- Going into Monday's game, Philadelphia is looking to break the two-game losing streak (0-2-0) aginst Pittsburgh with the last win on Dec. 4, 2023 (2-1 OT). This is the first of four contests against Pittsburgh.
- The Flyers are 1-3-1 on the road against the Penguins and looking to break the one-game losing road streak (0-1-0) with the last win on Dec. 2, 2023 (4-3 SO).
- Forward **Travis Konecny** has nine points (4g-5a) in the last nine games against the Penguins.
- Forward **Tyson Foerster** has six points (4g-2a) in the last four games against the Penguins.
- Captain **Sean Couturier** has six points (2q-4a) in the last seven games against the Penguins.
- Forward **Scott Laughton** has four points (3g-1a) in the last four games against the Penguins.
- Forward Morgan Frost has three points (1g-2a) in the last three games against the Penguins.
- Defenseman **Travis Sanheim** has three points (1g-2a) in the last three games against the Penguins.
- Forward **Owen Tippett** has three points (2g-1a) in the last four games against the Penguins.
- Defenseman **Cam York** has three points (1g-2a) in the last four games against the Penguins.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Philadelphia owns a 5-3-2 record in their last 10 games on the road since Nov. 2.
- The Flyers will play their next six games on the road with a five-game road trip after the Christmas Break.
- Philadelphia lead the NHL in shootout wins (2) on the road and have a 83.3% penalty kill percentage on the road (7th best in NHL).
- The Flyers recorded a seven-game point streak (5-0-2) on the road from Nov. 7 to Dec. 10.

EAST MODE ACTIVATED

- Philadelphia has a 8-8-2 record against the Eastern Conference, including a 5-4-2 record against the Atlantic Division and a 3-4-0 record against the Metropolitan Division.

KILLER INSTINCTS

- Philadelphia ranks ninth in the league in the penalty minutes per game (9:01), however the Flyers rank 15th in the NHL with 19 power-play goals-against in 96 penalty kills (80.2%).
- The Flyers have a perfect kill rate in 20 of 34 games this season.
- Philadelphia owned a seven-game streak without allowing a goal on the penalty kill, 10/29-11/11.
- Philadelphia tallied a shorthanded goal twice this season: Oct. 12 at Calgary and Dec. 12 against Detroit.



EXTRA SWAGGER IN EXTRA TIME

- The Flyers won their eighth game via overtime or a shootout this season on Dec. 21 vs. Columbus, passing the Oilers for the most in 2024-25.
- Philadelphia has gone past regulation a total of 12 times, tying Calgary for the most games past regulation and own the best extra time record at 8-4.
- The Flyers have gone into overtime in four consecutive games (11/7-11/14), which tied their lengthiest streak in franchise history at four games (6x; last: Dec. 16-30, 2021).
- Philadelphia played three consecutive that have gone to a shootout (11/7-11/11), posting a 2-1 record during that stretch.
- The last time the Flyers experienced a similar streak was during the 2019-20 season, going 2-1 in three shootout games: 11/9/19 at Toronto, 11/10/19 at Boston & 11/13/19 vs. Washington.

TEAM MISCELLANEOUS

- Philadelphia is 2-3-0 in their last five games and 4-5-1 in the last ten games.
- The Flyers lead the NHL with 630 blocked shots and and third with 199 takeaways.
- Philadelphia ranks 19th in the NHL with 695 hits. Forward **Garnet Hathaway** ranks eighth in the NHL in hits (116).
- The Flyers scored three game-tying goals in the third period of a game for the third time in franchise history. The others: March 26, 2024 and Oct. 16, 2001. Saturday marked the first time Philadelphia accomplished the feat and won (Dec. 21 vs. Columbus).
- Philadelphia scored three game-tying goals in the third period of a contest for the second time this calendar year (also March 26, 2024). The Flyers became the first team in NHL history to accomplish the feat multiple times in the same calendar year.
- Philadelphia joined Colorado (3), Tampa Bay (3), New Jersey (2) and Winnipeg (2) to become the fifth team to record multiple hat tracks this season, Sean Couturier (10/26/24 vs. MIN) and Scott Laughton (12/12/24 vs. DET).
- Per NHL Stats, Philadelphia won after scoring a game-tying goal within the final 15 seconds of regulation for the fourth time in franchise history on Nov. 27 at Nashville. The others: March 8, 2006 (59:59 vs. CAR), March 31, 2013 (59:50 vs. WSH) and Feb. 21, 2012 (59:50 at WPG).

