TWO-HEADED MONSTER

Sidney Crosby and Evgeni Malkin both scored in last Sunday's win against the Predators in Sweden for their 12th and fifth goals of the season, respectively.

- Sunday marked the Penguins' 116th win when both Crosby and Malkin score in the same game. Only three duos in NHL history have more wins when they score in the same game:

- Crosby leads the Penguins with 12 goals this season, while Malkin ranks first on the team with 18 assists and 23 points.

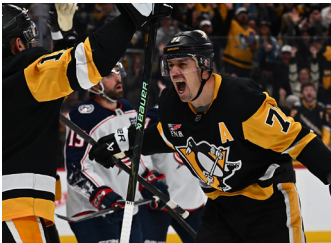

Forward Sam Poulin was recently recalled from the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins and looks to make his season debut tonight with Pittsburgh.

- Poulin has seven goals, eight assists and 15 points with a plus-8 through 16 games in the AHL this season. He leads all WBS Penguins in points, while ranking second in goals:

IN THE CREASE

Sergei Murashov recorded his first career win in a shutout victory last Sunday against the Predators in Sweden, marking the third Penguins goaltender to record a shutout this season joining Arturs Silovs and Tristan Jarry.

- Rookie Murashov became the second goaltender in Penguins history to record a shutout in his first career win, joining Jeff Zatkoff who did so on November 2, 2013.
- In his second game, Murashov required the fewest career games played to record his first career NHL shutout by a goaltender in franchise history, tying Denis Herron:

- At 21 years and 229 days old, Murashov became the sixth-youngest goaltender in franchise history to record a shutout:

- Silovs, who became the second goaltender in Penguins history to record a shutout in his debut with the team (Maxime Lagace, 2021), was the first netminder to record his first career regular-season shutout this season.
- The Penguins have earned points in eight of Silovs' 10 games this season (4-2-4). His .917 save percentage ranks fourth in the league (min. 7 GP):

- Jarry, who is currently sidelined due to injury, recorded his 22nd career shutout in October, tying Tom Barrasso for the second most in Penguins history.
