CHICAGO BLACKHAWKS

All-Time Wild Record: 51-29-5 (28-12-3 at Xcel Energy Center, 23-17-2 at Chicago)

2022-23: Minnesota went 4-0-0 against the Blackhawks...The Wild earned a 4-3 shootout victory in the series-opening game at United Center (10/30), a 4-1 win in the second game at Xcel Energy Center (12/16), a 3-1 victory in the third contest (3/25) in St. Paul and a 4-2 win in the season finale at Chicago (4/10)...LW **Matt Boldy** led Minnesota with five points (3-2=5)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** had four points (3-1=4) including a hat trick in the second game...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-2=3), C Sam Steel (0-3=3), C **Ryan Hartman** (1-2=3) and LW **Marcus Johansson** (2-1=3) each posted three points...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** went 2-0-0 with a 1.92 GAA and a .929 SV% in two starts...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 2-0-0 with a 1.50 GAA and a .954 SV%...RW Patrick Kane (0-2=2), D **Jarred Tinordi** (0-2=2), C Jonathan Toews (2-0=2) and C **Andreas Athanasiou** (1-1=2) led Chicago with two points each...G Alex Stalock was 0-2-1 with a GAA of 2.62 and .900 SV%...G **Petr Mrazek** saved 18-of-21 shots faced in the second meeting.

WILD LEADERS: D **Alex Goligoski** leads Minnesota with 20 points (2-18=20) in 42 games against Chicago...Zuccarello has 19 points (7-12=19) in 21 matches...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 16 points (3-13=16) in 40 games...LW **Pat Maroon** owns 12 points (4-8=12) in 31 career games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 13-6-5 with a 2.52 GAA, a .916 SV% and one shutout in 24 starts vs. the Blackhawks...Gustavsson is 2-0-0 with a 1.50 GAA and a .954 SV% in two starts.

BLACKHAWKS LEADERS: LW **Taylor Hall** has collected 21 points (8-13=21) in 27 games...LW **Nick Foligno** has 12 points (6-6=12) in 23 games...D **Seth Jones** owns 10 points (3-7=10) in 26 matches...Athanasiou has eight points (5-3=8) in 17 games.

BLACKHAWKS GOALIES: Mrazek is 4-3-0 with a 2.28 GAA and a .918 SV% in seven career starts against the Wild...G **Arvid Soderblom** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Hartman was selected by Chicago in the first round (30th overall) of the 2013 NHL Draft and collected 57 points (27-30=57) in 141 games during four seasons (2014-18) with the Blackhawks...C **Ryan Donato** tallied 39 points (18-21=39) in 84 games in parts of two seasons with Minnesota (2018-20)...D **Wyatt Kaiser** is from Andover and played three seasons (2020-23) at Minnesota Duluth...RW **Joey Anderson** is from Roseville and played two seasons (2016-18) at the University of Minnesota-Duluth...Nick Foligno is the older brother of Wild LW **Marcus Foligno**.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota's 51 all-time wins against Chicago are its third-most against an opponent...The Wild has won nine consecutive meetings against the Blackhawks dating back to 2/4/20...Minnesota is 12-2-2 in the last 16 games played at Xcel Energy Center...In 2015-16, the Wild became the first team to win every game in a season series of at least five contests against Chicago since the Boston Bruins went 8-0-0 in 1938-39.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Jonas Brodin: Is averaging 24:27 of TOI per game, eighth-highest in the Western Conference...Has blocked 57 shots this season, T-5th in the Western Conference and T-11th in the NHL.

Connor Dewar: Notched the first hat trick, multi-goal game and three-plus point performance of his NHL career with four points (3-1=4) at NSH (11/30).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history...Currently at 547 career wins, needs five wins to pass Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads Minnesota with 12 goals and six PPGs this season...Is T-5th in the NHL in PPGs this season...Recorded a four-game point streak (3-1=4) from 11/19 to 11/28 and a three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurrence), from 11/24 to 11/28.

Brock Faber: Leads all NHL rookies with 23:12 TOI per game and 35 blocked shots while ranking second with a plus-6 rating.

