- With Tuesday's win, the Stars extended their point streak to 11 games (9-0-2), posting only one longer point streak in the past 20 years (12 GP in 2019-20), according to NHL Stats.
- Eight different Stars skaters recorded points on Tuesday. **Mikko Rantanen** and **Wyatt Johnston** both had multi-point outings.
- Casey DeSmith** (7-0-3) extended his point streak to 10 games and became the third goaltender in Stars team history with a run of that length, following Ed Belfour (11 GP in 1998-99) and Scott Wedgewood (10 GP in 2023-24), according to NHL Stats.
- Mikko Rantanen** registered three points (0-3—3) in Tuesday's matchup and now has six points (1-5—6) in his last two games played against the Jets. He now has 34 points (11-23—34) in 33 career games played vs. Winnipeg.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of four games that the Stars will play against the Wild this season. The two teams will face each other again on March 21 in Minnesota and April 9 in Dallas.
- The Stars are tied for first in the NHL in wins (21) and rank second in both points (47) and points percentage (.758) this year. The team's success this season comes despite having 123 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Lian Bichsel, Matt Duchene, Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Rooth Hintz, Nils Lundkvist, Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this season.
- Kyle Capobianco** scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Dec. 2 against the New York Rangers, making him the 23rd Stars skaters to score a goal for the Stars this year. Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have at least 23 unique goal scorers this season.

- **Mikko Rantanen** (113) and **Jason Robertson** (103) are both pacing to finish the season with more than 100 points. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the second set of Stars teammates to have concurrent 100-point seasons, joining **Bobby Smith** (114) and **Dino Ciccarelli** (106) who did so during the 1981-82 season for the Minnesota North Stars.
- **Sam Steel** enters tonight's game one assist shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career assists.
- **Alexander Petrovic**'s next goal will be his third of the season, which will set a career high for the defenseman.

WILD THINGS

- Dallas is 55-28-12 all-time vs. Minnesota, including a 21-20-5 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in their last 15 consecutive games against the Wild, upholding a 10-0-5 record dating back to December 20, 2021. Their 25 points during that span are the most by any team in the NHL.
 - Dallas' 55 all-time wins against Minnesota rank third among all NHL teams, behind Colorado (65) and Calgary (60).
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Wild, earning three points (2-1-3) during that span. In all, **Duchene** has totaled 41 points (14-27-41) in 60 career games played vs. Minnesota, including registering 10 multi-point outings against them.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded 50 points (20-30-50) in 59 career games played against the Wild, carrying a plus-minus rating of +13. His 50 points vs. Minnesota rank second among active Stars skaters and sixth among active NHL skaters.
- **Mikko Rantanen** enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak against the Wild, collecting three points (0-3-3) during that span. In all, **Rantanen** has recorded 42 points (16-26-42) in 40 career games vs. Minnesota, averaging 1.05 points per game and carrying a plus-minus rating of +18.
 - His 42 points against the Wild rank third among Stars skaters and 10th in the league.
 - Of his 40 career games played against Minnesota, 10 have been multi-point outings.
- **Jason Robertson** has 19 points (11-8-19) in 16 career games against the Wild, averaging 1.19 points per game.
 - **Robertson's** 18 points against Minnesota since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied for the eighth-most in the NHL.
 - He enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against the Wild (1-1-2).
- **Roopé Hintz** has 24 points (10-14-24) in 24 career games against the Wild, upholding a plus-minus rating of +14. Twenty-one of those points (8-13-21) have come in 16 games since the start of the 2021-22 season, which is tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has registered 15 points (1-14-15) in 19 career games against Minnesota, having five points (0-5-5) in his last five games, dating back to Feb. 17, 2023.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has tallied 12 points (6-6-12) in 12 career games vs. Minnesota, carrying a plus-minus rating of +4 and registering three game-winning goals.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. the Wild, earning three points (1-2-3) during that span. In 34 career games played vs. Minnesota, **Lindell** has totaled 15 points (2-13-15) while carrying a plus-minus rating of +14.
- **Jake Oettinger** – a native of Lakeville, Minnesota – has an 8-0-3 career record against the Wild, posting a .926 save percentage, 2.19 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- **Casey DeSmith** has a 5-1-1 career record in seven career games vs. Minnesota, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.

