LOS ANGELES KINGS TEAM NOTES:

A ROYAL RECAP

The LA Kings are set to enter 2025-26 campaign following one of the most successful regular seasons in team history, tying the franchise marks in wins (48; also 48 in 2015-16) and points (105). The second 105-point campaign in Kings history marked the seventh time the organization surpassed the 100-point threshold and matched the team's single-season high set by the 1974-75 group's 42-17-21 result.

The Kings' historic success last year was powered in part by consistency at Crypto.com Arena. The team ultimately finished the regular season with a 31-6-4 record in DTLA, marking the first time the 30-win mark was eclipsed on home ice in a single season in franchise history:

In their win against the Hurricanes on March 22, 2025, the Kings scored six consecutive goals in a game for the first time in nearly a year (March 20, 2024 vs. MIN). All 12 forwards who dressed against Carolina recorded at least one point, marking the sixth time in franchise history, and first since Oct. 28, 1988, that all forwards who dressed recorded a point in the same game for the Kings:

The following day on March 21, in their 7-2 victory over the Bruins, 16 different skaters recorded a point in a game for the first time in team history. By scoring 14 goals in their back-to-back set against the Hurricanes and Bruins, it marked the 17th time in franchise history—and first occasion since April 1 & 3, 1995—the team scored seven goals in back-to-back games. Furthermore, it was just the third time the team had seven-plus goals in *consecutive calendar days* following Dec. 20-21, 1988, and Nov. 13-14, 1987 (via NHL PR).



As part of their successful home play last season, the team established another franchise mark for the longest home point streak at 15 games from Jan. 22 – March 25, 2025, where they went 12-0-3 while outscoring their opponents by a cumulative 54-26 in that span. That streak saw the Kings defeat the Pacific Division rival Vegas Golden Knights on Feb. 24 as part of the team's 20th home win of the year in their 27th game played at Crypto.com Arena. With a home record of 20-3-4 through their first 27 games played in Los Angeles, the Kings set a franchise record for the fastest pace to the 20-win mark on home ice, eclipsing their previous best of 20-9-1 in 30 GP in the 2005-06 campaign.

After the League returned from its 4 Nations Face-Off break, the Kings allowed two goals or fewer in 14 of their 19 games at Crypto.com Arena, including three shutouts. Overall, the Kings completed the campaign with an NHL-best .805 home points percentage (PTS %), earning 31 wins and 66 points in DTLA last season. On May 14, 2025, the LA Kings named **Ken Holland** as the team's new General Manager and Vice President. Holland enters his first season in Los Angeles as the fifth-winningest general manager in NHL history, having accumulated 1,145 wins over 26 seasons between the Detroit Red Wings (1997-2019) and Edmonton Oilers (2019-14).

Holland, the 10th GM in Kings history, won four Stanley Cups over two decades with Detroit while leading the organization to four President's Trophies, 10 division championships, and five regular season conference titles. A 2020 Hockey Hall of Fame inductee, Holland also served on several management staffs for Hockey Canada, winning gold medals at the 2010 and 2014 Olympic Winter Games and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

The native of Vernon, British Columbia, is one of several new additions to the Kings organization. At the 2025 NHL Draft, held at Peacock Theater in downtown Los Angeles this past June, the Kings made nine total selections, including defenseman **Henry Brzustewicz** (First Round, 31st overall), who made his first appearance for the Kings this preseason. The 18-year-old native of Washington, Mich., was one of 28 players on the Kings' preseason training camp roster that were drafted by Los Angeles.

Following the Draft, Holland and the Kings acquired several veteran players through free agency, signing forwards **Joel Armia** and **Corey Perry**, defensemen **Cody Ceci** and **Brian Dumoulin**, and goaltender **Anton Forsberg**. The quartet of skaters bring a combined 3,555 regular season contests and 478 games of Stanley Cup Playoff experience to their first season with the Kings, while Forsberg has posted a 74-81-14 record through 174 career starts.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Anze Kopitar skates into the 2025-26 NHL season for his franchise-record 20th NHL campaign. On Sept. 18, 2025, the captain announced that he will retire following this upcoming season, which will conclude an unparalleled two-decade career as an LA King. The captain now has one last campaign to add to a trophy case that holds a pair of Stanley Cup Championship rings, two Frank J. Selke Trophies, three Lady Byng Memorial Trophies and a Mark Messier NHL Leadership Award.

