut or otherwise) behind Dino Ciccarelli (221) according to NHL Stats. He also passed Kyle Connor (183) for the eighth-most goals through 400 games by a U.S.-born player in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored in seven consecutive games from Nov. 11 to 25, finding the back of the net 11 times in total during that span. His seven-game goal streak was the longest in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
- Robertson's seven-game goal streak was the longest of his career and the longest by a Stars skater since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94. It is also tied for the second-longest by an American skater since the start of the 2005-06 season according to NHL Stats, trailing only Auston Matthew's eight-game goal streak in 2023-24.

- Robertson's 11 goals over the course of his seven-game goal streak were the most ever by a Stars skater. The previous record was held by Bill Goldsworthy, who scored nine goals over the course of a seven-game goal streak from Feb. 6 to 17, 1971.
- When he extended his goal streak to six games on Nov. 22 against the Flames, Robertson became the fifth player in Stars/ North Stars history to have multiple six-game goal streaks according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (2x), Danny Grant (2x) and Bill Goldsworthy (2x).
- From Nov. 13 to 18, Robertson recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. Robertson previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to
- Robertson scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.
- He scored a goal and had two assists including on Roope Hintz's overtime winner on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators.
- Robertson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game riding a season-long eight-game point streak dating back to Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks, posting a 6-0-2 record in those contests.
 - The team has earned at least a point in 20 of their last 22 games played.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would extend the team's point streak to nine games for the first time since the team earned a point in 10 consecutive games from March 16 to April 3, 2025, posting an 8-0-2 record during that span.
- The Stars extended their road point streak to 12 games with their 3-0 win over New Jersey on Dec. 3, setting a franchise record for consecutive road games played with a point.
- A victory tonight would give Dallas wins in three consecutive home games for the second time this season after previously doing so from Oct. 25 to Nov. 4.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's game having recorded a point in each of the last four games that he has played in. A goal or an assist tonight would extend his point streak to five games for the third time this season. If he were to score tonight it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the second time this season (last: Nov. 11 to 6).
 - He has totaled seven points (2-5—7) during this current stretch.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have not allowed a power-play goal against in their last six games played, going a perfect 19-for-19 while shorthanded during that span.
- If they were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would give them seven consecutive games without allowing a power-play goal against for the first time since Dec. 8, to 27, 2024 when they went eight straight games without surrendering a power-play goal.
- Dallas has gone a perfect 5-for-5 on the penalty kill twice this season: on Nov. 26 against the Seattle Kraken and on Dec. 2 against the New York Rangers.
- In all this season, the penalty killing unit of Esa Lindell, Miro Heiskanen, Colin Blackwell and Sam Steel have played 17:03 together while shorthanded. During that time, the unit has only allowed one power-play goal against according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Entering play Thursday, Lindell was leading the NHL in total shorthanded ice time (115:36) and ranked second in shorthanded ice time per game (4:08) this season.

LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- Esa Lindell recorded two primary assists in Dallas' last game, a 3-0 win over the New Jersey Devils. It marked his first multi-assist game since March 31, 2025 against the Seattle Kraken.
 - Lindell was on the ice for all three Stars goals against the Devils.
- Lindell's first assist of the night was the 226th point of his career, which gave him sole possession of 10th on the franchise's all-time scoring list by defensemen, surpassing Lou Nanne (225).
 - He is now four points shy of tying Trevor Daley (231) for ninth.
- With 10 points (2-8—10) in 28 games this year, Lindell is now on pace to finish the season with 21 assists, which would tie his career high that he has reached on three previous occasions. His 10 points are tied for the second-most among Stars defensemen
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Lindell has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars...
 - Are outscoring their opponents 30-15.
 - Have 16 high-danger goals for to their opponent's five.
 - Own a 57.8 expected goals for percentage.
 - Have a 59.6 high-danger chances for percentage.

