FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 16, 2023 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. TAMPA BAY LIGHTNING [2]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Tampa Bay Lightning to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Hockey Night in Canada on Saturday night. The first would see the clubs combine for 14 shots but both goalies were solid in the opening 20 to keep the game scoreless. In the second, Calgary's offence would explode with A.J. Greer scoring just 2:30 into the middle stanza, followed by MacKenzie Weegar giving the Flames a 2-0 lead, and shortly after Yegor Sharangovich extended his goal-streak to five games to make it 3-0 Flames through 40. Tampa would push back with two goals early in the third to make it a one goal game, before Connor Zary scored a huge insurance marker for the home-side, and Calgary won 4-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Panthers. The Flames swept the season-series in 2022-23, outscoring the Panthers 11-6 in the pair of contests.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-2-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 4-6-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LAST SEASON VERSUS FLORIDA:

The Calgary Flames and Florida Panthers met twice last season, with the Flames going 2-0-0 against their Atlantic Division foe. Matchup number one came on November 19th, 2022 where Adam Ruzicka struck twice with Blake Coleman also finding the back of the net in a 5-4 shootout win. Jonathan Huberdeau converted against his former team in the shootout while Jacob Markstrom stopped four of the five attempts he faced and Rasmus Andersson scored the shootout winner in his first ever attempt. Meeting number two came at the 'Dome with Dillon Dube opening the scoring shorthanded just 3:05 into the game. Jonathan Huberdeau would score against his former team on the power play and Rasmus Andersson would add an even strength goal as the Flames headed into the break up 3-0. Florida would claw back to within two with Nick Cousins cutting the deficit, but Calgary would add three more to take meeting number two 6-2.

WORKIN' ON A COLE MINE:

Blake Coleman recorded an assist on MacKenzie Weegar's second period marker on Saturday night to extend his point-streak to six games. The Plano, TX native has two goals and four assists over the streak, and six games marks the longest point-streak of his career. All-time, Coleman has five goals and five assists for 10 points in 20 career meetings with the Panthers in the regular season, and a goal and two assists in six playoff tilts.

FLORIDA TIES TO CALGARY:

Panthers forwards Matthew Tkachuk, Sam Bennett, and Ryan Lomberg all spent time with the Calgary Flames. Tkachuk was drafted by the Flames sixth overall in 2016 and skated in 431 games with Calgary. Sam Bennett played in 402 contests as a member of the Flames after being drafted fourth-overall in 2014. Ryan Lomberg was signed as a free agent by Calgary in March of 2017, and skated in 11 games as a Flame.

CALGARY TIES TO FLORIDA:

Flames forward Jonathan Huberdeau and blueliner MacKenzie Weegar were both Florida Panthers draft picks. Huberdeau was the third overall pick by Florida back in 2011 and Weegar was drafted in 2013 by the Panthers in the seventh-round. Both players spent the duration of their NHL careers in Florida prior to last season.

ZARY GOOD:

Connor Zary netted his seventh goal of the season on Saturday night against Tampa Bay. Since December 1st, Zary has four goals which is tied with Adam Fantilli (8 GP) and Marco Rossi (7 GP) for the most among rookies through the month of December. Connor Zary's 0.76 points-per game are the second-most among rookies this season who have played atleast three games.

WEEGS:

MacKenzie Weegar leads all Flames blueliners in goals through 30 games this season with eight tallies. Weegar's eight goals are tied with Evan Bouchard and Cale Makar for the second-most goals by a defenceman in the league so far this season, only trailing Quinn Hughes (9).

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

Yegor Sharangovich found the back of the net again on Saturday night against Tampa Bay to extend his goal-streak to five games, with six goals over that span. Sharangovich has set a new career-best with a five-game goal streak and has matched Kent Nilsson (5 GP in 1980-81) and Joe Mullen (5 GP in 1985-86) for the longest goal streak by a player in their first season with Calgary. The only active players to record a longer run in their first season with a franchise are Alex Ovechkin (7 GP & 6 GP in 2005-06 w/ WSH), Matthew Tkachuk (6 GP in 2022-23 w/ FLA) and Evgeni Malkin (6 GP in 2006-07 w/ PIT).

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Mikael Backlund is now 10 games away from tying Mark Giordano for the second-most games played in Flames franchise history at 949.

Jonathan Huberdeau has the second-most games played in Florida Panthers franchise history at 671. In those 671 games as a Panther, he has the second-most points (613) and leads the Panthers in assists (415) and has the second most goals in franchise history (198).