Filip Gustavsson: Is 2-2-1 with a 1.79 GAA and a .930 SV% in his last five starts.

Kirill Kaprizov: With a goal and assist at NSH (11/30), recorded his 68th career multi-point game in the 6-1 win over NSH tonight, tying Jared Spurgeon and Andrew Brunette for sixth on the all-time franchise list, according to NHL Stats.

Pat Maroon: Currently at 299 career points (120-179=298).

Marco Rossi: T-2nd among NHL rookies in goals (six), fifth in shots (41) and T-5th in points (6-6=12).

Jared Spurgeon: Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

Mats Zuccarello: Leads the Wild with 23 points and 18 assists this season...Owns an active eight-game point streak (2-8=10), tied for the second-longest active streak in the NHL and third-longest of his career...Has recorded a point in 10 consecutive home games (5-8=13) to open the season, a franchise record...Currently at 596 career points (191-405=596).

HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 286-255-63 (.526) in 604 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.





PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** is tied for the team lead with five multi-point games and ranks second with 20 points (7-13=20), 13 assists and five PPGs this season.
- With a goal and assist at NSH (11/30), Kaprizov recorded his 68th career multi-point game in the 6-1 win over NSH tonight, tying Jared Spurgeon and Andrew Brunette for sixth on the all-time franchise list.
- Kaprizov scored the 120th goal of his career vs. COL (11/25) to move past Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 44 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for seventh-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

- Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with 23 points (5-18=23) and 18 assists this season. He ranks T-5th in the NHL with 11 power-play assists.
- Owns an active eight-game point streak (2-8=10), tied for the second-longest active streak in the NHL currently and the third-longest of his career. His six-game assist streak is the second-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Also owns an active 10-game home point streak (5-8=13), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.
- Recorded the 400th assist of his NHL career against OTT in Sweden (11/18), becoming the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 23 points this season ranks third in the NHL among players age 33 or older, while his 18 assists lead all players in the same age range.
- Zuccarello posted 22-45=67 during the 2022-23 season, leading the team in assists, ranking second in points and fourth in goals.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (596), third in career goals (191) and third in career games played (787).

PLAYER NOTES



SPURGEON GENERAL

- **Jared Spurgeon** led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season.
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-112 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

- The Edmonton native was named the second full-time captain in team history on Jan. 3, 2021.
- He is the franchise leader in goals, points, shots on goal, PPG, GWG and blocked shots by a defenseman and ranks second in assists, PPA, PPP, and hits among defensemen.



CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads the Wild with 11 goals and six power-play goals this season and ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPGs.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-1=4) from 11/19 to 11/28 and a three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurrence), from 11/24 to 11/28.
- Set a new career high with 23:53 of TOI at OTT (11/18) in Stockholm, Sweden.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded five multi-point games this season, tied for the team lead.
- Currently at 31 career PPGs, two behind Jared Spurgeon (33 career PPGs) for seventh in franchise history.
- Currently at 103 career goals, needs four goals to surpass Pierre-Marc Bouchard (106 goals) for 10th-most in franchise history.

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** is T-2nd among NHL rookies in goals (six), fifth in shots (41) and T-5th in points (6-6=12).
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12 - 12/24/23, a career long.
- He scored the first goal of his NHL career at TOR (10/14), becoming the ninth Austrian-born player to score a goal in a NHL regular-season game.
- Rossi joined Thomas Vanek (39 goals with Minnesota) and Christoph Brandner (four goals with Minnesota) as the only Austrian-born players to score goals for the Wild.

SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- **Ryan Hartman** is T-2nd on Minnesota with seven goals this season and is T-5th on the team with 11 points (7-4=11).
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.



PLAYER NOTES

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Marcus Foligno** is T-8th in the NHL with 62 hits this season. He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,244 hits.

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 23:12 TOI per game and 35 blocked shots while ranking second with a plus-6 rating this season.
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.



IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 247 career wins, needs four wins to tie (five to surpass) Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 994 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
