- Roope Hintz (0-1—1) registered an assist on Evgenii Dadonov's goal to extend his point streak against the Red Wings to four games, earning 11 points (3-8—11) during that span.

# **GAME NOTES**

#### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the fourth and final game that the Stars will play against the Predators this season and the second time they are playing in Nashville this year. The Stars won two out of three of the teams' previous meetings: Dallas defeating Nashville with a 4-3 win on Oct. 10. The Stars fell short to the Predators in a 4-1 loss on Dec. 12. Dallas earning a 5-1 win vs. Nashville on April 3.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 50-25-6 record for 106 points and a .654 points percentage. Their 50 wins were tied for the second-most in the NHL and their point total and points percentage ranked fourth in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he
  will become...
  - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's
     557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
  - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (492).
  - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Tuesday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.38, third) and top 10 in goals against per game (2.68, sixth).

## **PLAYOFF BOUND**

 Dallas became the third team to clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with their 5-1 win over the Kraken in their game on March 29.

- 2024-25 season marks the 37th postseason appearance in franchise history and their fifth time in the past five seasons
   tied for the most among all teams in that span according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have made the Conference Finals in each of their past two postseasons and can become the fifth team in the
  past 20 years to do so in three straight (also TBL, CHI, LAK & DET) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have won nine series in the past 10 years, tied with the Penguins for the third most in the NHL in that span according to NHL Stats behind only the Lightning (18) and Golden Knights (11).
- The Stars are set to face off against the Colorado Avalanche in the first round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

#### PREDATORS TO PREY

- Dallas is 59-40-12 all-time vs. Nashville, including a 24-24-8 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned wins in eight of their last 11 games played against the Predators (8-3-0). Dallas has also won their last five consecutive games at Bridgestone Arena.
- Jamie Benn has totaled 43 points (16-27-43) in 67 career games against the Predators, which is fourth-most among all active NHL skaters.
  - Benn's 43 points against Nashville are the most by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene has totaled 39 points (14-25—39) in 41 regular-season games against the Predators. Duchene's 39 career
  points rank seventh all-time among active NHL skaters.
  - Duchene has eight points (3-5-8) in seven games against the Predators as a member of the Stars, dating back to Dec. 23, 2023.
- Jason Robertson has totaled 26 points (10-16—26) in 23 career games played against Nashville, his highest assist and point total against a single opponent.
  - His 1.13 points-per-game against the Predators rank 15th among active NHL skaters that have played Nashville at least 15 times in their career.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Nashville, earning six points (1-5—6) during those games. In all, Rantanen has registered 33 points (11-22—33) in 28 career games against the Predators, averaging more than a point per game against them (1.18).
- Mikael Granlund enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game point streak against the Predators, earning eight points (5-3—8) during that span. Granlund has put up 27 points (12-15—27) in 30 career games vs. Nashville.
- Wyatt Johnston has totaled eight points (5-3-8) in 11 career games played against the Predators.
- Roope Hintz has totaled 26 career points (13-13—26) in 28 regular-season games against Nashville, his highest total against a single opponent.
- Mason Marchment has tallied six points in his last five games vs. Nashville (3-3—6).
- Thomas Harley has five points (0-5—5) in his last six games played against the Predators.
- Lian Bichsel has registered two goals in his last two games played against Nashville, which is his only active point streak against a single opponent.
  - o Of Bichsel's four goals this season, two have come against the Predators.

#### NOW YOU CECI ME, NOW YOU DON'T

- Dallas' last game on April 14 against Detroit was **Cody Ceci's** 84th game played this season he appeared in 54 regular-season games with the Sharks prior to being traded to Dallas, where he has played in 30 games with the Stars.
- If Ceci were to play tonight, he would become just the ninth player in NHL history to play in at least 85 games during a regular season, joining Tyson Barrie (2022-23), Rem Murray (2002-03), Bill Guerin (2000-01), Glenn Anderson (1993-94), Bob Kudelski (1993-94), Mark Lamb (1993-94), Joe Reekie (1993-94) and Jimmy Carson (1992-93).
- In 25 games since the Four Nations break (since Feb. 22), the Stars have outscored their opponents 30-16 at even strength when Ceci has been on the ice. His plus-14 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the seventh-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.
- In all this season, Ceci has totaled 24 points (4-20—24) in 84 games, which makes the 2024-25 campaign the fifth-highest scoring season of his 12-year career.

