- The Stars defeated the Penguins 7-1 in Pittsburgh. The victory marked the 621st of **Pete DeBoer's** head coaching career, which gave him sole possession of 20th on the all-time head coaching wins list.
- Nine different skaters recorded a point and five had multi-point efforts.
- **Brendan Smith** recorded his first points of the season with two assists on Monday, which was the 700th regular-season NHL game of his career.
- **Wyatt Johnston** recorded eight shots on goal, which matched his single-game career high and was the highest mark by a Dallas skater this season.
- The team's plus-19 shot differential was their best mark in a game this season.

## GAME NOTES

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final game the Stars will play against the Bruins this season. A Dallas win would give the Stars their first series sweep of the season.
- A Dallas victory tonight would give the Stars consecutive wins against the Bruins for the first time since they defeated Boston in straight games on Feb. 10, 2015 and on Nov. 3, 2015, winning both of those games 5-3.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.36 goals against per game this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Jamie Benn** has gone 73-for-111 at the faceoff dot this season. His 65.8 percent success rate was the best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Wednesday.
- **Esa Lindell** is averaging 3:34 of shorthanded time on ice per game this season, which was the seventh-highest mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Casey DeSmith** has posted a 1.79 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage in five games with the Stars this season. Entering play Wednesday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (third) and save percentage (sixth) among goaltenders to play in at least two games this year.

## LAST TIME OUT

- The Stars defeated the Penguins 7-1 in their last game on Nov. 11 in Pittsburgh, marking their highest-scoring game of the season so far.
- The win improved Dallas' record against Pittsburgh since the start of the 2021-22 season to 6-1-0, and they have now outscored them 23-11 in those contests.
  - The Stars have not allowed more than two goals in any of those seven games.
  - Their .857 points percentage against Pittsburgh since the start of 2021-22 is the second-best mark in the league (Edmonton, 1.00).

- Dallas has also gone 13-for-14 on the penalty kill against Pittsburgh since the start of the 2021-22 season. Their 92.9 percent success rate while playing a man down against the Penguins is tied for the third-best mark of any team during that span.
- Six of Dallas' seven goals were scored in the first period, marking the first time that the team has accomplished that feat since relocating to Dallas. It also marked the seventh time in franchise history – and the second time since relocating to Dallas – that the Stars have scored six goals in any period according to NHL Stats.
- Dallas was the first club to score six goals in the opening period of a game since four teams accomplished the feat in 2022-23 according to NHL Stats.
- Five Dallas skaters recorded multiple points in the first period – **Mason Marchment** (1-3–4), **Matt Duchene** (1-1–2), **Miro Heiskanen** (2-0–2), **Esa Lindell** (0-2–2) and **Brendan Smith** (0-2–2). It marked the 10th time in franchise history five or more players recorded multiple points in the opening frame for the Stars and first since Dec. 8, 2015 according to NHL Stats.
- Dallas' first five goals were scored in the first 14:37 of the game, which was the third-fastest five goals to begin a game in franchise history according to NHL Stats.

## IDES OF MARCH

- **Mason Marchment** recorded five points (1-4–5) in Dallas' last game, a 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game
  - It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4–6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
  - **Marchment** joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- **Marchment** (1-4–5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following Wyatt Johnston (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.
- His five-point game brought his season total to 13 points (3-10–13), which ties him with **Logan Stankoven** for second on the team in scoring this season.
- The 2024-25 season marked the first time in his career that **Marchment** has played at a point-per-game pace through his first 13 games played of a season.
- His 13 points are already 24.5 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31–53) that he reached last season in 81 games. **Marchment** is currently pacing to finish the year with 62 assists and 81 points, both of which would be career highs.
- **Marchment** enters tonight's game two assists shy of total 100 NHL assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 18th undrafted, active skater to tally 100 career assists.

## HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Boston with a perfect 6-0-0 record while playing at the American Airlines Center this season.
  - Dallas' one "home" loss this season was played at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- The Stars have allowed only six goals against in total in five games at the American Airlines Center this year.
- Dallas has gone a perfect 15-for-18 on the penalty kill when playing at the AAC this season.
- **Logan Stankoven** is the team's leading scorer while playing at the American Airlines Center this season, totaling seven points (one goals, six assists) in six games played.

## THE B HIVE

- **Miro Heiskanen** has four assists in his last four games against the Bruins.
- **Jason Robertson** has six points (2-4–6) in six career games against Boston.
- **Tyler Seguin** has six points (3-3–6) in his last six games against the Bruins.

## TYLER THE CREATOR

- **Tyler Seguin** has recorded a point in eight of the 10 games that he has played this year (7-4–11) and enters tonight's matchup against the Penguins ranked fourth on the team in scoring.
- **Seguin's** 11 points through his first 10 games played of the season is his highest scoring rate to begin a year since he had 12 points (3-9–12) in the first 10 games he played in 2018-19.
- With seven goals and 11 points in 10 games, **Seguin** is playing at a 55-goal and 86-point pace.
- When **Seguin** has been on the ice this year during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 6-2 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Seguin enters tonight's game one point shy of reaching the 800-point milestone. When he does, he will become the first skater from the 2010 draft class and the 21st active player to total at least 800 career points.

## DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 18 points (8-10–18) in 14 games this season, which includes recording six multi-point efforts this year.
- 2024-25 marks the first time in **Duchene's** career that he has had 18 or more points through his first 14 games played of a season.

- With 18 points in 14 games, **Duchene** has already reached 27.7 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40—65) despite only being 17.7 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in 10 of the 14 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (eight) and points (18) and tied for the team lead in assists (10).
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 10-4 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- He is currently pacing to finish the year with 47 goals, 59 assists and 105 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

## ROOKIE REPORT

- **Logan Stankoven** scored the game-winning goal in Dallas's 7-1 win over the Penguins and now has 13 points (3-10—13) through his first 14 games played this season. He enters tonight's game tied for both the team lead in assists and for second on the team with scoring.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Stankoven** was leading all rookies in scoring and points per game (0.93) this season, and his 10 assists were tied with Montreal's Lane Hutson for the league lead among first-year players.
  - His three goals this year were tied for the third-most among rookie skaters this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Stankoven** recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).
- **Stankoven** (8-18—26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following **Jason Robertson** (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, **Stankoven** became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Despite only playing in 38 regular-season games in his career, **Stankoven** already ranks 12th in career scoring among skaters selected in the 2021 NHL Draft. His 0.71 career points per game also top 2021 draftees who have appeared in at least two regular-season games.
  - The 11 skaters ranked in front of him have all played in at least 90 career regular-season games.
- His 10 assists this season have already surpassed his total from last year and he is one point shy of matching his total from 2023-24.
- **Stankoven** is pacing to finish the year with 59 assists and 76 points. Fifty-nine assists would establish a franchise record for assists by a Stars/North Stars rookie and 76 points would make him the second-highest scoring rookie in franchise history (Neal Broten, 98 points).
  - If he were to finish the year with 76 points, he would also become the highest scoring rookie since Mathew Barzal had 85 points (22-63—85) in 2017-18.

## BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's contest having played in 311 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, making him the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- **Benn's** current 311-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- **Benn** is one of 16 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,126), goals (386), assists (528) and points (914). His 914 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

## ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Esa Lindell** has several franchise milestones withing reach:
  - He is three points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
  - **Lindell** is two goals away from tying Philippe Boucher for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
  - He is also 17 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- **Tyler Seguin** is four assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
