KEEP IT ROLLIN'

The Penguins have earned points in 20 of their 27 games this season, going 14-7-6 entering tonight's game against the Anaheim Ducks.

- Pittsburgh is coming off a 2-0-1 road trip, securing five of six possible points.
- The Penguins have earned 13 of their 14 wins in regulation, a mark that ranks fourth in the entire NHL:

POWERED UP

Pittsburgh has six power-play goals over their last four games and have the best power-play percentage in the league entering today.

- The Penguins' power play continues to rank at the top of the league with a 33.3% success rate, going 22-for-66 this season:

- Pittsburgh has had the least amount of power-play opportunities in the league with 66, yet have scored the fifth-most goals on the man advantage this season:

- Crosby's career high in power-play goals is 16 set during his rookie season in 2005-06.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Sidney Crosby enters tonight's game with five goals over his last five games and leads the team with 18 tallies on the season.

- Only two players have more goals than the 38-year old Crosby this season:

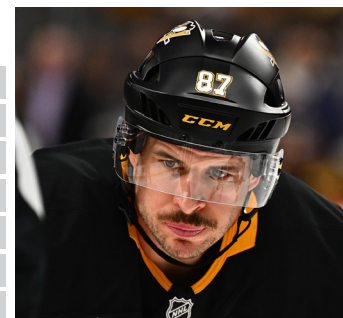
- Crosby is on pace for 55 goals this season, which would be the most by a 38-year old in a single season (Alex Ovechkin & Gordie Howe, 44). His career high goal total is 51 established in 2009-10.

- Crosby sits two goals away from the 18th 20-goal season of his career. Only six players in NHL history have more 20-goal seasons than him:

ALL THE STOPS

Pittsburgh's goaltending and defense have been stellar this season and are two reasons the Penguins have the seventh-highest points percentage in the league.

- The Penguins' 73 goals against this season are the fourth fewest in the NHL:

- Tristan Jarry has been phenomenal for the team this season, earning points in 10 of his 12 games, going 9-2-1 with a 2.54 goals-against average and .913 save percentage.

- Pittsburgh's team save percentage of .905 ranks sixth in the NHL, while their 2.70 goals-against average is the seventh best. Only the Minnesota Wild [6] and NY Islanders [4] have more shutouts than the Penguins' three.