The first Slovenian-born player to reach the NHL was selected by the Kings with the 11th overall pick in the 2005 NHL Draft. He now ranks in the top three in nearly every major regular-season category in team history, including seasons played (1st; 20), games played



(1st; 1,454), goals (3rd; 440), assists (1st; 838), points (2nd; 1,278), plus/minus (2nd; +108), power-play goals (3rd; 124), overtime goals (T-2nd; 9), game-winning goals (1st; 78), shots (3rd; 3,328), faceoff wins (1st; 14,493), blocked shots (3rd; 1,030) and takeaways (1st; 831). Kopitar's 1,454 games played are the 31st-most in NHL history and the 10th-most by a player with a single franchise. His 14 separate 20-goal seasons are also tied for the most in franchise history while his 154 multi-assist and 319 multi-point games each rank third in club history.

Kopitar capped off the 2024-25 campaign with 21 goals and a team-high 46 assists for 67 points (21-46=67) with a career-low four penalty minutes (PIM) in 81 games to earn his third Lady Byng Trophy. It marked the 16th time in his career Kopitar has finished as the Kings' leader in assists and 17th time finishing top two in team scoring (**Adrian Kempe**; 35-38=73 in 2024-25). Over his 19 seasons with the Kings, the captain has led the team in scoring 15 times, including six consecutive campaigns from 2017-23, and is joined by **Gordie Howe** as the only two players in NHL history to lead the same franchise in points on at least 15 occasions.

Since making his NHL debut in 2006-07, Kopitar has amassed 1,278 points (440-838=1,278) in 1,454 regular season outings. The 6-3, 225-pound forward is set to enter the year within the top-40 for most points in NHL history:

Per NHL PR, with his trio of goals in last year's season-opener, Kopitar became the fifth player in league history to score a hat trick in two season-opening games (also 3-2=5 on Oct. 14, 2021). The others: **Auston Matthews** (3-0=3 on Oct. 11, 2023 & 4-0=4 on Oct. 12, 2016), **Connor McDavid** (3-1=4 on Oct. 12, 2022 & 3-0=3 on Oct. 4, 2017), **Brendan Shanahan** (3-0=3 on Oct. 4, 2001 & 3-0=3 on Oct. 7, 1993) and **Cam Neely** (3-0=3 on Oct. 7, 1995 & 3-0=3 on Jan. 22, 1995).

THE KUEMPEROR'S NEW GROOVE

The Kings begin the sophomore year of goaltender **Darcy Kuemper**'s second stint in the LA crease after the Saskatoon, Saskatchewan native turned in a Vezina Trophy caliber season in 2024-25. Kuemper joined Tampa Bay's **Andrei Vasilevskiy** and the winner, Winnipeg's **Connor Hellebuyck**, as the three finalists for the award for "the goaltender adjudged to be the best at his position." Kuemper's performance last season also earned him the Bill Libby Memorial Award as the Kings' Most Valuable Player and Best Defensive Player honors, both of which were selected by the media.

The 34-year-old backstop finished the regular season with a 31-11-7 record, a career-low 2.02 goals against average (GAA), .922% save percentage (SV %) and five shutouts in 50 games played. Kuemper's GAA and SV% both ranked second, respectively, among all goaltenders with a minimum of 40 games played last season:

Per NHL EDGE, the 6-5, 215-pound netminder maintained a .863 SV% in high-danger situations through the regular season, the highest such save-percentage of any goaltender in the League. The veteran keeper posted the fourth-best SV% of his career and matched his personal-best in shutouts for a fourth time, being credited with five, while also playing most of a separate team-shutout on April 14 in Edmonton.



