- Roope Hintz tallied three points (2-1-3), which extended his point streak to four games
- Esa Lindell recorded the secondary assist on Hintz's first goal of the night, which tied him with Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- Lian Bichsel registered six hits, which tied his single-game career high and is also tied for the most by a Stars skater in a single game this year.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Blue Jackets this season and the only time the teams are facing off in Dallas this year. They will next play on Feb. 25 in Columbus.
- A win tonight would give the Stars five consecutive victories for the second time this season after previously winning seven straight games from Dec. 29 to Jan. 11.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 33-17-1 record for 67 points and a .657 points percentage. Their .657 points percentage was the fourth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
 - o Of the top four ranked teams, three of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.708), Edmonton (.667) and Dallas. The Washington Capitals (.725) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference.
- Defenseman Brendan Smith has played in each of Dallas' last four games as a forward. He's logged a 50.0 percent Corsi rating in those games according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game one assist shy of totaling his 500th NHL assist. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th active skater and the fourth player from the 2009 Draft class to tally 500 career assists.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.

The Stars have allowed only 2.47 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering
play Saturday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 28 of the 51 games that they have played this year.

DRIVING THE 'BUS

- Dallas is 42-24-8 all-time vs. Columbus, with a 21-13-2 mark at home.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with points in eight of their past 10 games against the Blue Jackets (7-2-1), also earning wins in five of their last six games played at American Airlines Center vs. Columbus (5-1-0).
- Matt Duchene recorded 12 points (4-8—12) in 23 games with the Blue Jackets in 2018-19. In all, Duchene has recorded nine goals and 28 points (9-19—28) in 41 career games vs. Columbus. Duchene's first goal with Dallas came in the club's 5-3 win over Columbus on Oct. 30, 2023. He enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak against Columbus, earning five points (2-3—5) during that span.
- Jamie Benn leads active Stars in goals (10), assists (23) and points (10-23-33) in 41 games vs. Columbus.
- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak (1-2—3). Robertson has tallied 10 points (5-5—10) in 12 career games against the Blue Jackets.
- Roope Hintz has three goals and nine points (3-6—9) in 13 career games vs. Columbus.
- Jake Oettinger is 9-0-1 with a 1.77 goals-against average, .927 save percentage and one shutout in 10 career appearances against the Blue Jackets. His lone shutout vs. Columbus was a 21-save performance in Dallas' 5-0 victory on March 6, 2021.

JANUARY MEN

- The Stars finished the month of January with a 11-4-0 record for 22 points and a .733 points percentage. Their 11 wins topped the league and their point total and points percentage were both tied for the best mark in the NHL in January.
 - o Dallas played 15 games in over the course of 30 days last month, which included three back-to-back sets.
- January of 2025 marked the Stars most wins in a single month since March of 2024 when they also had 11 wins and 22 points.
- It also marked the team's most wins in the month of January since the 2005-06 season when the team had an 11-3-1 record for 23 points and .767 points percentage in January 2006.
- Jason Robertson was the team's leading scorer in January, totaling 21 points (10-11—21) in 15 games. He tied for second
 in scoring in the NHL last month and his 10 goals tied for third.
- With three points in Dallas' last game, **Robertson** became the seventh player in franchise history to record at least 20 points in a single January according to NHL Stats. He joined Neal Broten (25 in 1984), Dino Ciccarelli (23 in 1984), Bobby Smith (22 in 1982), Joe Pavelski (21 in 2022), Mike Modano (20 in 2003) and Craig Hartsburg (20 in 1982).
- Robertson is the first Stars skater to have at least 20 points in a single month since both he (22) and Miro Heiskanen (23) did so in March of 2023.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted a 14-4-1 record for 29 points and a .763 points percentage. Dallas' win total, point total and points percentage during that span all topped the NHL entering play Saturday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 61-43. Their plus-18 goal differential was the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-22)
 - Only the Jets (62) and Buffalo Sabres (62) had scored more goals that the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday.
- Forty-one of the Dallas' 61 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which ranked fourth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- The Stars have gone 582-for-1099 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.0 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, **Jason Robertson** was both the team's and the league's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 27 points (12-15—27) in 19 games played.
- Fourteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: Jason Robertson (12), Roope Hintz (8), Wyatt Johnston (8), Jamie Benn (7), Matt Duchene (5), Evgenii Dadonov (5), Mavrik Bourque (4), Thomas Harley (3), Oskar Bäck (2), Esa Lindell (2), Logan Stankoven (2), Colin Blackwell (1), Matěj Blümel (1) and Miro Heiskanen (1).
 - o Robertson's 12 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 36 points (14-22—36) in his last 29 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 36 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and were tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - Robertson has multi-point efforts in nine of the last 16 games that he has played.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Robertson his second five-game point streak of the season.
- Robertson had three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' last game on Jan. 31 against the Canucks, his fourth three-point game of the season.

