FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP February 1, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. DETROIT RED WINGS [3]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game week by welcoming the Detroit Red Wings to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Through 20 minutes, the Flames found themselves down 2-0. In the middle frame, Calgary would muster 13 shots but the score remained 2-0 to the visitors through 40. In the third, Nazem Kadri would give the Flames life with his 18th of the season to cut the deficit to one. However, Detroit would shut the door and add an empty netter to knock off the Flames 3-1.

On Thursday the Calgary Flames acquired left winger Joel Farabee and centre Morgan Frost from the Philadelphia Flyers in exchange for forwards Andrei Kuzmenko, Jakob Pelletier and Calgary's second-round pick in 2025 and a seventh-round pick in 2028.

THE NEW GUYS:

Joel Farabee, a 24-year-old left winger, was a first round draft pick (14th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2018 NHL Draft. The following season he earned Hockey East and NCAA Rookie of the Year awards as he led Boston University with 36 points in 37 games as a freshman. After starting his NHL career in 2019-20, Joel has scored 90 goals along with 111 assists for 201 points and 219 penalty minutes in 384 games along with two 20+ goal seasons. This year he has netted eight goals and 11 assists for 19 points in 50 games.

Morgan Frost, a 25-year-old centreman, was also a first round pick (27th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2017 NHL Draft. He was an OHL First Team All-Star in both 2018 and 2019 as a member of the Soo Greyhounds before starting his NHL career the following season. In 277 career games with the Flyers, Morgan scored 50 goals and added 85 assists for 135 points and has had two 40+ point seasons. At the time of his acquisition, he ranked fourth in Flyers scoring with 11 goals and 14 assists for 25 points in 48 games with Philadelphia.

The pair both made their Calgary Flames debuts last night, with the duo each seeing over 17 minutes of ice-time (Farabee 18:01) (Frost 17:37). Frost registered three shots while going 6/12 in the face-off dot.

MAN OF THE MONTH:

Flames netminder Dustin Wolf earned NHL Rookie of the Month for the month of January. Wolf topped rookie netminders in games played (10), saves (270) and shots against (293), became the second rookie goaltender in Flames history to win at least seven contests in a single calendar month. The other: Mike Vernon, in both November 1986 (9-3-0, 3.09 GAA, .897 SV%, 1 SO in 12 GP) and December 1986 (7-3-1, 3.16 GAA, .900 SV% in 11 GP).

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Flames are set to finish off their seventh back-to-back set tonight in Seattle following last night's 3-1 setback versus Detroit. Calgary has a record of 5-2-0 in game one of back-to-back scenarios, and a record of 1-5-0 in game two of back-to-back scenarios. The Flames next back-to-back set will come on March 1st when they face the Florida Panthers before travelling to Carolina to face the Hurricanes the following afternoon on March 2nd.

HUBY DOO:

With one more tally, Jonathan Huberdeau (19-17—36 in 51 GP) can set a new personal benchmark for fewest games to 20 goals in a season; his current benchmark is 55 contests in 2020-21. Huberdeau's 19 tallies on the campaign lead the Flames.

Martin Pospisil scored his first NHL goal at Climate Pledge Arena against the Seattle Kraken on November 4th, 2023.