By stonewalling all 27 of Edmonton's shots on April 5, goaltender **Darcy Kuemper** secured his fifth shutout of the year and improved his record to 28-10-7 on the year to that point. With 26 saves on 28 shots faced last Monday against Seattle and a 24-save outing on Thursday, April 10, against Anaheim, Kuemper is joined by **Miikka Kiprusoff** (16 GS in 2003-04) as the only two goaltenders in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) to have 15 or more *consecutive starts* of allowing two or fewer goals:

Kuemper earned his 199th and 200th career victories on March 13 and March 15 by posting consecutive shutouts against the Washington Capitals and Nashville Predators. The pair of wins were the first time a Kings goalie recorded back-to-back shutouts since Kuemper himself did so on Jan. 30 and Feb. 3, 2018. As a result, he was named the NHL's "First Star of the Week" for the week ending March 16 with one goal against in three starts (78 SV/79 SA), posting a 3-0-0 record with a 0.33 GAA, .987 SV%, and two shutouts.

The team skates into this evening's matchup after limiting their opponents to a combined 203 goals against (GA) through 82 games played in the 2024-25 campaign, the second fewest total goals allowed this season behind only the Winnipeg Jets (190 GA). The team's success keeping pucks *out* of the net corresponds to keeping shots *away* from the cage; the Kings maintained a shots-against per game (SA/GP) average of 25.5 last season, trailing only the Carolina Hurricanes (24.9):

WARREN PEACE

In his first season with the Kings, forward **Warren Foegele** set career-highs in goals (24), points (24-22=46), even-strength goals (23), game-winning goals (7) and blocks (40) while maintaining a team-high plus-36 rating. Foegele's plus-36 was tied for the second-highest among all League forwards and tied for fourth in the league overall. In addition to his pacesetting plus/minus rating, Foegele finished the 2024-25 regular season tied with **Anze Kopitar** for the most game-winning goals on the team and played in all 82 regular season contests for the third time in his career.

In addition to receiving the team's Mark Bavis Memorial Award for "Best Newcomer" last season, Foegele was also recognized with the team's Unsung Hero Award. Of Foegele's personal-best 24 goals during his freshman campaign in Los Angeles, 23 were scored in even-strength situations. The Markham, Ontario native also led the Kings with 33 takeaways last season.

CRIMSON PRIDE

Forward **Alex Laferriere** is preparing for his third season in the NHL and the first campaign of the three-year contract extension he signed with the Kings this past August. The 23-year-old winger played in 77 games for LA last season, establishing personal-bests in goals (19), assists (23), points (42), plus/minus (+22), game-winning goals (4), shots (193), hits (124), blocked shots (43) and time-on-ice per game (TOI; 16:32 min.).

The native of Chatham, N.J. accumulated a plus-22 rating to tie **Adrian Kempe** for the second highest among team forwards last season. On the defensive side of the puck, Laferriere recorded 124 hits and 43 blocked shots, placing third on the roster in each category. The 6-1, 205-pound winger is the fourth U.S.-born skater in franchise history to reach the 15-goal and 40-point marks in a single season before turning 24 years old, and the first to do so since **Dustin Brown** in 2007-08.

A BRANDT NEW YEAR

Defenseman **Brandt Clarke** is set to skate in his second full NHL season after tallying 33 points (5-28=33) with nine power-play points and a plus-13 rating in 78 games as a rookie last year. His 28 helpers and 33 points led all Kings defensemen while his nine points on the man-advantage placed fourth among all Kings skaters. Clarke looks to replicate his fast start from last year where he recorded 11 points through the team's first 11 games of the season. By doing so, the native of Nepean, Ontario became just the third blueliner in team history aged 21 years old or younger to record as many points through the team's first 11 games to start a season, joining **Larry Murphy** (2x, 4-7=11 in 1980-81 and 5-8=13 in 1981-82) and **Rob Blake** (2-11=13 in 1990-91).



KUZ-ING DOWN PCH

Among the players donning black and silver for the first time in a season-opening contest is forward **Andrei Kuzmenko**, who enters his first full year as a member of the Kings after being acquired by the team at the trade deadline this past March. The 29-year-old winger played in 22 regular season games for LA after being acquired via trade with the Philadelphia Flyers, scoring five goals and 12 assists for 17 points (5-12=17).

