AT A GLANCE

NO P(LA)CE LIKE HOME

The Kings return to Crypto.com Arena to close out their three-game homestand following back-to-back 7-2 victories over the Hurricanes on March 22 and Bruins on March 23. By doing so, the Kings extended their home point streak to 14 games (11-0-3), setting a new record for the longest such streak in team history. The Kings' 14-goal weekend marked the 17th time in franchise history, and first since April 1 & 3, 1995, the Kings scored seven goals in back-to-back games. Furthermore, it was just the third time the team had seven-plus goals in consecutive calendar days folloing Dec. 20-21, 1988 and Nov. 13-14, 1987 (via NHL PR).

FIFTY-FIVE BIG BOOMS

Forward **Quinton Byfield** picked up his 19th goal and 25th helper of the season (1-1=2) on Sunday night as part of his second consecutive multi-point game (1-1=2) on Mar. 22 vs. CAR) to extended his career-long home point streak to nine games (7-7=14). It marks the longest home point streak by a player under 23 years of age since **Luc Robitaille's** 10-game run (6-9=15) in 1988-89. Overall, he is just the sixth player to establish a home point streak of at least nine games before turning 23 years old in LA Kings history: **Jimmy Carson** (x3), **Steve Duchesne**, **Larry Murphy** (x2), **Bernie Nicholls** (x2) and Robitaille (x3).

DR. DREI

In last Saturday afternoon's victory over Carolina, forward **Andrei Kuzmenko** (1-1=2) scored his seventh goal of the season and picked up his 15th assist of the campaign, his first points since being acquired by the Kings earlier this month. The native of Yakutsk, Russia, joined **Vladimir Tkachev** (0-2=2) as the only undrafted Russian-born skaters to record a multi-point game in Kings history. With his first helper in black-and-silver, Kuzmenko clinched his third 15-assist campaign to become just the fourth undrafted Russian-born skater in NHL history to record three or more such seasons. Kuzmenko followed his matinee performance up with his eighth tally of the year on Sunday night against Boston for goals in back-to-back games.
