As a proud member of the Philadelphia Flyers organization for over a decade now, I was honored and excited to oversee our community impact efforts this past season. It has been a privilege to work closely with our talented Community Relations, Flyers Charities and Flyers Alumni teams, along with the entire Flyers organization, to identify ways to further enhance our organization's impact and to extend our reach throughout the city of Philadelphia and its surrounding communities.

It has been incredibly rewarding to witness the positive change we have been able to achieve together. From engaging in youth development programs to supporting local charities and initiatives, our team has remained steadfast in its commitment to making a difference throughout the past year by focusing on:

- **Growing the game of hockey** by restoring ball hockey and ice hockey rinks throughout the Greater Philadelphia Region to provide every kid that wants to play hockey with an opportunity to do so; growing the Flyers "Learn to Play" program to over 600 youth participants, including the launch of an all-girls team; and partnering with Leveling the Playing Field to redistribute over 2,000 pounds of equipment to local youth athletes, reducing the financial barriers to our game and so much more.
- Hosting some of our most successful **marquee fundraising events** to date, including Flyers Charities Carnival, Flyers Alumni Game, Flyers Casino Night and Gritty 5K. These events, paired with Flyers Charities 50/50, serve as the main fundraising sources for the more than the \$1 million Flyers Charities has invested into the Philadelphia community this past season.
- **Supporting families impacted by cancer** by donating over \$100,000 to cancer research; making visits to local hospitals; creating special experiences at our annual Hockey Fights Cancer Game; and financially supporting and participating in volunteer opportunities for several cancer research nonprofits, including Ronald McDonald House of Philadelphia, American Cancer Society, Ryan's Case for Smiles, Alex's Lemonade Stand and more.
- **Teaming up with dozens of partners** to create experiences to leave lasting, positive impacts on fans and members of the community through player and community relations programs, including Hath's Heroes, Cates' Mates, Scott Laughton's Pride Initiative, Next Shift: Mentoring the Next Generation of Female Leaders, Flyers Penn Medicine Assist, Flyers Hometown Assist and more.

As leaders both on and off the ice, we recognize the importance of having a positive impact beyond the game of hockey. It is about the lives we touch, the communities we uplift and the legacy we aim to build alongside our partners. The stories of impact and empowerment shared in this annual report are a testament to our collective efforts to create a stronger and more inclusive community for all.

We are deeply grateful for the unwavering support of our dedicated employees, fans and partners, whose commitment enables us to continue making a meaningful difference in the lives of those around us.

Over 3,200 participants “ran” 3.1 miles on October 21 as part of the fan-favorite Gritty 5K presented by Penn Medicine. Many got Gritt-ified for this special occasion, with homemade costumes, orange face paint, tutus, and were invited to stop by our “Get Gritt-ified with West” station before hitting the road, where fans could get extra orange glitter and accessories sponsored by West Pharmaceuticals. The fun-packed course consisted of caking, ribbon dancing, “wooder” stations, a guessing game, and more, then “runners” crossed the finish line with a hot dog in hand.

Gritty 5K presented by Penn Medicine is a sustainable event. All materials used are separated into compost, recycling, or waste-to-energy bins. With the help of Sustainable Solutions and West Pharmaceuticals, we were able to divert 1,600 pounds of waste from going into landfills.

2ND ANNUAL NEXT SHIFT PRESENTED BY HOLMAN

After a successful debut in March 2023, the Flyers held their second annual Next Shift: Mentoring the Next Generation of Female Leaders presented by Holman. The program serves as part of the organization's celebration of Women's History Month and year-round efforts to promote and foster female talent in the front office. After receiving over 200 applicants, the team paired 26 local young women, ages 18-22, with different female Flyers leaders and executives to provide them with a behind-the-scenes look at the different roles they have on a Flyers gameday. Prior to the evening, participants enjoyed a panel featuring Flyers female leadership to learn more about pursuing a career in the sports and entertainment industry. The young women shadowed female employees in a variety of departments including marketing, finance, public relations, community relations, corporate partnerships, and more.