The native of Yakutsk, Russia notched 15 points (5-10=15) in as many contests played at Crypto.com Arena to account for the fifth-most home points by any NHL skater from the deadline on March 8 through the end of the season, April 17. Kuzmenko finished tied with linemate **Anze Kopitar** (6-9=15) and trailed only **Quinton Byfield** (9-7=16) for the most home points among Kings skaters since he joined the team, with the three skaters respectively ranking fourth, fifth, and sixth in home points in the NHL in that span.

The 5-11, 195 pound forward returns to the ice for the first time since his productive Stanley Cup Playoffs debut, where he became the second player in franchise history to record a three-point (1-2=3) effort in their first Stanley Cup Playoffs appearance, doing so against the Oilers in Game 1 of the First Round on Apr. 22.

JUICED TO BE BACK

Forward **Adrian Kempe** skates into Crypto.com Arena for his first regular season appearance since tallying his 35th goal and 38th assist of the year on April 15, 2025, in Seattle to finish the season with 73 points (35-38-73), the most among Kings skaters. Kempe's team-leading 2024-25 campaign helped him become the 14th player in franchise history to record 400 points (194-207=401) with the Kings and just the third active skater to do so, following **Anze Kopitar** (440-838=1,278) and **Drew Doughty** (160-526=686). Kempe and Kopitar are the only two skaters on that list who were not born in North America.

On April 14 in Edmonton, Kempe (1-2=3) contributed two power play assists, his 36th and 37th helpers of the year, before burying his 34th goal and 71st point (34-37=71) of the year in the final frame to clinch his second consecutive 70-point campaign (28-47=75 in 2023-24). Kempe is the 14th player in Kings history to register multiple 70-point seasons and joins current teammates Anze Kopitar (9x from 2007-08 through 2023-24) and **Kevin Fiala** (2x from 2022-23 through 2023-24) as three of five European-born players on that list. The active trio is joined by **Jari Kurri** (2x from 1992-93 through 1993-94) and **Ziggy Palffy** (2x from 2000-01 through 2002-03)

Kempe recorded his 200th career assist on April 5 against Edmonton, his 31st helper of the season, to become just the eighth LA King to tally at least 200 assists in his first 625 career games, joining **Dave Taylor** (433 A), **Luc Robitaille** (406 A), **Anze Kopitar** (349 A), **Butch Goring** (307 A), **Rob Blake** (271 A), **Drew Doughty** (243 A) and **Dustin Brown** (203 A). Kempe skated in his 600th career regular season NHL game on Feb. 5 against the Montreal Canadiens. By doing so, the 28-year-old forward became the 16th player in LA Kings history to reach such mark and just the second Swedish-born skater to do so, following **Mattias Norstrom** (780 GP). In 630 career NHL contests, Kempe has accumulated 194 goals and 207 assists for 401 points (194-207=401) with a plus-25 rating. Since his NHL debut on Feb. 16, 2017, Kempe occupies the top three among team skaters in multiple regular season categories:

Byfield, 23, played in 81 games last season for the Kings, setting new single-season career highs in games played (81), goals (23), average time-on-ice (15:57), and shooting percentage (14.6%). From Mar. 5 – Mar 15, 2025, the native of Newmarket, Ontario, recorded a career-long six-game goal streak to become just the fourth different skater under the age of 23 to record a six-game goal streak in Kings history.

In his last tilt against the Colorado Avalanche on April 12, 2025, Byfield posted his fourth three-point effort (1-2=3) of the 2024-25 campaign, setting a new single-season career high for three-point games. Byfield also became the ninth different skater in Kings history to record eight or more three-point games before turning 23 years old with his late-season performance against the club from the Centennial State.

- Colorado will play 24 games versus the Pacific Division (three times against each opponent) and 32 with teams from the Eastern Conference (one home/one away)...Anaheim, Calgary, Vancouver and San Jose come to Denver twice while the Avs visit Edmonton, Las Vegas, Los Angeles and Seattle twice
- This season features 12 back-to-back games, including at least one in every month of the regular season

A total of 49 players appeared in a game for Colorado last season, the most of any NHL team and tied for the highest total in franchise history...The Quebec Nordiques also used 49 in both 1989-90 and 1990-91...Colorado's 49 players last year matched the highest total of any team over the last 10 seasons, equaling the 2018-19 Ducks...The 49 players included 43 skaters (30 forwards, 13 defensemen) and six goaltenders, both league highs...The previous record for an Avalanche team (since relocating) was 43 players in 2022-23.

