- Saturday's victory over Philadelphia extended the Stars' win streak to a season-best five games. The team has now earned a point in 12 of the last 13 games that they have played.
 - Dallas has won the last nine home games it has played against the Flyers, dating back to April 2, 2019.
- The Stars' 14 unanswered goals dating to Nov. 11 was the longest streak in franchise history, besting the previous mark set by the Minnesota North Stars (13 from Dec. 19-27, 1979) according to NHL Stats.
- Jason Robertson registered a hat trick on Saturday and passed Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Lian Bichsel scored his first goal of the season, making him the 20th Stars skater to score a goal this year.
- Tyler Seguin had a goal and an assist on Saturday to give him 35 points (13-22—35) in 30 career games against Philadelphia.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Islanders this season. The two teams will face each other again on March 26 in New York.
- Lian Bichsel scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' last game on Nov. 15, making him the 20th Stars skaters to score a goal for Dallas this season. Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have 20 unique goal scorers this season.

- Esa Lindell is set to play in his 704th career game tonight, which will tie Stephane Robidas for the 15th-most games played in franchise history.
- The defensive pair of Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell (61.2 percent) ranked second in the NHL in expected goal share among defensive pairs to play at least 100 minutes together entering play Monday according to MoneyPuck.com. The pair's 1.84 expected goals against per 60 this season ranked third in the NHL among defensive pairs to have played at least 100 minutes together.
- All five Dallas skaters that have taken at least 100 faceoffs this season have a win rate above 50 percent: Tyler Seguin (56.9), Radek Faksa (56.3), Roope Hintz (56.1) and Wyatt Johnston (50.9).
- Sam Steel enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career assists.

LONELY ISLAND

- Dallas is 48-55-21 all-time vs. New York, including a 26-25-10 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned points in nine or their last 10 games against the Islanders (6-1-3), including recording points in their last seven consecutive games (5-0-2). Since the 2017-18 season, Dallas has held a .750 point percentage against New York, which ranks third among all NHL teams during that span.
- Tyler Seguin registered two goals in his last outing against the Islanders on Oct. 12, 2024. In all, Seguin has totaled 26 points (10-16—26) in 27 career games played vs. New York, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
- Jason Robertson scored a hat trick in his last outing against the Islanders on Feb. 23, 2025. In all, Robertson has six points (6-0— 6) in eight career games vs. New York.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak against the Islanders, earning three points (0-3—3) during that span.
- Sam Steel enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Islanders, collecting two points (1-1-2) during that span. In all, Steel has totaled five points (2-3—5) in nine career games played vs. New York, carrying a plus-minus rating of +3.
- Esa Lindell has tallied four points (3-1—4) in 15 career games vs. New York and upholds a plus-minus rating of +10.
- Jake Oettinger has posted a 5-1-0 record against the Islanders, posting a 1.82 goals-against average and a .936 save percentage in six career games.
 - o He enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game win streak against New York.

SEEING STARS

- Jason Robertson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- Robertson recorded three points in each of the last three games that he has played, marking the first time in his career that he has had three consecutive three-point games. If he were to do so again tonight, it would make him the first player in franchise history to notch four straight three-point games – as well as the first player from any team to achieve the feat since Nikita Kucherov from April 3 to 9, 2024 (1-11—12 in four games played).
- If Robertson were to score tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the first time since. Nov. 19 to 25, 2022. He enters tonight's game one goal shy of surpassing Tim Young (178) for the 15th-most goals by a forward in franchise history.
- Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' last game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.
- His performance against the Flyers was his 30th career multi-goal game, which tied former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored two goals in 1:39 of game time in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 at Montreal, a 7-0 win over the Canadiens, also notching an assist in that game to finish the night with three points.
- He scored a goal and had two assists including on **Roope Hintz's** overtime winner on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators.
- During this current three-game streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 7-2 during 5-on-5 play when Robertson has been on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
- In all this season, Robertson has totaled 23 points (9-14-23) in 19 games this season, ranking second on the Stars in scoring and tying for 14th in the NHL in points entering play Monday. His 23 points were tied with Dylan Larkin for the second-most among all American skaters this season entering play Monday, one shy of League leader Jack Eichel (8-16—24).
- Entering play Monday, only Nathan MacKinnon (85) had taken more shots on goal than Robertson (82) this season.
- Entering play Monday, Robertson was tied for fourth in the NHL this season with 11.3 expected goals according to MoneyPuck.com.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of their last five games played. Entering play Monday, their five-game win streak was the second-longest active winning streak in the NHL (Colorado; 6).
- A Dallas victory tonight would give the Stars their first six-game winning streak since they won seven straight from March 22 to April 3, 2025. It would also make them the sixth team this season to have a winning streak that was at least six games long, joining New Jersey (8), Utah (7), Boston (7), Anaheim (7) and Colorado (6).