**HOCKEY FIGHTS CANCER NIGHT
PRESENTED BY TOYOTA**

In November, fans came out to support Hockey Fights Cancer at the Wells Fargo Center. The “I Fight For” rally towels made a comeback along with the flashing purple lights that illuminated the arena. Along with the Flyers players wearing their lavender jerseys, they wrapped their sticks in lavender tape during warmups. The warm-up sticks and jerseys were later used in a Hockey Fights Cancer Auction.

For HFC, the Flyers hosted nine-year-old youth hockey player Owen Micciche who is battling cancer. Owen had his very own locker dressed with a custom jersey in the Flyers Locker Room, read the Flyers starting lineup, took a rookie lap with Flyers forward Owen Tippett ahead of warmups, and coached alongside Coach Tortorella on the bench during the first period.

**ABRAMSON CANCER CENTER AT
PENN MEDICINE**

As part of an ongoing partnership, Flyers Charities continues to support the Abramson Cancer Center at Penn Medicine. The Flyers Against Prostate Cancer initiative supports prostate cancer screenings in the community. Eligible participants will undergo a PSA (prostate-specific antigen) blood draw, and a patient navigator will inform participants of the results and provide further direction to diagnostic testing if needed.

CHOP VISIT

Ahead of the Flyers’ Hockey Fights Cancer Game in November, Flyers players Cam Atkinson, Joel Farabee, Morgan Frost, Sean Couturier and Scott Laughton visited patients on the oncology floor at Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia. The players spent time visiting with multiple patients to take photos, sign autographs and gift them with Flyers giveaways.



DEAR JACK FOUNDATION

Flyers Charities was excited to partner with the Dear Jack Foundation to support adolescents and young adults diagnosed with cancer. Flyers Charities supported the Dear Jack “LifeList” program with \$10,000. “LifeList” aims to fulfill wishes and improve the quality of life for young adults living with cancer. Flyers Charities also hosted five “LifeListers” at the Hockey Fights Cancer Flyers game.

**ST. CHRISTOPHER’S HOSPITAL FOR
CHILDREN VISIT**

In February, Flyers players Nick Seeler, Cam York, and Jamie Drysdale visited patients at St. Christopher’s Hospital for Children and gifted them with Flyers giveaways including hats, teddy bears, water bottles, pennants and sunglasses. HAMMERHEADS SLED HOCKEY

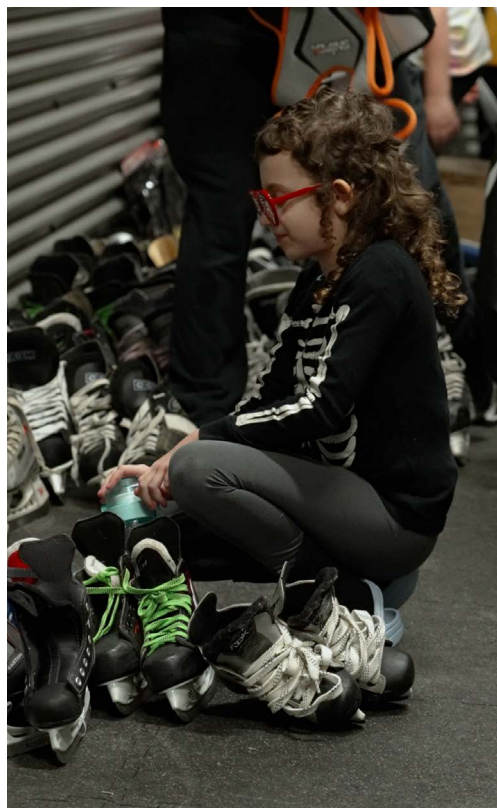

LEVELING THE PLAYING FIELD

In November, Flyers Charities united Leveling the Playing Field and Philadelphia Freeze Special Hockey team to outfit their players in head-to-toe gear.

Flyers Charities also donated \$50,000 to assist LPF, in growing its presence in our community! LPF redistributes equipment to expand access and equity within youth sports and recreation programs in under-resourced communities.

