- Eight different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and two had multi-point outings.
- **Logan Stankoven** recorded three points (2-1-3), which marks his second game this season with three or more points (last: Oct. 10 at Nashville). The most such instances by a rookie in Stars team history is three, set by Jussi Jokinen in 2005-06 according to NHL Stats.
- **Miro Heiskanen** and **Wyatt Johnston** both registered an assist on **Matt Duchene's** goal, extending their point streaks against Toronto to three games – **Heiskanen** (0-3-3, 3 GP) and **Johnston** (1-2-3, 3 GP).
- **Jake Oettinger** extended his win streak to six games, the third longest of his career (8 GP; March 20 - April 9, 2024 & 7 GP; Jan. 23 – Feb. 15, 2024).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Canadiens this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year.
- If the Stars were to score a power-play goal tonight, it would give them power-play goals in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has 14 points (4-10-14) in his last 14 games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals. He is now pacing to finish the year with 40 assists, which would be a career high for the forward.
- **Matt Duchene** has 11 points (4-7-11) in his last nine games played dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Canadiens with a plus-25 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday. Only Leon Draisaitl (28), and Kirill Marchenko (27) ranked higher.
 - In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-22 plus/minus rating, which was the sixth-best mark among all NHL skaters and tied for second among defensemen entering play Wednesday.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:20 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.

- The Stars have allowed only 2.44 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 25 of the 43 games that they have played this year.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 9-1-1 record for 19 points and an .864 points percentage. Their win total, point total and points percentage all topped the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 37-22. Their plus-15 goal differential was the best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday, and their 37 goals for were tied for second.
- Twenty-seven of the Dallas' 37 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which ranked second in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only St. Louis (30).
- The team's 22 goals against were also tied for the fourth-fewest allowed since Dec. 23 entering play Wednesday.
- The Stars have gone 334-for-630 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.0 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the league during that span entering play Wednesday.
- **Jason Robertson** is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 14 points (4-10—14) in 11 games played. His 14 points were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL since Dec. 23 entering play Wednesday.
- Thirteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 13: **Jamie Benn** (6), **Roope Hintz** (5), **Evgenii Dadonov** (4), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Wyatt Johnston** (4), **Jason Robertson** (4), **Mavrik Bourque** (2), **Thomas Harley** (2), **Logan Stankoven** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Miro Heiskanen** (1) and **Esa Lindell** (1).
 - **Benn's** six goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the 10th-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only team in the NHL to have six different skaters score at least four goals since Dec. 23.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** enters tonight's matchup against the Canadiens having won each of the last six games that he has played dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
 - During this stretch, **Oettinger** has posted a .930 save percentage and a 1.78 goals-against average.
- **Oettinger's** six-game win streak is both the third-longest of his career and was the longest active goaltender winning streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- If **Oettinger** were to play and win tonight, he would become the fourth goaltender this season to have a win streak of seven games – the longest in the NHL – joining Carolina's Pyotr Kochetkov, Ottawa's Linus Ullmark and Washington's Logan Thompson.
- A victory would also give **Oettinger** seven consecutive wins for the first time since he won a career-best eight consecutive games from March 20 to April 9, 2024.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

- **Logan Stankoven** tallied three points (2-1—3) in Dallas' last game, a 4-1 win over the Toronto Maple Leafs.
- **Stankoven's** performance against the Leafs was his second three-point game of the season after tallying three assists in the season opener on Oct. 10 at Nashville. Entering play Wednesday, **Stankoven** was one of three rookies this season to have multiple three-point games, joining San Jose's Macklin Celebrini and Montreal's Lane Hutson.
- **Stankoven** now has 23 points (6-17—23) on the season, which ranks fourth among rookies in scoring this season and puts him on pace to finish the year with 45 points.
 - If that pace holds, it would make **Stankoven** the highest-scoring Stars rookie since **Jason Robertson** also had 45 points (17-28—45) in 2020-21.
- **Mavrik Bourque** has tallied a point in four of the last five games that he has played dating back to Jan. 7 against the New York Rangers, scoring two goals and adding three assists during that stretch. This includes scoring the game-winning goal in Dallas' last game.
- Since Jan. 7, **Bourque** has logged a 54.6 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick, which ranks third among the team's forward's during that span, trailing only **Stankoven** (58.1 percent) and **Roope Hintz** (55.1 percent).
- **Oskar Bäck** has gone 57-for-100 at the faceoff dot this season for a 57 percent success rate, which topped all rookies to have played in at least 15 games this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Bäck** has also totaled 50:10 of shorthanded ice time this season, which ranked second among all NHL rookies this season entering play Wednesday, trailing only Minnesota's Marat Khuznutdinov (61:49).

