- Eight different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game. Tyler Seguin had Dallas' only multi-point outing.
- The Stars have now won eight straight games against the Kraken dating back to the 2023-24 season and improve to 12-1-1 all-time
 against the franchise. The only other teams with as many wins against the Kraken are the Oilers (12-4-0 in 16 GP) and the Golden
 Knights (12-2-2 in 16 GP).
- Dallas went a perfect 5-for-5 on the penalty kill, marking the first time the team has been shorthanded at least five times in a regular-season game without surrendering a power-play goal since Oct. 17, 2024 against the Washington Capitals.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

• Tonight is the first of four games the Stars will play against the Mammoth this year. The two teams will face each other again on Jan. 15 in Utah, Jan. 31 in Utah and March 16 in Dallas.

Entering play Friday, the Stars ranked second in the NHL in wins (15, tied), points (34) and points percentage (.708) this year. The
team's success this season comes despite having 93 combined man games lost with Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Matt Duchene,
Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Roope Hintz, Nils Lundkvist and Ilya Lyubushkin all missing multiple games with injury at various
points this season.

- Vladislav Kolyachonok scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' last game on Nov. 26 against the Kraken, making him the 22nd Stars skaters to score a goal for the Stars this season. Entering play Friday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have at 22 unique goal scorers this season.
- All five Dallas skaters that have taken at least 100 faceoffs this season have a win rate above 50 percent: Sam Steel (58.4), Roope Hintz (58.1), Tyler Seguin (54.3), Radek Faksa (54.1) and Wyatt Johnston (50.4).
- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 10-1 during 5-on-5 play when the defensive pair of Lian Bichsel and Alexander Petrovic is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
- A goal or an assist tonight from Justin Hryckowian or Vladislav Kolyachonok would give them points in three consecutive games for the first time in their respective careers.

WHAT UTAH-KIN 'BOUT?

- Dallas is 3-1-0 all-time vs. Utah, including a 1-1-0 mark on home ice.
- The Stars tied for first in total wins (3) against the Mammoth last season (also: Edmonton and Los Angeles), while also ranking first in blocked shots (58) and third in takeaways (22) against them.
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game point streak against the Mammoth, earning six points (1-5—6) during that span. He's collected points in each of his four career games played against them.
- **Jamie Benn** has registered three goals in four career games vs. Utah.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Mammoth, earning four points (1-3—4) in those games.
- **Sam Steel** has tallied three points (0-3—3) in four career games played vs. Utah.
- In one career game played against the Mammoth, Jake Oettinger has a 1-0-0 record while putting up a .943 save percentage and 1.90 goals against average.
- If Casey DeSmith were to play and win tonight, he would become the third goaltender in the NHL to record three wins vs. Utah. His .918 save percentage against the Mammoth is the best mark among active NHL netminders to have played Utah at least three times in their career.

MIRO THE HERO

- Miro Heiskanen is expected to play in his 500th NHL game tonight. In reaching the milestone, he will become...
 - The 34th player and 16th defensemen to play in 500 games for the Stars.
 - The second player (Nico Hischier) drafted in 2017 to play in 500 NHL games.
 - The 46th Finnish player and 13th Finnish defenseman to play in 500 NHL games.
- Heiskanen has 20 points (3-17-20) in 24 games played this season, ranking fourth on the Stars and ninth among all NHL defensemen in scoring this season entering play Friday.
- Heiskanen is averaging 25:53 of ice time per game this season, which was the third-highest total in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Oilers to him sole possession of seventh on the all-time assists list among Finnish defensemen. His next assist will tie him with Rasmus Ristolainen (56-248—304 in 776 games played) for eighth place on the NHL's all-time points list among Finnish defensemen.
- Heiskanen set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time in Dallas' Nov. 22 game against the Calgary Flames, a 3-2 shootout loss. It was the most ice time any skater in the NHL has had in a single game this season entering play Friday.
 - It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
 - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
 - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone. 0
 - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points. 0
 - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- Heiskanen recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied Roope Hintz (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied Hintz for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. Hintz first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
 - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
 - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- Heiskanen tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
 - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
 - Heiskanen last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- Heiskanen scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.