The 10 Flyers-branded donations bids located at rinks throughout Philadelphia have collected over 3,000 pounds of hockey gear, equivalent to over \$200,000, in the past year. 44 hockey programs were able to benefit from Leveling the Playing Field's redistribution of the collect equipment.



FLYERS POWERPLAY TEAM

Flyers staff and Alumni played a game against the Flyers Powerplay, a power wheelchair team! Powerplay won, 13-8! Flyers Charities also donated \$10,000 to help continue to grow their program.

RIDLEY HOCKEY LEAGUE RINK RENOVATIONS

Ridley Hockey League received a \$100,000 Flyers Charities Grant for the 2023-2024 season! The grant funded the expansion of the rink to standard size, installing new flooring and boards, and leveling out the surface and surrounding area. Ridley Hockey League saw their biggest season this past year with almost 200 kids and 100 adults playing in their programs. To celebrate the completion of the project, Gritty made a surprise visit to the seven & under ball hockey practice!

AAA RINK TAKEOVER

Travis Konecny, Bob Kelly, and Gritty surprised youth hockey players at two different local rinks this season making their practices extra memorable and educational.

FLYERS CUP CHAMPIONSHIP

WHITE HOUSE VISIT

The Philadelphia Flyers Community Relations team had the opportunity to utilize the holiday ice rink on the White House South Lawn for two days in December of 2023. Children from eight different hockey clubs, all from the Philadelphia area, were invited to skate on the 60' x 40' rink while showcasing a diverse variety of hockey programming.

All participants were provided of luxury coach transportation from Philadelphia, and every child was able to bring a guest with them to share the experience. It was truly a once-in-a-lifetime moment for all involved.

**LEARN TO PLAY ROOKIE PROGRAM
PRESENTED BY HOLMAN**

The Flyers Learn to Play Rookie Program presented by Holman provides first-time hockey participants, between 5-9 years of age, with six weeks of on-ice instruction and a full set of head-to-toe equipment.

This season, the Flyers hosted the Learn to Play Rookie Program at 15 local ice rinks in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware. Each location was treated to appearances from Flyers Alumni including Todd Fedoruk, Bob Kelly, and Riley Cote, who laced up their skates and served as guest instructors. Nearly 400 first-time hockey players took to the ice during the 2023-24 season.

LEARN TO PLAY BALL HOCKEY

The Flyers Learn to Play Ball Hockey program continued to grow in its fourth year, partnering with seven outdoor rinks throughout Greater Philadelphia, including new host sites in Egg Harbor Twp., NJ and Ridley Twp., PA. This program provides kids ages 4-9 with an introduction to the game of hockey using affordable and easily accessible gear including a Flyers-branded street hockey stick, ball and reversible pinnie. Over 430 boys and girls participated in Learn to Play Ball Hockey during the Spring of 2024, which is the most in the program's history!

STANLEY CUP VISIT

On January 27, the Stanley Cup made a surprise visit to IceWorks Skating Complex in Aston, PA. Participants in the Flyers Learn to Play Rookie Program were excited to pose for photos with the Cup, alongside two-time Stanley Cup champion Jim Watson.

QUEBEC PEE WEE TOURNAMENT

The Flyers Quebec Pee Wee team consists of the top 12-year-old hockey players from the Philadelphia Region. These players represent the Flyers at the annual Quebec International Pee Wee Tournament. This season the Flyers Quebec Pee Wees topped the Montreal Canadiens and Long Islands Stars Pee Wee teams during important, sold out games.





COMMUNITY OUTREACH INITIATIVES

SALVATION ARMY

Ahead of the holidays, Flyers players Ryan Poehling, Egor Zamula, Tyson Foerster, and Morgan Frost volunteered at Salvation Army to shop donated toys and complete wish lists for kids in need of gifts for the holidays. The players also sorted the hundreds of collected toys through the annual Flyers Toy Drive.

CPR TRAINING FOR YOUTH HOCKEY PLAYERS

The American Heart Association and Independence Blue Cross have joined forces to unveil an interactive Hands-Only CPR training kiosk at Wells Fargo Center. Located near Section 108, the kiosk provides an engaging and informative platform for Greater Philadelphia residents and visitors to learn this life-saving technique.