#### **IRON MEN**

- The Stars have three players that have appeared in every game for the club this season: Matt Duchene, Wyatt Johnston
  and Jason Robertson.
- If he plays tonight, the 2024-25 campaign with mark the second time in **Roberston's** career that he has played in all 82 of Dallas' 82 regular-season games after also doing so last year.
- Robertson's 291-game Iron Man streak began on Jan. 20, 2022 and was tied for the ninth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Johnston has played in every single regular-season game since he made he NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. If he plays tonight, he will become one of 26 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 246 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
  - His 245-game Iron Man streak was tied for the 20th-longest such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- If **Duchene** dresses for tonight's game, it will mark the third time in his 16-year career that he has played in all of his team's regular-season games. He enters tonight's contest having played in 106 consecutive regular-season games dating back to Feb. 20, 2024.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- The Stars have a 22-15-3 record when playing on the road this year, which is tied for the seventh-most road wins in a single season in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 45 points (17-28-45) in 40 games. His 45 road points were tied for seventh in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday.
  - o **Duchene's** 28 road assists this season are already a career high and his 45 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career, one shy of his career high that he set in 2021-22.
- Mikael Granlund has recorded 41 points (14-27—41) in 36 road games this season, which includes notching 11 points (3-8—11) in 16 road games with this Stars.
  - o Granlund's 14 goals, 27 assists and 41 points on the road this season are already career bests.
- Mikko Rantanen has 44 points (16-28-43) in 40 road games this season, including tallying 12 points (4-8-12) in 10 road games since being acquired by the Stars.
- Rantanen and Granlund tied for 10th and ranked 15th, respectively, in road scoring this season entering play Tuesday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 10, totaling 34 points (17-17—34) in 34 games played.
  - o Robertson's 20 road goals this year were tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
  - Since Jan. 10, Robertson has scored 15 goals on the road, which topped the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday and were two more than the second ranked player (Leon Draisaitl; 13).
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Jan. 13, totaling 20 points (11-9—20) in 20 games played.
- Roope Hintz has 18 points (3-15—18) in the last 18 games he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 12.
- Thoams Harley has 10 points (5-5—9) in his last 14 games played on the road dating back to Feb. 7. His 10 road points during that span were tied for the ninth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.
- Mason Marchment has nine points (2-7—9) in his last nine road games played and enters tonight's game riding a fourgame road point streak.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last six games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .955 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average during that span. His save percentage and goals-against average on the road since Jan. 25 ranked second and third, respectively, in the NHL entering play Tuesday among goaltenders who have played in at least two road games during that span.
  - o His six road wins since Jan. 25 were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play TuesdY.
  - DeSmith's six-game road win streak is the longest such streak of his career.

#### **BIKER GANG**

- Thomas Harley has 27 points (9-18—27) in his last 29 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fifth on Dallas' roster during that span.
  - Harley's 27 points (9-18—27) since Jan. 31 were the fourth-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.
- Harley tallied his 50th point of the season with an assist against the Canucks on April 8, making him the third Stars defensemen in the last 10 years to reach the 50-point plateau, joining Miro Heiskanen (2022-23 and 2023-24) and John Klingberg (2015-16 and 2017-18).
  - Harley's assist also allowed him to tie Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Harley set a career high with his 16th goal of the season in Dallas' game on April 6 against the Wild. His 16 goals this
  year are tied for the sixth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history and were tied for the sixthmost among all NHL defensemen this year entering play Sunday.
- Harley's assist against Pittsburgh on April 5 was his 33rd assist and 48th point of the season, both of which set career highs for the defenseman.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 24:58 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked eighth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
  - o Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
  - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 93-58. His plus-35 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday.
- Harley recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' March 26 game against the Oilers, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman
  in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP),
  Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).

- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
  - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Harley's game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fifth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 1972-73).

#### **POWER UP**

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 37-for-126 on the power play for a 29.4 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.
- The team's 37 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were tied with Detroit for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored nine power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.
- In all this season, the Stars have had three games in which they have scored at least three power-play goals Oct. 24 at Boston (3), March 2 vs. St. Louis (4) and April 8 vs. Vancouver (3).