SEEING STARS

- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.
- **Oettinger** has won the last six games that he has played dating back to Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks. If he were to win the next game he plays...
 - It would extend his win streak to seven games for the first time since he set a career high with eight straight wins from March 20 to April 9, 2024.
 - It would tie for the third-longest win streak by a Stars goalie in franchise history.
 - It would make him the third netminder this season to have a win streak of at least seven games.
- His current six-game win streak was the second-longest active streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday and is also tied for the seventh-longest win streak by a Stars netminder in franchise history.
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 14 games this season, which led the NHL entering play Wednesday. His 14 wins are tied for the most by a Stars/North Stars goaltender through his first 20 games played in a season according to NHL Stats.
- **Oettinger** made 30 saves on Dec. 3 to backstop the Stars to a 3-0 shutout win over the New Jersey Devils. He saved 2.5 goals above expected in the win according to MoneyPuck.com.
- **Oettinger's** performance against the Devils was the 14th shutout of his career, which tied Ben Bishop for the fifth-most in franchise history. He also tied Brent Johnson for the 24th-most by an American-born goaltender in NHL history.
- His victory over the Devils was also the 161st win of **Oettinger's** career, which gave him sole possession of third place on the franchise's all-time wins list, surpassing Ed Belfour (160).

ROAD WARRIORS

- Tonight's matchup against the Wild marks the fourth of seven road games the Stars will play this month and is also the final game of a two-game road trip that also saw Dallas take on Winnipeg Tuesday night.
- The Stars enter tonight's game riding a franchise-record 13-game road point streak, going 9-0-4 in those games.
- In all, the Stars have an 11-1-4 record in 16 road games this season. Their 26 points and .813 points percentage when playing on the road were the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday and their 11 wins were the second-most in the League.
 - Dallas is the only team this season to lose only one road game in regulation.
- The Stars were leading the NHL in road goals per game (3.63) and goals scored on the road (58, tied) entering play Wednesday. The team's 2.44 goals against per road game were tied for the seventh-best mark in the League entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas has gone 49-for-56 on the penalty kill while playing on the road this season for an 87.5 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Jason Robertson** is the Stars' leading scorer on the road this season, totaling 20 points (10-10—20) in 16 games played, tying for eighth in road scoring in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Mikko Rantanen** (1.27), **Robertson** (1.25) and **Nils Lundkvist** (1.00) are all playing at a point-per-game pace on the road this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has four points (2-2—4) in his last four games played on the road.
- **Jake Oettinger** has a 7-1-1 record with a .911 save percentage and a 2.51 goals-against average in nine games played on the road this season. His seven road wins were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Oettinger** has won the last five games he has played on the road dating back to Nov. 8, 2025.
- **Casey DeSmith** has a 4-0-3 record on the road this season, posting a .929 save percentage, 2.10 goals-against average and one shutout in those games. Entering play Wednesday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in road goals-against average (seventh) and save percentage (fifth) among netminders to play in at least five road games this year.
 - **DeSmith** and Seattle's Philipp Grubauer are the only goaltenders in the NHL this season to play in more than four road games without recording any regulation losses.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game riding a season-long 11-game point streak dating back to Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks, posting a 9-0-2 record in those contests.
 - The team has earned at least a point in 23 of their last 25 games played.
- The team's current 11-game point streak is tied for the seventh-longest in franchise history.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give them points in 12 consecutive games for the first time since Oct. 29 to Nov. 25, 2019, posting an 11-0-1 record during that span.
- If the team were to extend its point streak tonight, it would also make their current run tied for the fourth-longest point streak in franchise history.
- A win or overtime loss today would also give the Stars their sixth point streak of at least 12 games since the team relocated from Minnesota to Dallas.
- Dallas' 11-game point streak is the longest active streak in the NHL and is the third-longest overall this season, trailing only Colorado's 17-game point streak from Oct. 26 to Dec. 2 and Minnesota's 12-game point streak from Nov. 7 to Dec. 2.
- The Stars extended their road point streak to 13 games with their 4-3 win over Winnipeg Jets on Dec. 9, extending their franchise record for consecutive road games played with a point.
 - The previous franchise record was 11, which the team set from Dec. 27, 2002 to Feb. 27, 2003 (7-0-3-1).
- A victory tonight would give Dallas wins in five consecutive games for the first time this season. The team's current four-game win streak was tied for the second longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- The Stars have allowed three goals or fewer in 16 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 9, their fourth such streak of at least 16 games in franchise history according to NHL Stats, alongside 1999-2000 (18 GP), 1997-98 (18 GP) and 2018-19 (17 GP).
- **Mikko Rantanen** enters tonight's game having recorded a point in each of the last seven games that he has played in. A goal or an assist tonight would extend his point streak to eight games for the first time since he had a 14-game point streak from Dec. 7, 2024 to Jan. 6, 2025 (9-14—23).
 - His seven-game point streak was tied for the second-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - He has totaled 14 points (3-11—14) during this current stretch.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have not allowed a power-play goal against in their last nine games played dating back to Nov. 25 against the Edmonton Oilers, going a perfect 29-for-29 while shorthanded during that span.
 - Dallas went a perfect 4-for-4 on the penalty kill in their last game on Dec. 9 against the Winnipeg Jets, marking the fourth time during this current streak that the Stars have been shorthanded at least four times in a game without allowing a power-play goal against.
- Dallas is the only team in the NHL to be perfect on the penalty kill since Nov. 25.
- If they were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would give them 10 consecutive games without allowing a power-play goal against for the first time since they went 11 straight games without surrendering a power-play goal from Dec. 10 to 31, 2003. They went 39-for-39 on the penalty kill during that stretch.
- Since Nov. 7, the Stars had the best penalty kill in the League entering play Wednesday, going 51-for-55 while shorthanded during that span for a 92.7 percent success rate.

