LOS ANGELES KINGS

All-Time Wild Record: 44-30-16 (25-12-8 at Grand Casino Arena, 19-18-8 at Los Angeles)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 4-3, in a shootout victory at Grand Casino Arena (10/13) before Los Angeles took the second meeting, 5-4, in a shootout at Crypto.com Arena (1/3)...LW **Matt Boldy** (2-0=2), C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (1-1=2), D **Brock Faber** (1-1=2), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-1=2) and RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** each own two points in the series...G **Jesper Wallstedt** is 1-0-1 with a 3.25 GAA and .917 SV% in starting both games...RW **Quinton Byfield** leads the Kings with four points (2-2=4)...RW **Adrian Kempe** has three points (2-1=3)...G **Darcy Kuemper** is 1-0-1 with a 3.30 GAA and 870 SV% in two games against Minnesota this season.

WILD LEADERS: Tarasenko leads Minnesota with 29 points (12-17=29) in 32 career games vs. Los Angeles...RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 20 points (6-14=20) in 32 career contests...Kaprizov (11-8=19 in 21 games) and D **Quinn Hughes** (3-16=19 in 20 games) own 19 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 3-4-0 with a 2.25 GAA and a .926 SV% in eight games (six starts)...Wallstedt is 1-0-1 with a 3.25 and .917 SV% in two starts vs. Los Angeles.

KINGS LEADERS: C **Anze Kopitar** leads Los Angeles with 61 points (17-44=61) in 70 career games vs. Minnesota...RW **Corey Perry** has 46 points (25-21=46) in 58 games...D **Drew Doughty** owns 39 points (7-32=39) in 58 contests...Kempe has 22 points (10-12=22) in 31 games.

KINGS GOALIES: Kuemper is 6-7-2 with a 2.84 GAA, a .901 SV% and one shutout in 16 starts against Minnesota...G **Anton Forsberg** is 2-4-0 with a 2.33 GAA and a .925 SV% in six starts.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** went 3-3-2 with a 3.14 GAA and a .891 SV% in 12 games (nine starts) with the Kings in 1997-98...D **Jake Middleton** was selected by the Kings in the seventh round (210th overall) of the 2014 NHL Draft...D **Brock Faber** was drafted by the Kings in the second round (45th overall) of the 2020 NHL Draft...Fiala played three seasons (2019-22) with Minnesota, appearing in 215 games and tallying 186 points (79-107=186)...Kuemper was selected by the Wild in the sixth round (161st overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft and went 41-34-14 with a 2.60 GAA, a .910 SV% and seven shutouts in 102 games (82 starts) in five seasons with Minnesota (2012-17)...D **Mikey Anderson** hails from Fridley and skated one season at Hill-Murray (2013-14) and two seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2017-19).

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 14-4-1 in the last 19 contests played against the Kings in Saint Paul since 3/28/15.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 26-10-8, ranks second in the NHL with 58 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 43 games in franchise history...Owns an active seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) and is 10-2-2 (.786) in its last 14 road games overall...Is 22-4-5 (.790) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in wins and points (49)...Since Nov. 1, leads NHL in team SV% (.929) and ranks second in team GAA (2.05) and goal differential (plus-39)...Has scored first in 27 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL...Leads the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the franchise's single-season record...Ranks second in the NHL with 694 blocked shots. **Matt Boldy:** Has scored a goal in seven of his last 11 games (9-4=13) and ranks T-1st in the NHL with nine goals since Dec. 14...For the season, ranks second in the NHL in goals (26), T-5th in SHG (two), T-8th in shots (142) and 9th in points (26-22=48)...Ranks first on Wild in goals, second in points and assists, and T-2nd in GWG (three).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns five points (2-3=5) in his last four games and 16 points (7-9=16) in his last 14 games...Finished with two assists (0-2=2) at ANA (1/2/26) for his ninth multi-point game this season...Leads the NHL in total faceoffs taken (907) and ranks fourth in faceoffs won (448).

Brock Faber: Currently at 99 career points (27-72=99)...Notched two points (1-1=2) at LAK (1/3) and tied his single-game career high with six blocked shots...Owns three goals in his last six games and ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen with nine goals this season...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL in blocked shots (98) and 14th in TOI/G (24.23).

Marcus Foligno: Has collected a point in a season-best three straight games (1-2=3).

Filip Gustavsson: With a 26-save win at ANA (1/2), extended his current point streak to eight games (7-0-1) since Dec. 8, leading the NHL with a 1.75 GAA and ranking T-1st in wins and T-4th in SV% (.930) in that span (min. 5 gp)...In 13 starts since Nov. 16, is 10-1-2 and ranks T-1st in the NHL with two shutouts, second with a 1.83 GAA, and T-2nd in wins and a .930 SV% (min. nine GP)...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

Quinn Hughes: Has tallied 11 assists since making his Wild debut on Dec. 14, second among NHL defensemen and T-3rd among all skaters during that span...Owns five assists in his last two games and 12 points (1-11=12) in 11 games with Minnesota...Finished with four assists (0-4=4) at ANA (1/2) to set the Wild's single-game franchise record for assists by a defenseman and tie Matt Dumba (1-3=4, 3/29/18 vs. DAL) for single-game franchise point record among defensemen...Notched fourth career four-assist game at ANA (1/2), one point shy of his single-game career point record (1-4=5, 11/2/23 at SJS)...Per NHL Stats, tied Phil Housley for the fourth-most four-assist games by an American defenseman in NHL history. Gary Suter (8), Chris Chelios (6) and Brian Leetch (6) are the only ones with more...Ranks third among NHL defensemen in assists (32) and T-5th in scoring (3-32=35) this season...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27.21 TOI/G and even strength TOI/G (22.45) and ranks fourth in power-play TOI/G (4.29) this season.