- If Dallas were to score at least five goals again tonight, it would give them three straight five-goal games for the first time since Nov 1 to 5, 2022. They defeated the Flyers 5-1 and the Canadiens 7-0 in their last two games.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in 12 of their last 13 games played, including each of their last eight. If they were to do so again tonight, it would give them power-play goals in nine consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in 10 straight games from March 11 to 31, 2006.
- Dallas has not allowed a power-play goal against in four consecutive games, going a perfect 9-for-9 on the penalty kill during that span. If they were to remain perfect on the penalty kill again tonight, it would mark the first time since Dec. 18 to 27, 2024 (eight games) that the team has gone at least five games without allowing a power-play goal against.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's game riding a six-game point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in seven consecutive games for the first time since he had an eight-game point streak from Feb. 25 to March 11, 2023.
- If Jason Robertson were to score tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the first time since. Nov. 19 to 25, 2022. A point of any kind would extend his point streak to five games for the first time this season.
- If Tyler Seguin were to score in tonight's game, it would extend his goal streak to three games for the first time since Jan. 6 to 10,
- A goal or an assist tonight would extend Ilya Lyubushkin's point streak to three games, matching his career high that he set Dec. 31, 2022 to Jan. 3, 2023.
- If Alexander Petrovic were to record a point, it would give him points in three consecutive games for the second time in his career after previously doing so from March 24 to 29, 2016.
- If either of Lian Bichsel or Justin Hryckowian were to tally a point tonight, it would give them points in three consecutive games for the first time in their careers.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

- The Stars have posted a 6-1-1 record in eight games played this November, tying for the League lead in wins and points (13) this month entering play Monday.
- Dallas' 33 goals scored were tied with Colorado for the most this month entering play Monday and their 4.13 goals per game ranked second
 - The team's 20 5-on-5 goals for in November ranked third in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Mikko Rantanen (5-9—14) and Jason Robertson (6-8—14) were tied for third in the League in scoring since Nov. 1 entering play
- Miro Heiskaken (1-11—12) led all defensemen and tied for fifth in the NHL in points since Nov. 1 entering play Monday. His 11 assists were the most of any NHL skater this month entering play Monday.
- With 11 points (5-6—11), Wyatt Johnston was tied for seventh in the NHL in scoring this month. His five power-play goals and eight power-play points both topped the League this month entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team to have four players ranked in the top 10 in scoring this month.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 22-for-66 on the power play this season for a 33.3 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas' 22 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL entering play Monday.
 - The Stars didn't score their 22nd power-play goal of the season until their 42nd game played during the 2024-25 campaign, on Jan. 12, 2025 against the Ottawa Senators.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 15-for-35 on the power play for a 42.9 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Monday. Their 15 home power-play goals ranked second to only Minnesota (16) for the most in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in 12 of their last 13 games played, including each of their last eight. If they were to do so again tonight, it would give them power-play goals in nine consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in 10 straight games from March 11 to 31, 2006.
 - The current franchise record for consecutive games scoring a power-play goal is 18, set from Oct. 28 to Dec. 10, 2005
- A power-play goal tonight would also make the Stars the first NHL team to have a nine-game power-play goal streak since the Florida Panthers had a 10-game power-play goal streak from Jan. 22 to Feb. 17, 2024.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game six different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida and on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim. Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in six games.
 - In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their sixth multi power-play goal game in their 45th game of the season.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 22 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (8), Mikko Rantanen (4), Jason Robertson (4), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
 - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Rantanen was leading the NHL in power-play points this season with 15 (4-11—15) entering play Monday.
- Johnston led all NHL skaters with eight power-play goals and ranked second with 13 power-play points (8-5—13) entering play Monday.