- From the beginning of the regular season to Nov. 6, the Stars ranked 27th on the penalty kill, going 31-for-44 while shorthanded (70.5 percent).
- In all this season, the penalty killing unit of **Esa Lindell, Miro Heiskanen, Colin Blackwell** and **Sam Steel** have played 21:21 together while shorthanded. During that time, the unit has only allowed one power-play goal against according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Entering play Wednesday, **Lindell** was leading the NHL in total shorthanded ice time (133:06) and shorthanded ice time per game (4:18) this season.
 - **Lindell** has nearly 17 more minutes of shorthanded ice time than the second-ranked player (Mike Matheson, 116:16).

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Mikko Rantanen** has totaled 42 points (13-29—42) in 30 games played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in scoring. His 42 points were the fourth-most in the League and his 29 assists topped the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Rantanen** is currently pacing to finish the year with 78 assists and 113 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward. If he were to maintain that pace, **Rantanen** would become the third Finnish skater in NHL history to record three 100-point seasons after also doing so in 2022-23 (55-50—105) and 2023-24 (42-62—104). He would join Jari Kurri (6) and Teemu Selanne (4).
 - 113 points would tie Kurri in 1984-84 for the fourth-most in a single season by a Finnish player in NHL history.
- If **Rantanen** were to finish the year with 113 points, it would make his 2025-26 campaign the second-highest scoring season by a Stars skater in franchise history, one point shy of the franchise record 114 points (43-71—114) Bobby Smith had 1981-82. Seventy-eight assists would set a single-season franchise record.
- Twenty-one (4-17—21) of **Rantanen's** 42 points this season have come on the power play, which were the most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- He is currently on pace to have 57 power-play points this year, which would be a career high and set the franchise record for most power-play points in a season, surpassing Bobby Smith (13-31—44) in 1980-81.
- **Mikko Rantanen** enters tonight's game having recorded a point in each of the last seven games that he has played in. A goal or an assist tonight would extend his point streak to eight games for the first time since he had a 14-game point streak from Dec. 7, 2024 to Jan. 6, 2025 (9-14—23).
 - His seven-game point streak was tied for the second-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - He has totaled 14 points (3-11—14) during this current stretch.
- **Rantanen** tallied three assists on Dec. 9 against the Winnipeg Jets – his 50th regular-season game with the Stars. His third assist of the night was his 60th point with the Stars (18-42—60), setting a franchise record for most points by a skater through his first 50 regular-season games with the team according to NHL Stats.
- **Rantanen** scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Pittsburgh on Dec. 7. It marked the sixth game-deciding goal of his career, which tied him with Teemu Selane for the sixth-most in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- **Rantanen** had three points (1-2—3) the previous game on Dec. 5 against the Sharks, a 4-1 Dallas win. His performance against San Jose marked the 200th multi-point performance of his career, making him the fourth Finnish player and seventh-fastest European skater to record 200 multi-point games according to NHL Stats.