- Heiskanen's six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

- The Stars have posted a 9-2-2 record in 13 games played this November, ranking third in the NHL in wins (9, tied), points (20) and points percentage (.769) this month entering play Friday.
- Dallas' 52 goals scored and 4.00 goals per game this month tied for first and second in the NHL, respectively, entering play Friday.
 - The team's 35 5-on-5 goals in November ranked second in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Stars have gone 14-for-42 on the power play since Nov. 1 for a 33.3 percent success rate on the man advantage, which was the best mark in the NHL this month entering play Friday. No team has scored more power-play goals this month than the Stars.
- With two games left to play this month, the Stars' nine wins are already tied for the second-most in the month of November in Dallas team history (since 1993-94).

- If the Stars were to earn at least two points in their next two games, it would set the team record (since 1993-94) for the most points in the month of November.
- Every skater that has played in a game for the Stars this month has recorded at least one point.
- Entering play Friday, Jason Robertson (11-11—22) was leading the League lead in goals (11) and points (22) this month.
 - Robertson tied Bill Goldsworthy and Brian Bellows (both with four) for the third most 10-goal calendar months in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Dino Ciccarelli (10) and Mike Modano (6).
- Mikko Rantanen (6-10-16) was tied for eighth in the League in scoring since Nov. 1 entering play Friday followed by Miro Heiskanen (1-14—15) and Wyatt Johnston (6-9—15), who were tied for 12th in the League in November scoring.
 - Heiskanen's 14 assists in November were tied for the most in the NHL this month entering play Friday and his 15 points were also tied for the League lead among defensemen.

TYLER THE CREATOR

- Tyler Seguin has totaled 12 points (4-8—12) in his last 11 games played dating back to Nov. 4 against the Oilers and enters tonight's game riding a three-game assist streak.
- If he were to extend his streak tonight, it would give him assists in four consecutive games for the first time since Jan. 23 to Feb. 6, 2024. A point of any kind would give him points in four consecutive games for the first time this season.
- Seguin has recorded multi-assist efforts in three of his last five games played including each of his last two. If he were to have at least two assists again tonight, it would extend his multi-assist streak to three games for the first time since Oct. 6 to 13, 2018.
- Since Nov. 6, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 14-4 during even-strength play when Seguin is on the ice. His plus-10 evenstrength, on-ice goal differential was tied for the seventh-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
 - His 14 even-strength, on-ice goals for were tied for seventh among NHL forwards since Nov. 6 entering play Friday.
- Seguin is currently on pace to finish the season with 24 goals, 34 assists and 58 points, which would make the 2025-26 campaign his highest scoring season since he had 80 points (33-47—80) in 2018-19.
 - o His 17 points are good for sixth on the Stars this season.

MILESTONE WATCH

- Sam Steel enters tonight's game one assist shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career
- Jake Oettinger is one win shy of surpassing Ed Belfour (160) for the third-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is one point shy of surpassing Lou Nanne (225) for 10th-most points by a defenseman in franchise history.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson has totaled 31 points (14-17—31) in 24 games played this season, leading the team in scoring and tying for fifth in the NHL in points entering play Friday.
 - **Robertson's** 14 goals were tied for third in the League entering play Friday.
- Robertson is currently on pace to finish the season with 48 goals, which would be a career high and tie for the fifth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.

