TOP NOTES

The Sabres have earned three straight wins at home vs. the Oilers and they are 5-1-0 in their last six home games against Edmonton. Tonight's win marked the first time Buffalo had earned three straight home wins over Edmonton since Feb. 15. 2007 to Jan. 3. 2012.

Noah Ostlund's first goal marked the first power-play goal of his career. **Ostlund's** second goal of the night marked the first multi-goal performance of his career. It also marked the first multi-goal game by a Sabres rookie since **Jiri Kulich** on March 27, 2025 vs. Pittsburgh (2+0).

Colten Ellis made 32 saves and allowed just one goal in tonight's game. It marked the first time a Sabres rookie goaltender has made 30 or more saves and allowed one or fewer goals since **Devon Levi** did so on March 27, 2024 vs. Ottawa (31 saves, 1 goal against).

Isak Rosen registered the primary assist on **Ostlund's** first goal and now has four points (2+2) in his last four games.

Rasmus Dahlin's two assists tonight, on Ostlund's first goal and Beck Malenstyn's goal, gave him four assists in his last two games, including multiple assists in each of those games.

Dahlin's two assists marked the 15th time in his career that he has tallied multiple points in two or more consecutive games.

Following his goal, **Bowen Byram** has now registered one point in four straight games (2+2) and has posted his second point streak of four or more games this season. **Byram** is one of three Sabres defensemen (**Dahlin**, **Mattias Samuelsson**) who have recorded at least one four-game point streak this season.

Malenstyn's goal marked his first of the season and the first goal he has scored against against the Oilers in his career.

With his goal, **Tage Thompson** has now tallied seven points (5+2) in his last seven games against the Oilers, including at least one point in four straight home games against Edmonton. His goal made him the first Sabres skater to record a four-game home point streak against the Oilers since Jack Eichel from Dec. 6, 2016 to Jan. 2, 2020 (1+5).
