FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 14, 2024 - CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. FLORIDA PANTHERS [0]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a five-game homestand on Saturday night by welcoming the Florida Panthers to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Nazem Kadri would score the only goal of the opening frame after forcing a turnover and making a slick move to fool Spencer Knight for a highlight reel goal. In the second, Blake Coleman would register his sixth of the season and Dustin Wolf made 14 saves to keep the Flames in front with the home side leading 2-0 through 40. Wolf would continue to stand tall in the third, while Mikael Backlund added to the Flames advantage as Calgary blanked the defending Stanley Cup Champions 3-0.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Bruins. Calgary fell 4-3 in overtime in these clubs' first meeting on November 7th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-2-3 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 8-5-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames continued a three-game eastern road swing in Boston for these clubs first meeting on November 7th. The Bruins would open the scoring 2:04 into the contest courtesy of Hampus Lindholm, but just 19 seconds later Tyson Barrie would blast a point shot past Joonas Korpisalo to level things at one, and that is how the first 20 ended. In the second, Boston would net a pair to lead 3-1 through 40. Calgary would try to claw back in the third and it took just 58 seconds to draw within one as Yegor Sharangovich tipped a point shot home. Later in the frame, Nazem Kadri would bury his fourth third-period marker of the season to tie things up and force overtime. In the extra frame, Boston would score to win 4-3.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf turned aside all 32 shots he faced on Saturday's 3-0 win over Florida to earn his second-career NHL shutout. The only Flames rookie goaltenders to make as many saves in a shutout are Dan Bouchard (46 on Dec. 13, 1972 & 38 on Jan. 12, 1973), Rejean Lemelin (40 on Jan. 8, 1981) and Joni Ortio (36 on Jan. 10, 2015). Wolf also recorded his fifth consecutive home win to become the eighth Flames goaltender over the past 10 years with home wins in five straight contests, joining: Jacob Markstrom (10 GP in 2021-22), Brian Elliott (9 GP in 2016-17), Karri Ramo (9 GP in 2015-16), Dan Vladar (6 GP in 2022-23), David Rittich (5 GP in 2019-20) and Jonas Hiller (5 GP in 2015-16).

WEEGAR 500:

MacKenzie Weegar played his 500th NHL game against the team that drafted him, the Florida Panthers on Saturday night. Weegar made his NHL debut on April 3rd, 2017 against the Montreal Canadiens, and would score his first NHL goal on October 20th, 2017 against the Pittsburgh Penguins. Weegar played 306 games for the Panthers through six years before a trade in the summer of 2022 brought him to Calgary where he has skated in 194 contests. The Ottawa, ON native was the Panthers seventh-round pick (206th overall) in the 2013 NHL draft and has become just the fourth active seventh-round draft pick to reach 500 NHL games and join: Ondrej Palat (Drafted 208th overall by TBL in 2011), Erik Haula (Drafted 182nd overall by MIN in 2009), and Nic Dowd (Drafted 198th overall by LAK in 2009).

HANLEY MAN:

Flames blueliner Joel Hanley skated in his 200th NHL game on Saturday night against the Florida Panthers to become the 17th-active undrafted defencement to reach 200 games in their NHL career. The Keswick, ON native made his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016 against Calgary as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, and has spent time with Montreal (17GP), Arizona (5 GP), Dallas (161 GP), and Calgary (17GP) through his 200 NHL games. Hanley played alongside MacKenzie Weegar who skated in his 500th NHL game on Saturday as the pair both enjoyed milestone nights.

BARRIE PICKING:

Tyson Barrie scored his first goal as a member of the Flames in Calgary and Boston's first meeting on November 7th. The 33-year-old blueliner now has 110 goals in his 818 career NHL games. Barrie is currently sitting at 397 assists and needs three more to become the 11th active defenceman in the NHL to reach 400 assists.

BOSTON/CALGARY TIES:

Tonight's contest features multiple skaters who have ties to Calgary and Boston.

Bruins centre Elias Lindholm was acquired by the Flames in the summer of 2018 and spent six years in Calgary, scoring 148 goals and 209 assists for 357 points in 418 contests. Bruins defenceman Nikita Zadorov and Jordan Oesterle both began the 2023-24 campaign with the Flames and would join Boston as free agents this summer. Forward Mark Kastelic played his junior hockey in Calgary with the Hitmen along with Flames defenceman Jake Bean.

Flames netminder Dan Vladar was drafted by the Bruins 75th overall in the 2015 NHL draft and would play five games for the Boston in 2020-21 before being acquired by the Flames on July 28th, 2021. Centre Kevin Rooney was born in Canton, MA, just a 30-minute train ride from Boston.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Calgary Flames enter play tonight with a 6-1-1 record on Tuesday's so far this season. The only club with as many wins on Tuesday games is the Minnesota Wild.


