TOP NOTES

JJ Peterka (2+1) has now registered at least one goal in each of his last three games against the Senators. His first goal made him the second-youngest Sabres skater (22 years, 296 days) to record a goal streak of three or more games against Ottawa. Tonight marked the third time in his career that he has recorded three or more points in a single game and the first since April 2, 2024 vs. Washington (2+1).

With his assist on **Peterka's** power-play goal, **Jason Zucker** has now posted 10 points (3+7) in his last 10 games, including at least one in each of his last six home games (3+4). His current streak is the longest home point streak of his career.

As a result of his two goals, **Bowen Byram** has recorded four points (2+2) in his last three games. His first goal of the game marked the first goal he has tallied against Ottawa in his career.

Tage Thompson recorded a career-high 11 shots in tonight's game, one shy of tying the single-game franchise record.

Rasmus Dahlin's assist on **Byram's** first goal marked his 300th NHL point. He is now tied with Alexei Zhitnik for third on Buffalo's all-time list for assists by a defenseman (234) and he became the third Sabres defenseman to record 300 or more points with Buffalo (Phil Housley, 558; Mike Ramsey, 329).

Dahlin has notched seven points (1+6) in his last five games and he has posted seven points (1+6) in his last six home games against Ottawa.

Buffalo's two goals within the first 37 seconds of the third period marked the second-fastest two goals scored by the Sabres from the start of a period in franchise history. The quickest two goals came on Jan. 10, 1974 vs. NY Rangers (31 seconds; third period).

As a result of his two points (1+1), **Tage Thompson** has now registered at least one point in each of his last six home games and he has tallied 10 total points (5+5) in those games. In his last six games overall, **Thompson** has recorded nine points (4+5).

Ryan McLeod recorded two points (0+2) in tonight's game. It marked the sixth time he has posted multiple assists in a single game in his career, and the first time he has done so with Buffalo.

Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen made 37 saves and allowed just one goal in tonight's game. His performance marked the second time he has made 35 or more saves and allowed one or fewer goals in a single game in his career.