KEEPING IT ERR-TIGHT

- Samuel Ersson allowed three-or-fewer goals in 10 of 16 games played.
- He has posted a record of 2-3-0 in the last five games since returning from Injured Reserve.
- He returned to action after missing 11 games against Utah (12/8), stopping 21-of-25 shots in the contest.
- The Swedish native posted his sixth career shutout in a 2-0 win at Boston (10/29), stopping all 25 shots he faced. He becomes the 17th Flyers goaltender to reach the milestone in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Ersson became just the third Flyers goaltender to post a shutout in Boston, joining Antero Niittymaki (27 saves on Jan. 2, 2006) and Brian Boucher (21 saves on March 4, 2000).
- He stopped a season-high 28-of-31 shots in regulation against Vancouver (10/19).
- He earned his first win of the season on Friday (10/11), saving 24-of-26 shots in regulation/OT and 4-of-5 shots in the shootout.
- The win during the season-opener against Vancouver (10/11) marked the goaltender's fifth career shootout win to tie for fourth all-time among Flyers goaltenders in shootout wins.

FEDS AND FEARLESS

- Ivan Fedotov was pulled after saving five of seven shots in the first period against Florida (12/5).
- He has earned a point in the five of his last seven games (4-1-1) and has gone past regulation in five of his last seven games.
- He saved 26-of-30 shots in regulation/overtime and 2-of-3 shots in the shootout against Vegas (11/25).
- He faced 30-plus shots in four of his eight games this season.
- He stopped 33 of 37 shots against Carolina (11/20).
- He posted a three-game win streak, 11/7-11/16.
- He earned his first win at home and first win in regulation on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo, saving 24-of-26 shots.
- The goaltender notched his first overtime win at Ottawa on Nov. 14, stopping 33-of-37 shots he faced.
- He recorded his first NHL win and shootout win against Tampa on Nov. 7.
- He stopped 22-of-23 shots he faced in regulation/overtime and went 2-for-2 shots in the shootout vs. Tampa (11/7).

KOLOS-SAL IN THE CREASE

- Aleksei Kolosov holds a 2-2-1 record in his last five games played and has allowed three-or-fewer goals in six of his 11 games played.
- He ranks third among NHL rookie goaltenders in wins (4), ranks 10th in goals-against average (3.34) and save percentage (.878).
- He is only one of three NHL rookie goaltenders to play 10-plus games.
- The Belarusian native posted a career-high three-game win streak, Nov. 23-30, all three games had gone past regulation.
- He recorded his first NHL win on Nov. 23 against Chicago and became the first Belarusian-born goaltender to record a win in the NHL.
- Per NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Flyers history to record their first career win in overtime joining Rob Zepp, Sam-



uel Ersson and Ivan Fedotov.

- He missed three games due to a lower-body injury, 11/17-11/11.
- The goaltender made his NHL against Montreal on Oct. 27, saving 20-of-24 shots he faced and posting a .833 save percentage.
- He became the first Belarusian-born goaltender and 17th Belarusian-native to play in the National Hockey League.

CATES AND BAKE

- Noah Cates notched his first multi-point game this seasn (1g-1a) to extend his goal/point streak to three games (3g-1a), 12/18-12/21.
- He owns six points (4g-2a) in the last six games.
- He leads the team in plus/minus (+7) and ninth in goals.
- The 25-year-old logged a season-high 17:04 time on ice on Nov. 14 at Ottawa.
- He posted two points (1g-1a) in back-to-back games on Dec. 10 at Columbus and Dec. 12 vs. Detroit.

CAPTAIN O' CAPTAIN

- Sean Couturier owns eight points (3g-5a) in his last 13 games.
- He ranks second on the team in overtime goals (1), tied for third in game-winning goals (1), tied for fourth in assists (11), fifth in points (17), tied for sixth in goals (6) and shots (61).
- He took sole possession of 12th in Flyers history in all-time assists (318) on Dec. 18 at Detroit.
- He tied Gary Dornhoefer (316) for 12th in Flyers history in all-time assists on Dec. 7 at Boston.
- He posted a four-game point streak (3g-2a), 11/23-11/29.
- He leads all the Flyers in career overtime goals (7) and ranks third in franchise history behind Claude Giroux (11) and Jakub Voracek (9).
- With his assist against Carolina on Nov. 5, he passes John LeClair for 13th in all-time assists in Flyers history with 311 assists.
- He tallied his second career regular season hat trick in his first career five-point game (3g-2a) on Saturday vs. Minnesota (10/26).
- The forward tallied his 500th career NHL point with his first goal on Oct. 26 against Minnesota. He is the 16th player in franchise history to surpass this milestone and the 11th NHL player to hit the 500 point-mark from the 2011 NHL Draft class.
- He recorded his 800th NHL game on Oct. 19 against Vancouver.

