

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 7, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. CAROLINA HURRICANES [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames displayed a strong offensive performance on Saturday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome, defeating the Carolina Hurricanes 5–4. After trailing early, Calgary erupted for three goals in the second period beginning with newcomer Ryan Strome marking his Flames debut with a goal while Olli Määttä, also playing his inaugural contest with Calgary, recorded the primary assist after a clever feed to find Strome. Later in the frame, Joel Farabee, in his first game as assistant captain, recorded his 14th on the campaign, followed by a Morgan Frost powerplay marker to put the home side up 3-1. The Flames extended the lead in the third when Blake Coleman scored, but Carolina responded with a quick pair to cut the deficit to one. Farabee restored Calgary's two-goal cushion late in the period with his second of the night, which stood as the game-winner. Joel Farabee and Morgan Frost each recorded three-point nights, and Dustin Wolf made 25 saves to help Calgary knock off Carolina.

First, the Calgary Flames acquired forward Victor Olofsson, prospect centre Max Curran, a conditional 2028 first-round pick, and a conditional 2027 second-round pick from Colorado in exchange for centre Nazem Kadri and Calgary's 2027 fourth-round pick.

Olofsson, a native of Ornskoldsvik, SWE, has skated in 60 games for the Avalanche this season, netting 11 goals and adding 14 assists for 25 points. The 30-year-old winger is a veteran of 430 NHL games split between Buffalo, Vegas and Colorado, amassing 236 points from 116 goals and 120 assists.

Prospect centre Max Curran is in his third WHL season, appearing in 31 games, scoring 14 goals and 27 assists for 41 points along with 23 penalty minutes for the Edmonton Oil Kings. He represented Czechia at the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship, helping his nation earn a silver medal while recording five points in seven tournament games.

Next, the Flames acquired centre Ryan Strome from Anaheim in exchange for a 2027 seventh-round pick. Strome, a native of Mississauga, ON, skated in 33 games for the Ducks this season prior to his acquisition, scoring three goals and six assists for nine points. The 32-year-old has 898 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 491 points from 170 goals and 321 assists, playing for the New York Islanders, Edmonton Oilers, New York Rangers, Anaheim Ducks and now the Calgary Flames.

Strome played four seasons of junior in the Ontario Hockey League, beginning in 2009-10 with the Barrie Colts before traded to the Niagara IceDogs where he would spend the remainder of his junior career. He captained Niagara in his final campaign with the club in 2012-13 while also representing Canada at the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship.

Finally, the Flames acquired forward Brennan Othmann from the New York Rangers in exchange for forward Jacob Battaglia. Othmann, a native of Scarborough, ON, has played in 17 games for the Rangers this season, scoring his first NHL goal. He has also played 26 games with their AHL affiliate Hartford Wolf Pack, netting eight goals and adding eight assists for 16 points and 49 penalty minutes. The 23-year-old winger and former first round pick has won two gold medals with Canada's World Junior Team in 2022 and 2023 and an OHL championship with Peterborough in 2023.

On Wednesday evening, the Calgary Flames acquired defenceman Olli Määttä, prospect centre Jonathan Castagna and three 2026 second-round picks from Utah in exchange for defenceman MacKenzie Weegar. Määttä, a native of Jyväskylä, FIN, played 22 games for the Mammoth this season. The 31-year-old rearguard is a veteran with 784 games of NHL experience, having played for Pittsburgh, Chicago, Los Angeles, Detroit, Utah, and now Calgary. He has amassed 197 points from 42 goals and 155 assists and is a two-time Stanley Cup champion with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2016 and 2017. He has also represented Finland at three best-on-best international events, including the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and is a two-time Olympic bronze medalist in 2014 and 2026.