- His eight power-play goals are just three shy of tying his career high of 11 that he set last season.
- Rantanen and Johnston are on pace to finish the season with 65 and 56 power-play points, respectively, both of which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history.
 - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- Robertson's 11 power-play points (4-7—11) were tied for the fifth-most in the League this season entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen has totaled seven points (1-6—7) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.

MIRO THE HERO

- Miro Heiskanen has 17 points (3-14—17) in 19 games played this season, ranking fourth on the Stars in scoring and tying for third among all NHL defensemen in points entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen is averaging 25:18 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-highest total in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
 - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
 - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone.
 - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
 - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- Heiskanen's assist against the Canadiens was the 238th of his career, surpassing Reijo Ruotsalainen for the eighth-most assists by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history.
- Heiskanen recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied Roope Hintz (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied Hintz for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. Hintz first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
 - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
 - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- Heiskanen tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple six-point games.
 - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
 - Heiskanen last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- Heiskanen scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- Heiskanen's six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- Roope Hintz has tallied eight points (3-5—8) in six games since returning to the Stars lineup after missing five games with an injury.
- Hintz enters tonight's game riding a six-game point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in seven consecutive games for the first time since he had an eight-game point streak from Feb. 25 to March 11, 2023.
- Entering play Monday, Hintz's six-game point streak was the sixth-longest in the NHL.
- Dallas' last game a 5-1 win over the Flyers marked the ninth time in Hintz's career that he has had at least three assists in a game and first time doing so since he also had three assists on March 26, 2025 against the Edmonton Oilers.
- Hintz scored the overtime winner in Dallas' Nov. 11 game, a 3-2 win over the Ottawa Senators. It was his sixth career overtime goal, tying Loui Eriksson and John Klingberg for the fourth-most in franchise history.

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- Alexander Petrovic notched an assist in Dallas' last game on Nov. 15 against Philadelphia and now has five points (1-4—5) in 17 games played this season, ranking fourth among Stars defensemen in scoring.
- Petrovic scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 against the Montreal Canadiens, a 7-0 Stars win. It marked his first regular-season NHL goal since April 2, 2018.
- Petrovic finished the game with a plus-5 plus/minus rating. It marked the highest plus/minus rating in a single game in his career and the best mark by a Stars defenseman since Ryan Suter (plus-5) on March 9, 2023 at Buffalo.
- If he were to record a point tonight, it would give him points in three consecutive games for the second time in his career after previously doing so from March 24 to 29, 2016.

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 8-1 during 5-on-5 play when **Petrovic** is on the ice. His eight on-ice goals for are tied with Jason Robertson for the team lead during that span and his plus-7 goal differential is tied with Lian Bichsel (7-0) for the best mark on the Stars roster.
- Petrovic's and Bichel's plus-7 even-strength on-ice goal differential since Nov. 8 were tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 21 points (11-10—21) in 19 games played of the season and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team in scoring. His 11 goals and 21 points were tied for 11th and 22nd, respectively, in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Johnston was tied for sixth in goals and ninth in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- Johnston was one of five skaters under the age of 23 to have at least 20 points this year entering play Monday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 10-17—27), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 10-16—26), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 11-15—26) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 12-9—21).
- Johnston's scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North
- Johnston, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- Johnston recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since Tyler Seguin had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
 - Both of Johnston's goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
 - Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.
- Johnston enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists. He is also set to become the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the club.
- Johnston needs two more points to reach the 200-point milestone. Similarly, he will become the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the team.