- Robertson was tied for the lead among all American NHLers in both goals (14) and points (31) this season entering play Friday.
- Robertson's 102 shots on goal this year were the most in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- During even-strength play this season when **Robertson** has been on the ice, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 27-14. His plus-13 on-ice goal differential was tied for the sixth-best mark among all NHL forwards this year entering play Friday.
- Robertson scored in seven consecutive games from Nov. 11 to 25, finding the back of the net 11 times in total during that span. His seven-game goal streak was the longest in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- Robertson's seven-game goal streak was the longest of his career and the longest by a Stars skater since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94. It is also tied for the second-longest by an American skater since the start of the 2005-06 season according to NHL Stats, trailing only Auston Matthew's eight-game goal streak in 2023-24.
- Robertson's 11 goals over the course of his seven-game goal streak were the most ever by a Stars skater. The previous record was held by Bill Goldsworthy, who scored nine goals over the course of a seven-game goal streak from Feb. 6 to 17, 1971.
- When he extended his goal streak to six games on Nov. 22 against the Flames, Robertson became the fifth player in Stars/ North Stars history to have multiple six-game goal streaks according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (2x), Danny Grant (2x) and Bill Goldsworthy (2x).
- From Nov. 13 to 18, Robertson recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. Robertson previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to 15.
- Robertson scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.
- Robertson scored two goals in 1:39 of game time in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 at Montreal, a 7-0 win over the Canadiens, also notching an assist in that game to finish the night with three points.
- He scored a goal and had two assists including on Roope Hintz's overtime winner on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators.
- Robertson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- Roope Hintz has scored in each of the last three games that he has played in. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the third time in his career, matching his career high that he most recently reached from Feb. 25 to March 2, 2023.
- Hintz has totaled 19 points (7-12—19) in 19 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked fifth on the Stars in scoring despite missing five games with an injury this year.
- Hintz's current offensive output puts him on pace to finish the year with 49 assists and 77 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward.
- Hintz has gone 157-for-270 at the faceoff dot this season for a 58.1 percent success rate. His 58.1 faceoff win percentage was the ninth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday among skaters that have taken at least 200 faceoffs this year.
- When Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 17-8 according to Natural Stat Trick.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 25-for-80 on the power play this season for a 31.3 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday. Dallas' 25 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL and were three more than the secondranked Minnesota Wild (22) entering play Friday.
 - The Stars didn't score their 25th power-play goal of the season until their 45th game played during the 2024-25 campaign on Jan. 18, 2025 against the Colorado Avalanche.
- Dallas is averaging 1.04 power-play goals per game this season, the best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 15-for-38 on the power play for a 39.5 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Friday. Their 15 home power-play goals ranked second to only Minnesota (16) for the most in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game seven different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida, on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim and on Nov. 25 at Edmonton. Entering play Friday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in seven games.
 - In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their sixth multi power-play goal game in their 57th game of the season on Feb. 23 against the New York Islanders.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.