- Lindell is leading the Stars in 5-on-5 in on-ice goals for (30), high-danger on-ice goals for (16) and expected goals for percentage (57.8 percent) this season.
- Lindell's ranked 10th and 11th, respectively, in the NHL this year in 5-on-5 on-ice goals for (30) and high-danger on-ice goals for (16) according to Natural Stat Trick entering play Thursday. His 57.7 expected goals for percentage ranked 10th among players that have had at least 400 minutes of 5-on-5 ice time this season.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** made 30 saves in Dallas' last game to backstop the Stars to a 3-0 shutout win over the New Jersey Devils. He saved 2.5 goals above expected in the win according to MoneyPuck.com.
- Oettinger's performance against the Devils was the 14th shutout of his career, which tied Ben Bishop for the fifth-most in franchise history. He also tied Brent Johnson for the 24th-most by an American-born goaltender in NHL history.
- His victory over the Devils was also the 161st win of **Oettinger's** career, which gave him sole possession of third place on the franchise's all-time wins list, surpassing Ed Belfour (160).
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 12 games this season, which was tied for second in the NHL entering play Thursday. Only Colorado's Scott Wedgewood (13) had won more.
- Oettinger has won the last four games that he has played dating back to Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks. If he were to win
 the next game he plays, it would extend his win streak to five games for the first time since he won six consecutive games from
 March 18 to April 3, 2025.
 - o It would make him the 12th netminder this season to have a win streak of at least five games.
- His current four-game win streak was tied for the fourth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Thursday.

2025 WRAPPED

- Tonight marks the third of 14 games the Stars will play this month. The games will be split evenly between home and road, with seven games being played at the American Airlines Center and seven being played on the road.
- Since Jan. 1, 2025, the Stars have posted a 46-18-10 record for 102 points and a .689 points percentage. Entering play Thursday, the team's 46 wins and 102 points led the League this calendar year and their .689 points percentage ranked second.
- 2025 is the fourth consecutive calendar year that the team has earned at least 100 points and had a points percentage above .600.
 - The Stars have had a points percentage above .500 in 31 of the 32 full calendar years that the team has spent in Dallas (since 1994) since relocating from Minnesota.
- The team's 46 wins in 2025 are already tied for their ninth-most in a calendar year since 1994 the team's first full calendar year in Dallas trailing only 2022 (54), 2006 (54), 2024 (52), 2015 (52), 1997 (51), 2007 (48), 1999 (47) and 1998 (47).
- Dallas' 100 points are their 12th-most in a calendar year since 1994 despite having 12 games left to play in 2025.
- **Jason Robertson** is the Stars' leading scorer in 2025, totaling 88 points (43-45—88) in 74 games played. Entering play Thursday, his 88 points and 43 goals ranked fourth and second, respectively, in the NHL in 2025.
 - Robertson's 88 points are already the sixth-most in a calendar year in Stars team history (since 1994) and his 43 goals are the third-most. Robertson currently holds the Stars team record with 108 points and 56 goals in 2022.
- Wyatt Johnston was tied for 14th in the NHL in 2025 scoring entering play Thursday, recording 77 points (40-37—77) in 74 games played. His 40 goals were tied for sixth in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
 - o Johnston was also leading the League in power-play goals (21) and points (36) in 2025 entering play Thursday.
 - His 40 goals are already the fifth-most in a calendar year in Stars team history (since 1994). He enters tonight's game two goals shy of tying Tyler Seguin (42) in 2014 for the fourth-most.
- Despite missing 12 regular-season games this calendar year, Thomas Harley's 13 goals this year were the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen in 2025 entering play Thursday.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 31-13-5 record with a .908 save percentage, 2.70 goals-against average and three shutouts in 2025. His 31 wins were tied for the second most this calendar year entering play Thursday.
 - Oettinger's 31 wins in 2025 are already tied for the 10th-most in a calendar year in Dallas Stars team history (since 1994).

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 29-for-92 on the power play this season for a 31.5 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas' 29 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL and were seven more than the second-ranked Minnesota Wild (22) entering play Thursday.
- Dallas is averaging 1.04 power-play goals per game this season, the best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 19-for-47 on the power play for a 40.4 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Thursday. Their 19 home power-play goals were the most in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
 - o The team is averaging a League-best 1.46 power-play goals per game at home this season.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game nine different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida, on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim, on Nov. 25 at Edmonton, on Nov. 28 vs. Utah and on Nov. 30 vs. Ottawa. Entering play Thursday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in eight games.
 - o No other team had scored multiple power-play goals in more than six games this season entering play Thursday.

- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 29 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (12), Jason Robertson (5), Mikko Rantanen (4), Roope Hintz (3), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
 - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Rantanen (4-14—18) and Johnston (12-6—18) were tied for the League lead in power-play scoring this season entering play Thursday followed by Robertson (5-10—15) who was tied for third and Hintz (3-9—12) who was tied for 10th.
- Johnston's 12 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Thursday and were five more than the second-ranked skater (seven tied with seven). His 12 power-play goals are already a career high and are 10 shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
 - Mike Modano currently holds the Dallas Stars team record with 18 in 1993-94.
- Johnston had scored as many or more power-play goals than 12 NHL teams this season entering play Thursday: Philadelphia (12), Calgary (11), NY Rangers (11), Seattle (11), Tampa Bay (11), Utah (11), Washington (11), Columbus (9), NY Islanders (9), Carolina (8), Los Angeles (7) and Toronto (7).
- Rantanen (54) and Johnston (53) are both on pace to set career highs in power-play points and set franchise records for most power-play points in a single season by a Stars skater.
 - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- Heiskanen has totaled 10 points (1-9—10) on the power-play this season, which was the second-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- **Roope Hintz** has totaled seven points (4-3—7) in his last seven games played.
- Hintz recorded his 400th NHL point with an assist in Dallas' last game, a 3-0 win over New Jersey. In reaching the milestone he hecame:
 - The 18th player in franchise history to record 400 points with the team.
 - The 23rd Finnish player in NHL history to total 400 career points.
 - The 14th player from the 2015 draft class to have 400 NHL points.
- Hintz is the third-fastest skater in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and seventh-fastest Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 NHL points according to NHL Stats.
- Hintz has totaled 23 points (8-15—23) in 23 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranking fifth on the Stars in scoring despite missing five games with an injury this year.
- Hintz's current offensive output puts him on pace to finish the year with 50 assists and 77 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward.
- When Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 21-8 according to Natural Stat Trick.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

- The Stars posted an 11-2-2 record in 15 games played in November, tying for the League lead in wins (11) and points (24) and ranking third in points percentage (.800) last month.
- Dallas' 62 goals scored and 4.13 goals per game in November tied for first and second in the NHL, respectively.
 - The team's 41 5-on-5 goals in November tied for second in the NHL.
- The Stars have gone 18-for-51 on the power in November for a 35.3 percent success rate on the man advantage, which was the best mark in the NHL last month. No team has scored more power-play goals in November than the Stars.
- The Stars 11 wins, 24 points and 62 goals scored last month are all their most ever in the month of November since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.

- Every skater that played in a game for the Stars in November recorded at least one point.
- Jason Robertson (12-11—23) led the League lead in goals (13) and tied for the lead in points (26) in November.
 - Robertson tied Bill Goldsworthy and Brian Bellows (both with four) for the third most 10-goal calendar months in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Dino Ciccarelli (10) and Mike Modano (6).
 - Robertson was named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November
- Mikko Rantanen (6-15—21) ranked sixth in the League in scoring in November followed by Wyatt Johnston (10-10—20) who was tied for seventh.
- Miro Heiskanen (1-16—17) tied for the League lead in scoring among defensemen in November. His 16 assists ranked second among all NHL skaters last month.

MIRO THE HERO

- Miro Heiskanen has 24 points (4-20—24) in 28 games played this season, ranking fourth on the Stars and tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen in scoring this season entering play Thursday.
 - His 20 assists were tied for 15th in the NHL and third among defensemen this season entering play Thursday.
- Heiskanen is averaging 25:57 of ice time per game this season, which was the third-highest total in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Heiskanen played in his 500th NHL game on Nov. 28, a 4-3 win over the Utah Mammoth. In reaching the milestone, he became...
 - The 34th player and 16th defensemen to play in 500 games for the Stars.
 - The second player (Nico Hischier) drafted in 2017 to play in 500 NHL games.
 - o The 46th Finnish player and 13th Finnish defenseman to play in 500 NHL games.
- Heiskanen tallied two assists against Utah, the second of which was the 305th point of his career. He surpassed Philadelphia's Rasmus Ristolainen for eighth place on the NHL's all-time points list among Finnish defensemen.
- His 305 career points (61-244—305) are the fourth-most by a Stars defensemen through his first 500 games played according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen's performance against the Mammoth was also the 54th career multi-assist game, tying Craig Hartsburg for the second most in franchise history among defensemen according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time in Dallas' Nov. 22 game against the Calgary Flames, a 3-2 shootout loss. It was the most ice time any skater in the NHL has had in a single game this season entering play Thursday.
 - It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
 - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
 - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone.
 - o The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
 - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- Heiskanen recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied Roope Hintz (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied Hintz for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. Hintz first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
 - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
 - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- **Heiskanen** tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
 - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
 - o **Heiskanen** last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- Heiskanen scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the
 game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- **Heiskanen's** six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- After trailing 2-0, the Stars came back to defeat the Utah Mammoth 4-3 in their game on Nov. 29, marking the fifth time this season
 that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, which was tied for the most in the NHL entering
 play Thursday.
 - There have been seven games this season in which the Stars have been trailing by two goals and have comeback to earn at least one point, going 5-0-2 in those games.
- Overall, the Stars have eight comeback wins this year, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Additionally, Dallas has won six games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 16-4 during 5-on-5 play when defenseman **Alexander Petrovic** is on the ice. His 16 on-ice goals for plus-12 goal differential tied for fourth and second on the team during that span.
- Petrovic's plus-12 even-strength on-ice goal differential since Nov. 8 was tied for the seventh-best mark among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Thursday.

