The Calgary Flames traveled to Dallas to begin a quick two-game road swing on Sunday against the Stars. Calgary would open the scoring just a minute into the contest with Nazem Kadri feeding Jonathan Huberdeau who buried his ninth of the campaign to give the Flames an early lead. Dallas would respond just over three minutes later to tie things at one, and it would stay that way heading into the first intermission. In the second, Dallas took their first lead of the night, but Connor Zary found a loose puck in-front and deposited his sixth to knot things at two through 40. In the third, Dallas would score four-unanswered to knock off the Flames 6-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Predators. Calgary took game one of their season-series with a 2-0 win back on November 15th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-3-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 6-6-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames began a four game homestand by welcoming the Nashville Predators to the Scotiabank Saddledome back on November 15th. Both goalies were solid early, with Dustin Wolf and Juuse Saros turning aside all 18 shots the clubs combined for to keep the game scoreless through 20. It was the same story in the second, with this game still knotted at zero's heading into the third. In the final stanza, Daniil Miromanov finally broke the scoreless deadlock with his first of the season to give the Flames a 1-0 edge. Blake Coleman would add an empty netter later as Dustin Wolf would turn aside all 29 shots he faced to record his first NHL shutout in a 2-0 Flames victory.

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau got the Flames on the board one minute into Sundays outing in Dallas to register his fourth-career opening-minute goal (also 0:16 on Oct. 14, 2019; 0:17 on March 30, 2021; 0:49 on Oct. 19, 2023). Huberdeau also extended his point streak to four games and has posted two goals and three assists for five points dating back to November 30th. Huberdeau has now totaled 17 points so far this season which ties him with Nazem Kadri for the team lead.

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf recorded the first shutout of his career against Nashville in these clubs first meeting back on November 15th, becoming the third California-born goaltender in NHL history to record a shutout, joining Thatcher Demko (8) and John Blue (1).

CALGARY/NASHVILLE TIES:

Flames blueliner Tyson Barrie was acquired by Nashville in February of 2023 and spent the 2023-24 season with the Predators. Nashville forward Mark Jankowski was drafted by the Flames in the first round (21st overall) in the 2012 draft and spent seven seasons with the Flames organization.

KELOWNA KREW:

Calgary's Mikael Backlund and Tyson Barrie as well as Nashville's Luke Schenn and Colton Sissons all spent time with the WHL's Kelowna Rockets during their junior careers. Backlund and Barrie were teammates for the Rockets 2009 WHL Championship, Luke Schenn and Tyson Barrie were teammates for two seasons (2006-07, 2007-08), Colton Sissons was also a Kelowna Rocket for three seasons from 2010-11 to 2012-13. Flames bench boss Ryan Huska was an assistant coach for the Rockets beginning 2002-03 before being named Head Coach prior to the 2007-08 season. Flames assistant coach Dan Lambert was an assistant with the Rockets from 2009 to 2014, before Head Coaching the Rockets to the 2015 WHL Championship.

HOW SWEDE IT IS:

On December 4th Rasmus Andersson was named to Team Sweden for the Four Nations Faceoff in February. Andersson last represented Sweden in a major tournament at the 2014 IIHF U18 World Junior Championships, where he scored two goals and one assist for three points in seven games. Predators' forwards Filip Forsberg and Gustav Nyquist were also chosen to represent Sweden, and the trio will face Team Canada in their first game with the Tre Kronor on February 12th, 2025 at the Bell Centre.

HANLEY MAN:

Flames blueliner Joel Hanley skated in his 199th NHL game in Columbus on Nov. 29 and is just one game away from 200 in his NHL career. Hanley can become the 17th-active undrafted defenceman to reach 200 games in their NHL career. The Keswick, ON native made his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016 against Calgary as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, and has spent time with Montreal, Arizona, Dallas, and Calagry through his 199-previous NHL games.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Flames assistant coach Dan Lambert was an assistant with Nashville from 2019-20 until the 2022-23 campaign.