Before a Flyers home game, over 60 local high school hockey players, coaches, and parents participated in a hands-only CPR training at Wells Fargo Center.

HOMETOWN ASSIST

Hometown Assist returned for its fourth year. The Flyers Hometown Assist program awarded \$500,000 in advertising assets to five local small businesses. An additional ten small businesses received a hospitality suite for a Flyers game—a significant business development asset. Cultured Enuf, Mango Tree Counseling & Consulting, Pet Friendly Dog Bakery, True Believers Barbershop, and WellFed each received advertising assets valued at \$100,000, including radio commercials, social media promotions, and activations during home games.

PENN MEDICINE NICU VISIT

To kick off the season, we welcomed our newest and smallest Flyers fans into the world! Philadelphia Flyers and their wives, in partnership with locally based children's clothing brand, Clover Baby & Kids, designed custom Flyers-themed blankets for babies in the NICU at Penn Medicine.

PHILABUNDANCE

During the 2023-24 season, the Philadelphia Flyers teamed up with Philabundance and Penn Medicine to fight hunger in our community. For every Flyers assist made this season, the Flyers and Penn Medicine donated 30 pounds of food to Philabundance. By the end of the season, over 11,000 pounds of food was donated.

FLYERS RECESS

Flyers Recess presented by Wegmans, is a free school assembly program aimed to get kids in the Philadelphia area interested in the game of hockey. The program is an interactive game-show-style assembly where students learn more about the game of hockey. In addition to a school assembly, each school receives equipment and a manual, so that they can launch a street hockey curriculum in their PE classes. This year, Flyers Recess impacted over 5,600 students at 15 schools in the tri-state area.

EVERFI

This year through the Everfi Future Goals Hockey Scholar Program, 4,800 students at over 44 schools were taught the math and science of hockey through STEM sports activities. The Flyers and Everfi also recognize teachers in the tri-state area throughout the school year and hold teacher trainings.



COMMUNITY TICKET GRANTS & IN-KIND DONATIONS

The Flyers organization is committed to growing the game of hockey, and that includes working with organizations from across the region to introduce new fans to the sport and our team. The Flyers Community Ticket Grant program recognizes local non-profits making a difference in our communities by offering them tickets and a complimentary experience at a Flyers home game.

CATES' MATES MEET & GREET

As an ally of the LGBTQ+ community, Scott finds it important to emphasize that hockey is for everyone. As a part of this experience, guests received tickets to a Flyers game, custom Flyers Pride T-shirt jerseys, Flyers Pride pins, and a meet and greet with Scott.



HATH'S HEROES

As a part of Hath's Heroes, local fire, police, EMS, and military groups across the greater Philadelphia area had the opportunity to attend a select number of Flyers games. In addition to tickets, the groups also had the opportunity to meet with Garnet post-game.

