## PLAYER NOTES

- **John Tavares** scored the game-winning goal at 4:13 of overtime, scoring his ninth goal of the season and the 18th overtime goal of his NHL career. Per NHL Stats, “Tavares scored his 12th career overtime goal on the road and tied Jaromir Jagr and Alex Ovechkin for the most in NHL history.” Tavares recorded his third game-winning goal of the season and 77th game-winning goal of his NHL career, tying Patrick Kane for the sixth most career game-winning goals among active skaters. Tavares also posted the primary assist on McMann’s goal, recording his seventh assist of the season. Tavares has recorded five points in his last four games (4G, 1A). Tavares marked his fourth multi-point game of the season.
- **Bobby McMann** scored for Toronto at 12:11 of the first period, posting his fourth goal of the season. McMann registered eight shots tonight, setting a new single-game NHL career-high.
- **William Nylander** scored for the Maple Leafs at 15:51 of the third period, scoring his 12th goal of the season. Nylander recorded the 100th road goal of his NHL career. Nylander added the secondary assist on Marner’s power play goal, recording his eighth assist of the season. Nylander marked his eighth multi-point game of the season.
- **Mitch Marner** scored on a Maple Leafs power play opportunity at 19:12 of the third period, posting his fifth goal of the season. Marner also recorded the primary assist on Tavares’ goal, recording his 17th assist of the season. Marner marked his eighth multi-point game of the season.
- **Matthew Knies** posted the primary assist on Nylander’s goal, recording his fourth assist of the season. Knies has registered two assists in his last three games.
- **Morgan Rielly** registered the primary assist on Marner’s power play goal, posting his ninth assist of the season. Rielly has recorded six assists in his last five games.
- **Oliver Ekman-Larsson** skated in the 1,000th game of his NHL career tonight with the Maple Leafs. Ekman-Larsson became the 26th skater and ninth defenceman to play his 1,000th game as a member of the Maple Leafs. Ekman-Larsson became the 398th player in NHL history to reach the 1,000-game mark and per NHL Stats, “the ninth Swedish-born defenceman in NHL history to reach the milestone.”
- **Jani Hakanpää** skated in his Maple Leafs debut tonight and recorded two shots (five shot attempts), one hit and one block in 15:36 of ice time.
- **Joseph Woll** stopped 24 of 27 shots he faced in tonight’s overtime win.
- **William Nylander** was on the ice for a team-high 23 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Oliver Ekman-Larsson** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 68.75 percent (22 for, 10 against).

## TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs have posted a 1-2 record in overtime decisions this season.
- The Maple Leafs were 1-for-2 on the power play and 1-for-1 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted a 3-3-2 record on the road this season.
- The Maple Leafs have posted a 3-1-1 record in the second game of a back-to-back this season.
- Per NHL Stats, "The Maple Leafs earned a win after facing a multi-goal deficit in the final five minutes of regulation for the fifth time in franchise history, following Oct. 11, 2023 (6-5 SO W vs. MTL), Dec. 6, 2010 (5-4 SO W at WSH), Dec. 8, 1946 (5-4 W at DET) and Jan. 16, 1934 (7-4 OT W at SEN). Of note, there was no sudden-death provision during overtime games in the 1933-34 season."
- At 16:47 of the third period, video review was initiated to determine whether the puck was hit into the net with a high stick resulting in a Maple Leafs goal. Per the NHL's Situation Room, "video review supported the Referees' call on the ice that Matthew Knies' stick was above the height of the crossbar when he directed the puck into the Washington net. According to Rule 78.5 (vi) that states in part "Apparent goals shall be disallowed by the Referee . . . When the puck has entered the net after making contact with an attacking player's stick that is above the height of the crossbar. Where the puck makes contact with the stick is the determining factor." **Result: Call on the ice is upheld – No goal Toronto**
- At 9:09 of the third period, video review was initiated to determine whether the puck was batted into the net resulting in a Maple Leafs goal. Per the NHL's Situation Room, "video review determined Toronto's Steven Lorentz used his leg to deliberately direct the puck into the Washington net. According to Rule 78.5 (i), apparent goals shall be disallowed, "When the puck has been directed, batted or thrown into the net by an attacking player other than with a stick. When this occurs, if it is deemed to be done deliberately, then the decision shall be NO GOAL. A goal cannot be scored when the puck has been deliberately batted with any part of the attacking player's body into the net." **Result: Call on the ice is overturned - No goal Toronto**
- At 10:32 of the second period, the Maple Leafs initiated a Coach's Challenge to determine whether goaltender interference resulted in a Washington goal. Per the NHL's situation room, "video review determined Washington's Nic Dowd impaired Joseph Woll's ability to play his position in the crease prior to John Carlson's goal. The decision was made in accordance with Rule 69.1 which states, in part, "Goals should be disallowed only if: (1) an attacking player, either by his positioning or by contact, impairs the goalkeeper's ability to move freely within his crease or defend his goal." **Result: Call on the ice is overturned – No goal Washington**
