# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP March 14, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. COLORADO AVALANCHE [4]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Colorado Avalanche to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Friday night. Colorado scored the only goal of the opening frame with Ryan Lindgren giving the visitors a 1-0 lead. In the second, the Avalanche would double their advantage in the middle stanza and the Flames found themselves down 2-0 through 40. Blake Coleman would get the home side on the board 3:08 into the third and give the Flames a spark. However, Colorado reclaimed their two-goal lead shortly after and would go on to knock off the Flames 4-2.

## **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Maple Leafs. Calgary fell 6-3 in their prior meeting with Toronto on February 4<sup>th</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-6-5 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 12-10-6 against Eastern Conference opponents.

## **WEEGSY BABY:**

MacKenzie Weegar recorded his 91st assist as a member of the Flames on Friday night against Colorado to give him seven points (1G, 6A) over his last six games. Weegar's 91 helpers in Flames threads lead all Calgary blueliners since he was acquired prior to the 2022-23 season, and rank as the third-most among all Flames skaters over that span behind only Jonathan Huberdeau (104) and Nazem Kadri (103).

#### **HUBY DOO:**

Jonathan Huberdeau scored his third goal over his last two games on Friday against Colorado to give him a team-leading 25 tallies on the campaign. He now sits five goals away from reaching the 30-goal plateau for the third time in his career.

Huberdeau's goal was also the 250<sup>th</sup> of his NHL career to make him the seventh skater from the 2011 NHL draft to score 250 or more in their career and join; Nikita Kucherov (TBL), Mark Scheifele (WPG), Mika Zibanejad (OTT, NYR), Ryan Nugent-Hopkins (EDM), Brandon Saad (CHI, CBJ, COL, STL, VGK), and J.T. Miller (NYR, TBL, VAN).

#### **HE'S NAZTY:**

Entering play tonight, Nazem Kadri has 48 points from 23 goals and 25 assists. With two more points, Kadri can become the third Flames skater in the past 30 years to record 50 points in his first three seasons with the franchise, following Alex Tanguay (3 from 2006-07 – 2010-11) and Daymond Langkow (3 from 2005-06 – 2007-08).

#### **FARABEE 400:**

Joel Farabee is slated to play in his 400<sup>th</sup> NHL game tonight against Toronto. The 24-year-old left winger was a first-round pick (14<sup>th</sup> overall) by Philadelphia in the 2018 NHL Draft. He would make his NHL debut during the 2019-20 season and has gone on to score 93 goals along with 112 assists for 205 points in his 399 NHL outings.

#### ON THE HUNT:

On Friday, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of Dryden Hunt from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Hunt has competed in 48 contests this season with the Wranglers, scoring 15 goals along with 33 helpers for 48 points, the second most on the team. The Cranbrook, BC native's 33 assists and 48 points are new career highs. Hunt was on a five-game point streak at the time of his recall, finding the scoresheet in all five games the Wranglers had played in the month of March. He has also registered eight points in his last seven American Hockey League outings, with three goals and five assists dating back to February 15<sup>th</sup>.

### **KILLER CONFIDENCE:**

Since the NHL's return from the 4 Nations Face Off break, the Calgary Flames have posted a penalty kill percentage of 90.3%, which ranks as the best PK in the NHL. The Flames have only surrendered three power play goals against which is tied for the fewest in the NHL dating back to February 20<sup>th</sup>.

#### **CALAGRY/TORONTO TIES:**

Flames forward Nazem Kadri was drafted by the Leafs seventh overall in the 2009 NHL Draft. Kadri would spend his first 10 seasons with Toronto, skating in 561 games with 161 goals along with 196 assists for 357 points and 387 penalty minutes before being traded to Colorado.

Maple Leafs blueliner Chris Tanev spent four years in Calgary from 2020-21 through 2023-24, wearing the Flaming 'C' for 259 games. During his four seasons with the Flames, Tanev blocked a team-leading 566 shots and had a team-high +73 plus-minus rating while averaging over 20 minutes of ice time a game. Maple Leafs Assistant Coach Marc Savard spent the 2023-24 campaign as an Assistant Coach with the Flames. Savard also played four seasons with Calgary from 1999 to 2003, scoring 60 goals and registering 94 assists for 154 points.

### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Flames forward Dryden Hunt was acquired by Calgary from Toronto during the 2023 trade deadline.

Flames forward Morgan Frost and Maple Leafs defenceman Conor Timmins were teammates on the Soo Greyhounds of the OHL for two seasons in 2016-17 and 2017-18.