JUST IN CASE

- **Casey DeSmith** has earned at least a point in the last 10 games that he has started dating back to Oct. 26, posting a 7-0-3 record with a .930 save percentage, 1.96 goals-against average and one shutout during that span.
 - **DeSmith** has not allowed more than three goals in any game during that span.
- **DeSmith's** current run is the first time in his career that he has earned 10 consecutive decisions without losing a game in regulation. His 10-game point streak is tied for the fifth-longest streak in franchise history and the second-longest streak in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
- If **DeSmith** were to earn at least a point in the next decision he earns, he would become the fifth netminder in franchise history and the second in team history to have a point streak of at least 11 games. An 11-game point streak would also tie the Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Ed Belfour set from Dec. 6, 1998 to Jan. 6, 1999, posting an 8-0-3 record during that span.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has a 7-1-4 record with .920 save percentage, a 2.23 goals-against average and one shutout.
 - **DeSmith** was one of five netminders this season to play in at least 10 games while only recording one regulation loss entering play Wednesday.
- Among goalies to play in at least five games this season, **DeSmith** was tied for seventh in the NHL in save percentage and 11th in goals-against average entering play Wednesday.

ROBO ON THE GO GO

- **Jason Robertson** has totaled 39 points (19-20—39) in 31 games played this season, ranking second on the team and seventh in the NHL in scoring entering play Wednesday.
 - **Robertson's** 19 goals were tied for third in the League entering play Wednesday.
- He enters tonight's game having scored 16 goals in his last 15 games played.
- **Robertson** is currently on pace to finish the season with 50 goals, which would be a career high and would tie for the fourth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
- **Robertson** is also pacing to finish the year with 103 points, which would tie for the fifth-most in a single season in franchise history. It would also make him the second player in franchise history to have multiple 100-point seasons for the Stars, joining Dino Ciccarelli who did so in 1981-82 (106) and 1986-87 (103).
- **Robertson** was leading all American NHLers in both goals (19) and points (39) this season entering play Wednesday.

- **Robertson** has totaled 308 points (129-179—308) since the start of the 2022-23 season, which leads all American-born skaters during that span. His 308 points are 18 more than second-ranked Auston Matthews (290).
- **Robertson's** 124 shots on goal this year were the second-most in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- During even-strength play this season when **Robertson** has been on the ice, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 36-16. His plus-20 on-ice goal differential was tied for the fifth-best mark among all NHL forwards this year entering play Wednesday.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Robertson** played in his 400th NHL game on Nov. 30 against the Senators. In reaching the milestone, he became the 47th player in franchise history and the 13th skater selected in the 2017 NHL draft to play in 400 regular-season games.
 - **Robertson's** 429 career points (184-245—429) were the third-most in franchise history through a player's first 400 games with the team and the fifth-most in NHL history among American-born players through their first 400 career games.
- **Robertson** scored the 184th goal of his career in that game, which was the second-most by a player through 400 career games with the Stars/North Stars (NHL debut or otherwise) behind Dino Ciccarelli (221) according to NHL Stats. He also passed Kyle Connor (183) for the eighth-most goals through 400 games by a U.S.-born player in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored in seven consecutive games from Nov. 11 to 25, finding the back of the net 11 times in total during that span. His seven-game goal streak remains the longest in the NHL this season.
- **Robertson's** seven-game goal streak was the longest of his career and the longest by a Stars skater since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94. It is also tied for the second-longest by an American skater since the start of the 2005-06 season according to NHL Stats, trailing only Auston Matthews's eight-game goal streak in 2023-24.
- **Robertson's** 11 goals over the course of his seven-game goal streak were the most ever by a Stars skater. The previous record was held by Bill Goldsworthy, who scored nine goals over the course of a seven-game goal streak from Feb. 6 to 17, 1971.
- When he extended his goal streak to six games on Nov. 22 against the Flames, **Robertson** became the fifth player in Stars/ North Stars history to have multiple six-game goal streaks according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (2x), Danny Grant (2x) and Bill Goldsworthy (2x).
- From Nov. 13 to 18, **Robertson** recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. **Robertson** previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to 15.
- **Robertson** scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.

LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 11 points (4-7—11) in 31 games this year, which is the second-most among Stars defensemen this year.
- **Lindell** opened the scoring 44 seconds into regulation in Dallas' last game on Dec. 9, a 4-3 win over the Winnipeg Jets. It was the fourth opening-minute goal of his career, which is the most by a defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
 - Only five players in franchise history have more: Mike Modano (10), Jamie Benn (7), Brian Bellows (6), Dino Ciccarelli (6) and Bill Goldsworthy (5).
- His goal against the Jets made **Lindell** the 11th defenseman in NHL history with four opening-minute goals according to NHL Stats. Only four have more: Ray Bourque (9), Larry Murphy (6), Brent Burns (5) and Sandis Ozolins (5).
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when **Lindell** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars...
 - Are outscoring their opponents 31-17.
 - Have 16 high-danger goals for to their opponent's six.
 - Own a 55.67 expected goals for percentage.
 - Have a 57.07 high-danger chances for percentage.
- **Lindell** is leading the Stars in 5-on-5 in on-ice goals for (31) and high-danger on-ice goals for (16) this season.
- **Lindell** was tied for 14th and 15th, respectively, in the NHL this year in 5-on-5 on-ice goals for (31) and high-danger on-ice goals for (16) according to Natural Stat Trick entering play Wednesday. His 55.7 expected goals for percentage ranked 12th among players that have had at least 500 minutes of 5-on-5 ice time this season.
- **Lindell** surpassed Darryl Sydor (714) for the 14th-most games played (and the seventh-most by a defenseman) in franchise history in Dallas' last game on Dec. 9, a 4-3 win over the Winnipeg Jets.
- **Lindell** recorded two primary assists in Dallas' game on Dec. 3, a 3-0 win over the New Jersey Devils. It marked his first multi-assist game since March 31, 2025 against the Seattle Kraken.
 - **Lindell** was on the ice for all three Stars goals against the Devils.
- **Lindell's** first assist against the Devils was the 226th point of his career, which gave him sole possession of 10th on the franchise's all-time scoring list by defensemen, surpassing Lou Nanne (225).
 - He is now three points shy of tying Trevor Daley (231) for ninth.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** has totaled 36 points (16-20—36) in 31 games played this year and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team and tied for 13th in the NHL in scoring entering play Wednesday. His 16 goals this season were tied for 12th in the League entering play Wednesday.

- Entering play Wednesday, **Johnston** was tied for ninth in goals and sixth in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- **Johnston** was one of five players under the age of 23 to have at least 30 points this year entering play Wednesday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 15-28—43), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 18-22—40), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 16-22—38) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 16-18—34).
- Twenty (12-8—20) of **Johnston's** 36 points this season have come on the power play, which ranked second to only teammate **Mikko Rantanen** (4-15—19) for the League lead entering play Wednesday. His 20 power-play points are five shy of tying his career high of 25 that he set last season.
- **Johnston's** 12 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Wednesday and were four more than the second-ranked skaters (Leon Draisaitl and Tyler Bertuzzi). His 12 power-play goals are already a career high and are 10 shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
 - Mike Modano currently holds the Dallas Stars team record with 18 in 1993-94.
- **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 42 goals, 53 assists and 95 points, all of which would be career highs.
- **Johnston** is also on pace to finish the season with 53 power-play points, which would be a career high and set a single-season franchise record.
- **Johnston** scored the fourth hat trick of his career and added an assist for his second four-point game of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 30 against the Senators. He became the third player in Stars/North Stars history with four career hat tricks before age 23 according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli and **Tyler Seguin** (both with five).
- **Johnston** had four points (1-3—4) in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Oilers – an 8-3 Stars win – scoring one power-play goal and adding three assists. It was his highest single-game point total since he had a career-high five points (3-2—5) on March 5, 2024 against the Nashville Predators.
 - His performance against Edmonton marked the third time in his career that he has had at least four points in a game. He joined **Tyler Seguin** (6x) as the second player in Stars team history to register as many at age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston's** second assist of the night was the 200th point of his NHL career, making him the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the club. He is the first player in Stars team history with 200 career points at age 22 or younger, and the fifth in franchise history alongside Brian Bellows (342), Mike Modano (309), Bobby Smith (222) and Tom McCarthy (202) according to NHL Stats.
- Among players to debut with the Stars, **Johnston** (100-100—200 in 269 games played) became the third-fastest player in team history to record 200 NHL points behind Jason Robertson (190 games played) and **Roope Hintz** (263 games played) according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston's** second assist of the night also marked the 100th assist of his NHL career. He became the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists and the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the Stars.
- **Johnston** (100-100—200) became the 10th active player to have 100 goals and 100 assists at the time of his 200th career point according to NHL Stats. He joined Alex DeBrincat, Tyler Toffoli, James van Riemsdyk, Conor Sheary, Nino Niederreiter, Sam Bennett, Victor Olofsson and Joel Armia.
- **Johnston's** scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North Stars.
- **Johnston**, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- **Johnston** recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since **Tyler Seguin** had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston** recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
 - Both of **Johnston's** goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
 - **Johnston** also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999