- **Petrovic** notched an assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 28 against Utah and now has seven points (1-6—7) in 26 games played this season, ranking fourth among Stars defensemen in scoring. He is currently on pace to finish the season with four goals, 21 assists and 25 points, all of which would be career highs.
- **Petrovic** skated 22:12 of ice time in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Edmonton Oilers, his highest single-game total since he skated 24:02 on Oct. 19, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was a member of the Florida Panthers.
- Petrovic scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 against the Montreal Canadiens, a 7-0 Stars win. It marked his first regular-season NHL goal since April 2, 2018.
- **Petrovic** finished the Stars' game against the Canadiens with a plus-5 plus/minus rating. It marked the highest plus/minus rating in a single game in his career and the best mark by a Stars defenseman since Ryan Suter (plus-5) on March 9, 2023 at Buffalo.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (320) and **Wyatt Johnston** (274).
- Robertson's 320-game Iron Man streak was tied for the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 24 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 274 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Thursday, it was the 12th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Johnston was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - o Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected
 to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in
 international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before Heiskanen had to withdraw due to injury.
 - o Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - o Lindell and Rantanen won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final
 against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL
 began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

CONNECTIONS

- Sharks forward Ty Dellandrea was drafted by Dallas with the 13th pick in the 2018 NHL Draft and played with the Stars from 2020-21 to 2023-24.
- Sharks defenseman John Klingberg was selected by Dallas in the fifth round of the 2010 NHL Draft and played with the Stars from 2014-15 to 2021-22.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Nathan Bastian** and Sharks forward **Alex Wennberg** were all a part of the Seattle Kraken's inaugural roster in 2021-22. **Blackwell** and **Bastian** were the team's expansion selections and **Wennberg** signed with the team as a free agent.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Sharks forward Alex Wennberg both played for the Blue Jackets in 2018-19.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Tyler Seguin won a gold medal with Sharks forward Tyler Toffoli while playing for Canada at the 2015 IIHF World Championship. Jim Nill was also the General Manager of the team.
- Stars defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Sharks forward Barclay Goodrow both played for the Rangers during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Sharks forward Philipp Kurashev skated in Chicago from 2022-23 to 2023-24.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Sharks forward Ryan Reaves were teammates in Pittsburgh during the 2017-18 season.
- Stars defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Sharks forward Ryan Reaves shared the ice on the New York Rangers during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Sharks forward Jeff Skinner skated together in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Sharks forward Jeff Skinner both represented Team Canada during the 2017, 2013 and 2011 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward Jamie Benn and Sharks forward Jeff Skinner skated together on Team Canada during the 2012 IIHF World Championship.

- Stars forward Tyler Seguin and Sharks forwards Jeff Skinner and Tyler Toffoli were all members of Team Canada during the 2009 U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars forward Nathan Bastian and Sharks forward Tyler Toffili were teammates in New Jersey during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward Adam Erne and Sharks defenseman Nick Leddy and goaltender Alex Nedeljkovic shared the ice in Detroit during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin both skated with Sharks defenseman Timothy Liljegren
 in Toronto. They both skated with Liljegren during the 2021-22 season and then Lyubushkin skated with him again in 202324.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen and Sharks defenseman Dmitry Orlov skated in Carolina together for a brief period during the 2024-25 season.
- Stars head coach Glen Gulutzan coached San Jose forward Jeff Skinner and defenseman Vincent Desharnais as an
 assistant coach in Edmonton. Gulutzan coached Desharnais from 2022-23 to 2023-24 and Skinner the following season
 in 2024-25.