OLYMPIC BOUND

For the first time since 2014, NHL players will be participating in the Winter Olympic Games this February...Four Avalanche players were named to the preliminary rosters for their respective national teams: defenseman Cale Makar (Canada) and forwards Nathan MacKinnon (Canada), Gabriel Landeskog (Sweden) and Martin Necas (Czechia)...Only New Jersey and Tampa Bay (both five) have more players represented on the initial rosters (Florida also has four)...The 2026 Winter Games will be held from Feb. 11-22 in Milan and Cortina, Italy.

 **Gabriel Landeskog (Sweden):** This will mark Landeskog's second appearances in the Winter Olympic Games, as he helped his country win the silver medal as the youngest member of Team Sweden in 2014 (20 years old)...He finished with an assist in six games during that tournament...Landeskog's international resume includes the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, four IIHF World Championships (2012, 2013, 2017, 2019), the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship and the 2009 IIHF U18 World Championship...He won a gold medal with Sweden at both the 2017 IIHF World Championship in Germany/France and the 2013 IIHF World Championship in Stockholm and Helsinki

 **Nathan MacKinnon (Canada):** Will be making his first appearance at the Olympics...He was named tournament MVP of the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025 after leading the tournament with four goals in helping Canada secure the championship...He is a two-time medalist with Canada at the IIHF World Championship (gold in 2015, silver in 2017) and played for Team North America at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

 **Cale Makar (Canada):** Will also be making his first appearance for the Canadian Olympic Team...He was a member of Canada's championship team at the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025...He led that tournament in ice time (26:47) and assisted on Connor McDavid's overtime winner in the final against Team USA...His international experience also includes a gold medal at the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship

 **Martin Necas (Czechia):** Will be making his Olympic debut...Internationally, he notched an assist in the gold medal game at the 2024 IIHF World Championship to help Czechia win the title on their home soil...Overall, he has made three appearances at both the IIHF World Championship (also 2018 and 2025) and World Junior Championship (2017, 2018, 2019; he led the 2018 tournament in assists and co-led in points, then captained Czechia in 2019).

Nine different Avalanche players made their NHL debut in 2024-25, the most of any NHL team and the second-highest total in Colorado history...The Avs had 11 skaters debut in 2008-09...Wyatt Aamodt, Chase Bradley, Tye Felhaber, Jere Innala, Ivan Ivan, Trent Miner, Nikita Prishchepov, Calum Ritchie and Matt Stienburg all joined the NHL fraternity in 2024-25...If you include Nikolai Kovalenko, who made his debut in the 2024 playoffs but dressed in his first regular season game last season, then it's 10 Avalanche players who made their debut in 2024-25.

LET'S PUT IT TO BED(NAR)

Jared Bednar enters his 10th season behind the Avalanche bench in 2025-26...Hired on Aug. 25, 2016, Bednar is the second-longest tenured coach in the NHL behind Tampa Bay's Jon Cooper, who took over the Lightning on March 25, 2013...The only individual to win a championship in the NHL, AHL and ECHL as a head coach, Bednar is the winningest coach in franchise history with a 390-246-64 (.603) record in 700 regular-season games...Only six other coaches won more games through their first 700 games behind the bench...Bednar is tied with Fred Shero for 43rd place on the NHL's all-time wins list, the 16th most victories for a single franchise in league history...If you include his playoff totals, Bednar has 439 combined victories, which is also 43rd on the all-time list.

