GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Canucks this season. Dallas won their previous meeting against Vancouver, defeating them 5-3 on Jan. 31. The teams face each other once more this season on April 8 in Dallas.
- Yesterday's game against the Oilers and tonight's game against the Canucks is the ninth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 41-20-2 record for 84 points and a .667 points percentage. Their point total and
 points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season and their 41 wins were tied for second entering play Sunday.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars were the only NHL team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.41, fourth) and goals against per game (2.60, fourth).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 32 of the 63 games that they have played this year.

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, Rantanen signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the
- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Rantanen scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are Mason Marchment (2-0-2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1-2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2-2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1-2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen is currently tied for 10th in the NHL in scoring this season with 72 points (28-44-72) in 63 regular-season games with the Colorado Avalanche, Carolina Hurricanes and Stars. His goal, assist and point totals top all Stars skaters this season.
- Rantanen has totaled 689 points (290-399-689) in 633 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (290), seventh in points (689) and 10th in assists (399).
 - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.
- He has appeared seven times in the Stanley Cup Playoffs, all with the Avalanche, recording 101 points (34-67-101) in 81 career Stanley Cup Playoff games. Rantanen helped lead Colorado to the 2022 Stanley Cup, ranking fifth in postseason scoring with 25 points (5-20-25).
- Rantanen has been named to the NHL All-Star Game on two occasions (2019, 2023) and was selected to the 2020-21 NHL Second All-Star Team.

WHALE WATCHING

- Dallas is 99-75-29 all-time vs. Vancouver, including a 44-42-15 mark on the road.
- Sam Steel has eight points (8-0-8) in 11 career games vs. Vancouver, including his lone hat trick on March 26, 2019 at Vancouver (w/ Anaheim). Steel has goals in six of his 11 appearances against the Canucks.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Canucks, earning seven points (4-3—7) during that span. In all, Hintz has registered 11 points (7-4—11) in 13 career games against Vancouver.
- Among active Stars, Jamie Benn ranks first in goals (17) and in points (17-19—36) and is third in assists (19) in 42 career games against the Canucks. He also is first in game-winning goals (5) against them.
- Jason Robertson rides a three-game point streak against Vancouver heading into tonight's matchup, totaling seven points (3-4—7) in those games. In all, Robertson has nine points (3-6—9) in 10 career games against the Canucks.
- Mikael Granlund enters tonight's contest riding a five-game point streak (3-4-7) against Vancouver dating back to Nov. 20, 2023. Granlund has registered 31 points (9-22-31) in 33 career games played against the Canucks.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's game riding a seven-game point streak against the Canucks, earning 11 points (6-5— 11) during that span. In 19 career games vs. Vancouver, Rantanen has tallied 30 points (14-16—30), earning points in all but three games.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- On March 8, Wyatt Johnston signed a five-year, \$42 million contract extension with the Stars that will begin next season and carry an average annual value (AAV) of \$8.4 million.
- Johnston scored a goal in Dallas' last game to extend his point streak to nine games. His nine-game point streak is the longest of his career and was the fourth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Johnston's point streak is the longest by a Stars skater this season. If he were to extend it tonight, it would make him the first Dallas player to have a point streak of at least 10 games since Miro Heiskanen had a 12-game point streak from March 1 to 23, 2023.
- According to NHL Stats, Johnston is the third Stars player in the last 30 years to register a run of that length before age 22 behind Jamie Benn (10 GP in 2010-11) and Jason Robertson (9 GP in 2020-21).
- Johnston has also scored at least one goal in each of the last five games that he has played, matching his career-best goal streak that he originally set from March 13 to 21, 2023. Johnston owned the longest active scoring streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- According to NHL Stats, Johnston joined Mike Modano (6 GP in 1991-92 & 5 GP in 1990-91) as the only two players in franchise history with multiple goal streaks of at least five games at age 21 or younger.
- Johnston now has 60 points (24-36-60) in 63 games this season, which ranks fourth on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 60-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 78 points, which would be a career high.
 - He enters tonight's matchup five points shy of tying his career high (65) that he set last season.

- Johnston has also recorded a point in each of the last 14 games he has played at the American Airlines Center, making him the third player in franchise history to have a point in at least 14 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- Johnston scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Blues. Johnston tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, Johnston's hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of Johnston's goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three powerplay goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.
 - Johnston's performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 - that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- Johnston's first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward.
- Johnston scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Sunday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for third in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since Johnston made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (Roope Hintz; 7) and are tied for ninth in the NHL.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 27-12-2 record in 41 games for 56 points and a 0.683 points percentage. The team's win total and point total (tied) during that span all topped the NHL entering play Sunday and their points percentage ranked second.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 26.1 percent and 86.1 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

ROBO ON THE GOGO

Jason Robertson enters tonight's contest riding a seven-game point streak:

