

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 4, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. WINNIPEG JETS [5]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames travelled to Winnipeg for a meeting with the Jets on Thursday night. Calgary would open the scoring 4:35 into the contest with MacKenzie Weegar netting his 19<sup>th</sup> to give the Flames an early advantage. Winnipeg would score a pair later in the frame to lead 2-0 through 20. Daniil Miromanov would draw the Flames level midway through the second, before Winnipeg re-claimed their one goal advantage prior the end of the middle stanza to lead 3-2. The Jets added a pair in the third to knock-off the Flames 5-2.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Oilers. The Flames won their most recent meeting 6-3 on February 24<sup>th</sup> in Edmonton.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-9-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 20-21-2 against Western Conference opponents.

### LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames travelled north to Edmonton for round three of the Battle of Alberta on February 24<sup>th</sup> for Hockey Night in Canada. Calgary would draw first blood after Walker Duehr found a streaking Nazem Kadri who redirected home his 21<sup>st</sup> of the season to give the Flames an early lead. Martin Pospisil made it 2-0 Flames shortly after followed by Noah Hanifin scoring his 10<sup>th</sup> to put the visitors up 3-0. Edmonton would get on the board before the end of the first, but Calgary led 3-1 through 20. The Oilers would draw within one in the second, before a pair of goals from Dryden Hunt and Noah Hanifin gave the Flames a 5-2 lead through 40. In the third, both teams traded goals as the Flames knocked off Edmonton to take a thrilling third installment of the Battle of Alberta 6-3.

### WEEGSY BABY:

With a goal and an assist on Thursday against Winnipeg, MacKenzie Weegar has reached 200 points in his NHL career. The Ottawa, ON native has become just the ninth defenceman drafted in the seventh-round to reach 200 points in NHL history, and the only one to do so with less than 500 games played over their career (462). Weegar's goal in Winnipeg was his 19<sup>th</sup> of the season which is the most in the NHL among players with 100 or more hits (179) and 100 or more blocked shots (189).

### SHARKNADO:

With his tally on Tuesday against Anaheim, Yegor Sharangovich is now just one goal away from joining Kent Nilsson (40 in 1979-80), Michael Cammalleri (39 in 2008-09), Lanny McDonald (34 in 1981-82), Bob MacMillan (31 in 1977-78) and Hakan Loob (30 in 1983-84) as the sixth player in Flames history to record 30 or more goals in their first season with the club. Sharangovich's 29 goals are tied with Blake Coleman for the most among all Flames skaters so far through the 2023-24 campaign.

### BILL MASTERTON NOMINATION:

Oliver Kylington has been nominated for the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy by the Calgary chapter of the Professional Hockey Writers Association (PHWA). The annual award goes to the National Hockey League player who best exemplifies the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey. The Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy was first presented by the NHL Writers Association in 1968 to commemorate the late William Masterton, a player for the Minnesota North Stars who exhibited, to a high degree, the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey. Masterton died on Jan. 15, 1968 after an injury sustained during a hockey game. Two Flames have won the trophy, Lanny McDonald in 1983 and Gary Roberts in 1996.



### A BATTLE BY THE NUMBERS:

This will be the 263<sup>rd</sup> installment of the Battle of Alberta, with the Flames holding a 130-108-24 record over their provincial rival. 100 of those games have been one-goal games or ties (82 wins, 18 ties) with Calgary owning 45 of the 82 wins. Jarome Iginla is the Flames all-time goals leader against the Oilers with 34 tallies, while Al MacInnis sets the mark for points with 89 in 75 games against Edmonton during his time in Calgary.

### HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Dryden Hunt found the back of the net in the most recent installment of the Battle of Alberta to score his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames.