- Robertson scored two goals on Jan. 24 against Vegas including the game winner to bring his career total to 150. He is the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- Robertson's second goal of the game on Jan. 24 was 358th career point (150-208—358), giving him sole possession of 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Robertson factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26—40). Robertson has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
 - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
 - o In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- Robertson recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats.
 Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- Robertson tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. Robertson has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
- Robertson's second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- Roope Hintz scored twice and added in an assist in Dallas' last game a 5-3 win over the Vancouver Canucks on Jan. 31. He now has 14 points (7-7—14) in his last 13 games dating back to Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres.
- Hintz enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak, totaling eight points (3-5—8) during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him a point in five consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in six straight from Dec. 18 to 31, 2023.
- If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in four consecutive games for the first time since Nov. 1 to 8, 2022.
- If **Hintz** were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts for three consecutive games for the first time since Nov 1 to 5, 2022.
- Hintz recorded the primary assist on all three of Wyatt Johnston's goals in Dallas' game on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. His three assists tied his single-game career high that he had reached on four previous occasions, most recently on April 10, 2023 against the Detroit Red Wings.
- Hintz' three assists brought his career point total to 342 (167-175—342), passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam (340 each) to take sole possession of 22nd on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Hintz scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights. Hintz is the sixth Stars skater in the last 30 years to have at least four consecutive 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (8: 1995-96 2002-03), Jamie Benn (6: 2013-14 2018-19), Tyler Seguin (6: 2013-14 2018-19), Loui Eriksson (4: 2008-09 2011-12) and Joe Pavelski (4: 2020-21 2023-24).
- He is now pacing to finish the season with 37 goals, which would match his career high that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston tallied an assist in Dallas' last game and now has 36 points (12-24—36) in 34 games since Nov. 20. His 36 points during that span trail only Jason Robertson (41) for the team lead.
- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 25-15 at 5-on-5 when **Johnston** is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 25 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are the most of any Stars skater.
- **Johnston** scored his second career hat trick in Dallas' Jan. 28 game a 4-3 overtime win over the Vegas Golden Knights. The first of **Johnston's** three goals was shorthanded, the second at even strength and the third was the overtime winner.
- Johnston's hat trick hit several league and franchise historical milestones according to NHL Stats:
 - o **Johnston** (21 years, 259 days) became the youngest player in franchise history to score a natural hat trick, besting **Tyler Seguin** (21 years, 310 days on Dec. 7, 2013).
 - He became the first player in Stars/North Stars history to record a hat trick which included a shorthanded goal and overtime-winning tally. Johnston became the eighth player on record to achieve the feat and second in over a decade (Elias Lindholm on Oct. 23, 2021).
 - He became the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history to cap a hat trick with an overtime-winning goal. The last player to do so for Dallas was Roope Hintz on Dec. 29, 2023.
 - Additionally, Johnston became one of eight players in NHL history to complete a natural hat trick in overtime.
 The only other active players to do so are Evander Kane (Nov. 15, 2023 w/ EDM), Kirill Kaprizov (Feb. 26, 2023 w/ MIN) and Tomas Hertl (Jan. 8, 2022 w/ SJS). Johnston (21 years, 259 days) is the youngest to do so.

- Johnston's shorthanded tally was the fifth of this career and second of the season. He joined former Star Brian Bellows
 (9) as the only player in franchise history to have at least five shorthanded goals at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston became the fifth active player to score at least five shorthanded goals before his 22nd birthday according to NHL Stats, joining Jordan Staal (10), Sebastian Aho (5), Anze Kopitar (5) and Anthony Cirelli (5).
- Johnston's first goal of the night was his 40th point of the season. He has now tallied at least 40 points in each of the three NHL seasons that he has played.
- Johnston's 43 points (14-29-43) this season were tied with Utah's Logan Cooley for second among players that are
 age 22 or younger entering play Saturday, trailing only Chicago's Connor Bedard (45).
- Johnston is now pacing to finish the year with 23 goals, 47 assists and 69 points. Forty-seven assists and 69 points would both be a career high for the forward.
- Johnston enters tonight's game one point shy of totaling 150 career points. When he reaches the milestone he:
 - o Will become the first player from the 2021 Draft class to total 150 points.
 - Will become the 63rd skater in franchise history to total 150 points with the Stars.