TRAVIS KONECNY OUTFITS YOUTH HOCKEY PLAYER

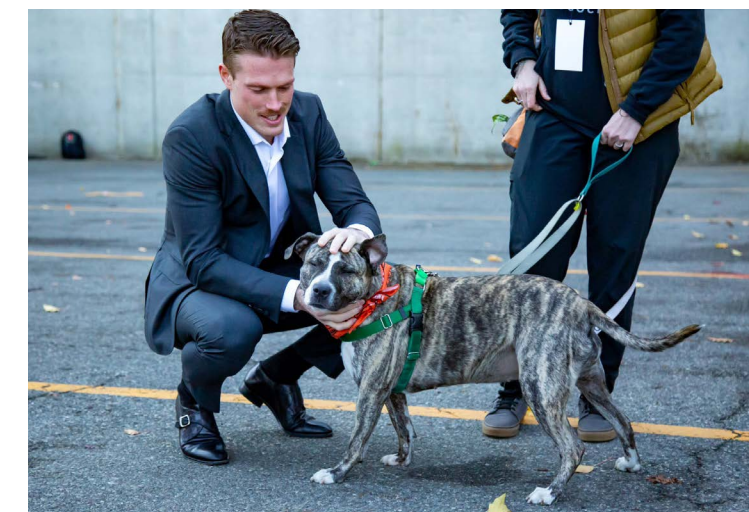

CAMDEN YOUTH HOCKEY CLINIC AND LITERACY EVENT WITH COACH TORTORELLA

Ahead of the 2023-2024 Flyers season, the Flyers teamed up with Head Coach John Tortorella's Tortorella Family Foundation and Camden, N.J. community partners to highlight the importance of collaboration in building stronger, more vibrant communities through literacy, health and athletics. The groups hosted 300 kids from the surrounding community to take part in a ball hockey clinic with John Tortorella, play games at the Game Truck, visit Bess the Book Bus and Tree House Book Bus, and visit a read aloud station with Christine and Brittany Tortorella as they read their children's book "Stubby and Rusty."

COACH TORTORELLA'S HOCKEY AND HOUNDS

For a second season, the Philadelphia Flyers and Head Coach John Tortorella partnered with Pennsylvania SPCA (PSPCA) and Philadelphia Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) to help adoptable dogs find their forever homes while also bringing awareness to animal welfare and local animal rescue organizations. On the weekly Hockey & Hounds podcast, Coach Tortorella discussed Flyers hockey while also featuring an adoptable dog. With the help of Hockey & Hounds during the 2023-24 season, 13 dogs were adopted and eight are in foster homes.



LEWISTON STRONG AUCTION

When the news broke of the tragedy in the Maine town of Lewiston, Garnet Hathaway, a Maine native, followed it very closely. That part of the USA is Bruins country, but Hathaway wanted to help, so he sought out an opportunity to get the Flyers involved with those efforts.

The Flyers and Buffalo Sabres used special blue tape on sticks that were then auctioned off to support the Lewiston victims. Flyers Charities sent the proceeds to the Lewiston Strong Fund, led by the Boston Bruins Foundation. Hathaway also donated a team-signed jersey and he arranged for autographed items from other NHL players from Maine to be donated to the auction.



RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE

As part of the Flyers' ongoing partnership with Ronald McDonald House of Philadelphia, Flyers players Scott Laughton, Owen Tippett and Ryan Poehling made a special visit and served meals to patients and their families in hopes of lifting their spirits. Flyers Charities also made a donation totalling \$10,000 to support their programs and families.



TEAM FOSTER

Spearheaded by Flyers forward Cam Atkinson, a proud advocate of military appreciation initiatives and a Co-Founder of Force Network Fund, Flyers Charities, Flyers Alumni Association, Force Network Fund and The John and Christine Tortorella Family Foundation have all teamed up with Philadelphia-based Team Foster. With a \$30,000 donation from the groups, Team Foster's mission is to identify a recipient and pair them with a service dog. Staff and volunteers from Team Foster were also able to attend the Military Appreciation Game on Saturday, November 4, where the Flyers highlighted the Team Foster service dog program in-game.

On Friday January 26, the Philadelphia Flyers, Flyers Charities, and Flyers Alumni Association celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Flyers 1974 and 1975 Stanley Cup Championship teams and Mark Recchi's induction to the Flyers Hall of Fame with a special Flyers vs. Bruins Alumni Game.

In honor of the 50th anniversary of the original Flyers vs. Bruins matchup in 1974 that won the Flyers their first Stanley Cup in franchise history, the Flyers Alumni, including John LeClair, Mark Recchi, and more hit the ice once again. Patrick Sharp and Brian Boucher also played alongside Joe Watson, who has suited up as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers and Flyers Alumni for seven consecutive decades.

