- The Stars extended their point streak against the Flames to five games, upholding a 3-0-2 record during that span.
- Jason Robertson extended his goal streak to six games, matching a career-high (also: Oct. 27 Nov. 8, 2022).
 - Robertson also extended his point streak vs. Calgary to 12 games, earning 20 points (11-9—20) during that span. It
 marks as his longest active point streak against a single opponent.
- Miro Heiskanen set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time, which was the highest time on ice total by any NHL skater in a game this season.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Oilers this season. The two teams will face each other for a final time on March 12 in Dallas.
- Tonight's game against the Oilers and tomorrow's matchup against the Kraken is the third of 12 back-to-back sets the Stars will play this season. Dallas in undefeated in its first two back-to-back sets this season, going 4-0-0 in those games.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars were tied for second in the NHL in both points (30) and points percentage (.682) and tied for fourth
 in wins with 13. The team's success this season comes despite having 83 combined man games lost with Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn,

Matt Duchene, Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Roope Hintz, Nils Lundkvist and Ilya Lyubushkin all missing multiple games with injury at various points this season.

- Lian Bichsel scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 against the Flyers, making him the 20th Stars skaters to score a goal for Dallas this season. Entering play Monday, Dallas, Anaheim (21) and Carolina (20) were the only teams in the NHL to have at least 20 unique goal scorers this season.
- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 8-0 during 5-on-5 play when the defensive pair of Lian Bichsel and Alexander **Petrovic** is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Mikko Rantanen (104) and Jason Robertson (104) are both pacing to finish the season with more than 100 points. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the second set of Stars teammates to have concurrent 100-point seasons, joining Bobby Smith (114) and Dino Ciccarelli (106) who did so during the 1981-82 season for the Minnesota North Stars.
- The defensive pair of Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell (58.8 percent) tied for fifth in the NHL in expected goal share among defensive pairs to play at least 100 minutes together entering play Monday according to MoneyPuck.com. The pair's 1.91 expected goals against per 60 this season ranked fourth in the NHL among defensive pairs to have played at least 100 minutes together.
- All five Dallas skaters that have taken at least 100 faceoffs this season have a win rate above 50 percent: Roope Hintz (56.4), Tyler Seguin (55.6), Radek Faksa (54.8) and Wyatt Johnston (51.0).
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (495).
 - The third fifth-round draft pick to score 400 NHL goals, joining Alexander Mogilny (473) and Ray Ferraro (408).
 - The 13th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Sam Steel enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career assists.

OIL LEAK

- Dallas is 82-49-23 all-time vs. Edmonton, including a 35-29-12 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned wins in four of their last five games played against the Oilers dating back to April 3, 2024 (4-1-0). Dallas also has wins in five of their last eight games played at Rogers Place (5-3-0).
 - The Stars have an all-time point percentage of .607 against the Oilers which ranks third among all NHL teams.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against Edmonton (1-1-2). In 46 career games against the Oilers, Benn has tallied 44 points (25-19—44), carrying a plus-minus rating of +14.
- Roope Hintz has 20 points (7-13-20) in 17 career games vs. Edmonton, which includes recording eight multi-point outings in his career against them.
 - His 1.18 points per game against the Oilers rank 15th among active NHL skaters who have played Edmonton at least five times in their career.
- Wyatt Johnston has 10 points (5-5—10) in 10 career games against the Oilers and currently rides a three-game point streak vs. Edmonton (2-3-5) entering tonight's game.
- Jason Robertson enters tonight's contest riding a five-game point streak against the Oilers, earning eight points (4-4—8) during that span. In all, **Robertson** has totaled 18 points (8-10—18) in 13 career games vs. Edmonton.
 - His 1.38 points per game against the Oilers are tied for third among active NHL skaters who have played Edmonton at least five times in their career.
- Tyler Seguin has 27 points (12-15—27) in 31 career games vs. Edmonton with a plus-minus rating of +4.
- Sam Steel, a native of Ardrossan, Alberta, has tallied seven points (4-3—7) in 16 career games against the Oilers, carrying a plusminus rating of +2.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's game riding a seven-game point streak dating back to Nov. 9 against the Kraken, totaling 15 points (10-5—15) over that span. Entering play Monday, his seven-game point streak was tied for the longest active streak in the NHL.
 - A goal or an assist tonight would extend his point streak to eight games for the first time this season. It would also be the longest point streak by a Stars skater this year.
- During Robertson's current seven-game point streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 12-2 during 5-on-5 play when he has been on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 12 on-ice goals for and plus-10 goal differential both top the Stars during that
- Robertson has also scored in the last six games that he has played in, finding the back of the net 10 times in total during that span. Entering play Monday, his six-game goal streak was tied with Buffalo's Tage Thompson for the longest active streak in the NHL.
 - Entering play Monday, Robertson, Thompson and Boston's Morgan Geekie were the only skaters this season to score in six consecutive games.
- If Robertson were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in seven consecutive games for the first time in his career and would also make him the first NHL skater this season to have a goal in seven straight games.
- If Robertson were to extend his goal streak tonight, it would also make him the first Dallas skater in team history (since 1993-94) to score a goal in seven consecutive games and would tie for the second-longest goal streak in franchise history.
 - The last Stars skater to have a seven-game goal streak was Dave Gagner from Dec. 26, 1992 to Jan. 7, 1993.