HEATING UP

- Jake Oettinger has an 10-2-0 record in his last 12 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .920 save percentage
 and a 2.07 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 10 wins since Dec. 29 were the most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Esa Lindell has recorded a point in each of Dallas' last three games scoring a goal on Jan. 25 and tallying an assist on both Jan. 28 and 31. A goal or an assist tonight would give Lindell points in four consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in five straight from Dec. 29, 2019 to Jan. 9, 2020.
- Matt Duchene has 19 points (5-14—19) in his last 17 games played dating back to Dec. 29 against Chicago. If he were to
 record an assist tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- Evgenii Dadonov has totaled four points (1-3—4) in his last four games. He is now on pace to finish the year with 43 points, his highest total since he also had 43 points for the Vegas Golden Knights in 2022-23.

ROOKIE REPORT

- Since Jan. 1, Mavrik Bourque has scored four goals including the Stars first of the game in their matchup on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. His four goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Saturday.
 - o In all, **Bourque** has totaled six points (4-2—6) during that span, which is one shy of the seven (2-5—7) he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31.
- Lian Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in each of the four games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL), including matching his single-game career high with six on Jan. 31 against Vancouver. In all this season, he is averaging 16 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked ninth among all NHL rookies this season that had played in at least five games entering play Saturday.
 - o Despite only playing in 12 games this season, Bichsel ranks fifth on the Stars roster with 46 hits.
- Oskar Bäck has gone 74-for-134 at the faceoff dot this season for a 55.2 percent success rate, which ranked second among rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Saturday.

JUST IN CASE

- Casey DeSmith recorded his second shutout of the season in Dallas' Jan. 25 game a 2-0 win over the St. Louis Blues
 stopping all 33 shots he faced.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, **DeSmith** saved 2.73 goals above expected. The Stars were outshot 19-33 in the game.
- The shutout was the 12th of **DeSmith's** career, making him one of 32 NHL goaltenders to record at least 12 shutouts since the start of the 2017-18-season.
- **DeSmith** is now one shutout shy of tying his career high of three that he set in 2018-19 and matched in 2021-22, both while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has a 7-6-0 record with a 2.42 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. He has allowed two or fewer goals in nine of the 15 games he has played in.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (348), **Jason Robertson** (261), **Esa Lindell** (221) and **Wyatt Johnston** (215). Entering play Saturday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 31 against the Canucks was the 348th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the
 fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300
 games.
- Robertson's 261-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
 only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- Lindell's 220-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.

• **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is two goals shy of tying J.P. Parise (154) for 17th-most goals in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is eight points shy of tying Danny Grant (353) for 21st-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is seven goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forwards Mikael Granlund (Finland) and Roope Hintz (Finland), defenseman Esa Lindell (Finland) and goaltender
 Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which
 will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
 - Finland native Miro Heiskanen was also selected to represent his home country at the tournament but had to withdraw due to injury.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - o Granlund has represented Finland at nearly every level of international competition: the Winter Olympics (2016), World Cup of Hockey (2016), IIHF World Championships (2011, 2012, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2022, 2024), IIHF U20 World Championships (2009, 2010, 2012) and the IIHF U18 World Junior Championships (2009, 2010). He has medaled six times, winning two golds, one silver and three bronzes.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
 again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 Granlund and Lindell have previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

 season
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Blue Jackets forward Zach Aston-Reese both played in Pittsburgh from 2017-18 to 2021-22.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Blue Jackets forward Zach Aston-Reese shared the ice in Anaheim during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Blue Jackets forward Zach Aston-Reese skated together in Toronto during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Blue Jackets forward Sean Monahan and defenseman Jordan Harris were teammates in Montréal during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards Colin Blackwell and Matt Duchene skated with Blue Jackets forward Mathieu Olivier and defensemen
 Dante Fabbro in Nashville during the 2019-20 season. Duchene, Olivier and Fabbro also played in Nashville during the
 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Blue Jackets defenseman Erik Gudbranson played together for the Florida Panthers during the 2011-12 season.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy Al Montoya and Blue Jackets defenseman Erik Gudbranson played together with the Florida Panthers from 2014-15 until 2015-16.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Blue Jackets defenseman Erik Gudbranson shared the ice in Pittsburgh for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.

- Stars forward Sam Steel and Blue Jackets defenseman Erik Gudbranson were teammates in Anaheim during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Blue Jackets defenseman Jack Johnson played together in Pittsburgh from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