- The Stars are a perfect 3-0-0 when wearing their new alternate jerseys – the '99s – this season, taking down the Utah Mammoth on Nov. 28, the Ottawa Senators on Nov. 30 and the Pittsburgh Penguins on Dec. 7.
- Two of the team's three victories have been comeback wins. The Stars were trailing the Mammoth 2-0 in the first period before eventually winning the game 4-3 and were then down 1-0 to Pittsburgh before winning the game 3-2 in a shootout.
- In all, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 12-6 when wearing the '99s.
- The Stars power-play is clicking at a 40 percent rate when wearing the '99s, converting on four of 10 opportunities in those three games.
- Dallas has not allowed a power-play goal against while wearing the '99s, going a perfect 7-for-7 while shorthanded when wearing the new alternates.
- **Wyatt Johnston** (4-2—6) and **Mikko Rantanen** (0-6—6) are tied for the team lead in scoring when wearing the '99s.
 - **Johnston** scored the fourth hat trick of his career and added an assist for his second four-point game of the season on Nov. 30 against the Senators while wearing the new alternates. He became the third player in Stars/North Stars

history with four career hat tricks before age 23 according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli and **Tyler Seguin** (both with five).

- **Jamie Benn** has scored in each of the three games that the Stars have worn the '99s.
- **Jake Oettinger** (2-0-0) and **Casey DeSmith** (1-0-0) are both undefeated when wearing the '99s.
- Launched on Nov. 28, the Stars' new alternates set an NHL record for single-game merchandise sales for both regular season and playoffs, breaking the previous regular-season record by 24 percent and the playoff record by 10 percent.
- The Stars will wear the '99s nine more times this season: on Dec. 13 vs. Florida, Dec. 21 vs. Toronto, Jan. 4 vs. Montreal, Jan. 18 vs. Tampa Bay, Feb. 2 vs. Winnipeg, Feb. 28 vs. Nashville, March 8 vs. Chicago, March 12 vs. Edmonton and March 22 vs. Vegas.