ALL HAIL CALE

Cale Makar captured his second Norris Trophy in 2024-25, becoming the 14th defenseman to win multiple Norris Trophies...He is just the seventh player to win two Norris awards within his first six NHL seasons and joined Erik Karlsson as the only active players with multiple Norris Trophies...Cale was named to the NHL First All-Star Team, his fifth career selection to the NHL postseason all-star team and third time he's made the First Team (both equaling franchise records)...Cale led all NHL blueliners in goals (30), assists (62) and points (92), with his 30 goals and 92 points breaking his own franchise records for a defenseman...Makar was the first defenseman to reach the 30-goal mark since Mike Green in 2008-09 with the Washington Capitals...In fact, Cale was just the ninth different defender in NHL history (18th instance) to top the 30-goal mark, joining Bobby Orr (five times), Paul Coffey (four), Denis Potvin (three), Ray Bourque, Kevin Hatcher, Phil Housley, Doug Wilson and Green...Cale is one of only three defensemen in NHL history to average over a point-per-game (also Bobby Orr and Paul Coffey)

THIS IS MY, MY BAD, COMEBACK SONG

The Avalanche had 24 comeback wins last season, tied for the second most of any team behind Washington (25) ...Eight of those 24 wins featured deficits of two or more goals, tied for the second-most multi-goal comebacks in the NHL...The Avs were 15-16-0 when trailing after one period, the most wins of any team when behind after the first, and 8-22-2 when trailing after two periods, tied for the most victories when behind going into the third...The Avalanche, who also finished second in come-from-behind victories in 2023-24 (26), have a league-high 50 comeback wins over the last two seasons.

LIGHTING THE LAMP

The Avalanche finished sixth in the NHL with 273 goals in 2024-25 (3.33 per game)...Colorado had 30 different goal scorers and 12 different double-digit goal scorers, both tied for the league lead.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM

Colorado scored 108 third-period goals last season, one behind Vegas (109) for the most of any team...Individually, Nathan MacKinnon led all players with 50 third-period points (14g/36a).

THE DEFENSE RESTS

The 2024-25 Avalanche led all teams in scoring from the blueline for the fifth consecutive season with 211 points (54g/157a)...The Avs became just the fifth club in NHL history to have the highest-scoring blueline for five consecutive seasons and the first since the Calgary Flames from 1986-87 to 1990-91...Colorado's 54 goals from the back end last season also led all clubs, the third straight year and fourth time in the last five seasons that the Avs defense have scored the most goals.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH LUMBER, I OWN TWO LUMBERYARDS

Beginning on Dec. 8, 2024, one day before the acquisition of Mackenzie Blackwood and a week after Scott Wedgewood joined the team, the Avalanche allowed just 2.37 goals-per-game over the final 54 contests, second best in the league behind only Winnipeg (2.20)...Blackwood posted a 22-12-3 record with a 2.33 goals-against average, .913 save percentage and three shutouts in 37 games (36 starts) after being acquired from San Jose...Between the two teams, he set career highs in wins (28), games (56), starts (53) and shutouts (4) while ranking among the league's top-10 in Sv% (8th, .912) and GAA (9th, 2.55)...After joining the Avalanche on Nov. 30, Wedgewood posted a 13-4-1 record with a 1.99 GAA, .917 Sv% and two shutouts in 19 games (18 starts)...Only Darcy Kuemper (1.86) and Connor Hellebuyck (1.96) posted a lower GAA than Wedgewood since he joined the Avs on Nov. 30 (minimum 15 games)...'Wedgie' finished the year 8-0-1 in his last nine starts with a 1.63 GAA and .928 Sv%.

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT

The Avalanche ranked among the NHL's top five in both shots for (5th, 29.9) and shots against (3rd, 25.9) last season.

NATE EXPECTATIONS

Nathan MacKinnon finished second in league scoring with 116 points (32g/84a) in 79 games last season...Nathan became the 12th player in NHL history (now 13) to record three consecutive seasons with 110+ points...MacKinnon was the first skater to the 30, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100 and 110-point marks last season...Current teammate Martin Necas was the first to 40, although MacKinnon reached 40 later in that same game...Nathan shared the league lead in assists (84) and paced all skaters in shots for the second straight year and fourth time in his career with 320...MacKinnon and Peter Stastny (six) are the only players in franchise history to register three consecutive 100-point campaign and Nate is the only player in Colorado/Quebec history to post back-to-back 80-assist campaigns.