- Robertson has scored 10 goals during his six-game goal streak and has double-digit goals in a six-game span for the second time in his career (also 10-2—12 from Nov. 21 – Dec. 1, 2022) according to NHL Stats. Only one player in franchise history has had more during a six-game stretch: Dino Ciccarelli with 11 in 1983-84.
- Robertson is the fifth player in Stars/North Stars history to have multiple six-game goal streaks according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (2x), Danny Grant (2x) and Bill Goldsworthy (2x).
- From Nov. 13 to 18, Robertson recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. Robertson previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to
- Robertson scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.
- Robertson scored two goals in 1:39 of game time in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 at Montreal, a 7-0 win over the Canadiens, also notching an assist in that game to finish the night with three points.
- He scored a goal and had two assists including on Roope Hintz's overtime winner on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators.
- In all this season, Robertson has totaled 28 points (13-15—27) in 22 games played, tying for the team lead and 10th in the NHL in
 - Robertson's 13 goals were tied for sixth in the League entering play Monday.
 - He is currently on pace to score 48 goals this season, which would be a career high for the forward and tie for the fifth-most in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Robertson ranked second in points and tied for first in goals among American skaters this season entering play Monday.
- Robertson's 96 shots on goal ranked second to only Cutter Gauthier (97) for the most in the NHL this season entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Robertson ranked sixth in the NHL this season with 12.4 expected goals according to MoneyPuck.com.
- Robertson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Tonight's matchup against the Oilers marks the seventh of eight road games the Stars will play this month and the third game of a four-game road trip that will also see the Stars take on the Canucks, Flames and Kraken.
- The Stars have a 7-1-3 record in 11 road games this season. Their .773 points percentage when playing on the road was the secondbest mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
 - Dallas' one regulation road loss was tied for the fewest in the NHL entering play Monday.
- The Stars are averaging 3.45 goals per game on the road this year, which ranked fourth in the NHL entering play Monday. The team's 2.55 goals per game against was the ninth-best mark in the League entering play Monday.
- A win or overtime loss today would extend the Stars' road point streak to a season-best nine games. It would mark their longest road point streak since they also had a point in nine straight road games (7-0-2) from Nov. 3 to Dec. 4, 2015.
- Jason Robertson is the Stars' leading scorer on the road this season, totaling 15 points (7-8—15) in 11 games. Despite only playing in 11 road games this season, his 15 points were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Monday.
- If **Robertson** were to score tonight, it would give him goals in five consecutive road games for the first time since Nov. 3 to 15, 2022.
- Robertson (1.36) and Rantanen (1.27) are both at a point-per-game pace on the road this season.
 - Among skaters to play in at least five road games this season, Robertson and Rantanen tied for seventh and ranked 10th, respectively, in the NHL in road points per game this season entering play Monday.
- Casey DeSmith has a 2-0-2 record on the road this season, posting a .936 save percentage, 1.69 goals-against average and one shutout in those games. Entering play Monday, he ranked in the top five in the NHL in road goals-against average (fourth) and save percentage (fifth).