BUZZIN' WITH BEEZER

- Joel Farabee has four points (1g-3a) in the last nine games.
- He ranks fourth on the team in shots (71), tied for fifth in power-play points (3), 10th in points (12) and tied for 10th in goals (4).
- He scored a goal against Utah on Dec. 8, breaking a 12-game goal drought.
- He has tallied two three-game point streaks this season, Oct. 27-31 and Oct. 11-17.
- He posted a three-game point streak (1g-2a) from Oct. 27-31.
- The 24-year-old owned three points (1g-2a) in the first four games of the season, Oct. 11-17.
- He tallied a power-play assist on Friday against Vancouver (10/11) to kick off the season. Per NHL Stats, with the assist, Farabee extended his career totals in season-opening games to three goals and five assists (5 GP). - Tyson Foerster tallied his second multi-point game (1g-1a) this season and ninth in his career on Dec. 21 against Columbus.
- The 22-year-old is currently on a three-game assist/point streak (3g-3a), 12/18-12/21.
- He owns 10 points (5g-5a) in the last 11 games and 12 points (7g-5a) in the last 16 games.
- He ranks third on the team in power-play goals (3), tied for third in game-winning goals (1), fourth in goals (9), and tied for sixth in points (16).
- He notched his second career three-point performance (2g-1a) on Dec. 19 vs. Los Angeles.

- He tallied a four-point game (2g-2a) against Carolina on Nov. 5, his third multi-point game this season and 94th in his career.

- The center scored his first career four-goal game on Dec. 12 against Detroit, ending a six-game goal drought.
- He is the first Flyer to score four goals in a game since John LeClair on Oct. 15, 2002 against Montreal.
- He scored his 100th career NHL goal on Dec. 12 against Detroit and became the 38th player in Flyers franchise history to reach this milestone.

MARVELOUS MICHKOV

- Matvei Michkov owns 10 points (3g-7a) in the last 10 games and 12 points (5g-7a) in the last 14 games.
- He posted a career-high five-game point streak (3g-7a), 11/30-12/10.
- The rookie leads NHL rookies in points (27), power-play goals (5), and power-play points (12), overtime goals (3), ranks tied for first in goals (11), second in assists (16), tied for second in game-winning goals (3), third in shots (66) and sixth in time on ice (17:02).
- He leads the team in power-play points, overtime goals and game-winning goals, ranks second in assists, points and power-play goals, tied for second in goals and fifth in shots.
- He tallied multi-point games in three consecutive games: two points (1g-1a) on Nov. 30 at STL, three points (0g-3a) on Dec. 5 vs. FLA and two points (2g-0a) on Dec. 7 at BOS.
- Per NHL Stats, Michkov has three consecutive multi-point outings, joining Eric Lindros (3 GP in 1992-93) and Peter Zezel (2x in 1984-85) as the only Flyers teenagers to do so in three consecutive games.
- He scored his third career overtime goal on Nov. 30 at St. Louis and is tied for most by a teenager in NHL history along with Sidney Crosby, Rick Nash and Ilya Kovalchuk.
- Michkov (8g-10a in 23 GP) required the fourth-fewest games by a Flyers teenager to reach 10 career assists behind Peter Zezel (10 GP in 1984-85), Eric Lindros (17 GP in 1992-93) and Behn Wilson (21 GP in 1978-79). (NHL Stats)
- Per NHL Stats, Michkov joined Danius Zubrus (5 in 1997-98), Sean Couturier (4 in 2011-12) and Mike Ricci (4 in 1990-91) as the fourth teenager in Flyers history with three or more game-winning goals in a single season.
- He scored his second career overtime goal on Saturday against Chicago. Per NHL Stats, Michkov became the eighth teenager in NHL history to score multiple overtime goals along with Ilya Kovalchuk (3), Rick Nash (3), Sidney Crosby (3), Lucas Raymond (2), Clayton Keller (2), Cam Fowler (2) and Andrei Svechnikov (2).
- He scored the overtime goal at Ottawa (11/14), his first career overtime goal. He is the youngest Flyer to score an overtime goal in franchise history.
- The right wing is the fourth Flyers rookie to score an overtime goal, along with Shayne Gostisbehere, Murray Baron and Dmitry