2025 WRAPPED

- Tonight marks the sixth of 14 games the Stars will play this month. The games will be split evenly between home and road, with seven games being played at the American Airlines Center and seven being played on the road.
- Since Jan. 1, 2025, the Stars have posted a 49-18-10 record for 108 points and a .701 points percentage. Entering play Wednesday, the team's 49 wins and 108 points led the League this calendar year and their .701 points percentage ranked second.
- 2025 is the fourth consecutive calendar year that the team has earned at least 100 points and had a points percentage above .600.
 - The Stars have had a points percentage above .500 in 31 of the 32 full calendar years that the team has spent in Dallas (since 1994) since relocating from Minnesota.
- The team's 49 wins in 2025 are already their sixth-most in a calendar year since 1994 – the team's first full calendar year in Dallas – trailing only 2022 (54), 2006 (54), 2024 (52), 2015 (52) and 1997 (51).
- The Stars' 108 points are their seventh-most in a calendar year since 1994 despite having nine games left to play in 2025.
- **Jason Robertson** is the Stars' leading scorer in 2025, totaling 91 points (45-46—91) in 77 games played. Entering play Wednesday, his 91 points and 45 goals ranked fourth and second, respectively, in the NHL in 2025.
 - **Robertson's** 91 points are already tied for the fourth-most in a calendar year in Stars team history (since 1994) and his 44 goals are the third-most. **Robertson** currently holds the Stars team record with 108 points and 56 goals in 2022.
- **Robertson** is one of two players in franchise history to score at least 45 goals in a calendar year twice according to NHL Stats, joining Dino Ciccarelli who did so six times.
- **Wyatt Johnston** was tied for 10th in the NHL in 2025 scoring entering play Wednesday, recording 82 points (40-42—82) in 77 games played. His 40 goals were tied for eighth in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
 - **Johnston** was also leading the League in power-play goals (21) and points (38) in 2025 entering play Wednesday.
 - His 40 goals are already the fifth-most in a calendar year in Stars team history (since 1994). He enters tonight's game two goals shy of tying **Tyler Seguin** (42) in 2014 for the fourth-most.
- Despite missing 14 regular-season games this calendar year, **Thomas Harley's** 13 goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen in 2025 entering play Wednesday.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 33-13-5 record with a .908 save percentage, 2.65 goals-against average and three shutouts in 2025. His 33 wins were tied with Andrei Vasilevskiy for the most in the NHL this calendar year entering play Wednesday.
 - **Oettinger's** 33 wins in 2025 are already tied for the sixth-most in a calendar year in Dallas Stars team history (since 1994).

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** has 27 points (6-21—27) in 31 games played this season, ranking fourth on both the Stars and among all NHL defensemen in scoring this season entering play Wednesday.
 - His 20 assists were tied for fourth among defensemen this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** is averaging 26:08 of ice time per game this season, which was the third-highest total in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** scored in three consecutive games from Dec. 3 to 7, setting a career high and becoming the seventh defenseman in Stars team history to score in three straight games.
- **Heiskanen** scored the game-tying goal with 1:49 remaining in regulation on Dec. 7 against the Pittsburgh Penguins, an eventual 3-2 shootout win for the Stars. According to NHL Stats, it was the latest game-tying goal by a Stars skater since Craig Smith (59:45) on Dec. 23, 2023.
- **Heiskanen** played in his 500th NHL game on Nov. 28, a 4-3 win over the Utah Mammoth. In reaching the milestone, he became...
 - The 34th player and 16th defensemen to play in 500 games for the Stars.
 - The second player (Nico Hischier) drafted in 2017 to play in 500 NHL games.
 - The 46th Finnish player and 13th Finnish defenseman to play in 500 NHL games.
- **Heiskanen** tallied two assists against Utah, the second of which was the 305th point of his career. He surpassed Philadelphia's Rasmus Ristolainen for eighth place on the NHL's all-time points list among Finnish defensemen.
- His 305 career points (61-244—305) were the fourth-most by a Stars defensemen through his first 500 games played according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** performance against the Mammoth was also the 54th career multi-assist game, tying Craig Hartsburg for the second most in franchise history among defensemen according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time in Dallas' Nov. 22 game against the Calgary Flames, a 3-2 shootout loss. It was the most ice time any skater in the NHL has had in a single game this season entering play Wednesday.
 - It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since **Heiskanen** skated 32:01 April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.

