BENN MOVES UP THE LIST

Captain **Jamie Benn** recorded his 868th career NHL point tonight (367-501—868) to move into sole possession of second place on the franchise's all-time scoring list. Benn surpassed **Neal Broten**, who had 867 points (274-593—867).

Now in his 11th season as the Stars captain, Benn is the longest-tenured captain in franchise history. The 34-year-old ranks second in franchise history in games played (1,060) and goals (367) and third in assists (501). He also ranks third in franchise history in shorthanded goals (16) and fourth in power-play tallies (101). Additionally, he ranks first in franchise history in overtime goals (11) and second in game winners (55).

Benn recorded his 500th career assist on Dec. 11 vs. Detroit to become the third player in franchise history to post 500 assists with the franchise, joining **Mike Modano** (802) and Broten (593).

NOTES

- Forward **Matt Duchene** opened the scoring just 1:14 into the game, giving Dallas five goals within the opening 90 seconds of a game, tied with the Oilers for the most among all teams.
 - Duchene (2-1—3) recorded his 51st career multi-goal game, while also reaching double digits with the Stars (10). It also marked his 50th career three-point performance. Duchene has points in 13 of his past 18 games (6-14—20) and in 18 of his previous 24 overall (8-17—25).

- Defenseman **Thomas Harley** (22 years, 121 days) became the fourth-youngest defenseman in franchise history to score an overtime goal, following **Julius Honka** (21 years, 122 days on April 4, 2017), **Bob Rouse** (21 years, 233 days on Feb. 6, 1986) and **Miro Heiskanen** (22 years, 88 days on Oct. 14, 2021). Harley leads Stars defensemen in goals (8) and shares second among NHL blueliners in that category.
- Forward **Joe Pavelski** (0-2—2) picked up his sixth multi-point game of the season and is now in sole possession of eighth on the all-time points list among U.S.-born players (462-568—1,030 in 1,280 GP).
- Forward **Jason Robertson** (1-0—1) reached double digits in goals with his 10th of the season. Robertson, who has points in 11 of his past 14 (5-10—15), leads the club in assists (18), ranks second in points (10-18—28) and shares second in goals (10).
- Goaltender **Scott Wedgewood** improved to 7-1-2 with 35 saves. Wedgewood has won three of his past four games (3-0-1) and has backstopped the club to at least one point in his past eight appearances (6-0-2).