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- Roope Hintz has totaled 17 points (5-12—17) in 17 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked fifth on the Stars in scoring despite missing five games with an injury this year.
- Hintz's current offensive output puts him on pace to finish the year with 54 assists and 77 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward.
- Hintz has gone 142-for-252 at the faceoff dot this season for a 56.4 percent success rate. His 56.4 faceoff win percentage was the 14th-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday among skaters that have taken at least 200 faceoffs this year.
- When Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 14-8 according to Natural Stat Trick.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

The Stars have posted a 7-2-2 record in 11 games played this November, ranking third in the League with a .727 points percentage this month entering play Monday.

- Dallas' 41 goals scored and 3.73 goals per game this month ranked fourth and third in the NHL, respectively, entering play Monday.
 - The team's 27 5-on-5 goals in November were tied for fifth in the NHL entering play Monday.
- The Stars have gone 11-for-37 on the power play since Nov. 1 for a 29.7 percent success rate on the man advantage, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL this month entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Jason Robertson (10-9—19) was tied for the League lead in points this month with 19. His 10 goals were tied with Tyler Bertuzzi for the most in the NHL this month entering play Monday.
 - Robertson tied Bill Goldsworthy and Brian Bellows (both with four) for the third most 10-goal calendar months in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Dino Ciccarelli (10) and Mike Modano (6).
- Mikko Rantanen (6-10-16) was tied for sixth in the League in scoring since Nov. 1 entering play Monday followed by Miro Heiskanen (1-13—14), who tied for the league lead among defensemen and tied for eighth in the NHL in November scoring.
- Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team to have three players ranked in the top 10 in scoring this month.

THE OUEBÄCK LINE

- Oskar Bäck, Mavrik Bourque and Justin Hryckowian have played 72:48 at 5-on-5 together this season. In that time, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 4-2, outshooting them 31-20 and have a 55.4 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick when the trio is on the ice.
- Among all NHL forward lines to play at least 50 minutes together this season, the Bäck /Bourque/Hryckowian line ranked eighth in the NHL with a 66.2 percent expected goals rate according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Monday.
- In Dallas' game on Nov. 21 against Vancouver, the line played 5:58 of 5-on-5 ice time together. When the trio was on the ice during that time, the Stars outshot the Canucks 7-0 and outscored them 1-0.
 - **Bourque** scored a goal and **Bäck** and **Hryckowian** both tallied an assist in the win.
- With seven points (3-4—7) in 22 games played this season, **Bourque** is pacing to finish the year with 11 goals, 15 assists and 26 points, all of which would be career highs for the forward.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 11-1 during 5-on-5 play when defenseman Alexander Petrovic is on the ice. His plus-10 goal differential is the best mark on the Stars roster during that span and his 11 on-ice goals for rank second.
- Petrovic's plus-10 even-strength on-ice goal differential since Nov. 8 was the fifth-best mark in the NHL and ranked second among all defensemen during that span entering play Monday.
- Petrovic skated 22:06 of ice time in Dallas' game on Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks, his highest single-game total since he skated 24:02 on Oct. 19, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was a member of the Florida Panthers.
- Petrovic notched an assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 against Philadelphia and now has five points (1-4—5) in 20 games played this season, ranking fourth among Stars defensemen in scoring. He is currently on pace to finish the season with five goals, 18 assists and 23 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Petrovic scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 against the Montreal Canadiens, a 7-0 Stars win. It marked his first regular-season NHL goal since April 2, 2018.
- Petrovic finished the Stars' game against the Canadiens with a plus-5 plus/minus rating. It marked the highest plus/minus rating in a single game in his career and the best mark by a Stars defenseman since Ryan Suter (plus-5) on March 9, 2023 at Buffalo.

BISH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 9-0 during even-strength play when Lian Bichsel is on the ice. His plus-9 even-strength goal differential during that span was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Bichsel was the only skater to be on the ice for nine even-strength goals for while not being on the ice for an even-strength goal against. The second ranked player was Parker Kelly (7-0).
- Bichsel has totaled a team-high 76 hits this season, which was tied for seventh in the NHL and led all NHL defensemen entering play Monday. He is currently on pace to finish the season with 283 hits, which would be the most hits in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
 - Steve Ott, with 278 in 2011-12, currently holds the single-season franchise record.
- Bichsel has recorded eight hits in a game three times this season, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, Oct. 28 vs. Washington and Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia. Entering play Monday, Bichsel was the only skater in the NHL this season to have three eight-hit games.
- If he were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the eighth player in franchise history to have recorded four eight-hit games and the fourth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistric (5; 2011-12), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07) and Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12).