- **Heiskanen** tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
 - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
 - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone.
 - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
 - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- **Heiskanen** recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied **Roope Hintz** (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied **Hintz** for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. **Hintz** first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
 - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
 - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- **Heiskanen** tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
 - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
 - **Heiskanen** last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- **Heiskanen** scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- **Heiskanen's** six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 32-for-99 on the power play this season for a 32.3 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas' 32 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL and were eight more than the second-ranked Edmonton Oilers (24) entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas is averaging 1.03 power-play goals per game this season, the best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 20-for-50 on the power play for a 40.0 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Wednesday. Their 20 home power-play goals were the most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
 - The team is averaging a League-best 1.33 power-play goals per game at home this season.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 10 different times this season – on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida, on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim, on Nov. 25 at Edmonton, on Nov. 28 vs. Utah, on Nov. 30 vs. Ottawa and on Dec. 9 at Winnipeg. Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in eight games.
 - No other team had scored multiple power-play goals in more than six games this season entering play Wednesday.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 32 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (12), **Jason Robertson** (7), **Roope Hintz** (4), **Mikko Rantanen** (4), **Matt Duchene**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Steel's** power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- **Rantanen** (4-17—21) was leading the League lead in power-play scoring this season entering play Wednesday followed by **Johnston** (12-8—20) who ranked second, **Robertson** (7-10—17) who was tied for fourth and **Hintz** (4-9—13) who was tied for ninth.
- **Johnston's** 12 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Wednesday and were four more than the second-ranked skaters (Leon Draisaitl and Tyler Bertuzzi). His 12 power-play goals are already a career high and are 10 shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
 - Mike Modano currently holds the Dallas Stars team record with 18 in 1993-94.
- **Rantanen** (57), **Johnston** (53) and **Robertson** (45) are all on pace to set career highs in power-play points and set franchise records for most power-play points in a single season by a Stars skater.
 - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 11 points (1-10—11) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the most among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.

WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- **Roope Hintz** has totaled 26 points (9-17—26) in 26 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranking fifth on the Stars in scoring despite missing five games with an injury this year.

- **Hintz**'s current offensive output puts him on pace to finish the year with 50 assists and 77 points, both of which would be career highs for the forward.
- When **Hintz** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 22-8 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Hintz** recorded his 400th NHL point with an assist in Dallas' game on Dec. 3, a 3-0 win over New Jersey. In reaching the milestone he became:
 - The 18th player in franchise history to record 400 points with the team.
 - The 23rd Finnish player in NHL history to total 400 career points.
 - The 14th player from the 2015 draft class to have 400 NHL points.
- **Hintz** is the third-fastest skater in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and seventh-fastest Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 NHL points according to NHL Stats.
- **Hintz** enters tonight's game with several franchise milestones within reach:
 - He is one goal shy of tying Bobby Smith (185) for the 13th-most goals in franchise history.
 - He is four assists away from tying Derian Hatcher (223) for the 23rd-most assists in franchise history.
 - He needs four points to tie Mike Ribeiro (407) for the 17th-most points in franchise history.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

- The Stars posted an 11-2-2 record in 15 games played in November, tying for the League lead in wins (11) and points (24) and ranking third in points percentage (.800) last month.
- Dallas' 62 goals scored and 4.13 goals per game in November tied for first and second in the NHL, respectively.
 - The team's 41 5-on-5 goals in November tied for second in the NHL.
- The Stars have gone 18-for-51 on the power in November for a 35.3 percent success rate on the man advantage, which was the best mark in the NHL last month. No team has scored more power-play goals in November than the Stars.
- The Stars 11 wins, 24 points and 62 goals scored last month are all their most ever in the month of November since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.

- Every skater that played in a game for the Stars in November recorded at least one point.
- **Jason Robertson** (12-11—23) led the League lead in goals (13) and tied for the lead in points (26) in November.
 - **Robertson** tied Bill Goldsworthy and Brian Bellows (both with four) for the third most 10-goal calendar months in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Dino Ciccarelli (10) and Mike Modano (6).
 - **Robertson** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November
- **Mikko Rantanen** (6-15—21) ranked sixth in the League in scoring in November followed by **Wyatt Johnston** (10-10—20) who was tied for seventh.
- **Miro Heiskanen** (1-16—17) tied for the League lead in scoring among defensemen in November. His 16 assists ranked second among all NHL skaters last month.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- After trailing 2-0, the Stars came back to defeat the Utah Mammoth 4-3 in their game on Nov. 29, marking the fifth time this season that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, which was tied for the most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - There have been seven games this season in which the Stars have been trailing by two goals and have comeback to earn at least one point, going 5-0-2 in those games.
- Overall, the Stars have nine comeback wins this year, which was the third-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Additionally, Dallas has won seven games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.

- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (323) and **Wyatt Johnston** (277).
- **Robertson**'s 323-game Iron Man streak was tied for the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 24 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 277 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Wednesday, it was tied for the 12th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward **Sam Steel** was a member of the Minnesota Wild during the 2022-23 season.