#### THIRTY, FLIRTY AND THRIVING

- The Stars enter tonight's game with four players that have scored at least 30 goals this season: Jason Robertson (35), Wyatt Johnston (33) Mikko Rantanen (32) and Matt Duchene (30).
  - o The 2024-25 campaign marks the first time the Stars' roster has housed four 30-goal scorers since the 1992-93 season when Russ Courtnall (36), Ulf Dahlen (35), Dave Gagner (33) and Mike Modano (33) all scored at least 30 goals.
- Entering play Tuesday, the Stars and the Tampa Bay Lightning were the only two teams this season to have four 30goal scorers on its roster.
- Entering tonight's game, Roope Hintz is two goals shy of reaching the 30-goal mark. If he were to score 30 goals by the end of the regular season, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the Stars would have five 30-goals scorers on its roster.
- Additionally, the Stars could become the first team to have five 30-goal scorers on its roster since the Pittsburgh Penguins and Detroit Red Wings, who both did so during the 1992-93 season according to NHL Stats. Please note that this includes players who did not score all 30+ of their goals with one team.

### **IT TAKES TWO**

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 20-8-3 record in his last 30 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .913 save percentage and a 2.60 goals-against average during that span.
  - o His 20 wins since Dec. 29 were the fourth-most in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- Oettinger made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.

- Oettinger's shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate Casey DeSmith for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of **Oettinger's** career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Casey DeSmith has posted an 8-2-1 record in his last 11 games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .920 save percentage and a 2.64 goals-against average in those contests.
- **DeSmith** made 46 saves in Dallas' March 27 game against the Flames, a 5-2 Stars win. His 46 saves were the most by a Dallas netminder this season and the third-most in a single game in **DeSmith's** career.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .908 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday. The duo's 2.66 goals-against average this season was tied for sixth in the NHL this year entering play Tuesday.

- Thomas Harley is four goals shy of surpassing Barry Gibbs (35) for the 15th-most goals by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is one goal shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is two assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is eight points shy of tying Lou Nanne (225) for 10th most points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is eight goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Wyatt Johnston is one goal shy from tying Mike Modano (90) for the second-most before age 22 in Stars/North Stars history. Brian Bellows tops the list with 133.

- Stars forward Matt Duchene played for Nashville for four seasons (2019-20 to 2022-23), recording 197 points (84 goals, 113) in 197 regular-season games and adding nine points (five goals, four assists) in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell played part of the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons with the Predators, totaling 10 points (3-7—10) in 33 regular-season games.
- Stars forward **Mikael Granlund** played 268 games for the Predators between 2018-19 and 2022-23 earning 162 points (51-111—162).
- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverley** played for the Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09, recording 20 points (7-13—20) in 73 regular-season games.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Predators defenseman Jeremy Lauzon were both a part of the Seattle Kraken's inaugural roster in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Predators forward Jonathan Marchessault both played for the Vegas Golden Knights during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Predators forward Ryan O'Reilly played in Colorado together from 2009-10 to 2014-15. The two also played for Team Canada together at the 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017 IIHF World Championships and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey. They've won four medals together: 2015 World Championship (gold), 2016 World Championship (gold), 2016 World Cup of Hockey (gold) and 2017 World Championship (silver).
  - Stars forward Tyler Seguin won a gold medal with the duo at the 2015 World Championships and defenseman Matt Dumba won a gold medal with the two at the 2016 World Championships.
  - Predators forward Steven Stamkos was also on the 2013 team with Duchene and O'Reilly. Stamkos played again with the two at the 2017 World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Predators forward Steven Stamkos both played in Tampa Bay in 2023-24.
- Stars forward Roope Hintz and defenseman Esa Lindell have both played for Team Finland in international competition with Predators goaltender Juuse Saros.
  - Hintz and Saros played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
  - o Lindell and Saros played together at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Championship. They won a gold medal in 2014 and a silver medal in 2016.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Predators defenseman Brady Skjei both played for the New York Rangers from 2016-17 to 2019-20. The two then reunited in Carolina for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played with Predators forward Michael Bunting and defenseman Jordan Oesterle in Arizona during the 2018-19 and 2020-21 seasons.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin played with Predators forward Michael Bunting in Toronto during the 2021-22 season.

- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen played with Predators defensemen Justin Barron and Andreas Englund and goaltender Justus Annunen in Colorado. Rantanen played with Barron during the 2021-22 season and Englund in 2022-23. Rantanen was teammates with Annunen from 2021-22 to 2024-25.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and defenseman Cody Ceci played with Predators defenseman Andreas Englund in Ottawa. Ceci and Englund played together from 1016-17 to 2018-19 and Duchene joined them for 2017-18 and 2018-19.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell played with Predators defenseman Andreas Englund in Chicago for the 2022-23