- Dallas' 25 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (9), Jason Robertson (5), Mikko Rantanen
 (4), Roope Hintz (2), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
 - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov.
 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- **Johnston** (9-6—15) and **Rantanen** (4-11—15) were tied for the League lead in power-play points this season entering play Friday. **Johnston's** nine power-play goals were the most in the NHL entering play Friday are just two shy of tying his career high of 11 that he set last season.
- Rantanen (53) and Johnston (49) are both on pace to set career highs in power-play points and set franchise records for most
 power-play points in a single season by a Stars skater.
 - o Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- Robertson's 14 power-play points (5-9—14) ranked third in the League this season entering play Friday, just one shy of Johnston
 and Rantanen for the most in the NHL.
- Heiskanen has totaled eight points (1-7—8) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the second-most among all NHL
 defensemen entering play Friday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston had four points (1-3—4) in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Oilers an 8-3 Stars win scoring one power-play goal and adding three assists. It was his highest single-game point total since he had a career-high five points (3-2—5) on March 5, 2024 against the Nashville Predators.
 - His performance against Edmonton marked the third time in his career that he has had at least four points in a game.
 He joined Tyler Seguin (6x) as the second player in Stars team history to register as many at age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's second assist of the night was the 200th point of his NHL career, making him the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the club. He is the first player in Stars team history with 200 career points at age 22 or younger, and the fifth in franchise history alongside Brian Bellows (342), Mike Modano (309), Bobby Smith (222) and Tom McCarthy (202) according to NHL Stats.
- Among players to debut with the Stars, Johnston (100-100—200 in 269 games played) became the third-fastest player in team
 history to record 200 NHL points behind Jason Robertson (190 games played) and Roope Hintz (263 games played) according to
 NHL Stats.
- Johnston's second assist of the night also marked the 100th assist of his NHL career. He became the first player from his draft class
 to total 100 career assists and the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the Stars.
- Johnston (100-100—200) became the 10th active player to have 100 goals and 100 assists at the time of his 200th career point
 according to NHL Stats. He joined Alex DeBrincat, Tyler Toffoli, James van Riemsdyk, Conor Sheary, Nino Niederreiter, Sam Bennett,
 Victor Olofsson and Joel Armia.
- **Johnston** has totaled 25 points (12-13—25) in 24 games played this season and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Friday, Johnston was tied for ninth in goals and 10th in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- **Johnston** was one of seven skaters under the age of 23 to have at least 20 points this year entering play Friday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 14-20—34), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 14-19—33), Will Smith (20 years old, 7-14—21), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 12-18—30), Logan Cooley (21 years old, 13-9—22) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 14-14—28).
- Fifteen (9-6—15) of **Johnston's** 25 points this season have come on the power play, tying teammate **Mikko Rantanen** for the most in the NHL entering play Friday. His nine power-play goals also topped the League and are two shy of tying his career high of 11 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 41 goals, 44 assists and 59 points, all of which would be career highs. Fortyone goals would tie for the 12th-most in a single season in franchise history.
- **Johnston** is also on pace to finish the season with 49 power-play points, which would be a career high and set a single-season franchise record.
- Johnston's scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North Stars.
- **Johnston**, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- **Johnston** recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since **Tyler Seguin** had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston** recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
 - o Both of **Johnston's** goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
 - Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 14-2 during 5-on-5 play when defenseman Alexander Petrovic is on the ice. His plus-12 goal differential is the best mark on the Stars roster during that span and his 14 on-ice goals for were tied for Esa Lindell and Jason Robertson for the team lead.
- Petrovic's plus-12 even-strength on-ice goal differential since Nov. 8 was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL and ranked second among all defensemen during that span entering play Friday.
- Petrovic notched an assist in Dallas' last game on Nov. 27 against Seattle and now has six points (1-5—6) in 22 games played this season, ranking fourth among Stars defensemen in scoring. He is currently on pace to finish the season with four goals, 21 assists and 25 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Petrovic skated 22:12 of ice time in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Edmonton Oilers, his highest single-game total since he skated 24:02 on Oct. 19, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was a member of the Florida Panthers.
- Petrovic scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 against the Montreal Canadiens, a 7-0 Stars win. It marked his first regular-season NHL goal since April 2, 2018.
- Petrovic finished the Stars' game against the Canadiens with a plus-5 plus/minus rating. It marked the highest plus/minus rating in a single game in his career and the best mark by a Stars defenseman since Ryan Suter (plus-5) on March 9, 2023 at Buffalo.

BISH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Lian Bichsel has totaled a team-high 84 hits this season, which ranked seventh in the NHL and led all NHL defensemen entering play Friday. He is currently on pace to finish the season with 287 hits, which would be the most hits in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
 - Steve Ott, with 278 in 2011-12, currently holds the single-season franchise record.
- Bichsel has recorded eight hits in a game three times this season, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, Oct. 28 vs. Washington and Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia. Entering play Friday, Bichsel was the only skater in the NHL this season to have three eight-hit games.
- If he were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the eighth player in franchise history to have recorded four eight-hit games and the fourth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistric (5; 2011-12), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07) and Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12).