Marcus Johansson: Currently at 197 career goals...Ranks T-10th in the NHL with four GWG this season...Leads the team with a plus-21 rating (T-4th among NHL forwards) and ranks third in goals, T-3rd in points (12-20=32) and fourth in assists. **Kirill Kaprizov:** Has 15 points (6-9=15) in his last 11 games. Currently at 435 career points (209-226=435), two from tying Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for second in franchise history...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 24 goals and nine PPG, sixth with 149 shots, and eighth with 49 points (24-25=49)...Ranks first on Wild in points and assists and second in goals.

Nico Sturm: Scored a goal at ANA (1/2) to move his career point total to 99 points (49-50=99).

Yakov Trenin: Notched two points (1-1=2) at ANA (1/2) and owns three points (1-2=3) in his last four games...Leads the NHL with 209 hits, the highest total in franchise history through a season's first 43 games and the fourth-highest total in the NHL through 43 games since the 2006-07 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Is 11-2-4 on the season with a .928 SV% (first in NHL), four shutouts (first in NHL), and 2.30 GAA (third in NHL)...Is 5-1-3 with a 2.20 GAA, .925 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.

Danila Yurov: Has tallied three points (2-1=3) in his last two games and owns points in consecutive games for the third time this season...Scored two goals (2-0=2) at ANA (1/2), his first career multi-goal game and third multi-point game of the season.

Mats Zuccarello: Owns an active three-game point streak (1-2=3) and has five points (2-3=5) in his last five games...Has recorded a point in 14 of the 23 games he's played in this season (4-15=19).

WORLD JUNIORS AT GRAND CASINO ARENA

The **2026 IIHF World Junior Championship** is taking place from Dec. 26 - Jan. 5 at Grand Casino Arena and 3M Arena at Mariucci. Two Wild prospects are named to tournament rosters: forward **Adam Benak** is representing Czechia, while defenseman **Aron Kivihiarju** is representing Finland.

During the tournament, the Wild will embark on a seven-game road trip throughout the Western conference, departing the morning of Dec. 27 and returning Jan. 9. The trip marks the third occurrence of seven consecutive road games in franchise history, and the first instance where the team does not return home to Minnesota at any point during a seven-game trip.

He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Matt Boldy** and defenseman **Brock Faber** were named to the United States roster on Jan. 2, joining defenseman **Quinn Hughes**, who was selected to the United States' preliminary roster in June.

Defenseman **Jonas Brodin**, forward **Joel Eriksson Ek**, and goaltenders **Filip Gustavsson** and **Jesper Wallstedt** were named to Sweden's roster on Jan. 2.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster in June.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with a plus-11 goal differential in the opening frame and by allowing 0.65 first-period goals per game this season.
- Ranks T-1st the NHL by allowing 0.77 second-period goals per game this season and ranks T-3rd with a plus-10 goal differential in the middle frame this season.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL by allowing 0.74 goals per game in the third period and third with a plus-14 goal differential in the final frame.
- Ranks T-6th in NHL with seven extra-time victories (four OTW, three SOW).

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 27 games this season, T-2nd in the NHL.
- Owns a 19-3-5 record (.796) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 675-179-111 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 26-10-8, ranks second in the NHL with 58 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 43 games in franchise history.
- Owns an active seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) and is 10-2-2 (.786) in its last 14 road games overall.
- Is 22-4-5 (.790) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in wins and points (49).
- Since Nov. 1, leads NHL in team SV% (.929) and ranks second in team GAA (2.05) and goal differential (plus-39).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 16 game streak).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 10-3-2 (.733) in December, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in points (22) and T-4th in wins.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov** has 15 points (6-9=15) in his last 11 games. Currently at 435 career points (209-226=435), two from tying Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for second in franchise history.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 24 goals and nine PPG, sixth with 149 shots, and eighth with 49 points (24-25=49).
- Ranks first on Wild in points and assists and second in goals.
- Tallied an assist at VGK (12/29), reaching 225 career assists and passing Mikael Granlund (224) for sixth in franchise history.
- Notched three points (1-2=3) at WPG (12/27), recording his 44th career multi-assist game and tying teammates Jared Spurgeon and Mats Zuccarello for the third most in Wild history.
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Posted three points (1-2=3) at CBJ (12/18) to reach 427 career points (207-220=427) and move past Spurgeon (119-305=424) for third in Wild history.
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history.
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 - 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

- **Quinn Hughes** has tallied 11 assists since making his Wild debut on Dec. 14, second among NHL defensemen and T-3rd among all skaters during that span.

- **Marcus Johansson** tied his single-game career high with four points (1-3=4) at VGK (12/29) while posting a career-high plus-4 rating.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** is 11-2-4 on the season with a .928 SV% (first in NHL), four shutouts (first in NHL), and 2.30 GAA (third in NHL).
- Is 5-1-3 with a 2.20 GAA, .925 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21).
- He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