DAYDREAM BELIEVER

The Avalanche will play 18 afternoon games this season, the most in franchise history...The previous high was 15 day contests in 1998-99...The 18 matinee matchups are the second most in the NHL in 2025-26 behind only the Pittsburgh Penguins (21)...The New York Rangers are third with 14...Five of the 18 matinees are at Ball Arena and 13 are on the road...Colorado finished 4-4-0 in day games a year ago, 3-2-0 at home and 1-2-0 on the road...The Avalanche are 29-11-2 in afternoon contests since 2019-20...Colorado is 26-7-2 in *home* afternoon games going back to 2017-18.

DELIVERING WHEN IT COUNTS

The Avalanche led the NHL with thirteen 6-on-5 goals in 2024-25, the most in a single season in franchise history...In fact, the 13 goals were the second most by an NHL team since the league began recording the data in 1987-88...Ten of those 13 goals occurred with the goalie off for the extra attacker while trailing late in the third period.

YOU GO BACK, JACK, DO IT AGAIN

This season features 12 back-to-back sets of games, including at least one in every month of the regular season...Colorado also played 12 back-to-back sets last year, going 6-6-0 in the first contest and 8-3-1 on the second...The Avalanche's 8-3-1 (.708) mark in the second half of a back-to-back trailed only Dallas (8-2-1, .773)...Since 2020-21, the Avalanche are a combined 71-26-11 (.708) in back-to-back affairs, 34-16-4 (.667) on the first night and 37-10-7 (.750) on the second.

THAT'S THE POWER OF LOVE

The Avalanche's power play finished eighth in the NHL at 24.8% in 2024-25, finishing among the NHL's top-10 power-play teams for the fifth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons.

WELCOME BACK, CAP

Avalanche captain Gabriel Landeskog returned to the lineup for Game 3 of the 2025 First Round Series against Dallas on April 23, some 1,032 days since his last contest on June 26, 2022 when he lifted the Stanley Cup in Game 6 of the 2022 Final against the Lightning...Landeskog's return after a 1,032-day absence is the fourth-longest in NHL history and marked just the third time a captain has returned to his team after not playing in over 1,000 days...The others were Syl Apps (1,009 days) on Nov. 4, 1945 with the Maple Leafs and Sid Abel (1,045) on Feb. 16, 1946 with the Red Wings, who both left their respective teams to serve in the Canadian armed forces during World War II...Landeskog followed that up by registering a goal and one assist in Game 4 on April 26, his first tally in 1,041 days since Game 3 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Final against Tampa.

RUNNING ON EMPTY

The Avalanche scored a franchise-record 27 empty-net goals last season, second most in the NHL behind Tampa Bay (28)...Colorado's 27 empty-net tallies, in fact, were the second most in a single season since the league began tracking the statistic behind the 2024-25 Lightning.

EXTRA CREDIT

Colorado finished 9-4 in games decided past regulation last season, 5-1 in overtime and 4-3 in shootouts...The Avalanche's .692 winning percentage beyond regulation ranked fifth among NHL teams...All-time, the Avalanche are 240-201-204 in OT contests and 89-52 (.631) in shootouts, the highest winning percentage of any team since the shootout started in 2005-06...The Avs have the best all-time shooting percentage at 36.8% (172/468) and the second-best save percentage at .721 (346/480).

HOME COOKING

Nathan MacKinnon led the league in home scoring for the second consecutive season in 2024-25 with 68 points (21g/47a) in 40 contests...He was the first NHL player to pace the NHL in home points for two consecutive seasons since Joe Thornton in 2005-06 and 2006-07...MacKinnon recorded points in each of his final 26 games at Ball Arena last year (16g/27a), the NHL's longest home point streak in 2024-25 and the second longest stretch in franchise history behind his own 35-game run in 2023-24...Since the start of the 2023-24 campaign, the Avalanche center has found the scoresheet in 76 of his last 81 home games (55-102=157) and going back to Jan. 1, 2023, has a goal or assist in 96 of his last 104 home contests (72-119=191)...Between the pipes, Mackenzie Blackwood was 14-4-2 in 20 appearances at Ball Arena last season with a 1.98 GAA, .921 Sv% and three shutouts...As a team, the Avalanche finished the 2024-25 campaign by going 12-2-1 in their final 15 matches at Ball Arena.