Yushkevich. (NHL Stats)

- Per NHL Stats, Michkov (1g-1a) recorded his fourth career multi-point game, which ties with Ron Sutter and Boby Kelly for sixth-most by a Flyers teenager. (11/11)
- He tallied an assist at Carolina (11/5) to become the 17th Flyers skater to reach 10 career points in 13 games or fewer. Over the past 30 years, only two Flyers skaters have accomplished the feat: James van Riemsdyk (9 GP in 2009-10) and Mike Richards (11 GP in 2005-06). (NHL Stats)
- He was named NHL Rookie of the Month for October (11/1).
- The forward became the first Flyers rookie since James van Riemsdyk (1g-6a in 2009-10) to record at least seven points through his first seven NHL games. The only other teenage rookies to do so for the club are Peter Zezel (2g-6a in 1984-85), Eric Lindros (4g-3a in 1992-93) and Rich Sutter (5g-2a in 1983-84). (NHL Stats)
- The 19-year-old tallied his first and second NHL goals, both while on the power play, his first multi-goal and multi-point game in his career (10/15 at EDM).
- He is the first Flyers rookie to score multiple power-play goals since Nolan Patrick on April 3, 2018 at NY Islanders.
- The forward posted his first NHL assist/point against Calgary (10/12).
- He posted four shots and blocked one shot in 18:32 ice time in his NHL debut on Oct. 11 against Vancouver.

SANNY SIDE UP

- Travis Sanheim saw his three-game point streak (1g-2a), 12/12-12/18, come to an end on Thursday against Los Angeles (12/19).
- He owns five points (1g-4a) in the last eight games and eight points (1g-7a) in the last 14 games.
- He ranks sixth in the NHL in takeaways (26), tied for sixth in time on ice per game (25:07), and tied for 11th in blocked shots (76).
- He ranks T-12th among NHL defensemen in points (14) since Nov. 11th.
- He leads the team in blocked shots and time on ice per game, ranks third in assists (14) and shots (72), fourth in points (20) and tied for sixth in goals (6).
- The 28-year-old leads all Flyers defensemen in goals, assist, points and shots.
- Per NHL Stats, Sanheim became the eighth defenseman in Flyers history to record 200 points with the franchise.
- The Canadian native was named to Canada's roster for the NHL's 2025 Four Nations Faceoff.
- He posted a three-game point streak (2g-4a), 11/14-11/18.
- The Manitoba-native posted his third multi-point game (1g-1a) vs. Buffalo (11/16).
- He registered his fifth-career three-point game (1g-2a) at Ottawa on Nov. 14.
- He notched three points (2g-1a), his first multi-point appearance of the season, against Montreal (10/27).
- The defenseman logged a season-high 27:49 time on ice on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota (10/26).
- He scored his first goal of the season against Washington (10/22).

TIPP OF THE HAT

- Owen Tippett recorded his first career four-point game (1g-3a), his fifth multi-point game this season, on Dec. 21 vs. Columbus.
- He is on an active three-game point streak (2g-4a), 12/18-12/21.
- His overtime goal against Columbus (12/21) was his third career overtime goal and 10th career game-winning goal. He ranks thir among active Flyers in career overtime goals.
- He owns 11 points (7g-4a) in the last 10 games.
- He ranks second on the team in shots (86), tied for second in goals (11), third in points (22) and tied for fourth in assists (11).
- He played in his 300th career NHL game on Dec. 12 against Detroit.
- He scored the lone goal for Flyers in regulation against Tampa on Nov. 7 as well as a shootout goal to help earn the victory. His shootout goal was on his first shootout goal on his first attempt this season and his fourth attempt in his career.
- He tallied a multi-point game (1q-1a) against Carolina (11/5), his third this season and 35th in his career.
- The right winger posted a three-game point streak (1g-4a) from Oct. 23 27.

- In the last ten games, the Flyers have had 17 points (3g-14a) from defensemen (11/30-12/21).
- **Jamie Drysdale** owns two points (0g-2a) in the last six games.
