

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****January 25, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. ANAHEIM DUCKS [4] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames earned a point Sunday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome in a 4–3 overtime setback to the Anaheim Ducks. Calgary jumped out to a 2–0 advantage in the opening period, first Jonathan Huberdeau registered his 9th of the campaign before Hunter Brzustewicz scored his first NHL goal. Anaheim would equalize things in the middle frame, but Calgary regained the lead early in the third when Matt Coronato converted on a Flames powerplay. Anaheim would respond again later in the stanza to force overtime. In the extra frame, the Ducks scored 2:54 in. Matt Coronato finished with a goal and an assist, Mikael Backlund, Adam Klapka, Joel Farabee, Nazem Kadri and Matvei Gridin all chipped in helpers, while Calgary outshot Anaheim 35–21 on the night.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Wild. Calgary and Minnesota have split their season-series so far in 2025-26, with the home team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-6-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 11-17-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING WITH MINNESOTA:

The Calgary Flames opened up a four-game homestand on December 4 with a 4–1 win over the Minnesota Wild, riding a 26-save performance from Dustin Wolf and a multi-point outing from Matt Coronato. After a scoreless first period, Jonathan Huberdeau broke the ice at the 4:21 of the second, before Yakov Trenin tied it late in the frame. Calgary took over in the third as Matt Coronato restored the home side's lead 3:33 in, Connor Zary added insurance just 2:45 later, and Calgary tacked on an empty netter to seal things. Blake Coleman, Mikael Backlund, Morgan Frost and Joel Hanley all picked up helpers on the night. The Flames penalty kill was lights on the night, forcing Minnesota to go 0-for-5 on the power play.

GRAB THAT PUCK:

On Sunday night against Anaheim, Hunter Brzustewicz scored his first NHL goal. Brzustewicz was drafted by the Canucks 75th overall in the 2023 NHL Draft and was acquired by Calgary on January 31, 2024. He played 23 games with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers this season and continues to have the highest points-per-game average by a defenseman (min. 5 GP) on the club after producing 4-8—12 (23 GP). Brzustewicz recorded his first NHL point on January 7 with an assist against Montreal.

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

The Calgary Flames enter tonight's contest having not surrendered a powerplay goal in six-consecutive contests and have been perfect on the kill in 11 of their last 12 games, allowing just one powerplay goal over that span. Since December 29, the Flames have successfully killed 31 of 32 shorthanded situations, boasting a league-leading 96.9% on the PK. The Flames are also the only club in the league to have an even shorthanded goal differential during that stretch thanks to a shorthanded marker by Mikael Backlund on January 15 in Chicago.

TIGHT CONTESTS:

Through the last 10 meetings between Calgary and Minnesota, seven have been decided by two goals or fewer, with four one-goal games and three contests requiring extra time. Since March 4, 2023, the Flames hold a 6-3-1 record against the Wild, with Calgary holding a one goal advantage over Minnesota, outscoring them 25-24 during that span.

HISTORY AGAINST THE WILD:

With their 4-1 win over Minnesota on December 4, the Flames (60-32-17 in 109 GP) improved their all-time points percentage against the Wild to .628, their fourth-best percentage against any active franchise:

The win also stood as the 60th against the Wild in franchise history, helping the Flames record 60+ wins against 14-different NHL franchises.

A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE:

Flames assistant coach Dave Lowry scored the final goal of his 1,084-game NHL career as a member of the Calgary Flames against the Minnesota Wild on Dec. 29, 2003. That season, Lowry's teammates in Calgary included current Flames general manager Craig Conroy, special advisor to the GM Jarome Iginla and Martin Gelinas, who now serves as part of the club's player development staff.



EAT IT:

MacKenzie Weegar registered a game-high five blocked shots for the second-consecutive game on Sunday night against Anaheim, giving him 623 blocks since joining the Calgary Flames prior to the 2022-23 season — the sixth-most among all NHL skaters over that span. So far in 2025–26, Weegar leads the Flames with 114 blocked shots, eclipsing the 100-block mark for the fifth-consecutive campaign, and sixth time in his career.

NATIONAL PRIDE:

On June 16, 2025, Martin Pospisil was named as one of the six players to Team Slovakia's preliminary roster for the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026. Pospisil represented Slovakia at the 2024 IIHF World Championships, where he scored three goals and added four assists for seven points in seven games before his participation was cut short due to injury. In August of 2024, Pospisil again represented his nation at the 2024 Men's Final Olympic Ice Hockey Qualification Group D, posting three assists in three games to help lift Slovakia over Austria, Hungary, and Kazakhstan to punch their ticket to the Olympics for the ninth-consecutive time. Team Slovakia is in Group B and will open their tournament on February 12 against Team Finland. Following that, they will face the hosts, Team Italy, on February 14, before closing out the group stage against Team Sweden on February 14.