- He tallied an assist on March 9 against the Oilers.
- He scored two goals, including the overtime winner, on March 6 against the Flames.
- He recorded two assists on March 4 against the Devils.
- He tallied an assist on March 2 against the Blues.
- He scored a goal and added two assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings.
- He notched a goal and an assist on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets.
- He scored a hat trick on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Roberston points in eight consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 17, 2022 to Jan. 3, 2023.
- Robertson's streak was tied for the sixth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Robertson's assist against the Blues was his 60th point of the season. 2024-25 is now the third consecutive year in which he has recorded at least 60 points.
- Roberston's goal against the Kings was his 25th of the season, making the 2024-25 season the fourth consecutive year in which he has scored at least 25 goals. Roberston is sixth Dallas player in the past 30 years to record four or more consecutive 25-goal campaigns, joining Jamie Benn (6), Tyler Seguin (6), Mike Modano (5), Joe Pavelski (4) and Loui Eriksson (4).*
- Robertson's hat trick on Feb. 23 was the fourth of his career. Only three players in Stars/North Stars history have as many at age 25 or younger: Dino Ciccarelli (8), Tyler Seguin (7) and Steve Payne (6).*
- All three of Roberston's hat trick goals game in the second period, making him the first Stars skater to score three goals in a single period since Jamie Benn did so on April 7, 2018.*
- Robertson's three goals came within a 8:40 span, marking the fastest hat trick by a Stars player since April 7, 2018 when Jamie Benn scored three in 5:17.*
- Robertson's younger brother Nicholas also scored twice for the Maple Leafs on Feb. 23, making the Robertsons the first pair of brothers to score multiple goals on the same day since Pavel Bure and Valeri Bure on March 1, 2000.*

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has 15 points (4-11—15) in his last 13 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 15 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
- Harley's 15 points since Jan. 31 ranked third among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Sunday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (19) and Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin (16).
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 70-43. Entering play Sunday, his plus-27 goal differential was tied for the ninth-best mark in the NHL this year and his 70 on-ice goals for tied for 11th.
- In all, Harley has totaled 38 points (11-27—38) in 60 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 35 assists and 50 points.
 - His 11 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Sunday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:36 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
 - Harley has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in seven of those 13 games during that span.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 26-for-71 on the power play for a 35.3 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday.
- The team's 26 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Sunday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (27) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored six power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday.
 - In all this season, Johnston has scored a career-high eight power-play goals, which is five more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

GOALIE GANG

- Jake Oettinger has an 14-5-1 record in his last 20 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .911 save percentage and a 2.54 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 14 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Sunday.

- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last five games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .927 save percentage and a 2.21 goals-against average in those contests.
 - DeSmith's five-game win streak is the longest such streak of his career.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .906 save percentage this season, which was the third-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Sunday. Only Winnipeg (.917) and Tampa Bay (.907) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.58 goals-against average this season was ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has played in 13 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outshot their opponents 95-76 and have 95 scoring chances to their 76 when Bichsel has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His 56.3 shots for percentage tops all Stars skaters during that span.
- Bichsel had two assists in Dallas' game on Feb. 8, an 8-3 win over the San Jose Sharks. It marked both the first multipoint performance of his career and the first time that he has recorded a point in a road game.
- Bichsel's assists brought his season point total up to five (2-3-5), which tied him for 10th in scoring among rookie defensemen this season entering play Sunday. He is also averaging 0.25 points per game this year, which was tied for ninth among rookie defensemen.
- Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in 11 of the 13 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 17.0 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Sunday.
- Despite only playing in 21 games this season, Bichsel leads all Stars skaters with 89 hits. His 89 hits also ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season entering play Sunday.
- There have been eight instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning seven of them.
- Bichsel is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game seven times. No other rookie had done it more than three times this season entering play Sunday.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.3 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 26, and their -20 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in both total penalty minutes (414) and penalty minutes per game (6:40) entering play Sunday.
 - Dallas' last game on March 8 against the Oilers marked the second time this season that the Stars were not assessed a penalty in a game.
- Entering play Sunday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (214:24) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:27) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley and Sam Steel both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Sunday.
 - Harley, who has played 104:18 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.45.
 - Steel ranked fourth with 3.70. He has totaled 113:39 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (360), Jason Robertson (273), Esa Lindell (233) and Wyatt Johnston (227). Entering play Sunday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 8 against the Oilers was the 360th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 273-game Iron Man streak is the 12th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Sunday.
- Lindell's 233-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is seven assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is four goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is seven assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is six assists shy of surpassing Miro Heiskanen (225) the 20th-most assists in franchise history.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars GM Jim Nill, goaltender Casey DeSmith and Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn were all members of the Canucks. Nill skated for Vancouver from 1981-82 to 1983-84, DeSmith from 2023-24 and Benn from 2019-20 to 2020-21
- Stars assistant coach Misha Donskov coached Canucks forward Teddy Blueger in Vegas when he played there during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Canucks forwards Teddy Blueger and Danton Heinen played together in Pittsburgh. DeSmith and Blueger played together from 2018-19 to 2022-23, and Heinen joined them from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and defenseman Brendan Smith played with Canucks forward Phillip Di Giuseppe with the New York Rangers. Blackwell played with Di Giuseppe from 2019-20 to 2020-21 and Smith joined the two during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin played alongside Canucks forward Conor Garland in Arizona from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Canucks forward Danton Heinen played together in Anaheim during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Canucks forward Kiefer Sherwood played together in Anaheim during the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Canucks forward Kiefer Sherwood and goaltender Kevin Lankinen played together in Nashville during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Canucks forward J.T. Miller shared the ice with the New York Rangers during the 2017-18 season.