Prospect centre Jonathan Castagna is in his third season at Cornell University, appearing in 29 contests, leading his team in scoring with 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points along with 27 penalty minutes. In 2023-24, Jonathan helped Cornell win the ECAC Championship, was named ECAC Tournament MVP, and earned a spot on both the ECAC All-Rookie Team and the All-Ivy League Second Team. Last season, he helped Cornell repeat as ECAC Champions while being named to the ECAC All-Tournament Team.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Capitals. Calgary fell 3-1 in these clubs' first matchup on January 23 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-3-2 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 11-10-4 against Eastern Conference opponents.

WELCOME TO CALGARY:

Ryan Strome arrived in Calgary and made his Flames debut on Saturday night against Carolina, recording a goal and an assist to register his second multi-point game of the season (also: Dec. 7 vs. CHI). Strome finished the night a point short of matching the franchise record for points in a Flames debut, a feat has been achieved by six players and last done by Kristian Huselius (0-3—3 on Dec. 3, 2005).

Strome is closing in on his 900th NHL game, sitting two contests away from becoming the ninth skater from the 2011 draft class to reach 900 games played, with one of the other players on that list being Jonathan Huberdeau who did so with Calgary last season on March 22 against the New York Islanders. In his career, the Mississauga, ON native has recorded 491 points, and is nine away from becoming the 15th player drafted in 2011 to reach the 500-point milestone.

MÄÄTTÄ OF FACT:

Olli Määttä also made his Calgary Flames debut on Saturday night, recording his first point as a Flame against the same club he recorded his first NHL point against, the Carolina Hurricanes (Oct. 8, 2013). The 31-year-old skated in a season-high 23:54 of ice-time against Carolina, his highest TIO in a single contest since January 4, 2025 when he saw 25:18 in a game against the Dallas Stars. Määttä's minutes were the second-most on the Flames on the night, behind only Kevin Bahl (25:50).

METRO-BOOMIN':

The Calgary Flames enter today's contest having recorded points in 15 of their last 17 games against Metropolitan Division opponents, dating back to a 3-1 win in Washington on February 25, 2025. Over that span, Calgary holds a 12-3-3 record against the division.

MAGIC NUMBER:

With their five-goal outburst against Carolina on Saturday night, the Calgary Flames have now won 51-straight games when scoring four or more goals in a contest, dating back to December 16, 2023. This season, Calgary is 14-0-0 when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game.



BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames are prepared to open their eighth back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season, travelling to New York to face the Rangers tomorrow night. Calgary's last back-to-back set saw them close out February at Crypto.com Arena against the Kings on February 28, before travelling to Anaheim to kick off their busy March schedule against the Ducks the following night. The Flames have one more back-to-back set remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their final one coming on April 11 when they close out a six-game road trip against the Seattle Kraken at Climate Pledge Arena before coming flying home to host the Utah Mammoth on April 12. Calgary began their 2025-26 season with a back-to-back set and played four of their first five contests on the campaign in back-to-back scenarios.

THE FORST-BEE CONNECTION:

Joel Farabee played his first game as Flames assistant captain on Saturday night against Carolina, marking the occasion two goals, including the game-winner, along with an assist for a three-point night. Farabee has registered 15 goals this season and with seven more can match his career-high of 22 which he set in 2023-24 as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers.

Morgan Frost also had himself a three-point night on Saturday, with a goal and the primary assist on both of Joel Farabee's markers against Carolina. The trio of points went down as Frost's fifth multi-point game this season, and the 3rd three-plus-point effort of his career, his first in a Flames sweater.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund enters play tonight with 598-career points, sitting two shy of becoming the sixth player in Flames franchise history to record 600 points with the club. Of Backlund's 598 points, 228 of them have been goals and with one more tally he would tie Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in franchise history as well as the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history. Backlund and Nilsson rank as the only two Swedes to eclipse 200 goals with the Calgary Flames.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Ryan Strome's goal, assisted by Olli Määttä, on Saturday against Carolina is the first scoring play featuring two Flames making their debuts since Oct. 3, 2013 when David Jones scored with Sean Monahan recording an assist, a game in which Sean Monahan was also making his NHL debut.
