AT A GLANCE

LAFF FACTORY

Forward **Alex Laferriere** picked up his fourth and fifth assists of the season to mark his sixth career multi-point game (0-2=2) on Tuesday at the Xcel Energy Center. Laferriere enters tomorrow as Kings' leading goal scorer, having found the back of the net four times in his last five games (4-0=4), including his second multi-goal outing on Saturday against the Blackhawks. As part of his performance, Laferriere collected his first power-play goal and seventh even-strength goal (EVG) of the campaign. Only **Nikita Kucherov** (9G), **Leon Draisaitl** (8G), and **Tage Thompson** (8G) have more EVGs than Laferriere's seven. Laferriere is one of 17 skaters in Kings history to record at least seven EVGs through the first 14 games to start a season, and is just the sixth to do so aged 23 years or younger.

FIALA CALLED FIVES

After scoring his seventh goal of the season on Tuesday in Minnesota, forward **Kevin Fiala** skates into Crypto.com Arena on a five-game point streak (3-4=7) dating back to Oct. 26 against the Utah Hockey Club. The Swiss-born winger has now tallied nine points (3-6=9) over his last seven matchups against the Wild. Tomorrow, Fiala looks to extend his point streak against the Vancouver Canucks to a third straight game (2-1=3) and add to the six points (3-3=6) he has recorded against the Pacific Division rival in as many outings since joining the Kings ahead of the 2022-23 season. In 17 career contests against the Canucks since 2016-17, Fiala has scored 10 goals and added five assists for 15 total points (10-5=15) with two power play tallies and three game-winning goals.

SAUCE LAKE CITY

On Tuesday, forward **Trevor Lewis** scored his second and third goals of the season for the 100th and 101st goals of his career to become the 21st skater, and fourth U.S-born skater, selected in the 2006 NHL Draft to reach the 100-goal mark. Lewis (101-129=230) is also the second Utah-born skater in league history to reach the 100-goal mark, joining fellow Salt Lake City native **Steve Konowalchuk** (171-225=396), who played in 790 games with Washington and Colorado from 1991-2006. Appearing in his 14th season with the franchise, Lewis has amassed 184 points (81-103=184) with the organization which place seventh-most by a U.S.-born player with the Kings while his 79 goals rank sixth.