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- Mikko Rantanen has tallied 26 points (9-17—26) in 19 games played this season and enters tonight's game leading the team in scoring. He has recorded a point in all but three games this season.
- Rantanen's 26 points were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL and his 17 assists were tied for sixth entering play Monday.
- Fifteen (4-11—15) of Rantanen's 26 points this season have come on the power play, which was the most in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - Rantanen is currently on pace to finish the season with 65 power-play points which would set a franchise record and surpass his career high of 40 (14-26—40) that he had in 2023-24 while playing for the Colorado Avalanche.
 - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31-44).
- Rantanen has drawn 11 penalties this season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Monday. His 11 penalties drawn account for 15.5 percent (11 of 71) of the penalties the Stars have drawn this season.
- Rantanen had two points (1-1-2) in Dallas' game on Nov. 11 against Ottawa. His goal marked his 40th point as a member of the Stars in his 37th game played with the team. He tied Russ Courtnall as the second-fastest player in franchise history to reach the mark, behind only Mike Gartner (35 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, Rantanen became the 14th player in franchise history and sixth skater in Stars team history to have at least 20 points through the team's first 14 games of a season. Jason Robertson was the last player to do so, notching 21 points (9-12-21) through the team's first 14 games played in 2022-23.
- His performance against the Ducks was Rantanen's 195th career multi-point game, tying Saku Koivu for the fourth most in NHL history by a Finnish player behind Jari Kurri (385 GP), Teemu Selanne (382 GP) and Aleksander Barkov (209 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Rantanen scored his 300th and 301st career goals on Nov. 4 against the Oilers, making him the fourth Finnish skater in NHL history, the second player drafted in 2015 and the 39th active NHL skater to score 300 career goals.
 - o Rantanen is also the third-fastest Finn to score 300 NHL goals, doing so in his 665th career game.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars erased a two-goal deficit in their game on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators, eventually winning the game 3-2 in overtime. It marked the first time the Stars won a game in Ottawa since March 6, 2016.
- Dallas' performance against the Senators marked the fourth time this season that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, the most in the NHL entering play Monday.

- Overall, the Stars have seven comeback wins this year, which was tied with the Flyers for the second-most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Additionally, Dallas has won five games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

BISH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Lian Bichsel has totaled a team-high 66 hits this season, which tied for ninth in the NHL and ranked second among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday. He is currently on pace to finish the season with 285 hits, which would be the most hits in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
 - Steve Ott, with 278 in 2011-12, currently holds the single-season franchise record.
- Bichsel has recorded eight hits in a game three times this season, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, Oct. 28 vs. Washington and Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia. Entering play Monday, Bichsel was the only skater in the NHL this season to have three eight-hit games.
- If he were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the eighth player in franchise history to have recorded three eight-hit games and the fourth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistric (5; 2011-12), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07) and Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12).

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: Jason Robertson (311) and Wyatt Johnston (265).
- Robertson's 311-game Iron Man streak was tied for the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Johnston has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 27 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 265 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Monday, it was the 13th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Johnston was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy Al Montoya was a member of the Islanders during the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons.

- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Islanders forward Bo Horvat played in Vancouver together from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Islanders forward Jean-Gabriel Pageau played for the Ottawa Senators from 2017-18 to 2018-19.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Mikko Rantanen and Islanders goaltender Semyon Varlamov were all teammates on the Colorado Avalanche. Duchene skated with Varlamov from 2011-12 to 2017-18 and Rantanen from 2015-16 to 2018-19.
- Stars forward Adam Erne and Islanders forward Jonathan Drouin were teammates in Tampa Bay during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen and Islanders forward Jonathan Drouin skated together in Colorado during 2023-24 and part of the 2024-25 season.
- Stars forward Oskar Bäck and defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Islanders defenseman Adam Boqvist all represented Team Sweden during the 2019 IIHF World Juniors Championship and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
 - Bäck and Boqvist also skated on Team Sweden together during the 2017 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Islanders defenseman Tony DeAngelo both played for the New York Rangers during the 2020-21
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Islanders goaltender David Rittich were teammates in Nashville during the 2021-22 season.

- Stars assistant coach Alain Nasreddine was a part of New Jersey's coaching staff in the same role for six of the seasons that Islanders forward Kyle Palmieri played for the Devils (2015-16 to 2021-22).
- Stars forward Matt Duchene played under Islanders head coach Patrick Roy in Colorado from 2014-15 to 2015-16.
- Stars forward Radek Faksa and Islanders goaltender David Rittich represented Team Czechia during the 2018 IIHF World
- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Reese and Islanders assistant coach John MacLean were teammates for one season (1996-97) in New Jersey.
- Stars head coach Glen Gulutzan coached Islanders defenseman Ethan Bear in Edmonton from 2019-20 to 2020-21 as an assistant coach.
- Stars head coach Glen Gulutzan and Islanders goaltender David Rittich were together in Calgary while Gulutzan was head coach in 2016-17 and 2017-18.
