##### EDMONTON OILERS

**All-Time Wild Record:** 65-33-10 (34-17-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 31-16-7 at Edmonton)

**2025-26:** Minnesota won the first meeting, 1-0, in Edmonton (12/3) and the second matchup, 5-2, at Grand Casino Arena (12/20)...LW **Matt Boldy** (2-0=2), C **Nico Sturm** (1-1=2), RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (1-1=2) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-2=2) each own two points...G **Jesper Wallstedt** saved all 33 shots faced to earn the shutout victory for the Wild in the first game...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 28-of-30 shots faced to earn a win in the second meeting...G **Stuart Skinner** stopped 23-of-24 shots faced in the game for Edmonton...G **Calvin Pickard** saved 32-of-36 shots faced in the second game.

**WILD LEADERS:** RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads Minnesota with 30 points (9-21=30) in 26 career contests vs. Edmonton...D **Quinn Hughes** owns 28 points (5-23=28) in 30 games...Tarasenko has 25 points (14-11=25) in 32 games...C **Ryan Hartman** has 18 points (8-10=18) in 23 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** Gustavsson is 3-2-0 with a 3.89 GAA and a .890 SV% in five career starts vs. Edmonton...Wallstedt is 1-0-0 with a shutout victory in his lone start against the Oilers (12/3/25).

**OILERS LEADERS:** C **Connor McDavid** (13-20=33 in 27 games) and C **Leon Draisaitl** (16-17=33 in 28 games) lead the Oilers with 33 career points each against Minnesota...C **Ryan Nugent-Hopkins** has 32 points (12-20=32) in 41 games...C **Adam Henrique** owns 24 points (8-16=24) in 34 games.

**OILERS GOALIES:** G **Tristan Jarry** is 5-0-1 with a 2.31 and a .921 SV% in six starts against the Wild...G **Calvin Pickard** is 4-5-0 with a 2.77 GAA, a .913 SV% and one shutout in nine games (eight starts) against Minnesota...G **Connor Ingram** is 2-3-0 with a 2.17 GAA and a .937 SV% in five starts.

**CONNECTIONS:** President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** collected 161 points (79-82=161) and 354 PIM in 211 games with Edmonton in parts of four seasons (1997-01)...D **Jared Spurgeon** is from Edmonton...F **Tyler Pitlick** was selected by Edmonton in the second round (No. 31 overall) of the 2010 NHL Draft and collected 14 points (11-3=14) in 58 games across parts of three seasons (2013-15, 2016-17) with the club.

**FAST FACTS:** The Wild's 65 wins and 31 road wins all-time against the Oilers are its most against any team...The Wild's 33 victories at Grand Casino are the second-most against any franchise (COL, 35)...The Wild is 13-4-0 in the last 17 games against the Oilers dating back to 10/22/19...Minnesota is 37-13-1 (.735) vs. Edmonton since the 2010-11 season, the NHL's second-best point percentage against the Oilers in that span...Since the start of the 2010-11 season, Minnesota is 20-5-0 (.800) in 25 games at Edmonton, including an eight-game win streak (2/21/13-1/31/17) – the longest road win streak in team history...Minnesota has won seven of its last nine games against Edmonton at Grand Casino Arena dating back to 10/22/19...The Wild won 17 straight games against the Oilers in Saint Paul (2/25/07-10/13/11) – the longest home win streak against an opponent in franchise history.

#### NOTES & MILESTONES

**Team:** At 31-14-10, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 72 points, the third-highest point total through a season's first 55 games in franchise history...Is 28-8-7 (.733) since Nov. 1, ranking first in the NHL in points (63), second in point percentage and T-2nd in wins...Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.915), third in goal differential (plus-36) and fourth in team GAA (2.46)...Since Dec. 14, ranks third in the NHL in PPG/game (0.87), T-4th in goals/game (3.70) and T-5th in shots on goal/game (29.7)...Is 30-0-8 (.895) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the only team in the NHL without a regulation loss...Has scored first in 33 games, second most in the NHL (Washington, 34)...Ranks second in the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record...Ranks T-1st with 21 extra-time games and T-2nd with 11 extra-time victories this...Ranks fourth in the NHL with 861 blocked shots...Ranks third in the NHL with 44 PPG and six with a 24.3 PP% (44/181).

**Matt Boldy:** Currently owns 299 career points (131-168=299)...Notched a PPG vs. CGY (1/29) to move his career total to 99 PPP (35-64=99)...For the season, ranks T-3rd in the NHL with three SHG and T-7th in goals (29)...Ranks T-1st on Wild in goals, second in points (29-26=55) and assists, and T-2nd in GWG (three).

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Owns an active three-game point streak (2-2=4)...Owns 20 points (9-11=20) in his last 20 games played...Ranks fourth in the NHL in total faceoffs taken (1,014).

**Brock Faber:** Owns 12 points (3-9=12) in 13 games played since Jan. 3...In 23 games since Dec. 14, ranks T-8th among NHL defensemen with five goals and T-10th with 18 points (5-13=18)...Since Nov. 7, ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen with a plus-23 rating...For the season, ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen in goals (11) and fourth among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:07), eighth in TOI/G (24:52) and T-11th in blocked shots (112).