THE QUEBÄCK LINE

- Oskar Bäck, Mavrik Bourque and Justin Hryckowian have played 89:57 at 5-on-5 together this season. In that time, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 5-3, outshooting them 38-25 and have a 56.8 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick when the trio is on the ice.
- Among all NHL forward lines to play at least 60 minutes together this season, the Bäck/Bourque/Hryckowian line ranked sixth in the NHL with a 64.4 percent expected goals rate according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Friday.
- On Tuesday against the Oilers, which the trio was on the ice, Dallas outscored Edmonton 1-0, outshot them 6-1 and 80 percent onice Corsi rating during 9:37 of 5-on-5 play.
 - Hryckowian scored the team's seventh goal of the night and Bourque notched an assist in an eventual 8-3 win.
- In Dallas' game on Nov. 21 against Vancouver, the line played 5:58 of 5-on-5 ice time together. When the trio was on the ice during that time, the Stars outshot the Canucks 7-0 and outscored them 1-0.
 - O Bourque scored a goal and Bäck and Hryckowian both tallied an assist in the win.
- With eight points (3-5—8) in 24 games played this season, **Bourque** is pacing to finish the year with 17 assists and 27 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- After trailing 2-0, the Stars came back to defeat the Ottawa Senators 3-2 in overtime on Nov. 11, marking the fourth time this season that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, which was tied for the most in the NHL entering play Friday.
 - There have been six games this season in which the Stars have been trailing by two goals and have comeback to earn at least one point, going 4-0-2 record in those games.
- Overall, the Stars have seven comeback wins this year, which was tied for the fifth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Additionally, Dallas has won five games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the sixth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: Jason Robertson (316) and Wyatt Johnston (270).
- Robertson's 316-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Johnston has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 24 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 270 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Thursday, it was tied for the 13th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Johnston was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - o Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before Heiskanen had to withdraw due to injury.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - Lindell and Rantanen won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Mikko Rantanen and Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot and defenseman Ian Cole all played for the Colorado Avalanche. Duchene played with Kerfoot in 2017-18. Rantanen and Kerfoot also played together in the 2018-19 season. Rantanen and Cole were members of the Avalanche from 2018-19 to 2020-21, along with Mammoth forward Liam O'Brien who skated 12 games in Colorado in 2020-21.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin were teammates with Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot with the Toronto Maple Leafs for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Mammoth defenseman Ian Cole were teammates for a handful of games with Pittsburgh in 2017-18 and crossed paths again as members of the Vancouver Canucks in 2023-24.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Mammoth defenseman Olli Matta were both members of the Pittsburgh Penguins for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Mammoth forward Brandon Tanev and defenseman John Marino were all teammates in Pittsburgh from 2019-20 to 2020-21. DeSmith and Marino would skate another season together in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Mammoth forward Kevin Stenlund played four games together on the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2018-19.
- Stars forward Wyatt Johnston and Mammoth forward Dylan Gauenther both represented Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Mammoth forwards Clayton Keller and Kailer Yamamoto all represented Team USA during the 2016 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and 2015 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Mammoth forward Clayton Keller were teammates at Boston University (NCAA) during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Mammoth forward Kailer Yamamoto skated for Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot shared the ice at Harvard University (NCAA) from 2013-14 to
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Mammoth forward JJ Peterka both skated in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards Collin Blackwell and Nathan Bastian and Mammoth forward Brandon Tanev all played for Seattle during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Nathan Bastian and Mammoth defenseman John Marino and goaltender Vitek Vanecek were all teammates in New Jersey from 2022-23 to 2023-24. Mammoth defenseman Nick DeSimone would join the three in New Jersey during the 2023-24
- Stars forwards Roope Hintz and Mikko Rantanen and defenseman Esa Lindell and Mammoth defenseman Olli Määttä all represented Team Finland during the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen and Mammoth defenseman Olli Määttä were teammates on Team Finland during the 2023 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Esa Lindell and Mammoth defenseman Olli Määttä skated together on Team Finland during the 2017 World Cup
- Stars forward Adam Erne and Mammoth defenseman Mikhail Sergachev shared the ice in Tampa Bay from 2017-18 to 2018-19.
- Stars head coach Glen Gulutzan coached Mammoth forward Kailer Yamamoto as an assistant coach in Edmonton from 2018-19 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Mammoth assistant coach Mario Duhamel were both members of the Colorado Avalanche in 2013-14 to 2014-15 where Duhamel was a video coach.
- Stars defensemen Ilya Lyubushkin and Mammoth assistant coach Mario Duhamel were together in Arizona while Duhamel was an assistant coach in Arizona from 2021-22 to 2023-24. Lyubushkin played under Duhamel during the 2021-22 season.