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- After trailing 2-0, the Stars came back to defeat the Ottawa Senators 3-2 in overtime on Nov. 11, marking the fourth time this season that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, which was tied for the most in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - There have been six games this season in which the Stars have been trailing by two goals and have comeback to earn at least one point, going 4-0-2 record in those games.
- Overall, the Stars have seven comeback wins this year, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

Additionally, Dallas has won five games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the fifth-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 22-for-75 on the power play this season for a 29.3 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas' 22 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL entering play Monday.
 - The Stars didn't score their 22nd power-play goal of the season until their 42nd game played during the 2024-25 campaign on Jan. 12, 2025 against the Ottawa Senators.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 15-for-38 on the power play for a 39.5 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Monday. Their 15 home power-play goals ranked second to only Minnesota (16) for the most in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game six different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida and on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim. Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in six games.
 - In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their sixth multi power-play goal game in their 45th game of the season.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 22 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (8), Mikko Rantanen (4), Jason Robertson (4), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
 - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Rantanen was leading the NHL in power-play points this season with 15 (4-11—15) entering play Monday.
- Johnston led all NHL skaters with eight power-play goals and tied for second with 13 power-play points (8-5—13) entering play Monday. His eight power-play goals are just three shy of tying his career high of 11 that he set last season.
- Rantanen (56) and Johnston (48) are both on pace to set career highs in power-play points and set franchise records for most power-play points in a single season by a Stars skater.
 - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- Robertson's 11 power-play points (4-7—11) were tied for the eighth-most in the League this season entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen has totaled seven points (1-6-7) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.

MIRO THE HERO

- Miro Heiskanen has 18 points (3-15—18) in 22 games played this season, ranking fourth on the Stars and tying for sixth among all NHL defensemen in scoring this season entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen is averaging 25:52 of ice time per game this season, which was the third-highest total in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time in Dallas' Nov. 22 game against the Calgary Flames. a 3-,2 shootout loss. It was the most ice time any skater in the NHL has had in a single game this season entering play Monday.
 - It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
 - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
 - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone. 0
 - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
 - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- Heiskanen's assist against the Canadiens was the 238th of his career, surpassing Reijo Ruotsalainen for the eighth-most assists by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history. Heiskanen's next assist will give him sole possession of seventh on the all-time assists list among Finnish defensemen.
- Heiskanen recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied Roope Hintz (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied Hintz for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. Hintz first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
 - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
 - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- Heiskanen tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
 - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
 - Heiskanen last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- Heiskanen scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.

- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- Heiskanen's six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 21 points (11-10—21) in 22 games played this season and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Monday, Johnston was tied for 11th in goals and 14th in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- Johnston was one of six skaters under the age of 23 to have at least 20 points this year entering play Monday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 14-20—34), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 13-18—31), Will Smith (20 years old, 7-14—21), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 11-18—29) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 13-13—26).
- Johnston is currently on pace to finish the year with 41 goals and 78 points, both of which would be career highs. Forty-one goals would tie for the 12th-most in a single season in franchise history.
- Johnston's scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North
- Johnston, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- Johnston recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since Tyler Seguin had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
 - Both of Johnston's goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
 - Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.
- Johnston enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists. He is also set to become the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the club.
- Johnston needs two more points to reach the 200-point milestone. Similarly, he will become the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the team.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: Jason Robertson (314) and Wyatt Johnston (268).
- Robertson's 314-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Johnston has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 24 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 268 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Monday, it was tied for the 13th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Johnston was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - o Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before Heiskanen had to withdraw due to injury.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - Lindell and Rantanen won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.

In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forward **Sam Steel** played with Oilers defenseman John Klingberg in Minnesota for part of the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Mikko Rantanen and Oilers goaltender Calvin Pickard shared the ice in Colorado. Duchene and Pickard were there for three seasons (2014-15 to 2016-17), and Rantanen joined them in 2015-16 and 2016-17.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Oilers goaltender Calvin Pickard skated together on Team Canada during the 2017 and 2016 IIHF World Championships.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Oilers goaltender Calvin Pickard were teammates for a short time in Arizona during the 2018-19 season.