**Filip Gustavsson:** In 21 games (20 starts) since Nov. 16, is 14-2-4 and ranks fourth in the NHL with a 2.24 GAA and .920 SV%, T-4th in the NHL with two shutouts, and T-5th in wins (min. 13 GP)...Since Nov. 1, has appeared in 15 consecutive games and made 14 consecutive home starts without a loss (9-0-5), the second-longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 16-game streak without loss, 2017-18 season)...Ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

**Ryan Hartman:** Played in the 700th game of his NHL career vs. CGY (1/29), blocking a career-high six shots...Ranks T-2nd on the Wild with three GWG and third with 14 goals this season.

**Daemon Hunt:** Has recorded assists in consecutive games, the first point streak of his NHL career. (0-2=2).

**Quinn Hughes:** Currently has 396 career assists...Owns active seven-game point and assist streaks (1-10=11), tied for his career long and the longest assist streak in franchise history among defensemen (Spurgeon, 7 GP in 2021-22; Suter, 7 GP in 2013-14)...Has 19 assists since Jan. 1, third among NHL skaters (first among defensemen) and the highest single-month total in franchise history...Leads NHL defensemen with 22 PPP (2-20=22) and ranks T-1st with 46 assists (T-7th among all skaters) and fifth in scoring (4-46=50) this season...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:46 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (23:12) and power-play TOI/G (4:28) this season...Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, ranks T-1st among NHL defensemen with 25 assists (T-3rd among all skaters) and ranks third with 27 points (2-25=27), T-12th among all skaters.

**Marcus Johansson:** Owns 198 career goals.

**Kirill Kaprizov:** Needs six goals to pass Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record...Has tallied multiple points in six of seven games played since Jan. 17 (4-10=14), leading the NHL in points and ranking T-1st in assists during that span...Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games...Since Dec. 14, ranks T-6th in the NHL with 32 points (11-21=32) and T-7th with 21 assists...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 11 PPG, T-5th with 194 shots, 7th with 66 points (29-37=66) and T-7th with 29 goals...Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG and shots and T-1st in goals.

**Jared Spurgeon:** Owns 432 points (122-310=432), six shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history...Needs five assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

**Yakov Trenin:** Leads the NHL with 271 hits, the fifth-highest single-season total in franchise history and the second-highest total in the NHL through 55 games since the 2005-06 season.

**Jesper Wallstedt:** Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and T-5th with a .914 SV%...Is 6-2-3 with a 2.34 GAA, .921 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.

**Mats Zuccarello:** Currently at 495 career assists...Needs five points to pass Ryan Suter (369) for sixth in franchise history.

## WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Matt Boldy** and defenseman **Brock Faber** were named to the United States roster on Jan. 2, joining defenseman **Quinn Hughes**, who was selected to the United States' preliminary roster in June.

Defenseman **Jonas Brodin**, forward **Joel Eriksson Ek**, and goaltenders **Filip Gustavsson** and **Jesper Wallstedt** were named to Sweden's roster on Jan. 2. Brodin has since been ruled out with an injury. Forward **Marcus Johansson** was named to Sweden's roster on Jan. 27.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster in June.

Iowa Wild defenseman **David Spacek** was named to Czechia's roster on Jan. 7 and Iowa Wild goaltender **Samuel Hlavaj** was named to Slovakia's roster on Jan. 8.

## LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks T-2nd in the NHL with seven shutouts this season, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (eight SO, five occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks fourth in the NHL with 2.51 goals against/game since November 1.

## BY THE PERIOD

- Rank T-7th in the NHL with a plus-10 goal differential in the opening frame and eighth by allowing 0.76 first-period goals per game this season.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL by allowing 0.85 second-period goals per game this season and 10th with a plus-7 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks fourth in the NHL with a plus-14 goal differential and T-4th by allowing 0.84 goals per game in the third period.
- Ranks T-1st in NHL with 21 extra-time games played and T-2nd with 11 extra-time victories (seven OTW, four SOW) this season.

## OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 33 games this season, second most in the NHL.
- Owns a 23-4-6 record (.788) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 679-180-112 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

- Minnesota ranks T-4th in the NHL with 3.70 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

- Since Dec. 14, the Wild ranks T-5th in the NHL with 29.7 shots on goal per game and eighth with 61.2 shot attempts per game.
- Since Dec. 14, Minnesota ranks third in the NHL with a 28.2 PP% (20/71).
- The Wild leads the NHL with 72 points (12-60=72) and 60 assists recorded by defensemen since Dec. 14.

## RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 31-14-10, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 72 points, the third-highest point total through a season's first 55 games in franchise history.
- Is 28-8-7 (.733) since Nov. 1, ranking first in the NHL in points (63), second in point percentage and T-2nd in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.915), third in goal differential (plus-36) and fourth in team GAA (2.46).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 16 game streak).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 10-3-2 (.733) in December, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in points (22) and T-4th in wins.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** needs six goals to pass Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.
- Has tallied multiple points in six of seven games played since Jan. 17 (4-10=14), leading the NHL in points and ranking T-1st in assists during that span.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Since Dec. 14, ranks T-6th in the NHL with 32 points (11-21=32) and T-7th with 21 assists.
- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 11 PPG, T-5th with 194 shots, 7th with 66 points (29-37=66) and T-7th with 29 goals. Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG and shots and T-1st in goals.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Extended his franchise record with his 13th career OTG vs. DET (1/22), tied for most in the NHL since he debuted in 2020-21.
- Has surpassed the 60-point plateau for the fourth season in his career, tying Marian Gaborik for most in franchise history.
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Tallied an assist at VGK (12/29), reaching 225 career assists and passing Mikael Granlund (224) for sixth in franchise history
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history.

## HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov had multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.