Fans looking to make the most of their Flyers Alumni Game experience also attended an exclusive pregame Flyers Hall of Fame VIP Party. This included the chance to mix and mingle with Flyers Hall of Fame members including Bob Clarke, Bill Barber, Bernie Parent, and more at Wells Fargo Center. FLYERS ALUMNI GOLF INVITATIONAL

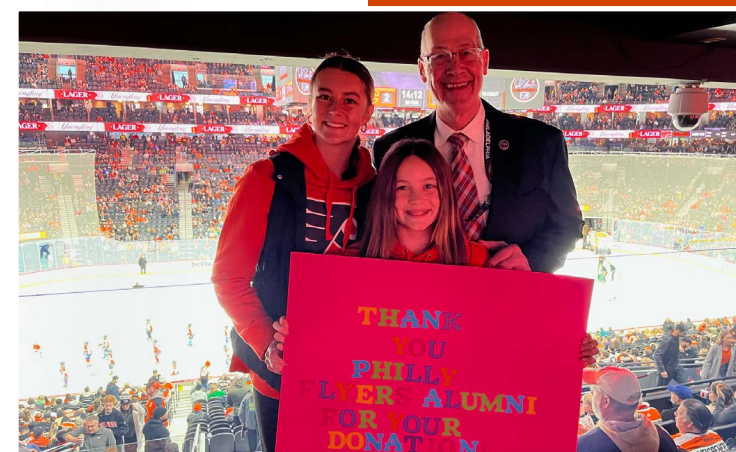
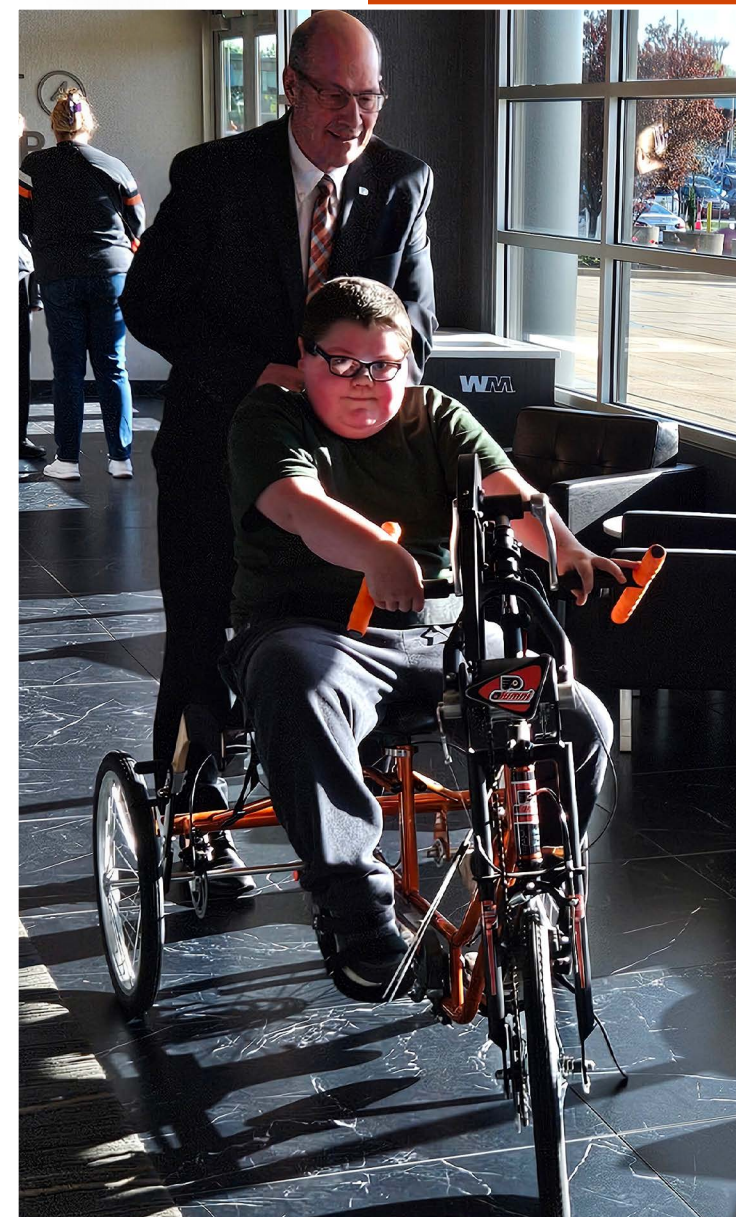