WHEN IN MONTRÉAL

- Dallas is 43-77-24 all-time vs. Montréal, including a 24-34-14 mark at home.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has 10 points (3-7—10) in 27 career games against the Canadiens. **Dadonov** appeared in 50 games with the Canadiens during the 2022-23 season, posting 18 points (4-14—18).
- **Jason Robertson** has six points (2-4—6) in seven career games against Montréal.
- Among active Stars, **Matt Duchene** is second in points (7-15—22) in 26 career games vs. the Canadiens. He enters tonight's game registering five points (1-4—5) in his last five games played against Montréal.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's matchup having totaled eight points (3-5—8) in his last six games against Montréal. **Benn** also has the third-most points among active Stars against the Canadiens with 21 (10-11—21) in 22 games.

- **Mavrik Bourque**, a Plessisville Québec native, tallied his first point (0-1-1) in his first game against the Canadiens on Jan. 11 in Montréal.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 23 points (6-17-23) in his last 21 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 23 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
 - **Robertson** has multi-point efforts in five of the last nine games that he has played.
- **Robertson** scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montreal Canadiens.
 - In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202-344) in 329 regular-season games.
 - He now sits seven points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** – who turned 25 on July 21 – became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

DADDY ISSUES

- **Evgenii Dadonov** has 10 points (4-6-10) in his last 10 games played dating back to Dec. 27 against the Minnesota Wild.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 10-4 when **Dadonov** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - Only **Jamie Benn** (12), **Matt Duchene** (12), **Thomas Harley** (12) and **Wyatt Johnston** (11) have been on the ice for more 5-on-5 goals since Dec. 27 than **Dadonov** according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Dadonov's** goal on Jan. 12 against the Senators was his 12th of the season, matching his total that he reached in 51 games last season. He is now pacing to finish the year with 23 goals, which would be his highest total since he scored 25 for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- **Dadonov's** goal against Ottawa was also his fourth power-play goal of the year, which is tied with **Matt Duchene** and **Roope Hintz** for the team lead.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.2 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas has allowed only 17 power-play goals against and .40 power-play goals against per game played this year, which were both the top marks in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 35-for-38 on the penalty kill for a 92.1 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
 - This stretch includes an eight-game streak (from Dec. 8 to 27) in which the Stars did not surrender a power-play goal.
- **Thomas Harley** has allowed 2.58 power-play goals against per 60, which was the sixth-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday among NHL skaters that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 148:46 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was the most of any NHL skater this season entering play Wednesday.
 - Since 2016-17 – his first full NHL season – no skater has spent more time on the penalty kill than **Lindell**, who has totaled 1929:31 of shorthanded ice time during that span.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (340), **Jason Robertson** (253), **Esa Lindell** (213) and **Wyatt Johnston** (207). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 14 against the Maple Leafs was the 340th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 253-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Wednesday.
- **Lindell's** 213-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is three assists shy of tying Darian Hatcher (223) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is one assist shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 25th on the franchise's all-time assists list. He is also six goals shy of becoming the 19th player in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov**, Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **AI Montoya** all played for the Canadiens. Dadonov played in Montréal in 2022-23, Benn from 2016-17 to 2018-19 and Montoya from 2016-17 to 2017-18.
- Canadiens assistant coach Stéphane Robidas played for the Dallas Stars from 2002-03 to 2003-04 and 2005-06 until 2013-14. Robidas served as an alternate captain for Dallas from 2009-10 to 2013-14.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Canadiens forward Josh Anderson and defenseman David Savard played together in Columbus during the 2018-19 season following the trade deadline.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Canadiens forward Christian Dvorak were teammates in Arizona from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Colin Blackwell** shared the ice with Canadiens defenseman Alexandre Carrier in Nashville. Blackwell played two games with Carrier in 2019-20 and Duchene skated with Carrier from 2019-20 to 2022-23.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **AI Montoya** and Canadiens defenseman Mike Matheson were both members of the Florida Panthers during the 2015-16 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Canadiens defenseman Mike Matheson played together for the Pittsburgh Penguins during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.

- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Canadiens goaltender Sam Montembeault were teammates on the Florida Panthers during the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Canadiens head coach Martin St. Louis were both in Tampa Bay where Reese held multiple positions from 2000-01 to 2007-08. The two won a Stanley Cup with the Lightning in 2004.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Canadiens head coach Martin St. Louis were teammates in Tampa Bay during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons.
- Stars forward **Mason Marchment** played under Canadiens assistant coach Stéphane Robidas when Robidas was the Player Development Coordinator in Toronto in 2019-20.
