

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 10, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] at CAROLINA HURRICANES [7]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames finished off a three-game road trip at PNC Arena against the Carolina Hurricanes. The Flames would fall behind 2-0 after 20 following a pair of opening frame goals by the Hurricanes. In the second, Dryden Hunt got the Flames on the board, but Carolina continued to push and found themselves up 6-1. Yegor Sharangovich would find the back of the net in the third, but Calgary fell 7-2.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Avalanche. The Flames have dropped both prior meetings against Colorado this season.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-8-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 18-15-2 against Western Conference opponents.

### **FIRST MEETING:**

The Calgary Flames finished up a four-game road trip in Colorado in the clubs first meeting back on November 25th. It would be the Avalanche who opened the scoring prior to the midway point of the first off the stick of Jonathan Drouin and Colorado led 1-0 through 20. In the second, Ryan Johansen extended Colorado's advantage to two goals, before Mikael Backlund made it goals in back-to-back games to give Calgary life and make it 2-1. Nathan MacKinnon would score later in the frame to restore the Avalanche's two-goal lead and make it 3-1 through 40. Calgary would outshoot Colorado 15-6 in the third period but couldn't find an answer and fell 3-1 in game one of their season-series. In their second meeting, the Flames would get goals from Nazem Kadri, Andrew Mangiapane, Blake Coleman, Connor Zary and Yegor Sharangovich but fell 6-5 to Colorado in a back-and-forth contest.

### **NAZ-HIM KADRI:**

In these clubs second meeting on December 11<sup>th</sup>, Nazem Kadri had a big night against his former team, recording a goal and an assist for his-then fourth multi-point game of the season. With the goal, Nazem Kadri scored the 250<sup>th</sup> in his NHL career and at the time became the sixth skater from the 2009 draft to reach 250 NHL goals and joined: John Tavares, Matt Duchene, Evander Kane, Chris Kreider, and Ryan O'Reilly. Kadri is now up to 265 goals in his NHL career, and his 0.70 points-per-game rank fourth among all skaters from the 2009 draft class, behind only John Tavares (0.94), Matt Duchene (0.77) and Ryan O'Reilly (0.72).

### **SHARKNADO:**

Yegor Sharangovich scored four goals on the Flames recent three-game road trip to increase his goal total to 27 on the campaign. Sharangovich currently leads all skaters on a new team this season in goals, with Tyler Toffoli (26 w/ NJD/WPG) – whom he was traded for in June, sitting in second. His 10 multi-point games in 2023-24 are the fourth most among all Flames players this season behind Nazem Kadri (12), Blake Coleman (11) and Jonathan Huberdeau (11).

### **ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIES:**

Avalanche defenseman Cale Makar was born in Calgary and played his junior hockey just two hours east of his hometown with the Brooks Bandits of the AJHL. Nazem Kadri spent time in Colorado, skating in 178 games over three seasons with the Avs scoring 155 points (58G, 97A) over that span. Kadri was also a key contributor in the 2022 playoffs for the Avalanche, scoring seven goals and eight assists for 15 points en route to winning the Stanley Cup. A.J. Greer was a Colorado Avalanche second-round draft pick in 2015 and played in 37 games with Colorado over three seasons. Flames defenseman Dennis Gilbert also played three games with the Colorado Avalanche during the COVID-shortened 2021 season. Winger Dryden Hunt spent 25 games with the Colorado Avalanche during the 2022-23 season, registering one goal.

### **ON THE HUNT:**

Dryden Hunt scored his third of the season on Sunday in Carolina. Since being recalled by the Flames on February 17<sup>th</sup>, Hunt's trio of tallies are tied with Andrew Mangiapane for the fourth-most on the Flames over that span, trailing Yegor Sharangovich (7), Blake Coleman (5) and Nazem Kadri (5). Hunt's first goal as a Flame came on February 24<sup>th</sup> in Edmonton, a goal that held up as the game-winner, the third of his career.

### **LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

Flames captain Mikael Backlund (198-327—525 in 972 GP) is two goals away from becoming the 11<sup>th</sup> player in franchise history with 200 goals. Backlund has 13 goals on the campaign and is looking to become just the second Swedish-born skater in Flames franchise history to reach 200 goals with the Flames and join Kent Nilsson (229).


### **'DOME SWEET DOME:**

The Flames get set to kick-off a four-game homestand tonight against Colorado. Following tonight's tilt, Calgary will host Vegas on Thursday and Montreal on Saturday to close out the week. Calgary will finish off the four-game stand by welcoming the Washington Capitals next Monday.

### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Yegor Sharangovich (7-2—9 in 6 GP) leads the Flames with seven goals in his last five games dating to Feb. 27.
